

Royal Arsenal, Woolwich.—On Tuesday, twenty-six pieces of ordnance, 32 pounders, were proved at the butt, and they were all found perfect. These pieces were cast from the arsenal patterns introduced by Mr. Monk, and present a massive and light appearance, compared with great strength. Compared with those formerly in use, the saving in weight or metal is considerable, there being a difference of 26 cwt. less in a 32 pounder on Mr. Monk's plans, and the experiments made at Valmer Castle during the summer have decided their superiority as the most effective pieces ever introduced in the British army. A piece of 8 inches bore, from which a ball weighing about 80 lbs. was fired, carried a distance of three miles and a quarter, and would, consequently, do great execution before our opponents could come
