# CYCLOPEAN CONCRETE BUCKETS

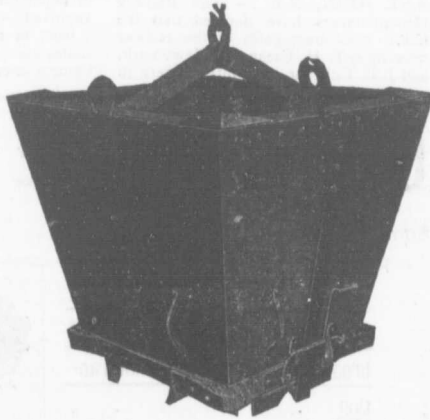
