We are charged with making a personal attack upon the kind and courteous Bishop of Niagara. In treating us to such wholesome condemnation our critics are guilty of a more violent display of party feeling than they charge us with. Let us look soberly at the facts. The great mass of the laity of the Diocese of Niagara are Protestant and Evangelical. Their loyalty to the Church causes them to look with distrust upon innovations in ritual which savour to them of Romanism, or which are, at least, antagonistic to the spirit of New Testament Christianity which condemns unnecessary forms and ceremonies. The most entiusastic defender of Bishop Hamilton's policy will not say that he most advanced theories of ritualistic practice, wherever practicable. The joining of the English Church Union is an act which is in line with the Bishops previous policy, but it accentuates the differences which have finally alienated hundreds of the loyal Churchimen of Niagara. It is with genuine, heartfell'sorrow that we are obliged to thronicle this act of His Lordship. Even supposing the English Church Union were nothing worse, it is a union of extreme party men with an extreme party policy. To join such an association is an indubitable act of partizanship. In committing himself by such an act the Bishop of Niagara has lost the confidence of the vast majority of the laymen of his Diocese.


