out any increase in the ratio of expenses to income, or departure from sound business principles.

The total business in force at the end of the year was \$19,311,000, an increase during the year of over \$1,600,000.

The total income for the year was considerably over three-quarters of a million, and the total amount paid out to policy-holders for death claims, endowments, dividends, etc., \$224,672.

The cash surplus over all liabilities, including paid-up capital stock, is within a fraction of \$300,000, the actual surplus earned during the year being over \$128,000 which is equal to \$1.7 per cent. of the insurance, premium income. The mortality experience was more than usually favorable, bearing strong testimony to the care exercised in canvassing and soliciting risks. The total claims for the year amounted to \$133,000 being some \$19,000 less than the claims of 1889 and representing a rate on the amount of insurance in force of only \$5.10 per \$1000.


