# SECOND REPORT.

OFFICE OF THE BOARD OF REGISTRATION STATISTICS.

25th August, 1854.

GENTLEMEN,—The first Report on the Census of Canada inserted at the commencement of the 1st vol: having had reference chiefly to the increase of the population and to the Agricultural Productions, it may not be uninteresting in a second Report to make such a digest of the particulars of the Personal Census as will enable the Public to arrive at the most interesting facts connected with it, without having the trouble of wading through numberless columns of figures or pages of matter. To enter into the merits of a work like the Census which will probably occupy twelve hundred pages of condensed and analyzed matter, prepared with much thought and labour, would occupy a greater amount of time than most people would be willing or able to bestow, and yet any Census must be of comparatively little value to the community at large unless its results and the most important deductions from it are put in a tangible and readable shape before the Public. Under this feeling, care has been taken to give such general abstracts as will satisfy the casual enquirer without exacting from him any very tedious researches.

The General Abstracts of the Personal Census which will be now noticed are to be found on pages 308 and 492 of the 1st vol: the former referring to the Upper and the latter to the Lower Province. In looking at the general population of the former, it will be found that the number of males exceeds that of the females by 46.130 or nearly 5 per ct., whilst in the latter the males exceed the females by only 9.773 or a little over 1 per ct. The Lower Province is no doubt more influenced by the ordinary laws of population than the Upper Province, which receives a far larger number of Immigrants, and of these probably a great majority are males.

In Great Britain the very opposite is the case, the females exceeding the males in number by  $3\frac{1}{2}$  per ct., or 31 females to every 30 males. In Scotland the disparity is still greater there being 110 females to every 100 males. In Middlesex there are 112 to 100. In Somerset 111. In Gloucester 110. In Surrey and Bedford 109. Cornwall, Devon and Dorset 107. Whilst on the contrary in Monmouth the males predominate, being 109 to 100. Rutland 105. Stafford 104. London has 13 per ct. more females than males. Hampstead 42 per ct. Kensington 40 per ct. St. Georges, Hanover Square, and Hackney both 32 per ct. Bath 50 per ct. Exeter



37. Devonport 26. York 13. Manchester 9. Leeds 6. In the District of the Woolwich Dockyard, the excess of Males is 55 per ct. In Chatham 17 per ct. In Windsor 8, and in Sussex  $2\frac{1}{2}$  per ct.

Again, the youthfulness of the population of Canada bears a striking contrast to that of Great Britain, the number in Upper Canada under one year of age is 37,732 or nearly  $\frac{1}{25}$  of the whole population. Those under 2 years of age, bear very nearly the same proportion. In Lower Canada the number of these ages form a still greater proportion of the population, being each about  $\frac{1}{22}$  of the whole. The Births.

married or of marriageable age, showing that ten children were born in 1851, to every 43 women living in 1852 between those ages. The Census of England according to Cheshire, page 20, shows that 10 children were born in 1850 for every 58 women living in 1851 between 20 and 45. Those are the ages he has taken, and the locality, the five Counties forming the South Eastern division under the English Census.

Another singular difference, corresponding with this statement, is this, that in Great Britain "the average number of children *at home* in families, does not exceed two." [Page 24.] whilst those in Canada average more than three,  $3\frac{18}{100}$ .

Of 42,000 families in Great Britain, having each man and wife at its head, there were 12,000 having no children at home, 8,500 having one, 7,300 had each two, 5,600 had each three, 4,000 had each four, and so on in a decreasing scale, until we come to 14 families having each ten children at home, 5 having eleven, and one having twelve. (See page 24.) In this respect the Census of Canada shows a most extraordinary difference. In 42,000 families there were not half the same amount without children; instead of 12,000 there were only 4,760; instead of 8,500 having only one, there were 7,000. In Canada having two, there were 6,160; having three, 5,600; having four, 6,440; having five, 5,880; having six, 2,520; having eight, 1,680, and so on—numerous families being more predominant in Canada than Great Britain. It is quite easy to account for this, for servants being more difficult to be procured in Canada than in Great Britain, young men are obliged to marry earlier in life, and they are better able to do so; and another way of accounting for it is, that Emigrants, when transplanted, increase faster in this climate than if they

had remained at home, and moreover, Emigrants always number an excess of healthy people at a reproductive age, the old people seldom coming with them, and the average Immigration to British North America has been about 41,200 per annum for the last 10 years, by far the larger number of which have come to the Canadas.

How to account for this great discrepancy between the two Provinces, both in the number of Births and Deaths, is a difficult matter. The Census was taken with care in the Lower Province, perhaps with greater care than that of the Upper Province, and there is no reason to doubt the accuracy of the returns, as the same results pervade all the various ages, except that during the infantile ages up to five years, the mortality in the Lower Province is in a much greater ratio, in fact nearly cent per cent; but it must be remembered that the Births in Lower Canada are one-eighth more numerous than in Upper Canada. The causes of Death will be found duly classified in the Appendix to the 1st vol., p. 556, and so on, and it will appear from it that the Epidemic Diseases, such as Small Pox, Meazles, Scarlet Fever, and other Fevers, Hooping Cough, Croup, and Cholera, &c., are much more fatal in Lower Canada than in Upper Canada,—the Deaths in the latter, under this head, being only 1,783, whilst in the Lower Province they were 3,088. Pleurisy also is more destructive, as is Consumption, though not to a great degree.

An examination of the Census of the United States shows some results very interesting to the Physiologist as regards the variations in the numbers of the Sexes. In 1850 there were in the United States 47,727 more males than females under five years of age; 46,484 more females than males between 15 and 20; 160,425 more males than females between 30 and 40, and at 70 the females are again in the ascendant. It is said that the same results have been developed from former Censuses there, and if so it would almost reveal a fixed law in the numerical relations to the Sexes at particular ages.

In Canada the result is somewhat similar.

Of those under 5 years of age, the males are predominant by 497. Of those between 15 and 20, the females predominate by 3,687. Of those between 20 and 30, the males predominate by 1,052, showing a variation in the same direction, though not to such a degree. It may be right to remark that, taking Upper Canada alone, the variation is very similar to that of the United States, the males there exceeding the

females in number by 10,608, whilst in Lower Canada, at those ages, the females exceed the males by 9,556.

The disparity between the number of Widows and Widowers, is rather an extraordinary item ascertained by the Census. In the Upper Province there are—

The excess of Widows over Widowers being greater in both Provinces, between the ages of 50 and 60 than at any other period of life.

It is supposed by many that the population of the United States is underrated half a million in the Census.

In 60 Years from 1790 to 1850, the most careful investigation gives the aggregate number of Immigrants into the United States at 2,729,359, or an average of 45,988 annually, and the estimated natural increase of those Immigrants is 1,590,405. Of these the Irish are the most numerous; then the Germans; Ireland has in 50 years contributed about a million; Germany nearly half a million; and England and British America, together, not quite the same amount.

The United States Census gives some curious particulars as to the Emigration of their people from one section of the country to another, and they prove beyond a doubt that internal Emigration moves *upon the same parallel of Latitude*, and this

fixed law is found to be almost universal, and it may probably arise from the fact that men naturally seek, as much as possible, to preserve the same climate, habits, and social institutions, to which they have been accustomed. The actual numbers borrowed, as it were, from the Eastern States, and in turn lent to those more Western, are given with great accuracy. Our Census returns do not, unfortunately, enable us to enter into the same subject of enquiry.

In 60 years the law of decennial increase in the States has been almost uniformly 34 per cent., being, however, at one period, only 32½, and at two other 36 per cent. The Slaves, increased 38 per cent., and the free Blacks only 10 per cent., over a period of 10 years.

Total Indians in Canada returned in the Census, 8,728. This is probably little more than half the number. Smith, in his valuable work on Canada, gives upwards of 14,000, who received presents in 1842. A large portion of them on Lake Huron and in the Lower Province, reside beyond the limits of the Census enumeration.

The number of Coloured Persons in Canada East is only 743, residing nearly all in Bonaventure and Yamaska. Those in Canada West number 4,669, of whom there are in Essex, 1,871; in Toronto, 526; in Haldimand, 321; in York, 287; in Welland, 273; in Brant, 220; in Kent, 181; in Oxford, 123; in Wentworth, 141; in London, 115; in Kingston, 104; in Hamilton, 98. Eighteen Counties having no coloured persons, Glengarry having only two, and Bruce only one.

**RETURNS OF THE DEAF AND DUMB.**

One of the most useful of the Statistical Details connected with the Census, is that which points out the number of unfortunate persons who come under the above designation.

The table below gives the particulars of the numbers in each County, as well as the aggregate, so that those who wish to make their condition and improvement a special study, have a reliable report of the number and locality of the sufferers; and perhaps there is nothing which calls so loudly for legislative interference as some provision for the education and comfort of these unfortunate individuals, the supply of whose wants should be made a particular study by others, since it has pleased Providence to deprive them of the power to make known their own, and their parents and guardians have neither the kind of knowledge nor the other requisites necessary for furnishing them with that instruction, which a very large proportion of them are capable of receiving and appreciating. A more particular return of the residence and condition of these Mutes individually could be obtained and compiled in this

Office, if thought necessary, but before any initiatory public measures are taken for their amelioration, such a return would perhaps be premature.

“The Directors of several Institutions for the Deaf and Dumb (says Mr. Kennedy) memorialized Congress, at its last Session, to provide for the publication of a small vol., to be prepared by the Census Office, in which should be given the name, sex, age, residence, occupation, &c., of each deaf-mute in the United States. Such a work would be of great value to such Institutions, but of more consequence to the unfortunate class it would be especially designed to benefit. It would lead to the discovery of hundreds whose abode is unknown, and render the blessings of instruction available to those unable to proclaim their own wants.

“The method of deaf-mute instruction was introduced from Europe thirty-five years ago. To study the improvements effected—Institutions in this Country have at different times sent Commissioners into different portions of Europe, and the result of their investigations appear to have led to the conclusion, that, in the matter of actual instruction, we have very little to learn from European schools, while in the very important one of *religious* instruction they are *painfully* inferior.”

or one in every 1991 of the whole population. The total of all mutes in Canada is 1343 or 1 in 1372 of the population.

The Census of the United States returns the total number of Deaf and Dumb at 9,723, and total population 23,198,000, or one in every 2,395 of the population. In the *white* population the number is one to 2,151—in the *free colored* population, one to every 3,032, and in the slave population one to every 6,552. It is an interesting subject of enquiry why deaf-mutes are so much more numerous in Canada than in the United States, and certainly the largeness of the number would appear to call for Legislative provision for their instruction and fostering care. They are more numerous than in most other countries. According to the most authentic and recently published Tables, it is found that in all Europe the proportion of Deaf-mutes to the population is one to 1,593. In Ireland the proportion is one to 1,573. The Duchies of Luxembourg and Wurtemberg and Tuscany, and the Kingdoms of Bavaria, Belgium, and Holland, average one in 2,209, whilst those of Sardinia,

Norway, and part of Switzerland, average one in 642. In some of the Swiss Cantons the proportion of the Deaf and Dumb to the population is one in 206; but here it is generally combined with Idiocy. In other countries, as well as Switzerland, different portions of the same Country show varying proportions of Deaf and Dumb.

In Ireland, for instance, an Island limited in extent, and presenting much sameness of surface, we find the following varieties in the Provinces: In Leinster, one deaf and dumb to every 1474. In Connaught, one to 1499. In Ulster, one to 1318, and again in the Counties, the Flat Counties, such as Roscommon, Westmeath, Dublin and Kildare, average one in 1935, whilst the more mountainous, such as Mayo, Donegal, Tipperary, Tyrone, and Fermanagh, average one in 1068, and in the Counties of Wicklow the proportion is as high as one in 1031.

Of Deaf and Dumb, the proportion of Males to Females in Canada is as 100 Males to 68 Females, whilst in Ireland it is 100 Males to 76 Females, and that appears to be the general proportion elsewhere.

In a very interesting Report of the Registrar General of Ireland, recently published, he gives a Table showing a great variety of Arts, Trades, and Handicrafts upon which the Deaf and Dumb are capable of being employed, the chief of which are Shoemakers and Binders, Weavers, Tailors, Carpenters, Blacksmiths, Masons, and other occupations, such as Sailors, Fishermen, and Gardeners, and among the special Female occupations are Milliners, Seamstresses, Spinners and Lace workers. Several of these Trades and occupations were adopted by the Mutes from choice, but a large proportion were either taught at the Educational establishments or acquired from parents or other near relations. A great number of the Deaf and Dumb in Ireland are found amongst the agricultural and labouring classes.

Three special causes (says Dr. Wm. Wilde, Assistant Commissioner for taking the Census of Ireland) seem to influence the production and propagation of Muteism. Fright, experienced by the mother while pregnant—too close Consanguinity, or the intermarriage of near relatives—and Family or Hereditary taint.

The second named of these causes has long been considered paramount among the predisposing causes of hereditary disease, and upon enquiry how far too close consanguinity had the effect of producing deaf-dumbness, 170 instances are recorded in which the parents were related as first, second, or third Cousins. The result of these intermarriages was 109 cases, in which 94 were born deaf and dumb and idiotic, and 5 acquired—17 instances occurred in which 3 of the same family, and 3 cases in which 4 of the same family were deaf and dumb, and one where there were 7—one where there were 8—and all in families where the Parents had been nearly related to each other.

In showing the result of hereditary predisposition, he enumerates 471 persons born in Families some of the previous members of branches of which had been mute, of whom 249 persons were deaf and dumb where the disease appeared to come by the father's side, and 222 where the disease was transmitted through the female line—but it is remarkable, says the same Author, that while Muteism is

often manifest in several members of a Family derived from a common stock, the effect is seldom transmitted *direct* from parents to children : thus, according to the returns of the Hartford Institution, United States, we learn that in 91 instances where both Parents were deaf and dumb, in only four cases were the children affected.

In the Census of Ireland, or rather in the Registrar's Report on the status of disease in Ireland, is given a valuable Table, showing by Sexes the causes of *acquired* Deaf-dumbness, and the ages at which the diseases producing such occurred.

In the 1st Section he gives 91 cases, 65 of which were produced by Small Pox, Measles, Scarlatina, and Influenza ; Scarlatina also being one of the most frequent causes of Deafness, there being 37 of these cases caused by it alone.

In the 2nd Section he gives 284 cases acting through the Nervous System, the most numerous of which are Fever, 74 ; Paralysis, 53 ; Fright, 43 ; Convulsions, 27 ; Epilepsy, 13, &c., (see page 20.) How far these causes operate in producing Muteism in Canada would be a very interesting enquiry, upon which unfortunately our Census gives us no information. This Table (p. 21) further shows that the chances of acquiring dumbness lessen as life advances—out of 535 cases there given, 121 occurred between the 2nd and 3rd year ; 107 between the 3rd and 4th ; 81 during the 4th year ; 191 between 4 and 11, and the remainder after that period. These 535 were all the cases of *acquired* dumbness in the 5160 that were returned in all Ireland.

And again, says Dr. Wilde, in 362 cases out of the entire 535, the deaf-dumbness occurred during the first five years of life, and the liability to acquire deaf-dumbness decreases with great regularity from the 3rd to the 10th year.

To say that very many of the Deaf and Dumb are capable of education would be a Truism. There are very many establishments for that purpose in Europe and the United States, and Canada is certainly called upon to found similar Institutions. In Ireland, at the last Census, there were 790 Mutes, 441 Males and 349 Females, all of whom were either already educated or were receiving instruction in some of the establishments for the purpose.

“Notwithstanding,” says Dr. Wilde, “that Deaf Mutes existed from the earliest times, no effort was made to afford them instruction until comparatively recent periods. In ages wont to be called enlightened, and among nations styled civilized, and even refined, as the Egyptians, Hebrews, Greeks and Romans, the deaf-mute was regarded as little removed from the brute, and often employed for the basest and most degrading offices, such as humanity revolts at. It was believed that they were not capable of instruction of any kind, and their very passions, unrestrained by any influence human or divine, were frequently made to minister to the cruelty or sensuality of those around them.” Deaf-mutes even laboured under legal disabilities with respect to property and evidence, which have only been removed since their susceptibility to education has been established.



The first systematic attempt to instruct them was made by Petro de Ponce, a Benedictine Monk, at Sahagun, about the middle of the 16th Century, during that bright period when the Literature of Spain was graced and extended by men of the highest genius.

It is related by the Historian of that celebrated Ecclesiastic, "That he taught the two mute sons of a Castilian Nobleman, and a young Arragonese, to read, and also to write with elegance not only the language of their own Country, but like wise in the Latin-tongue," and it is moreover stated that these persons could understand by sight the motions and expressions of the lips, and also spoke as those do who have been taught at a modern Deaf and Dumb Asylum.

Dr. Ponce died in 1584, but his system was carried out by John Paul Bonet, who published, in 1620, at Madrid, a work upon the teaching of the Deaf and Dumb. In Spain there are now said to be 12,000 Mutes.—One in every 1500 of the population—but their instruction was entirely neglected till 1805, when a National School was established at Madrid.

In America the first Institution for the instruction of Deaf Mutes was opened at Hartford in 1817—since then no fewer than twelve other large establishments for a similar purpose have been erected in that Country, and in all these, like most of those on the Continent of Europe, the expenses are defrayed by the State. The Directors of the New York Institution sent the Rev. Geo. Day in 1844, and in 1851 the President of the Institution, Dr. Peet, to examine the different Schools in Central and Western Europe, and Dr. Peet's valuable Report presented to the Legislature of the State of New York would, no doubt, be of great assistance in the establishment of similar Institutions in Canada.

At present the method of instruction of these unfortunates is being much improved. A method is being adopted by a Mr. Boyd, and a Committee of Gentlemen interested in the welfare of the Deaf and Dumb, to procure a Dictionary of universal signs, and premiums have been offered for the best Essays on such a work.

### RETURNS OF THE BLIND.

The enquiry into the circumstances of the Blind appropriately follows that into the state of the Deaf and Dumb, and until very lately there have been no Statistics of Blindness in Canada, and what is more extraordinary, not even in Great Britain.

The few particulars given in this Census will, however, open a field for investigation which may hereafter prove serviceable both to science and to the number of persons so afflicted. Institutions for the instruction of the Blind may not be so necessary as those for the Deaf and Dumb, but when it is remembered how heavy a tax it is upon the time and labour of each Family having a Blind person resident, and that so much of it might be saved to the Public by concentration, and that, moreover, the time and labour bestowed *at home* is profitless and unremunerative; and in well conducted Institutions might be made self-supporting, or nearly so, and valuable both to the afflicted and the public at large, it is not too much to hope that Canada will ere long, as a Community, direct their attention to the establishing of Institutions for the instruction and support of this class of sufferers.

No one Township in either Province contains more than Six Blind persons ; the proportion of Blind to the whole population in Canada West is smaller than in any other Country. In Belgium, Hanover, portions of Saxony Prussia, Lombardy, and Denmark, the average of Blind is one to every 950. In Ireland one to every 864 In Wurtemberg, Nassau and Hesse one in every 1340, and in Alpine Regions, and in some of the Swiss Cantons, and in Sardinia one in every 1500. In all other Countries the number of Blind Females exceeds the number of Males but in Canada the Males are the most numerous.

One very sufficient reason why the Blind bear so small a proportion to the population in Canada West is that Immigrants leave their Blind behind them either in Asylums or with Friends, and a very large proportion of our population consists of Immigrants, though strange to say Dr. Harvey Peet of the United States, in an analysis with respect to native and foreign population presents it as a “fact, that the Blind and Insane are much more numerous among our Foreign population of the States” which he attributes to “home sickness, change of climate, and the various hardships of an Emigrant’s lot, which have a strong influence in producing insanity and perhaps blindness.”

The Comparative freedom from these two Maladies which Canada West exhibits is presumptive evidence that Dr. Peet is not correct in the view which he has taken. The number of Blind persons in the United States is 9,702 of whom 8000 are white and 1700 coloured, of which latter 1211 are slaves. Mr. Kennedy the United States Census Superintendent has given a Table showing the numbers and proportions of Deaf and Dumb, Blind, Insane and Idiotic, among the white, free, coloured, and

slaves, from which it appears that muteness and insanity are more prevalent among the white, and blindness and Idiocy among the coloured. In the white population of the United States there is one blind person for each 2445. Among the free coloured, one to each 870, among the slaves one to each 2645 and among the whole population one to every 2390.

Almost all the Institutions for the support or education of the Blind in the Old Country are maintained by Public Charity or private donations or bequests and but few receive Government aid. There is one great difference between the Blind of Canada and of the Old Country, and that is the latter are generally of a less indigent class, and this may be said of the Deaf and Dumb as well as the Blind; but this is no argument against the propriety of Government establishing Institutions for their welfare. If it be the duty of Government to provide for the Education of her youth having sound mind and full powers, it is much more her duty to provide for the education of those having defective powers, and if well organized, such institutions may be made almost if not altogether self-supporting.

In the Richmond National Institution in the City of Dublin, Basket-making and other Wicker-Work is carried on to great advantage. Here each pupil pays a small sum upon admission, and in the Molyraux Asylum, many females are personally supported and taught Music reading upon the raised letter, and various industrial pursuits.

Notwithstanding the existence of these and numerous other Institutions, Dr. Wilde, the Assistant Commissioner, reports that great necessity exists for the establishment of some general Institutions for the pauper-blind, irrespective of those comparatively private ones at present in operation. Dr. Lettsom, the benevolent advocate of the blind, has wisely said that "He who enables a blind person without any excess of labour, to earn his own livelihood, does him more real service than if he had pensioned him for life."

It is to be regretted that there is no information in the Census of Canada by which it can be ascertained how many of these 870 in Canada were born blind, or how many became blind from disease or old age. It is very probable that not more than two-thirds of the whole, if so many, were born blind.

Dr. Wilde gives a very curious table of the diseases of the eye producing blindness, and in 7,354 cases, he shows that in 3,970 the eyes affected were of a grey colour; in 1,345 they were blue; in 1,319 they were brown, and in only 720 they were hazel. These disproportions, however, he adds, have not been produced so much by the peculiar colour of the eye, pre-disposing to disease as to the circumstance of the majority of the inhabitants possessing light coloured eyes.

### RETURNS OF LUNATICS AND IDIOTS.

Unfortunately in the Census Rolls for 1851, for Canada, the same error has occurred as in that of the United States for 1840, viz: the giving only one heading whereby to designate Lunatics and Idiots, and thus it is out of the power of the

enumerator or parent to contra-distinguish between the two. By the United States Census of 1850 it is found that the number of both is about equal, and this may be taken as a fair criterion for Canada.

Or one in every 736. With this coincidence, that so far as Insanity alone is concerned, among the white population, there is one to every 1,290. Among the free-coloured one to each 1,338, and among the Slaves only one to 11,010, whilst with regard to Idiocy alone, the white population presents one to each 985, and among the Slaves, only one to each 3,080.

Taking for granted that one half of those denominated Lunatics in the Census of Canada are Idiots, the proportion to the rest of the population would be very similar to that in the United States, viz: one to every 1314. It is the opinion of many that fully two-thirds of those in Canada denominated Lunatics are Idiots. There are no data in the Census however, whereby to arrive at the facts.

According to the Census of Ireland, there is one Lunatic in every 1291 inhabitants and one Idiot in every 1336. But including both Lunatics and Idiots the different Provinces show there, as in Canada, great discrepancies as to numbers. The total of Leinster gives one in 484, Munster one in 729, Ulster one in 679 and Connaught one in 1022—the average of all Ireland, including both Lunatics and Idiots is one in 657, exactly the same average as in all Canada.

The following tables show the numbers in each County and Township. In the former all numbering 10 and above and in the latter all numbering 8 and above are given.

There are 144 Townships and Towns in the Upper Province and 185 Townships, Parishes and Villages in the Lower Province that return no Lunatics or Idiots. The sub-divisions being 432 in the Upper and 504 in the Lower Province. In the latter, Parishes are the older settlements and the first set apart for Ecclesiastical purposes. Villages form separate Municipalities distinct from those of the Parishes. Townships are settlements formed subsequent to the formation of the Parishes.

It is perhaps worth observing that a very large proportion of these Lunatics and Idiots are under age. The adult Lunatics being generally sent to the Asylums. The two Asylums of Quebec and Toronto return only 13 of their patients out of 517, as being under age, viz: 3 aged 19, 3 aged 18, 2 aged 17, and one of each at the respective ages of 15, 14, 12, 9 and 8.

There is no information given in the Census, by which to form an idea of the causes of Lunacy, except the return of the Lunatic Asylum, page 578 of the First volume, and as there were only 25 Idiots returned in the two Institutions, ten in Toronto and fifteen in Quebec, and in these cases, the causes of the disease are not given—neither can any information with regard to the causes of *Idiocy* be arrived at, nor does it appear that any particular class of persons or those of any particular calling or employment are specially affected either in themselves or families.

In other countries “the preponderance of mental disease among the professional and upper classes, shows how much more education and habits of thought tend to produce aberration of intellect than ordinary manual labour;” but there is no information conveyed by the Census of Canada, on which to base such a conclusion.

In the Census of Ireland the Lunatics are divided into ten classes, and returns given of 2,164 cases where the cause of disease had been investigated, chiefly upon medical authority, or by the Governors of the Asylums. They are divided into moral and physical causes; Grief predominates, giving a complexion to about one-third of the whole cases. Jealousy, Terror, and Religious excitement are also particularly mentioned, and among the physical causes are, malformation of the head resulting chiefly in Idiocy, Intemperance, Consanguinity of parents, Epilepsy and Fever, Disease of the Brain, Sun-strokes. A special correspondence with medical men and other reliable authorities was carried on for years to arrive at the knowledge thus acquired on these subjects, a course that would probably be premature in the present infant state of this Colony.

The Consanguinity of Parents is now admitted to be, by the highest medical authorities, one of the most fruitful causes of this disease. It is an understood fact that families who intermarry too often *die out*, but the misery that precedes this dying out has been too little regarded, especially when the evil arises from a disregard of natural laws, which we are bound to obey; and when these calamities which afflict families are ascribed to Providence, it might be well to enquire whether Providence has not given us abundant warning to avoid them.

In a recent report on Idiocy in Massachusetts, in which the tables of health and disease are given with great care and particularity the state of seventeen families where the father and mother were related by blood, is thus described:

“ Some of the Parents were unhealthy, and some were intemperate ; but to set against this disadvantage to begin with, there is the fact that the evil consequences of such intermarriage does not always appear until the second generation or even later. However, in these households there were 95 children. What were these children like? Imagine, a school of 95 children of all ages, or the children of a Hamlet at play, and think what the little crowd would look like ; and then read this ! Of these 95 children *one* was a Dwarf, *one* was Deaf and Dumb, *twelve* were Scrofulous, and *forty-four* were Idiots.”

This affliction is perhaps the more trying as leading to so many years of uncertainty for the Parents. How many children are really stupid in early life, who show a more than ordinary amount of intellect when more advanced. A mother will admit her child to be *deficient*, but hopes on, and even Idiots sometimes display gleams of sense, and very often, in some single particular, an extraordinary degree of shrewdness. Buoyed up by this delusive feeling, and deceived by these “ *ignes fatui*,” the parents of such children, who undergo the trials of suspense and uncertainty, are literally subject to a double misery.

The particulars given in the two foregoing tables will no doubt lead to many enquiries, by parties locally interested, and by drawing attention to the extent of the malady, will be likely to result in remedial measures.

It has been thought right to give the names and residence of those, 100 years of age and over, in order to prove the authenticity of the return or otherwise, persons residing in the neighbourhood would most probably be able to judge of their correctness from personal knowledge, and there are so many returned at very advanced ages that doubts might be entertained of their existence unless the names and residences were given.

The Longevity of Canada West when compared with that of other Countries, speaks Volumes for its general healthfulness, and it is most interesting to compare the rates of death to the number of living in Canada and the United States, the number of deaths in the latter exceeding that of Upper Canada in proportion to the population by about 36 per ct. and of Lower Canada by 25 per ct. The ratio given by Mr. Kennedy in his report on the United States Census is inserted with that of the two provinces for the sake of comparison, the average ratio in the United States having *one to seventy four*—in Upper Canada *one to one hundred and two*; and in Lower Canada *one to Ninety-four* of the number living. The greatest mortality in the United States is in Louisiana, 1 in 43; and the greatest in Canada is in Leinster, 1 in 60; exclusive of the Cities where deaths are always more numerous in proportion to population.

## DEATHS AND CAUSES OF DEATHS.

In the arrangement of the Census of Ireland, it has been the custom to employ the services of some eminent Medical Practitioner, to report upon the deaths and causes of deaths, and the analysis of such a person would of course be much more comprehensive, much more correct, and much more scientific than one proceeding from any other person. It appears very desirable that the Statistical returns of the various causes which affect the health of the community should be ascertained with the greatest possible degree of accuracy, but a great difficulty will, it is to be feared, always exist, from the inability of so large a portion of the inhabitants of a Country to specify the exact disease of which their relatives or friends had died, especially when such diseases were not generally known to the people, or had occurred at a remote period of the time when the returns were demanded. Another difficulty

exists from the fact that so many diseases are called by different names in different localities, amongst the uneducated classes, and thus it becomes necessary in arranging the Tables to compress the materials supplied by the Enumerators, in order to place in the clearest light, and display in the most concise and succinct manner the information to be given to the public. In looking at the returns of the causes of Death, it has been thought advisable to abstain from drawing conclusions from premises which might possibly be false, and only to venture on calculations for the purpose of *local comparisons* as with the Tables of Mortality, and these will be so far valuable as exhibiting the relative healthiness or unhealthiness of particular places. Independently of this, however, the returns of this portion of the Census will, no doubt, present many features of interest to the Statistician. In taking the next Census it will be easy to furnish much valuable information which in the present case the Returns of the Enumerators do not afford. The healthiness or unhealthiness of particular classes, and of particular trades and occupations, would have been a valuable addition to the matter which we now possess.

It would appear from the foregoing Abstracts that the number of Deaths from Epidemic Diseases far exceeds that from any other cause, being, in each Province about  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the whole. Upper Canada returning 1782, and Lower Canada, 3088.

From

### SMALL POX

the Deaths in Upper Canada are 38, and in Lower Canada, 147. As in England and Ireland, this disease is fortunately on the decline. In 1841, the mortality appeared to have been  $\frac{1}{2}$  that of Fever, but each succeeding year has given satisfactory evidence of the blessings of Vaccination.

From

### MEAZLES

the deaths, especially in Lower Canada, appear to be considerable, although an affection whose symptoms are tolerably well known by the people; but it is highly probable that several of the minor eruptions, which sometimes prove fatal to the young, may have been included under this head.

### SCARLET-FEVER.

The ravages of this disease, the most fatal of the Epidemics, seems to have been very great in Lower Canada, which returns 1502 deaths—Upper Canada 414. The County of Dorchester alone returns 136 deaths, and from *all Fevers* no less than 329 deaths. The County of Megantic from *all Fevers* returns 78 deaths; and from *all Fevers* the City of Quebec returns 170 Deaths—Montreal 116—Toronto 23—Kingston none—Hamilton 4—Bytown 13, and London 1. The cases of Scarlatina have in these Tables been included under this head as the two terms are generally used to denote the degree of intensity of the malady, or according to the predominance of Eruption or sore throats.

### HOOPING COUGH.

From this affection, generally considered the fifth most fatal Epidemic, the number of deaths in the Two Provinces is nearly equal, but from

### CROUP,

which is generally considered the fourth most fatal disease, Lower Canada returns 365 deaths, and Upper Canada, 204. Of the first we notice that, as in other Countries, the returns present a great uniformity, and more equal distribution than any other Epidemic. Croup has been generally found to prevail more in Rural than in Civic Districts, but our own returns do not convey this result.

### DIARRHŒA AND DYSENTERY.

These Diseases are frequently, and have been in the English and Irish Census, classed together, but as they possess some very distinguishing features, it has been thought better to give them as returned by the Enumerators.

Of deaths from these, Upper Canada returns by far the largest.

#### THRUSH.

Of this Disease there is but little to remark beyond the fact that of 63 cases in Upper Canada, Northumberland should return 32. It is probable that under this head are embraced many of the Versicular eruptions of childhood, such as Infantile Erysipelas, Chicken Pox, and others. The whole of Lower Canada returns but 3 cases.

#### AGUE.

This Disease would appear to be, if not of rare occurrence, at least of a very mild nature in Lower Canada, which returns only one death from its effects. Upper Canada returns 36 cases.

#### INFLUENZA.

This Disease which is often very fatal, and especially so as laying the foundation for others, does not appear to have been severe in either Province, although Upper Canada returns 46 deaths to the 28 of Lower Canada.

#### HYDROCEPHALUS.

The contrast in the return of the two Provinces is very striking in this disease. Lower Canada returns only 1 death, and Upper Canada 124. Under this head are probably included all cases caused by inflammation or other acute chronic diseases of the brain and membranes, besides pure Hydrocephalus as understood by this term, and it has been remarked by Medical authorities, that many cases of water on the brain, during the early periods of life, are mistaken for worms, Scarlet Fever, teething, and Convulsions, under which latter head they remark that many cases of Hydrocephalus are returned.

There is no striking difference in the Returns of the Several Counties in Upper Canada, but as might be naturally expected, the City of Toronto returns the greatest number of Deaths, in proportion to the population—of Lower Canada the same remark may be made, the mortality being greater in the Cities of Montreal, and Quebec.

It is the only one of this class of diseases, where the Females have been generally found to preponderate, and were our own returns perfect, this result would probably appear in Canada. Decline is given under a separate heading, as being in some features very different, though with atrophy often classed under the same head.

#### PROFESSIONS, TRADES AND OCCUPATIONS.

A glance at these Returns seems at once to lead us to the "curiosities" of the Census. The Superintendent of the United States has candidly admitted how little reliance can be placed on their Schedules, and they certainly present even greater inconsistencies than our own; and yet, it is difficult to imagine how an Enumerator, having correctly taken the Age, Origin, and Religion of an individual, could have failed in this. Some Counties seem to possess a superfluity of Trades, whereby to supply the wants of the people, and of the same, others would appear to be wholly destitute. The only solution of the difficulty is perhaps to be found in the simple fact that occupations are called by different names in different places.

Though some hesitation existed as to the publication of this branch of the Census, it has been given to the public. It contains at least as few absurdities as that of England, Ireland, and the States, and it has not been deemed advisable to withhold even the inconsistencies, or may be, inaccuracies of so important a work. They will, at least, serve to point out where improvements may be made in the Schedules given to the Enumerators, and suggest their appointment from a better educated class of individuals.

The Report of the Registrar General of England, which deals with the "occupation" of the people, is preceded by a short summary of the results of the five previous enumerations, which have been taken at decennial periods, during the present century. In 1801, three classes only were distinguished, viz: persons engaged in agriculture—persons employed in trade, manufacture, or handicraft—all others not included in these classes, but having some employment—and persons having no occupation.—The return was found very defective.

This arrangement has been changed at the taking of each succeeding Census, and now, after every possible care to adopt a perfect system, it is not found to be wholly satisfactory. The last Census would show that the number of Domestic Servants was less in 1851 than in 1841; an utter impossibility looking at the enormous increase in population and wealth.

In England, as well as in Canada, the first place in point of importance must be conceded to those dependent upon agriculture. The Cotton, Woollen, Cloth, Worsted, Silk, Linen, Iron, and Coal Trades, only give employment to 1,225,817 persons in the whole—a number considerably less than that of Agricultural *Labourers* alone, whilst the whole Agricultural population amounts to 2,295,727.

The United States Census returns 722 Actors and Actresses, and of these the State of New York returns one-third. Connecticut returns one solitary individual. The state of the Drama would not appear to be very flourishing in Canada, for the only members of the profession (viz, 7,) are returned by the County of Elgin, and the wonder is how they ever got there. Some of the States return 40 or 50 Architects, others, none. The whole of Upper Canada possesses only 15 who aspire to the title. Toronto has 10 Artists; London, not one. There are 7 Axe-makers in Toronto, and Kingston, Hamilton, Bytown and London, appear to be without, and make no return under the head of Edge-tool or other manufacturers, which can explain the deficiency. In the whole of Upper Canada we have 5 Brush-makers, and Toronto monopolises them.

It is difficult to understand the apparently unequal distribution of the Trades, or in some cases, even their nomenclature, but there is no reason to doubt that all the more important Trades are accurately returned. The table might have been diminished by combining Trades, which are generally carried on together; but if a man declares to an Enumerator that he makes but one thing, it appears absurd to make him *volens volens*, manufacture another.

In analysing the Professions, Trades, and Occupations, it would appear that the adult male population of Canada West pursuing Trades and Professions,—

Of these there are 86,224 Farmers, being only three-eighths of the whole. By this it appears that Canada West is far from what is generally denominated a "Solely Agricultural Country," and it appears a singular feature in the population of Canada West, that the Labourers, including male servants of every description, and those on public works, are not so numerous as the Farmers, being only 81,764.

The trades and occupations occupying the greatest numbers, are, Carpenters and Joiners, 8,122—about  $\frac{1}{28}$  of the whole; Blacksmiths, 4,235,  $\frac{1}{54}$ ; Tailors, 2,662; Merchants and Shopkeepers, 2,794; Clerks, 3,100; Coopers, 1,935; Millers, 1,083; Weavers, 1,738; Inn keepers, 2,026; Waggon and Carriage Makers, 1,409; Cabinet Makers, 1,030; Masons and Bricklayers, 1,718. Among the Professions we find, of Clergymen, 963; Medical Men, 382; Lawyers and Notaries, 321; Engineers, 373; and of Teachers there are 2,120.

In Canada East, the adult male population following Trades and Professions, are..... 185,462  
 Persons living on private means..... 3,870

Of these there are 78,264 Farmers, or more than three-sevenths of the whole, and here, as in Canada West, Labourers of all kinds, including male servants, are less numerous than Farmers, being only 63,924; Carpenters and Joiners are 6,580, or as in Canada West, about  $\frac{1}{28}$  of the whole; Shoemakers, 3,069; Blacksmiths, 2,840; Tailors, only 671; Merchants and Storekeepers, 2,785; Clerks, 2,222; Coopers, 473; Millers, 667. Of Weavers there are only 166 returned, the Habitans for the most part weaving everything for their own use, and furnishing much for the market. Of Inn-keepers and Tavern Keepers 443 only are returned, and no doubt, correctly. Of Cabinet Makers, 311; Masons and Bricklayers, 1,022. Among the Professions there are, of Clergymen, 620; Medical Men, 410; Lawyers and Notaries, 511; Engineers, 225; and of Teachers there are 1,136.

To account for the number of Farmers in Canada West being returned as 86,224, whilst the occupiers of land were returned in the General Abstract of Agricultural Produce, as 99,906, it will be perceived that 12,417 were returned as occupiers of less than 10 acres, and were most of them probably persons following other avocations than farming, and returned accordingly. This will also account for the discrepancy in the Lower Province, though the Farmers, with small holdings are more numerous there.

## RETURN OF RELIGIOUS DENOMINATIONS.

Although the 1st Vol. of the Census contains only the numbers of the various Religious denominations without giving those of the places of worship which will appear in the second Volume it appears right that the present Report should to some extent notice a subject so important as the progress of the different Religious persuasions amongst us. It is perhaps the most difficult of the several portions of the Census on which to comment, for our tide of Immigration has in a few years produced results in this Country which, in others, have been the silent change of a century. The ordinary laws of increase are, however, hardly applicable to a young Colony, which in the summer of each year is thronged by settlers of almost every Land, and every creed, but still to some extent the increase in the several Denominations in the Old Country is (setting aside any Foreign cause) fully borne out in Canada.

From the Reformation grew up 7 or 8 Religious denominations of Christians, and there are now in England and Wales 36 sufficiently consolidated to be classed as Sects, 27 native or indigenous, and 9 foreign, besides a number of isolated congregations not sufficiently organized to be called Sects. From the Report of Mr. Horace Mann, on the Religious Census of England, the following Table is extracted.

In both Countries the returns were voluntary, and though conveying much valuable information, are no doubt incomplete, especially with regard to the places of worship, which would in Canada be greatly increased were all the School Houses used on Sunday for Divine Worship in many of the sparsely settled Districts included.

It is impossible to give any idea of the accommodation afforded by the Churches and Chapels, as the Returns in this particular are very imperfect.

There are some curious details in Mr. Mann's Report on the Census of Great Britain, as to the distribution of the various Religious Creeds. The Wesleyans are found most numerous in Cornwall, Yorkshire, Lincolnshire, Derbyshire, Durham, and Nottinghamshire—least so in Middlesex, Surrey, Sussex, Essex, Warwickshire, and Hertfordshire.

The Independents flourish most in South Wales, North Wales, Essex, Dorsetshire, Monmouthshire, and Suffolk,—least in Northumberland, Durham, Hertfordshire, and Worcestershire. The Baptists are strongest in Monmouthshire, South Wales, and Huntingdonshire—weakest in Cumberland, Northumberland, Westmoreland, Cornwall, Staffordshire and Lancashire.

At the beginning of the Century, the number of Roman Catholic Chapels was somewhat more than 200; in 1824, 346 were enumerated—and in 1853, 616—thus increasing threefold, while the Churches of the Church of England have augmented in the proportion of 9 to 14.

Mr. Mann calculates that 58 per cent of the population, or 10,212,563 could attend Religious Worship on the Sabbath—but he estimates that, allowing for persons attending more than once, the number attending Worship on the Census Sunday was only 7,261,032, and thus 2,951,331 persons were absent who might have been there.

After giving the extent of Church and Chapel accommodation, and giving the the attendance at Public Worship on the Sunday when the Census was taken, Mr. Mann proceeds to distinguish the numbers attending each particular place of Worship, and this shows 311,064 more attendances in all other places of Worship than in the Church of England. Each other Persuasion, on the average, bestows  $2\frac{3}{4}$  hours, each Churchman  $2\frac{1}{2}$  hours on his Public Religious duties—of all the other Denominations the Wesleyan Reformers make the most use of their Chapels—the Friends the least—the attendance of the former, in proportion to their sittings have been 45 per cent—of the Friends only 8. It is mentioned, as illustrative of the habits of the different religious denominations, that the members of the Church of England prefer the Morning Service, and the other Persuasions, generally, the Evening Service—of every 100 sittings, 48 are occupied in the morning by Churchmen—36 in the afternoon—and only 16 in the evening; while of every 100 sittings amongst Protestant Dissenters, 40 are occupied in the morning, 36 in the afternoon, and 45 in the evening. It is however observed that Sunday Schools are held in the Dissenters Chapels in the afternoon, which may account for their absence at that time and attendance in the evening.

Of the population of Lower Canada, 890,261, there are 746,866 belonging to the Church of Rome. The Church of England numbers 45,402. All Methodists 21,183. All Presbyterians 33,535. There are 10,475 returned under the head of Protestants, 4,493 of Baptists, 3,927 of Congregationalists, 3,450 of Universalists.

The enormous preponderance of the Church of Rome renders any table unnecessary. Of other creeds, the Church of England are the most numerous in the Townships, and in Quebec and in Montreal, the Presbyterians in Beauharnois and two Mountains, the Methodists in Sherbrooke.

---

In conclusion, I would remark that the whole of the tables are now ready for the Printer, and no time will be lost in completing the work.

Notwithstanding any omissions or inaccuracies it probably presents as near an approximation to the truth as other works of a similar nature and it must not be forgotten that this was the first attempt to take a complete Census of the Province.

It may be a matter of regret that its publication should not have taken place earlier, but there have been many difficulties to encounter, which, if not altogether avoided, may be materially lessened on a future occasion; at the same time, it must be remarked that the Census of Great Britain and the United States, with all their advantages of precedent and a practised staff, have only just been completed, the former having been taken as our own, in 1852, and the latter one year earlier.

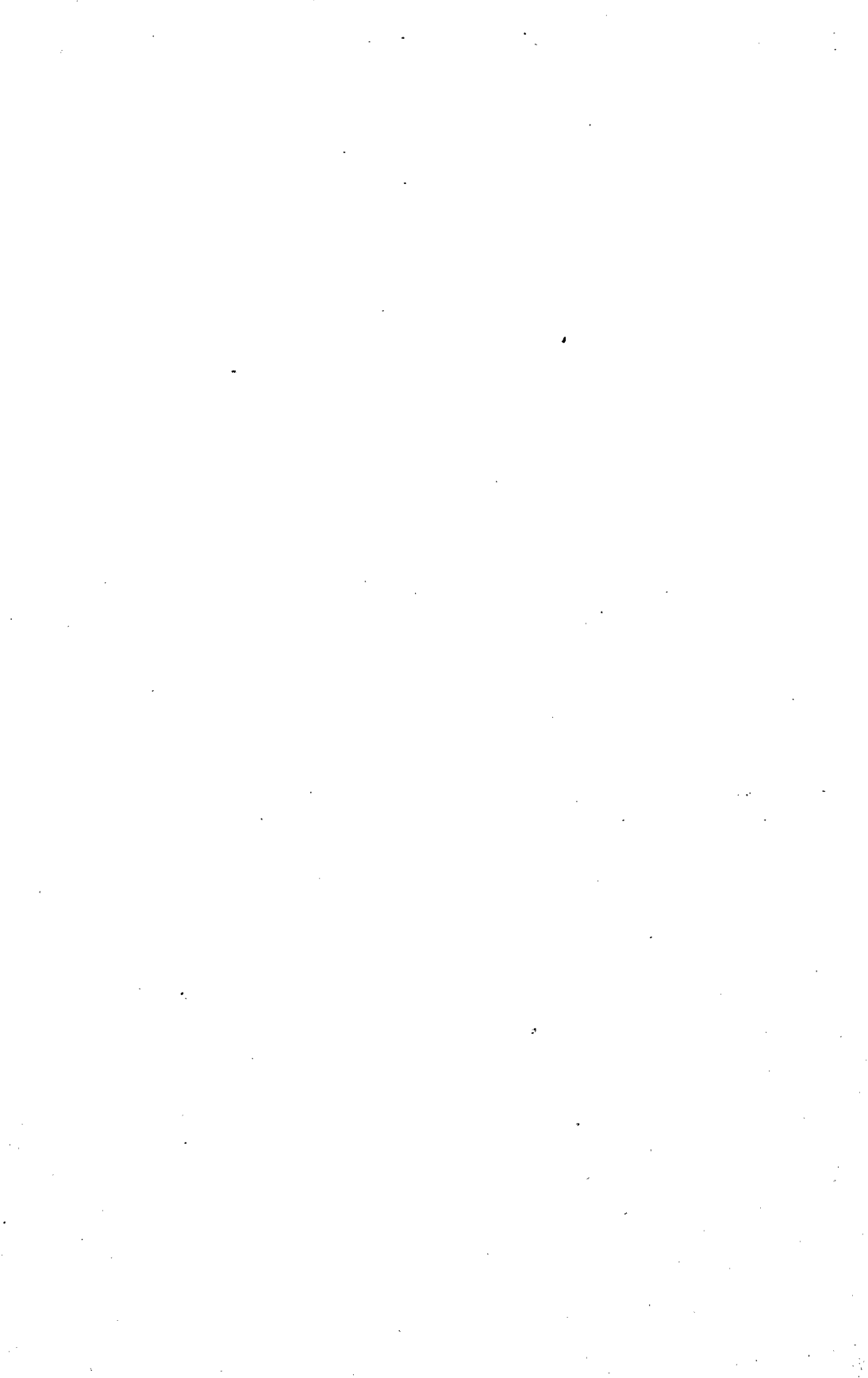

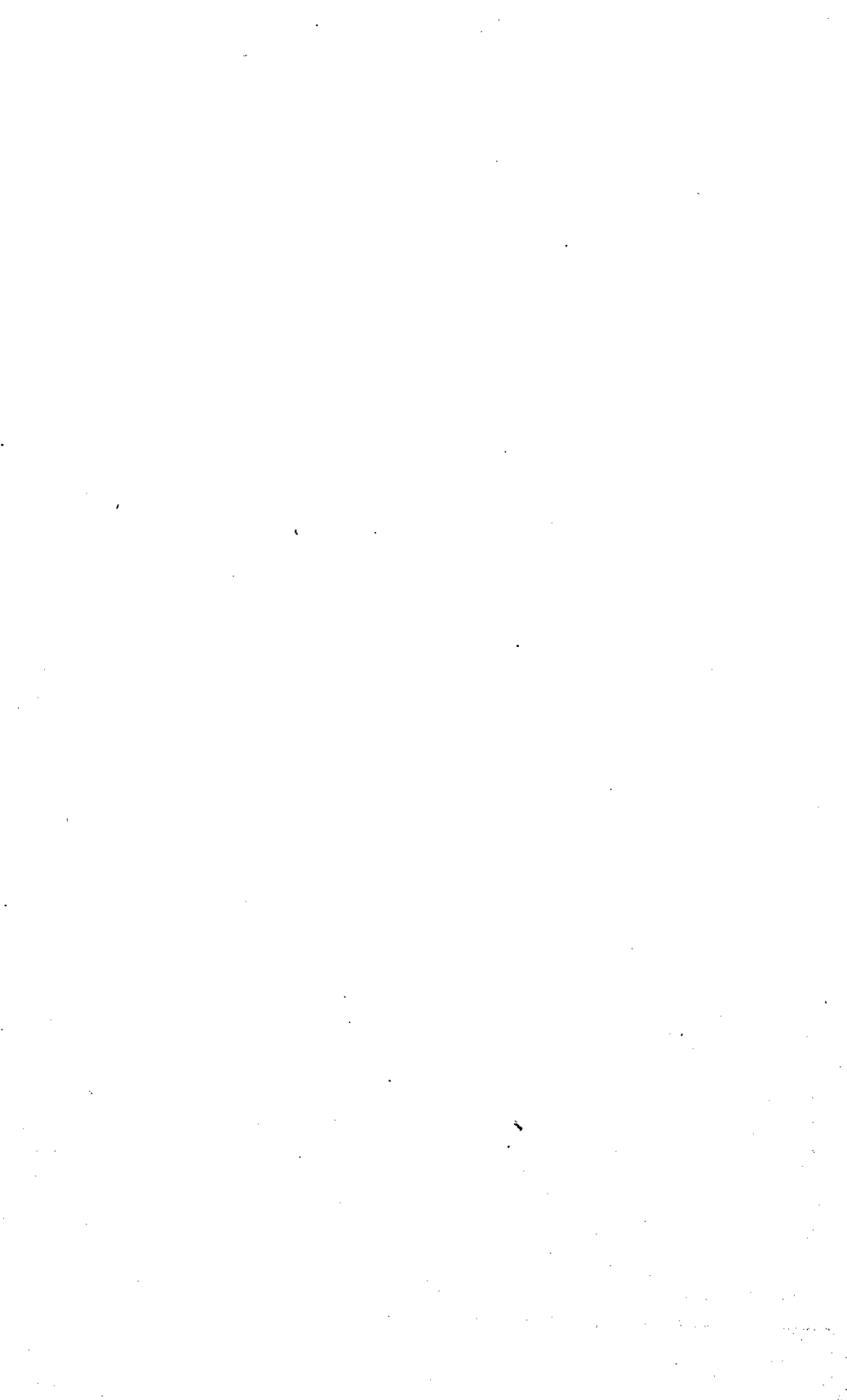
