THE TRANSCONTINENTAL COMMISSION.

In reply to the criticism that none of the transcontinental railway commissioners have any railway experience, it is said that Mr. Wade for some years managed a local Nova Scotia line, under an order of the supreme court of the province. This is something, who it can hardly be said to prove Mr. Wade's ability to construct a railway 1900 miles long thru a new and difficult country. It is to be remembered that the work of the commission is not to manage the railway, but to build it, and experience in management might be of little value in construction. Of course it is hardly possible that Mr. Wade or some of his colleagues may possess hitherto undeveloped talents in the way of railway construction, but a hope of this kind is hardly a satisfactory substitute for experience. Another matter that calls for explanation is Mr. Wade's emphatic denial in parliament that he had any prospect of being one of the commissioners. If we accept this denial as truthful we must suppose that a member of the opposition was more accurately informed on this point than Mr. Wade himself. He is not a man whose qualifications would point him out as a man likely to receive the offer. Yet we are asked to believe that he received the appointment without any application of his own, and that he was in entire ignorance of any work that was being done by his friends; and at the same time that the movement had obtained such publicity that it came to the ears of a member of the opposition. This is a mystery that ought to be cleared up.

MUNICIPAL BILLS FOR OUTSIDE FRIGIDITY LIVES.

The Globe yesterday raises the question of the entrance into the city of radial electric railways. It says nothing has been done for months, and it also says that Toronto Railway Company are playing with the city council. We are not quite certain that it is a mistake, or rather, to put it in another way, there is great danger that what the city does will be to the disadvantage of the citizens, unless the greatest care is exercised. So far, no damage has been done, and we must prevent it. There is only one clear-cut policy open to the city, and that is to design, lay out and construct a system of tracks from the city limit where the radials touch it in the centre of the city, say St. Lawrence Market. These tracks, to be owned absolutely by the city, and the radials to be charged tolls over them. The tolls charged the suburban companies to be at the lowest possible sum consistent with the cost and maintenance of the system. Furthermore, any rights to the city over these tracks should absolutely terminate when the street railway franchise terminates. The right to use this municipal system would be a genuine regulating force of the tolls and conduct of the companies.

LABOR CANDIDATES FOR PARLIAMENT.

Everything points to a general election for the house of commons within the next ten weeks. Mr. Flett, the president of the Trades and Labor Congress of Canada, deplored in these columns a couple of days ago the fact that labor questions had received less than scant attention in the present parliament, and that it was incumbent on labor men to take some independent action in order to get any kind of legislative relief of their grievances. The Trades and Labor Congress is to meet again in a few days in Montreal, and it is likely some kind of action will be decided on. Organized labor is decidedly in favor of public ownership and in favor of a great many progressive ideas, and that being the case, there is no reason why the working men of Toronto should not try and secure two of the five seats in the City of Toronto in the forthcoming election. They ought, at least, to get one member in Hamilton and another member in Ottawa. But everything depends on how they unite in the struggle. It does not necessarily follow that a labor candidate must be himself a workman, but he certainly must be pledged up to the hilt to support the program of labor, and he must be a man whose word is as good as his bond, and who, once elected, can maintain himself on his indemnity and his own resources, and who is not looking for a job for himself or some friend or some relative. About 60 per cent. of the members of parliament seem to occupy half their time in chasing jobs for themselves or for their relatives, or in getting some kind of advantages for themselves or for the business in which they are identified; once a member of parliament has accepted a favor of any kind from the party in power,

his usefulness is gone. He is an enemy to his constituency, and a reproach to the community. Surely labor can elect a few straightforward, progressive men. The World will help them to do it. THE PURSUIT OF THE DOLLAR. Prof. Munsterberg in a work giving a German view of the United States, advances a new theory as to the dollar-chasing proclivities of the American. He says that the American regards work not as a means to an end, but as an end in itself. "The charm that wealth has for him is not in its possession as much as in its acquisition. He hunts the dollar in about the same spirit in which the English go fox-hunting. He loves the hunt, but he also loves the game. A European merchant or manufacturer looks forward to the time when he can retire from business and live on his income; an American money-getter no more thinks of retiring than does a scientific man or an artist who is still in the full vigor of his powers. For these and similar reasons the author thinks that it is radically wrong to accuse that class of materialists. They are really idealists, for idealism does not depend on the acts which a man performs, but on the spirit in which he performs them." While this may be regarded as a rather high-flown description of the American, it probably contains an element of truth. A love of money in the sense of mere greed and avarice is by no means a distinctive American quality, and the average American is as fond of spending money as of making it. What seems to be distinctive about the American is a habit of talking in dollars and measuring things by a standard of dollars. This again seems to be part of a general proclivity for weighing, measuring and counting things. A gentleman who was trying to explain to an American visitor something about Brock's monument at Queenston was asked, "How high is it?" The habit is perhaps due to the rapid growth of the country in material wealth, which it is natural to express in statistics. We are acquiring the same habit; the budget speech appears with diagrams vividly setting forth the growth of trade, and our immigration literature, by means of pictures of a little boat and a big one, illustrates the wonderful development of the cattle industry. The extravagance of a government is emphasized if you can show that it spends every year an amount which in dollar bills would make a giraffe around the earth. But taking as charitable a view as possible of the dollar-chasing habit, where, its effects are hardening and vulgarizing. The liberality in spending money may to a certain extent relieve the soreness of eagerness in getting, spending has its own excesses and follies. The standard of the most apt to take the place of the standard of worth, and unmeaning extravagance and ostentation are the results. Even if the race for money is only a game, it is a game that brings no health either to body or mind.

GETTING AT LAND VALUES.

Donald McKay Assessed \$20,000 for Property Recently Bought at L. S. The court of revision dealt chiefly with property in the north end of Ward Three yesterday. The Aikins estate appealed on the assessment of 170 feet on the corner of Yonge and Wellesley-streets. The corner lot was valued at \$175 per foot and the remainder at \$140. A reduction of \$15 per foot was made. The warehouse of T. R. Haig was assessed at \$8000 and it was not changed. The lot on the corner of Yonge-street secured a reduction from \$125 to \$100, an increase of \$10 over last year. Thomas Thompson, assesser 245, 250 and 252 Yonge-street, appealed against a valuation of \$450 per foot, an increase of \$100, but will appeal. The University of Toronto obtained exemption of the Thorn and Howland properties on the east side of Queen's Park, which have passed into its possession. Donald Mackay was refused reduction on Queen's Park-croft, assessed for \$12,000 on land and \$8000 on buildings. He said he had paid only \$16,000 for the property. A vacant lot at 7 LaPlante-avenue was assessed at \$40 per foot, but the court reduced it to \$25. In the afternoon E. J. Lennox appealed against the assessment of his property 16 Bay-street, where he holds 21 feet, which was assessed at \$450 per foot, or \$2450 on the land and \$6000 on the building. The land was valued at \$200 last year and the court reduced the assessment to \$400 per foot. It is expected that the appeals in Ward Three will be finished to-day.

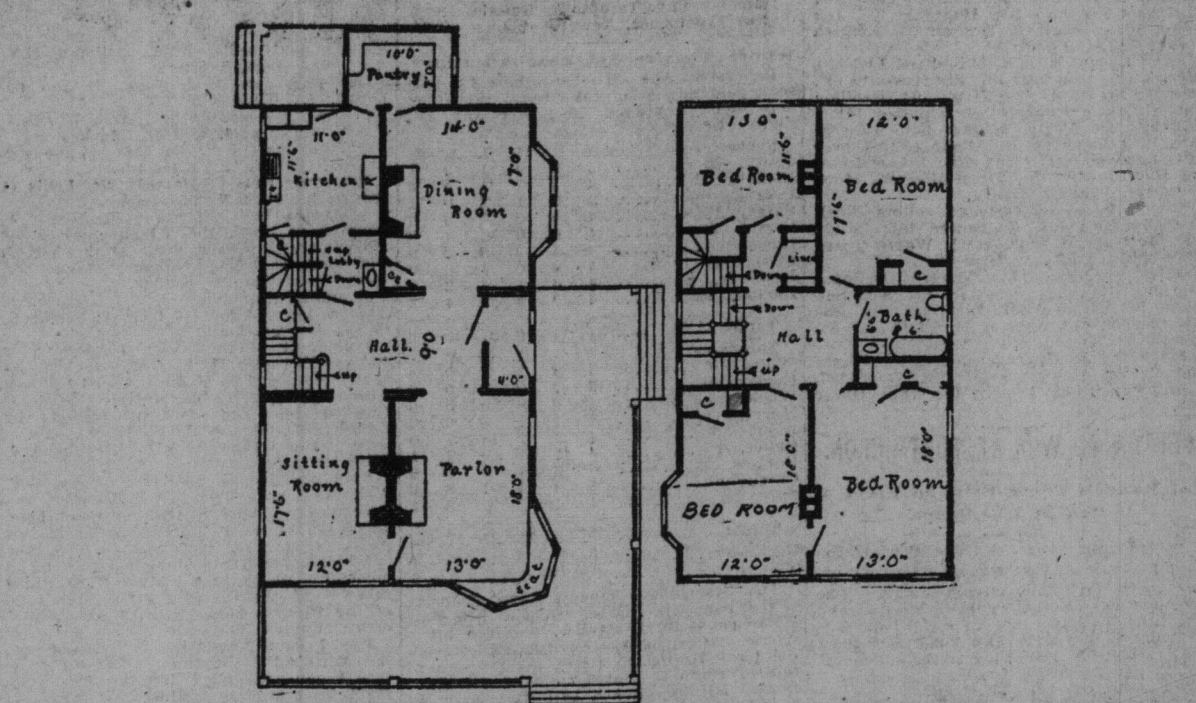
ANNEXATION WORRIES.

Controllers Not Pleasied With Government's Course. The board of control yesterday received a letter from the assistant provincial secretary in regard to the annexation question. Mr. Mulvey said that the matter was receiving attention, but that he was directed to say that a general scheme of extending the limits would receive more favorable consideration than the annexation of a number of small parcels of land, which were apparently intended for private interests rather than upon public grounds, and many of which were opposed. The controllers were not pleased with the tone of the communication and Controller Spence protested strongly against the course taken by the government on the question. He said the conditions of the act had been complied with, the people wanted to come in and the government, in blocking the movement, was acting against the interests both of the city and the outside residents.

Detroit, Mich., Aug. 31.—When Melvin Bartlett, clerk of vital statistics in the provincial department of agriculture, Winnipeg, stepped up to his private mailbox, at the Detroit Postoffice, last night, he was surprised to find detectives waiting for him. Bartlett at first denied that he had left Winnipeg under a cloud. It is alleged that for eight or ten years Bartlett has been embezzling money received from the sale of marriage licenses, and that, during all that time, he has been falsifying entries. COLONIAL HOUSE FOR \$3,500



The house is purely Colonial in style, with heavy columns and all detail in Colonial style, both inside and out. AS TO RADIAL ROADS.

Mayor Explains Delay, But Will Say Himself Again. The delay in the matter of radial railways is asserted by the officials of the James Bay Railway to be entirely due to the Toronto Railway Company. The matter is still in the same condition in which it stood some months ago, when a tentative agreement was prepared, and negotiations were in progress between the mayor and W. H. Moore, secretary to the president of the Toronto Railway Company. The mayor, who was to secure a conference with Mr. Moore, and the matter was dropped while it was away from the city. His worship is still of the opinion that the city should build the lines within the city and lease running rights to all radial lines. In this way the control of the situation would be vested in the city for all time. The city, he reports from Mr. Jennings and the city engineer, covering the whole matter, and he is prepared to go into the question as soon as the railway company will take it up. The company is endeavoring to secure all franchises on its suburban lines, and might buy a private right of way into the city and transfer the passengers at the limits.

JAMES BAY RAILWAY CONSTRUCTION.

Work to be Started This Fall in the Don Valley. The World yesterday interviewed some of the officials of the James Bay Railway at the head offices, King and Toronto-streets, and got from them a statement to the effect that work would be under way at several points on the construction of the road between Toronto and Sudbury. On Monday a man said to represent the contractor visited a number of farmers along the line of the railway in the Don Valley, adjacent to Toronto, and told them that large ranges of laborers would be at work on the Don end of the road this fall. Mr. Moore, vice-president of the company, would not verify or deny this statement yesterday. He said that the contractor practically the whole of the road had been let to Archie Mackenzie and A. B. Mann, who were busy now organizing their forces for prosecuting the work. Mr. Moore also said that both he and the other vice-presidents were ready to purchase the right of way from parties thru whose property the road had been located.

ALPINE ACCIDENTS.

Well-Known English Professor's Fall Down a Precipice. Geneva, Sept. 2.—The body of the Rev. Dr. Henry Palm Curney, with his neck broken, was discovered at the foot of a precipice on the mountains above Arolla.

He left his hotel on Saturday to climb the Eysa, a southern spur of the Rousset, and was probably caught in a sudden storm. It was discovered that he was missing on Sunday, and search-parties were organized, but it was not until next morning that the tragic and fatal climb was discovered.

Dr. Curney was for ten years the principal of the Durham College of Science at Newcastle, and professor of mathematics. He was formerly partner in the well-known firm of Curney, Gurney, army coaches. It is recalled that twenty years ago Prof. Gubert of the Durham University was killed on the Alps.

A man named Wilhelm Sattler, a resident of Innsbruck, fell over the edge of a precipice for edelweiss, and was killed.

Prof. Sattler of Zittau, Saxony, who was staying at an hotel at Kainach, left Kainach with the intention of ascending the Paduenerkogel to gather edelweiss, and never returned.

Advices from Innsbruck state that an artisan named Umberto Dorigo, who was employed at Moserboden, while gathering edelweiss on the Kainachstein fell over a precipice upwards of 300 feet high, and was dashed to pieces.

FEEDING THE RUSSIAN ARMY.

St. Petersburg, Sept. 1.—The Russian outfit for feeding General Kurto's army, and is probably the largest ever undertaken in the history of the world.

There are needed daily twelve thousand pounds of flour, one thousand three hundred pounds of grain, one thousand three hundred pounds of hay, one thousand three hundred pounds of straw and a supply of three hundred and fifty thousand pounds of biscuit has been ordered.

At present, thirty thousand mules and horses are occupied in bringing in these local supplies. The Chinese camp is working—three supplied from the mountains, each grinding 2,000 pounds daily, and two from Odessa, each grinding 1,400 pounds, besides 28 hand mills with the army, furnished by Warsaw subsistence.
