**King's County Exhibition.**

King's County Exhibition at Georgetown on Wednesday last was most successful in point of exhibits and the attendance although not so large as under more favorable weather was nevertheless good.

About twelve o'clock the Lieutenant Governor and Mrs. Howland, and the ladies accompanying them, arrived at the Exhibition grounds, and soon thereafter the Hon. D. Gordon, President of the Association, in a few well chosen words presented His Honor with the following address:

To His Honor, the Honorable George W. Howland, Lieutenant-Governor of Prince Edward Island:

MAJESTY PLEASE YOUR HONOR—The Directors of the King's County Exhibition Association have much pleasure in extending to Your Honor a hearty greeting on the occasion of your visit to the county for the purpose of opening the exhibition for 1894.

From your long and varied experience in public life, your thorough acquaintance with the past history of the Province, and the active interest taken in all measures tending to the advancement and prosperity of the people, we entertain the assurance that you will cherish a lively interest in all matters relating to agriculture and the handicraft of the mechanic and artisan.

On a survey of the various productions and works of utility now being exhibited, it is pleasing to witness the marked improvement in many classes, as compared with those shown at former exhibitions.

It is also very gratifying to note the greater interest taken by the people in these annual fairs, competition is keen, the entries have steadily increased each year, more especially since under the management of the Association, as evidenced by the prize lists.

The efforts of our farmers in establishing cheese factories in various sections of the Province have led to good results, inasmuch as these industries tend to effecting a complete change in the system of conducting farm operations, besides giving encouragement to the introduction of pure bred stock and dairying purposes. There is also much to give hope for future success in the new departure adopted by the husbandman in the growing of corn for feeding stock during the winter months, this we look upon as of the utmost value to the stock raiser.

In concluding, we thank you for your presence here to-day, and we would ask you to tender to Mrs. Howland our expressions of esteem and regard, and hoping to have her countenance at many future exhibitions.

His Honor in reply thanked the President and Directors for the flattering address presented to him. He spoke of the fight in Parliament and some other members had to get an exhibition grant extended to Prince and King's Counties in order to benefit those who could not come to Charlottetown. The scene here to-day is truly gratifying, and evidences great advancement. Especially is this true of dairying, in which King's County is first. The spirit of dairying is abroad. His Honor related his experience at the dairying convention in Ontario, from which he returned deeply impressed with the fact that a great future is store for P. E. Island in regard to this movement. He was especially pleased with the splendid fair exhibit, and this department, with proper care and attention, was capable of still greater advancement. He also paid a deserved tribute to John Robertson, of Inkerman. Proceeding he referred to the fertility of our soil, the advantages we possess, and believed that this Island was destined to become the happy home of our young men, whom he advised to remain here. He spoke of the improved facilities for holding exhibitions now, as compared with those of by-gone years, when we had no railway. With respect to the roots he complimented the county on this exhibit which he considered eclipsed that of the Provincial Exhibition. He dwelt at length on the Island's dairying resources, pointing out the beneficial results that followed the adoption of dairying in other parts of the Dominion. Not only would this industry be a benefit to our land, but it would also improve our stock. He was glad to note that our young men were now studying butter and cheese making, and had no doubt but what they would master it as they had other industries peculiar to the Island. His Honor gave some practical suggestions on this head. In conclusion, he said he had spent a lifetime in public affairs, and he believed that an era of prosperity is dawning upon the Island. The marked improvement noticeable to-day is, in nearly every department, astounding. And he was highly pleased with the exhibits of women's work. "No wonder P. E. Island homes are happy," said he. He again thanked the president and directors for their kindness to Mrs. Howland and himself, and declared the Exhibition open. Three cheers were given His Honor on concluding.
