MORAL PRESSURE TO GET SLACKERS

British Government Committee Reports on Best Method of Using National Registration Returns

London, Sept. 11—It is officially announced that a government committee under the chairmanship of the Marquis of Lansdowne, which was recently appointed to advise as to the best method of using national registration for the successful prosecution of the war, has agreed upon an interim report dealing provisionally with the conditions under which the registration returns from men of military age will be available for use in the departments concerned. The report also indicates approximately the classes which in the public interest should not be approached by the recruiting authorities.

This is regarded as confirming reports of a proposed recruiting campaign by moral pressure. Men of military age have been eliminated from the registration returns and their records entered in special pink forms. These men, according to the Daily Mail, will be visited at their homes by recruiting agents, and will be asked why they have not enlisted.
