AND BE IT ENACTED that, the pro-cects of the said debentures shall be ap-piled and apportioned to the several pur-poses hereinbefore mentioned, and in the-amounts and proportion aforeasid, the grants of the said local municipalities to be paid to the Treasurers thereof respec-tively, to be applied by them at hely to the purposes aforeasid, and an account of such application to be returned by each Reeva to the Council of the said County, at the next December Session of this Council.

Council. No person lending money upon or pur-chasing said Debentures shall be bound to see to the application of the proceeds

to see to be thereof. AND BE IT ENACTED that, this By law shall take effect upon, from and af-ter the first-day of October, in the year of our Lyrd one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two.
