

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR GENERAL IN

COUNCIL.

ON the recommendation of the Honorable the

Minister of Customs and for the reasons

given in his Report of the 8th June instant, His

Excellency has been pleased to order, and it is

hereby ordered, that the Red River, in the Pro-
vince of Manitoba, from the point of its inter-
section with the boundary line between the

United States and the said Province of Manitoba
(Canada) to its junction with Lake Winnipeg,

shall be and the same is hereby declared to be

comprised within the limits of the Port of Win-
nipeg under the following conditions and restric-
tions, that is to say:—

All Steamers, Vessels, and boats of any kind,

on entering the said Province of Manitoba, on

the Red River, shall be and they are hereby re-
quired to report at the Out Port of North Win-
nipeg, and to comply with all existing requirements

of the Law, but, on payment of duty at that Out

Port on goods destined for any place between that

Out Port and the Port of Winnipeg, they are

permitted, on the warrant of the Sub-Collector,

to land and discharge such goods, or the luggage

of such passengers as may desire to disembark,

before reaching the said Port of Winnipeg.

That in like manner, after payment of duties at

the Port of Winnipeg, the same privilege be

granted them as at the said Out Port to land

and discharge goods under the restrictions afore-

said at any place on the Red River above or be-

low Winnipeg; and all steamers plying within

the limits, and observing the conditions aforesaid,

shall be considered and treated as trading within

the limits of the said Port of Winnipeg.
