



FIFTY-SECOND ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

OF THE

St. George's Society

OF THE

CITY OF TORONTO,

FOR THE YEAR 1886.

---

The termination of the year having brought the labours of the Committee to a conclusion, they now present to the Members this the fifty-second Annual Report which they are enabled to do with much gratification, as the Society still continues to grow in the confidence and support of the English population of the city.

RELIEF.

The relief given during the year has generally been of the same character as that of the previous years, adapted to the needs and requirements of the applicant, after the case has been enquired into, and the statements made as far as practicable verified. This course naturally occupies time and gives trouble.

The immigration of English people has been about as large as previous years; and the proportion of those needing relief has not exceeded the previous years to any great extent. Every practicable

effort has been made to obtain employment for applicants, and with success in many cases. The number of applicants relieved during the year have been 1704, and these consisted of 656 different persons.

Orders have been given for the interment in the Society's plot in St. James's cemetery, of 9 adults and 10 children. The old plot was thus filled, and in accordance with the vote of the Members the adjoining plot was purchased for \$495, \$195 of which have been paid, and the remaining \$300 is to be paid in three yearly instalments of \$100.

#### FINANCIAL.

The Treasurer's Annual Statement, duly audited, will be found herewith.

The financial position of the Society continues to advance. Balance in the Treasurer's hands at the beginning of the year

As directed by vote at the last Annual Meeting the sum of \$500 bequeathed to the Society by the late Mr. J. D. Ridout, has been invested in a Debenture of the Canada Loan and Savings Company at 4½ per cent. interest, and now forms the "Ridout fund". That Company having made a further issue of shares, the Committee deemed it prudent for the Society to take up the allotment of eleven shares to which it was entitled and paid thereon, the call of 10 per cent. with the premium of 5 per cent. in all \$165.

It will be observed that for this purpose resort had to be had to the general funds.

#### MEMBERSHIP.

The number of the Members is still sustained, there having been 9 new Life, and 56 Ordinary Members elected who have accepted their election, but the losses by death, removal, etc., nearly equal the gains.

The numbers stand at the present time as follows viz.:—

Honorary Life Members 10, two having died during the year so far as is known ; Life Members 247, three having died during the year ; and Ordinary Members 383, six having died during the year ; leaving at the present time 640 Members on the roll altogether.

The Honorary Life Members who have died during the year are : The Rev. W. S. DARLING, once a Chaplain of the Society, and a very zealous Minister of the Episcopal Church.

Mr. J. JACQUES, well known as of the firm of Jacques and Hay, Cabinet Makers of this City.

The Life Members who have died are :

Mr. T. BURGESS, for many years one of the leading Clothiers of this City.

The REV. JOHN DOUSE, an aged and very highly respected Wesleyan Methodist Minister.

MR. JAS. METCALFE, a very successful business man, as a contractor and real estate purchaser.

And the Ordinary Members who have died are :

MR. A. BLACHFORD, one of the very oldest Members of the Society, and who was always esteemed for his unassuming amiable deportment.

MR. JAS. BROOM, who was very suddenly taken off at little more than middle-age, amid business cares.

MR. JOS. DAVIDS, who also died very suddenly after an active and useful life, having retired from business.

MR. W. B. ROBINS, an old and highly respected Member of the Society, and living on the fruits of a careful and industrious life.

MR. F. SMITH, also an old Member of the Society, and for some years Steward of the General Hospital.

MR. SAM'L THOMPSON, also one of the earliest Members of the Society, who had served on the Committee, and been a Vice-President, as also a very active man in public life in past years.

ANNIVERSARIES AND ENTERTAINMENTS.

On Sunday April 25th, the usual Anniversary service was held in St. James's Cathedral ; the Rev. R. A. Bilkey preached a most patriotic discourse to a good Congregation of Englishmen, among which our brethren of the Sons of England Benevolent Society figured conspicuously, and the collection taken up was liberal and gratifying.

The second service in the Metropolitan Methodist Church was not held until Sunday the 10th of October, and took the form of a thanksgiving service. The Rev. E. A. Stafford preached a very thoughtful and appropriate sermon, but owing to a great counter-acting influence occurring at the same time, neither the audience nor the collection were very satisfactory.

The musical portion of the services were efficiently rendered by the Choirs of both Churches, under the direction of Dr. Davies, and Mr. F. H. Torrington, the respective Organists.

The Churches, as on previous occasions, were most kindly and freely lent for the occasions, and have been suitably acknowledged by the Society.

#### DINNER.

The usual Annual Celebration was held at the Walker House, and a very excellent Dinner was served, to which about ninety gentlemen sat down, and spent an enjoyable evening.

#### EXCURSION.

The excursion this year was to the Falls of Niagara, on August 5th, about 250 attended, and it proved a very pleasant and agreeable occasion. The net results were \$71.65.

#### CONCERT.

The Pavilion in the Horticultural Gardens was again engaged for a Concert, on the evening of Thanksgiving Day, and with the hope of making a great success the Trebelli Musin Company were engaged, and, although the results did not come up to the expectations formed, the sum of \$71.62 was realized therefrom.

#### CHRISTMAS DISTRIBUTION.

The distribution of Christmas Cheer took place as formerly on December 24th. in a large wareroom in the Globe lane, just off Adelaide Street East. very kindly lent for the occasion. Donations were taken up by the Committee and Stewards. In cash the very handsome sum of \$984.90 was collected, and a variety of other gifts were presented for the occasion.

ST. GEORGE'S UNION.

The St. George's Union Convention was held in London, Ont., on the 24th to the 27th of August, and as an enjoyable re-union, could not have been surpassed, our London brethren having done everything in their power to make it so.

Messrs. J. H. Mason, H. Symons, and J. E. Pell, represented this Society. The principal burdens, under which many of the Societies seemed to have to contend, were, unsuitable Immigrants and Tramps. The next meeting place selected was Philadelphia.

THE TENT.

The Tent has not been used during the year, and it is recommended that it should be sold in the spring.

HER MAJESTY'S JUBILEE.

The Committee and Stewards of the coming year, should, without doubt, take into consideration, and be prepared to report to the Members prior to St. George's Day some scheme either to be adopted in conjunction with other public bodies, or alone for the celebration and commemoration of Her Majesty's Jubilee year.

SOCIAL OBJECTS.

With a view to promote "mutual and friendly intercourse" among the Members it was recommended by a monthly meeting recently held, that matters of interest of a literary or musical character should be introduced at the Society's monthly meetings, and the Committee trusts that the subject will be dealt with at the coming annual meeting.

AMENDMENTS.

Notices of motion have been given for amendments to the By-Laws, by providing for the addition of four new Members to the Managing Committee, and by restoring the By-law limiting the occupation of the President and Vice-Presidents chairs for one year.

## CONCLUSION.

Your Committee cannot close this report without expressing its satisfaction in presenting it to the Members, showing as it does the great usefulness of the Society, and the ability with which it is enabled to meet all demands, and at the same time to add to its investments without requiring more than reasonable exertion and a proper watchfulness over the Society's interests.

The hope is also expressed that the Society may ever increase in its usefulness and that this the Jubilee year of our beloved Queen's Reign may be a remarkable one in the History of Canada and of this Society.
