REPORT OF THE COUNCIL.

The Council of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association submit herewith the Treasurer's Report of the Finances of the Association, shewing as the result, a balance of \$1,483 25 to the credit of the Association at the close of the year.

In pursuance of the decision arrived at at the last Annual Meeting, the whole efforts of the Council have been directed to the selection of a team of twenty to proceed to Wimbledon as representatives of the Dominion Rifle Association.

Owing to the shortness of the time at the disposal of the Council, and in order that the Provincial Associations might have time to make the necessary preparation for selecting the names to be submitted to the Council by them, it was found impossible to select the men to compose the team by competition at Ottawa as was proposed. The selection was therefore made upon the scores of competitors at the Provincial Ranges, in accordance with the following conditions:

Memorandum.

In view of the limited time available for the selection of the men for the Wimbledon Team, it is necessary to deal with their selection for the present year as an exceptional case, and for that purpose to modify the resolution passed at the last meeting of the Council, so as to provide as follows:—

1st. The firing upon which the selection for 1872 is to be made may take place at the ranges of the respective Provincial Associations during any three days in the week commencing Monday, 27th instant, under the supervision of such officers as may be appointed by the Adjutant General.

2nd. Thirty rounds shall be fired on each of the three days—namely five rounds in the morning, and five rounds in the afternoon, at each of the ranges, 200 yards, 500 yards, and 600 yards. At 200 yards from the shoulder, and at the other ranges from any position.

3rd. The competitors must fire with the Long Snider Rifle issued by the Government, the sights of which must be in the same state as when originally issued from the Government stores, the pull off to be not less than six pounds.

4th. Each Provincial Association shall send to the Secretary of the Dominion Rifle Association, on or before the 6th June, the full details of the scores made in the 90 rounds by the men from whom they desire the final selection to be made—namely, ten from each Province—such scores to be certified by the officer designated by the Adjutant General, and under whose supervision the firing took place.

5th. The said officer shall accompany his certificate by a report of the circumstances under which the firing took place, especially as to the state of the weather, light, force and direction of the wind, and the state of the atmosphere.

6th. From the forty scores so submitted, the Executive Committee will select twenty to proceed to Wimbledon, and as soon as the selection has been made, the names will be telegraphed to the Secretaries of the respective Provincial Associations.

7th. The twenty so selected must report themselves at the Brigade Office, Quebec, at noon on the 21st June, to the officer appointed by the Adjutant General as Captain of the Team, when they will be required to subscribe to the rules and regulations approved by the Adjutant General for the governance of the Detachment.

8th. The expenses of the men to Quebec must be paid by the respective Associations, and their expenses from the time at which they report at Quebec, and while on duty until they return to their homes, will be paid by the Dominion Association.

In consequence of the above changes, it is desirable to postpone the Annual Match of the Association, proposed to be held at Ottawa on the 17th June, until the return to Canada of the Wimbledon Team—the date at which it is to be held to be subsequently determined by the Executive Committee, by whom due notice will be issued.

The Council ~~is~~ not in a position to submit any further report as to the proceedings of the Association during the ~~past~~ year, and the accompanying memorandum, prepared by the President, ~~is~~ submitted as an explanation of the cause, and as an expression of the opinion generally entertained by the Council, in reference to the despatch of the Team to Wimbledon.

MEMORANDUM.

Although the last year has been the most eventful one in the history of the Dominion Rifle Association, the undersigned has to express his regret that he is not able to lay before the Members and Council of the Association at this, their Annual Meeting, any Report or particulars connected with the Expedition sent to Wimbledon to represent the Riflemen of the Dominion, for the purpose of competing for all Prizes to which they might become eligible, and more especially for the "Rajah of Kolapore's" Prize, offered by the National Rifle Association for competition by Teams "from the Colonies, and one United Team from the Mother Country."

The victory gained by the Canadian Team, in winning the great "Kolapore Prize," adds to the cause for regret, as it would have been, it is believed, a source of great satisfaction to the Members of the Council, and of the Association generally, to have had a full and detailed Report of the Expedition, so important in itself, so creditable to Canada and Canadians; originated by the efforts of the undersigned, with the most cordial co-operation of all the Members of the Association.

An Expedition which would have had no existence but for the organization of the Dominion Rifle Association.

It is necessary that the Council should distinctly understand from the undersigned that not being able to submit the Report referred to, is not a fault of his, or of the Executive Officers of the Association.

To explain, the undersigned begs to call the attention of Council to a memorandum addressed to the Hon. Sir George E. Cartier, Bart, Minister of Militia and Defence, dated 29th April, 1872, in which he recommends as follows:

"I would suggest that each of the Associations annually select, by a designated competition, from amongst their marksmen, ten representatives to attend the Dominion Rifle Association at Ottawa. Let each Provincial Association defray the travelling expenses of their representatives to and

"from the Capital. When there, let these representatives be
 "taken charge of by the Officers of the Dominion Rifle Associ-
 "ation resident in the Capital, and connected with the Militia
 "Department, and in a match under the auspices of the Associ-
 "ation and the Department of Militia and Defence, select twenty
 "competitors to be taken as representatives of the Dominion,
 "at the next Wimbledon Meeting. Such representatives, auth-
 "orized by the Department of Militia, and under the command
 "of an Officer appointed by the Department, to be sent to
 "Wimbledon at the expense of the Dominion Rifle Association.
 "To carry out this scheme no additional grant of money from
 "the Government to that hitherto made to the Association
 "would be required, while the advantages accruing from the
 "annual representation of Canada at Wimbledon would far
 "exceed those gained by an Annual Itinerant Prize Meeting,
 "if such representation were under the combined auspices of
 "the Dominion Association, and of the department of Militia
 "and Defence."

Carrying out the spirit of the above memorandum which
 had attained the sanction of the Honorable the Minister of
 Militia and Defence, the following Circular, authorized by the
 Council, was addressed by the Secretary to the Presidents of
 the Provincial Rifle Associations.

DOMINION RIFLE ASSOCIATION,

OTTAWA, 2nd May, 1872.

Circular.

I am directed to inform you that the Council of the Dominion Rifle
 Association, with the co-operation of the Department of Militia and
 Defence, have decided to send a Team of twenty Marksmen to Wimble-
 don to compete at the next Annual National Rifle Tournament to be
 held there in July next.

The twenty men to be selected from ten men to be sent by each of
 the four Provinces—Ontario, Quebec, New Brunswick and Nova Scotia.

You are requested to send ten men from your Province to attend a
 Competitive Meeting to be held at Ottawa on the 17th June next.

The conditions are as follows:

1st. The travelling expenses of the men to be paid by the Provin-
 cial Rifle Association to and from Ottawa.

2nd. The Dominion Rifle Association to pay the expenses of the
 men during the Match at Ottawa, and of the Team to Wimbledon, and
 back to their respective homes.

3rd. The men must be regularly enrolled in the Active Militia.

4th. They are to be sent under the command of an Officer to be
 appointed by the Department of Militia and Defence, and shall be sub-
 ject to such orders and regulations as may be issued by the Adjutant-
 General of Militia.

On account of the very short time between the date of that Memorandum and Circular, and the period for despatching the Team, it was not possible to hold the Competitive Meeting at Ottawa for the selection of Members who were to compose the Canadian Team.

Meetings for the selection of Competitors were therefore held in the respective Provinces, and the selected men were sent for embarkation from Quebec by each Province—Ontario, Quebec, New Brunswick and Nova Scotia.

An objection was made by the Adjutant General to the Circular referred to, and more particularly to the fourth clause.

In a telegraphic communication received by the undersigned from the Adjutant General, he was informed that as in the last paragraph of the Circular, it appeared that the selection of the Officer had not been left to him, the Adjutant General, but to the Minister of Militia and Defence, he could not act unless he had the selection of the Officers without any interference, and authorized to despatch the party as a regular Militia Detachment, and that he considered two Officers indispensable.

Although this message conveyed plainly the desire of the Adjutant General to have the exclusive control of the Expedition, the undersigned, to avoid further delay and complication that might have arisen if he objected to the proposition, sent a telegram in reply, that there was no objection to the Adjutant General selecting the two Officers. All these appointments were then made by the Adjutant General, without further reference to the undersigned, or to the Council.

The first of the appointments was that of Major General McDougall, late Adjutant General of Canadian Militia, to a position which the Adjutant General designated as Captain of the Team.

The second appointment was that of Major Worsley, late Captain 60th Rifles, as Officer to take the Team to Wimbledon; and the third was that of Sergeant Kelly, as an assistant to Major Worsley.

The Officer appointed to take the Team to Wimbledon received his instructions from the Adjutant General, was under his control, and responsible to him alone, with orders to report to him.

The Adjutant General's instructions to Major Worsley appertained not only to discipline, but also to the disposition of Prize Money. To that portion of the instructions the undersigned ventured to object, on the ground that the Association was the proper guardian of its funds, and should have control, as per clause 13 of the Constitution, which provides as follows :

"The Council shall have the sole management of the income and funds of the Association, &c., &c." ; but the objection was of no avail. It will be observed that by the manner in which the appointments were made, and instructions issued, as further evidenced by the "Militia General Orders" of the *Gazette* of 18th June, 1872, the competitors representing Canadian Riflemen intended to be sent by the Association, according to the Memorandum of the undersigned above referred to, under the combined auspices of the Dominion Association and the Department of Militia and Defence, were converted into a Militia Detachment and sent as such, under the entire and exclusive control of the Adjutant General, and in every respect disconnected with, and bearing no evidence that their mission had been projected by and was altogether due to the Dominion Rifle Association.

These are the causes why the undersigned is unable to furnish the Council with the Report referred to.

The great desire that prevailed to send the first representative Team from the Dominion, and the belief that very great disappointment would have followed if no Team had been sent, were chief reasons that induced the undersigned to throw no obstacle in the way, or take any steps to prevent the accomplishment of an object so greatly desired, and so important to be attained, as the securing of a representation of Canada at Wimbledon, in a competition for a valuable trophy especially dedicated for that purpose by the National Rifle Association.

The undersigned would however be wanting in respect to the position he occupies as President of the Association, and to the position the Association itself occupies in Canada, if he did not urge upon the Council the importance and necessity, if the existing spirit so favorable to the Rifle movement is to be preserved, encouraged, and maintained in the Country, to determine that no other Team depart for Wimbledon as a detachment of Canadian Militia, but as Canadian Riflemen representing and sent by the Dominion Rifle Association, an Association supported by our Parliament, and recognized by the Country as an Institution for organizing, despatching, and controlling such representation.

There are many valid reasons why the Dominion Rifle Association, whilst working in accord and co-operating with, should, so far as it is possible, be independent of the Adjutant-Generals Department or its Regulations. One of these is that the Association has not been formed for the benefit of parties connected with the Militia Service only, but it is open to all Civilians, the object being to secure the most general introduction of the Rifle in the country as a weapon of defence, and of the education in the use of it.

The Constitution provides that "any person being a Subscriber of \$2.00 per annum, shall become a member of the "Association." The Association has obtained, and there are reasons to believe that it is likely to continue to obtain, increased valuable aid from Civilians who would at once withdraw their co-operation and support if they saw the Association converted into an offshot of the Militia Department, subject to the numerous Departmental regulations.

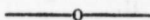
Without, however, entering into further explanation of disadvantages arising from too close a connection between the Dominion Rifle Association and the Adjutant General's Department, the undersigned submits this brief Memorandum detailing the circumstances connected with the selection and despatch of the Wimbledon Team last year, and has to conclude by most earnestly urging upon the attention of the Council the necessity

of making arrangements for the future representation at Wimbledon, in a manner that will give the Association more direct control, and in a greater degree preserve the connections with those who may be selected and sent there to represent it.

REPORT OF THE TREASURER
OF THE
DOMINION OF CANADA RIFLE ASSOCIATION,

For 1872.

The undersigned has the honor to submit a detailed statement of the Finances of the Association for the period from 27th April, 1872, to 8th March, 1873, to which is attached the Auditors' Report.

The Balance Sheet shows the total income from all sources for the year to have been \$6,834.62, while the expenditure amounted to \$6,178.90, giving an excess of income over expenditure of \$655.72. This surplus being added to the balance of \$827.53, carried forward from last year's financial statement, will give a total in favor of the Association of \$1,483.25.

It will be observed that the principal expenditure during the year has been incurred in connection with the "Canadian Team" of marksmen, sent to Wimbledon in June, 1872, under the auspices of the Dominion Rifle Association. Major Worsley's account of disbursements, while in charge of the Team to Wimbledon, is also attached.

The expenditure under this head, up to the present time, amounts to \$5,220.77, to which has yet to be added sundry expenses for printing and transport of Wimbledon Cups, now being exhibited in the chief Cities of the Dominion; ordinary expenditure for the year 1872, \$439.67; for account of 1871 \$340.50; and for 1870, \$177.96.

The item of \$177.96 embraces certain disputed claims in the Province of New Brunswick of the nature of transport and land damages, on account of the Annual Competition at Fredericton in 1870, to which reference was made in the Annual Report of that year.

It was deemed expedient to settle these claims, in view of the representations made in behalf of the claimants by the Local Executive Committee at Fredericton, and to avoid litigation.

The Government again aided the Dominion and Provincial Associations with liberal grants, as shewn below :

and the usual grants in aid of County and other Rifle Associations for the year ending 30th June, 1872, were made through the Department of Militia and Defence.

The receipts from Subscribers and Affiliated Associations have been much less than previous years,—the number of Annual Subscribers of \$2 during the year being 24, and Affiliated Associations 7. The diminution in the receipts from this source, and the absence of the usual special donations in money and prizes, may perhaps be attributed to the circumstance that no prize competition took place under the auspices of the Dominion Rifle Association during the year,—the operations of the Association being confined chiefly to the sending of the twenty marksmen to Wimbledon.

In view of the prospect of a Prize Meeting being held at Ottawa during the ensuing summer, it may be expected that the list of subscribers and Affiliated Associations will be considerably increased, and that liberal donations will be made to the funds of the Association.

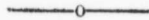

[MEMORANDUM.]

For guidance of Major Worsley, Brigade Major, appointed by the Adjutant General of Militia to take charge of the Wimbledon Team from Canada.

1. The team of twenty officers, non-commissioned officers and privates, selected from the Active Militia of Canada, will embark from Quebec, per steamer *Scandinavian*, on the 22nd June, 1872, for Liverpool.

2. The day before sailing the members of the Team will report to Major Worsley at Quebec and subscribe to the Regulations in duplicate, which have been approved by the Adjutant General of Militia—one copy to be retained by Major Worsley, and one copy to be forwarded to the Adjutant General, Ottawa.

3. The subsistence of the Team from the time of subscribing to the Regulations up to the time of embarkation on board of the steamship at Quebec, will be paid by the officer in command.

4. The Dominion of Canada Rifle Association will provide Cabin Passage tickets for each member of the Team, and the officer in charge, from Quebec to Liverpool and return to Canada. These passage tickets will include all meals while on board the steamship, and no further expense will be allowed during the voyage.

5. After landing of the Team at Liverpool, Major Worsley will pay out of funds placed in his hands for the purpose, all necessary expenses for subsistence, railway fares, entrance fees to matches, sighting shots, cost of ammunition, and hire of camp equipage up to the period the matches may terminate at Wimbledon and the time required for the Team to return to the point of embarkation of the Allan line of steamers; no expenses to be allowed beyond the time of sailing of the first steamer of the Allan Line from Liverpool after termination of the matches at Wimbledon.

6. Major Worsley will have a due regard to economy in all expenditure connected with the Team and the duty assigned to him.

7. Major Worsley will keep an account of all sums disbursed by him on account of the Team, supporting the same by proper vouchers—such detailed account to be furnished to the President of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association on completion of the duty.

8. Major Worsley will receive all prizes won by the Team, as a Team or as individuals, at Wimbledon, and keep a separate detailed account of the same, both as regards prizes in money or kind, which

are to be disposed of in the manner provided in the Regulations signed by the Team.

9. An Acquittance Roll will be drawn up in accordance with the accompanying form and signed in duplicate by each member of the Team, shewing the amounts divided equally and paid to them as provided by the Regulations herein referred to.

10. On arrival at Liverpool Major Worsley will put himself in communication with Captain E. St. John Mildmay, Secretary of the National Rifle Association, London, who has kindly offered to supply all information that may be required in carrying out the arrangements for the Team at Wimbledon.

11. Major Worsley will be good enough to report by mail to the Adjutant General of Militia and the President of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association, the arrival of the Team in England, and also by each subsequent mail, as to the movements and progress of the Team up to the termination of the meeting at Wimbledon.

DOMINION OF CANADA RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

We, the undersigned, agree to the following Regulations :

1. The Officers, the Non-Commissioned Officers, and Privates selected by the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association, from the Active Militia of the Dominion of Canada, to represent the said Dominion at the meeting of the National Rifle Association, to be held at Wimbledon in July, 1872, are, from the date of signing of this Agreement, until discharged from duty at Wimbledon, to be under the immediate command of Major Worsly, Brigade Major of Militia, Canada, and to be subject to such orders and regulations as he or such other officer appointed by the Adjutant-General of Militia of Canada to act as Chief in Command at Wimbledon may, from time to time, issue for their guidance.

2. No Member of the Detachment to be absent from the Headquarters of the Detachment from the day of landing in England, and until released from duty after the conclusion of the matches at Wimbledon, on any pretence whatever, without the permission of the Officer in command.

3. Any member of the Detachment disobeying the order of the Officer Commanding, or contravening any of the orders made for the regulation of the force assembled at Wimbledon, or be under the influence of drink, shall forfeit his return tickets.

4. The Members of the Detachment shall have their steamship and railway fares paid, as well as their ordinary board on the steamship, and at such places after landing in England, and until the conclusion of the matches at Wimbledon, as the Officer Commanding may select, all such allowances to be stopped from any Member of the Detachment guilty of a breach of this agreement.

5. No Member of the Detachment shall send communications to the Press for publication with respect to the shooting or any other matter connected with the Detachment.

6. The Officer Commanding will provide the necessary ammunition, pay entrance fees and sighting shots, for the Matches open to the Detachment as a Detachment or as individuals, and all Prizes in *Money* won by the Detachment or by individuals, in such Matches, shall be divided *equally among the Members of the Detachment*.

7. *Prizes in Kind* won by the Detachment as a Detachment, or by the aggregate shooting of the whole or any number of the Detachment, are not to be considered the property of the Detachment collectively or individually ; but such prizes are to be handed over to the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association, for such subsequent disposition as the Council of that Association may determine upon.

8. *Prizes in Kind* won by any member of the Detachment individually, in Matches open to individual competition, to become the property of the winner, if not inconsistent with the Wimbledon conditions under which such competition is held.

9. At the conclusion of the Matches at Wimbledon, and when relieved from duty by the Officer in Command, Return Tickets will be furnished to each member of the Detachment, from Wimbledon to the port of embarkation; thence by the Allan Line of steamships to Canada. Such members, after being so discharged from duty, may suit their own convenience as to the time for returning to Canada; but no expense will be paid on account of any member of the Detachment beyond the period necessary to complete the duty at Wimbledon and the time of sailing of the first steamer of the Allan Line from Liverpool to Quebec, after discharge.

10. The Officer Commanding will make requisite arrangements for the transport of the Members of the Detachment on their return, from Quebec to their homes.

11. Should any Member of the Detachment from the Provinces of Nova Scotia or New Brunswick elect to return direct to Halifax, and in the event of any of the Allan Line of Steamships sailing from Liverpool to that port about the time, the Officer Commanding may authorize such arrangement, provided no further charge is made for the passage by the Steamship Company than that included in the Return Tickets to Quebec.

12. Each Member of the Detachment, on his being released from duty at Wimbledon, will sign an Acquittance Roll, to the effect that he has been properly settled with in accordance with these regulations.

13. The Officer in Command will, on the completion of the duty, forward a report to the Adjutant General of Militia on the manner in which the same has carried out, accompanied by the Acquittance Roll and Statement of Accounts of expenditure connected therewith, full details of shooting and conduct of the Members of the Detachment.

The Report of the Council of the Association for the year 1872, together with the memorandum of the President, forming part thereof, having been read to the General Meeting, was adopted unanimously and ordered to be printed.

The Alterations in the Constitution, of which notice had been given, having been read, were adopted unanimously, viz. ; Clause 4 to be amended so as to read as follows :

“ 4.—Any Provincial Rifle Association of the Dominion subscribing not less than \$40.00 annually, and any other Rifle Association of the Dominion not less than \$20 annually, to the funds of the Dominion Rifle Association, shall be considered as being in connection with it, and shall be entitled to a number of memberships in the proportion of one to every Dollar thus subscribed. Each subscribing Association is to elect from its members the persons to hold such memberships, and return their names and addresses, when elected, to the Secretary of the

Dominion Rifle Association, to be registered by him one month previous to the Match."

Clause 8 to be amended so as to read as follows:

"8.—There shall be a Council of Fifty-two Members, who shall be elected in the following proportions:—

Sixteen [16] from Ontario.	Seven [7] from Nova Scotia.
Twelve [12] " Quebec.	Five [5] from Manitoba.
Seven [7] from New Brunswick.	Five [5] " British Columbia.

Clause 15 to be amended so as to read as follows:

"15.—The Annual Prize Meetings shall be held at Ottawa, at such times as may be determined on by the Council."

Resolved, That the thanks of this meeting be tendered to Lieut.-Col. C. S. Gzowski, President of the Association, for his valuable services to the Association during the past year.

That the thanks of this meeting be tendered to the Treasurer, Lieut.-Col. Macpherson, and the Secretary, Lieut.-Col. Stuart, for their efficient services during the past year in their respective offices.

That the thanks of the meeting be tendered to Major Worsley, for the efficient and satisfactory manner in which he performed the duty as officer in command of the Wimbledon Team from the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association, 1872.

The Report of the Minutes of the meeting of the Council held 27th inst. having been read and passed, were duly signed by the President.

The President informed the meeting that he had waited upon His Excellency the Governor-General, who had graciously signified his consent to become Patron of the Association.

The members of the Council present being resolved into a Committee to frame the Rules for the selection of the Wimbledon Team for 1873, under the Resolution of yesterday. The President having read over the Rules proposed by this Committee,

It was Resolved that the Council of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association send a Team of 20 Riflemen to represent the Association at Wimbledon, the selection of the men for the Team to be on the following conditions :

1. The firing upon which the selection for 1873 is to be made may take place at the ranges of the respective Provincial Associations during any three days in the ten days commencing Tuesday, 13th May next, under the supervision of such officers as may be appointed by the Council.
2. Thirty rounds shall be fired on each of the three days, namely, five rounds in the morning and five rounds in the afternoon, at each of the ranges, 200 yards, 500 yards, and 600 yards. On the first and last days, the firing at 200 yards shall be from the shoulder; on the second day it will be in any position, and at the other distances in any position.
3. The competitors must fire with the long Snider Rifle, issued by the Government, the sights of which must be in the same state as when originally issued from the Government stores, and the pull off must not be less than 6 pounds.
4. Each Provincial Association shall send to the Secretary of the Dominion Rifle Association, on or before the 2nd June, the full details of the scores fired in the 90 rounds by the men from whom they desire the final selection to be made, namely, 15 from each Province, such scores to be certified by the officers appointed by the Council, and under whose supervision the firing took place.

5. The said officer shall accompany his certificate by a report of the circumstances under which the firing took place, especially as to the state of the weather, light, force, and direction of the wind, and the state of the atmosphere.

6. From the 90 scores, so submitted, the Executive Committee will select 20 to proceed to Wimbledon, and as soon as the selection has been made the names will be telegraphed to the Secretaries of the respective Provincial Associations.

7. The 20 so selected must report themselves at the Brigade Office (Quebec), at noon on the 20th June, to the officer appointed by the Council as Captain of the Team, when they will be required to subscribe to the rules and regulations approved by the Council for the guidance of the Team.

8. The expenses of the Team to Quebec must be paid by Provincial Associations, and their expenses from the time they report at Quebec while on duty, and until they return to their homes, will be paid by the Dominion Rifle Association.

9. That the officers in command of the Military District, where the competition is to be held be requested to superintend the firing for the competition for the selection of the Wimbledon Team, and to associate with them a Brigade Major of the District, or where there is no Brigade Major, a member of the Council.

Resolved, That the appointment of the officer or officers to command the Wimbledon Team be left to the President.

That a Competitive Meeting of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association take place at Ottawa, to commence on Tuesday, the 9th day of September next, under the management of a local Executive Committee, who have authority to change the date if found necessary

That the Local Executive Committee consists of all the members of the Council resident at Ottawa, together with Lieut.-Col. Fletcher, C. M. G., Brigade Major, Lieut.-Col. Jackson, Act'g D. A. G., Lieut.-Col. French (A Battery), Lieut.-Col. Buell, M.P., Lieut.-Col. Grant (Quebec Garrison Artillery), Major Worsley (Brigade Major G. T. R. Brigade.) Four to make a quorum.

The President read the following letter from S. H. Morley, Esq., respecting the "London Merchants' Cup:"—

To Major Worsley, Commanding Canadian Volunteers at Wimbledon, July, 1873:

5
DEAR SIR,—In handing over to your care the Cup which was presented to the Canadian Volunteers by some of the London Merchants, I would beg to acquaint you with the origin and history of its presentation.

On receipt of the intelligence in July 1871, that a team of Volunteers was coming over from Canada to shoot at the Annual Meeting at Wimbledon, it was determined to avail ourselves of the opportunity to present a cup to the Volunteers of Canada generally.

As the time was short, the number of merchants joining was necessarily limited, and as there was nothing ready made which was suitable, it was resolved to present the Cup in *form* to the Canadians then in this Country, and to send it out when executed to the Dominion Rifle Association.

This formal presentation was made, but the manufacturer taking longer than was expected, it was finally thought best to keep the Cup until the visit of the team this year, and then to place it in your hands, as their commanding Officer, to be shot for by the representatives of the different Provinces, and afterwards consigned to the custody of the Dominion Rifle Association.

It is the wish of the merchants who have subscribed, that the rules under which the Cup is to be shot for in future be made by the Dominion Association as may seem best to them, with the sole stipulation that the Cup be a Challenge Cup under the name of the "London Merchant's Cup," and that it be shot for by more than single individuals.

I may add that it is hoped that the kindly feeling and good fellowship at present existing between the Dominion and the Mother Country may increase and flourish, and that this Cup may express the gladness with which we welcome our countrymen from Canada to these shores.

The conditions for the competition of this Cup to be as follows :

That it be competed for this year by Provinces at Ottawa. Number of competitors, five per Province. That a money prize be given to the three highest aggregate scores. The Cup to be held by the Presidents of the Provincial Rifle Associations for the year, and then returned to the President of the Dominion Rifle Association.

That a copy of the conditions for the above competition be furnished by the Secretary to Samuel Hope Morley, Esq., London.

The Council approve of the suggestion that the Senate and the House of Commons contribute towards a prize, to be designated, "The Dominion of Canada Senate and House of Commons Prize," to be competed for at the next prize meeting of the Association to be held at Ottawa, and that the Local Executive Committee be instructed to institute a Senate and Common Prize for that meeting.

That the Committee appointed at yesterday's meeting having reported upon the Rules for the selection of the Wimbledon Team, and their Report having been approved by this Council, the said Committee

is hereby relieved from making the further Report ordered in yesterday's Resolution.

That the thanks of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association be presented to Earl Ducie for his kindness, and the valuable assistance given by him to the Wimbledon Team of 1872, and to request his acceptance of a Moose Head and Horns, and also of two Cariboo Deer Head and Horns, and that they be handed to Lord Ducie by the Captain of the Wimbledon Team for 1873, on arrival at Wimbledon.

The above to be purchased by the Local Executive Committee, at the expense of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association.

- 5.—There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patrons named by the Council.
The Governor-General of the Dominion of Canada for the time being shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron."
- 6.—There shall be a President.
- 7.—There shall be Vice-Presidents.
- 8.—There shall be a Council of Fifty-two Members, who shall be elected in the following proportions:

of whom four shall form a quorum, and who shall be elected, primarily, by the delegates now assembled at Ottawa, and hereafter at the Annual Meeting,—and the General Meetings of the Council shall be held at the Capital of the Dominion.
- 9.—The Council shall choose from the members elected the President of the Association.
- 10.—There shall be a Vice-President from each Province, selected from among the Members of the Association, and who shall be elected by the Council.
- 11.—The Presidents of the various Provincial Associations in connection with this Association, and the Militia Staff Officers in

charge of the several Militia Districts of the Dominion, being members thereof, shall be *ex-officio* Vice-Presidents, and all Vice-Presidents shall be members of the Council.

- 12.—There shall be a Treasurer, and there shall be a paid Secretary at Ottawa, both to be appointed by the Council, and holding office during pleasure.
- 13.—The Council shall have the sole management of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting, such account having been previously audited by a person or persons not members of the Council, who shall be annually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendence of all the affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do, all such acts and deeds as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.
- 14.—The Council shall be regulated in their proceedings by such By-laws as may from time to time be enacted by them;—no By-law being in any case altered, or new one proposed, without at least one month's notice of such intention being given to each member of Council.
- 15.—The Annual Prize Meetings shall be held at Ottawa, at such times as may be determined on by the Council.
- 16.—The Prizes shall be competed for in accordance with such Regulations as may be passed by the Council from time to time.
- 17.—An Annual Report, embracing the audited account of the Finances, shall be drawn up by the Secretary, and shall (having been previously submitted to the Council) be published as soon after the Prize Meeting as may be found practicable.
- 18.—There shall be an Annual Meeting, to be held at such time as shall be selected by the Council.

BY-LAWS.

Annual Meeting. The Annual Meeting of the Association shall be held at Ottawa on the third Wednesday after the assembling of the General Session of the Parliament of the Dominion.

Meetings of Council. There shall be two Ordinary Meetings of the Council. The first of which shall be held on the day after the Annual Meeting of the Association, and the second at such other time as the Council may then determine upon.

Extraordinary Meetings. Extraordinary Meetings shall be summoned by the Secretary if required by any six of the members of the Council,—notification being sent to each member of the Council at least fifteen days previous to such Meeting,—and the requisition for the Meeting, and the notices to the members, must state the object or objects of such Extraordinary Meeting.

The Council to keep minutes of all proceedings. The Council shall keep Minutes of its proceedings at all Meetings, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose by the Secretary,—and open to the inspection of any members of the Council

Finance Committee. There shall be a Finance Committee, consisting of three of the Council.

Treasurer to deposit sums received in Savings Bank. The Treasurer is authorized to deposit from time to time in the Savings Department of the Ontario Bank all sums of money paid over to him on behalf of the Association.

Expenditure of sums for current expenses. All expenditure of sums for current expenses which may be required by the Secretary must be authorized by the signature of the President of the Association, or in his absence by some member of the Finance Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner.

Expenditures of a general nature. Other expenditures of a general nature are to be made only upon the authority of the Council of the Association

Annual accounts. A detailed statement of all Receipts and Expenditure shall be rendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer.
