Minnehakda Is Carrying 117 Men For This District.

OTTAWA, March 23.—The militia department has received by cable the classification by dispersal areas of troops on board the transport Minnehakda, which is due at Halifax on or about March 27. She carries 2,550 soldiers. The classification of Ontario men is as follows:

PRISONER MAKES DARING ATTEMPT TO ESCAPE PEN

Raps Guard on Head and Stabs Him Viciously With Kitchen Knife.

TRAPPED BY A CITIZEN

While Providing Desperado With Clothes, Kingston Man Phones For Aid.

KINGSTON, March 23.—Leo Rogers, a young Russian Pole, who is serving a seven-year term for robbery, made a desperate but unsuccessful attempt to escape from penitentiary yesterday afternoon, and as a result of his effort John Barrigan, a penitentiary guard, lies in the Hotel Dieu, seriously wounded.
Yesterday afternoon, about 3 o'clock, Rogers, who had been employed in the prison kitchen, rapped on the west gate, and in reply to a query from Barrigan, who was in charge of the gate, he told him he had a note for him. The guard opened the gate, and as he did so Rogers hit him on the head with a stick of wood.
Barrigan was knocked down, but he quickly got to his feet, and attempted to grapple with the convict, who viciously stabbed him with a knife which he had taken from the kitchen.
A Stab Below Heart.
The knife entered Barrigan's left side below the heart, passed through the diaphragm and lodged in the stomach, which required several stitches. Rogers ran along the outside of the prison wall, passed over the late Senator Richardson's property, and on to the grounds of the Onwanada Military Hospital. Here Capt. Morrison tried to intercept him, but he threatened the captain with an axe which he had picked up on the grounds. The captain, being unarmed, naturally made no effort to detain the prisoner.

who after hitting the door of the garage with his axe, crossed the road to the home of J. G. Ettinger. He entered the house by way of the kitchen, went up the back stairs, and when first discovered by a woman in the household, he was standing on the landing at the top of the front stairs.
When asked what he wanted he replied: "I want money to go to see my mother, who is in the hospital."
Mr. Ettinger, who had been sleeping, was awakened, and succeeded in getting Rogers to go downstairs to the kitchen. Here he exchanged his prison trousers for a pair of overalls and a cloth cap. He had arrived hatless, coatless and bootless. In the meantime, Mr. Ettinger had phoned the prison authorities, and with the view of detaining him, was getting Rogers a pair of boots when George Laturney, the penitentiary accountant, arrived with a drawn revolver.
As Rogers left the house, Laturney, who was right on his heels, said: "Stop, or I'll put a hole through you."
The fleeing prisoner did not stop, and Laturney fired, but not at him. Rogers dropped on his knees and threw up his hands.
In addition to the wound in his stomach, Barrigan has two severe scalp wounds. His hand was cut when he attempted to ward off Rogers' knife thrusts. His condition is serious, but it is thought he will recover.
Rogers, who is only about 18 years old, has served nearly two years of his sentence, and until now has never given the slightest trouble. He is closely confined, and will be arraigned in court in a few days. He was born in Liverpool.

This optimistic outlook is voiced by "This Optimistic Outlook" is voiced by a Londoner, Dowler Building, this city, who has interested numerous Londoners in the enterprise within the past few weeks.

Fourteen hundred acres of farms have been leased by the company for drilling and development purposes. While the present prospect, as being made near Flesherton, is being limited to Grey County, the prospect is supposed to contain this superior quality of crude oil runs, roughly 100 miles south beyond Orangeville.

A Starting Discovery.
That there is oil in Grey County has been known for many years. Oil was extracted one time in Collingwood Township, but is only since July, 1912, that anything sensational has been reported.

Comparing with Rumania.
An expert of another company, who has been watching operations at the well on the Lever field near Flesherton, reported to his firm as follows: "At the depth of 1,430 feet a hard rock was struck. This was supposed to be granite, but after four or five hours the drill broke through the crust and a much softer material was encountered. Those hard crusts have continued every 15 or 20 feet, but after each hard crust more oil substances were found. The last bit feet the cuttings have been thoroughly saturated with this oily substance and the last two days I expected to see a flow of oil every time the drill went down."

The Driller is Confident.
Dr. W. W. McKenzie gives his views as follows: "I have been in the drilling business in different parts of the world for over 15 years and I am satisfied that there is oil ahead on the Lever field. We have been able to drill 205 feet below where the granite line should be, which would be an utter impossibility if that granite had not been cut through with something and the thing found down there that would do that has been oil. The last pumping bit was on November 23 and we did not get a drop of oil and would have had more had the machinery not broken down completely."

Gas Struck at Rockwood.
The next developments will undoubtedly be watched with keen interest by the general public, and none the less because of a news announcement that on the night of Friday evening, March 22, a good gas well had been struck at Rockwood, in Wallington County. It is not to be considered as part of the Lever field, as it is at least 100 miles from the Lever field, and it would serve to emphasize the possibility of the zone in question.

HOME PARTLY BURNED.
The home of Henry Mahon, eighth concession, Nassau, was partly burned on Saturday. The fire was caused by a defective chimney. The ready response of the neighbors to a phone call for help kept the fire from destroying the whole house.

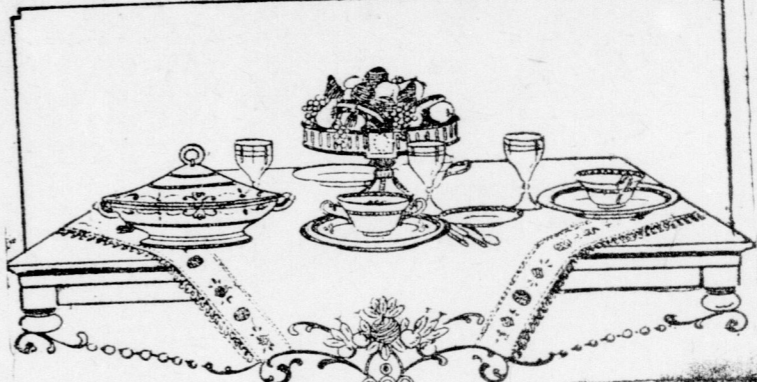
