John Young, the Patron of Letter Thieves, Appointed a Postmaster

—A Minister Forced to Back Down.

OTTAWA, Dec. 26.

The Grit papers announce Hon. John Young's appointment as Postmaster at Montreal. The Grits recognize eternal fitness of things, he being the hero of the Montreal Post office letter steal.
