GERMANY'S DEFICIT FOR 1923 ESTI-MATED AT 721 BILLION MARKS

Berlin, Dec. 22—The federal council yesterday adopted the provisional budget for the Reich for 1923. The ordinary budget balances at 732 billion marks. The estimated receipts include 270 billions as the revenue from the income tax and thirty billions

as the revenue from exports.

The extraordinary budget shows an estimated expenditure of 84,500,000,000 marks, with revenue of 18,700,000,000 marks. This leaves a deficit of 65,800,000,000 marks to which must be added for general administration purposes 449,000,000,000 for the execution of the peace treaty and 206,400,000,000 for various

other items.

The total deficit for 1923 therefore is 721,000,000,000 marks to offset which only 99,000,000,000 are expected to be available from the proceeds of the compulsory loan.
