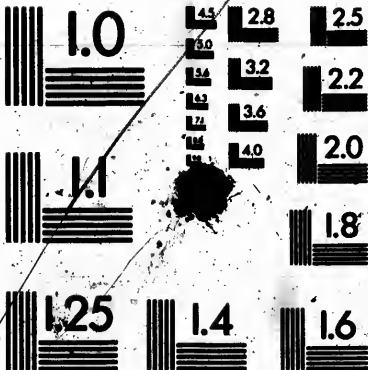

Transient Newspapers, 2 cents each—must be prepaid.

Printed and published in Canada and posted from office of publication, if paid quarterly in advance, Daily 30 cents, Tri-weekly 15 cts., Bi-weekly 10 cts., Weekly 5 cts. per quarter; if un-paid, 1 cent will be charged on delivery.

PERIODICALS.

To any part of Canada, P. Edward Island, Newfoundland, or the United States, 1 cent per 4 oz., prepaid. To United Kingdom, if Canadian publications, per Canadian packet, 2 cents each, prepaid; weighing less than 1 oz., put up singly $\frac{1}{2}$ cent each, prepaid.

BOOKS, CIRCULARS, PAMPHLETS, &c.

To any place in Canada, P. E. Island, Newfoundland, or the U. S., 1 cent per 2 oz., prepaid.

Book-packets to the United Kingdom, 1 oz., 2 cts., 2 oz. 4 cts., 4 ozs. 6 cts., 8 ozs. 12 cts., 12 ozs. 18 cts., 16 ozs. 24 cts., and so on.

PARCEL POST.

Not to exceed 4 lb., to any part of Canada, 8 ozs. 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ cts., 1 lb. 25 cts., and so on, 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ cts. per 8 ozs.

ECLIPSES.—In the year 1875, there will be two Eclipses: both of the Sun.

I. A total Eclipse of the Sun, April 5, 1875, visible in portions of Africa and Asia, and the intermediate Indian Ocean.

II. An Annular Eclipse of the Sun, September 28, 29, 1875, visible in Canada. Begins on the earth generally.

September 29, 10 h., 1 m., a.m., meantime of Greenwich in longitude 61° W., Latitude 38° N., ends on the earth generally, September 29 d., 3 h., 54 m., p.m., in Longitude 30° E., and Latitude 29° S.
