MARRIAGE AND DIVORCE.

WITH SPECIAL REFERENCE TO DE VORCE IN CANADA.

Evils of the Present System-A Remedy Suggested-A General Divorce Court for Canada or Divorce Jurisdiction Conferred Upon High Court of Justice for Ontario-What the Law and Protice

In dealing with this important ques-tion it is necessary to present the un-settled and unsatisfactory condition of the law in Canada relating to it in the hope that, public attention being aroused, our legislators may be induced without delay to amend the law and bring it in harmony with the spirit of the age, and in line with that in other countries, notably England. Many improvements in recent years have been made in our laws and in the machinery for their administration. It is only necessary, as an instance, to refer to our Criminal Code, largely the work of that eminent statesman and jurist, the late Sir John Thompson. But on the vital question of divorce we have not progressed at all, and are 40 years behind the Mother Country, England having had a divorce court since 1858. We in Canada still retain the slow, costly and altogether unsuitable sysalthough there are provincial divorce courts in the Maritime Provinces and British Columbia. Divorce in this ountry is the privilege of the rich, and the poor man is virtually denied redress. Let Parliament establish a general divorce court for the Dominon, with power to annul the marriage tie for certain specified causes, but in default of this clothe the High Court of Justice in this province with a jurisdiction in marriage and divorce matters similar to that belonging to the Probate and Divorce Division in England, with modifications to suit our different circumstances. It is hardly necessary to say that the system pre-vailing in the United States, with all its looseness, and divorce for a multiplicity of trifling causes, would not

The latest news from Europe is to the effect that the chances of serious international complications growing out of Armenian riots are not as great as represented, and that the sale of mining stocks by Paris were not large enough to constitute a danger.




