Mr. Armstrong spent considerable time at Yorkton, a prosperous town at the termination of the Northwestern branch of the C.P.R. The Doukhobors go to Yorkton to trade, but place, engaged in farming. They are congregated in the city, and are being urged to separate and take up farms individually. The Doukhobors' farms are the common property of each, and in many cases the people are proprietary.
