



BON VOYAGE, BUT...

Canadians love to travel. Each year we make more than 90 million trips abroad for both business and pleasure. The vast majority of these excursions go off without a hitch.

But unfortunately all trips don't come with a hassle-free guarantee. Accidents, illnesses, legal problems and linguistic and cultural difficulties do occur.

Most problems are minor and you can usually solve them yourself. But if you run into more serious obstacles, our Canadian missions are there to assist you.

If you're sick, in trouble or have lost your passport, our missions will do all they can to smooth your way.

Bon Voyage, But... will help you plan ahead. Read it before you book your next business trip or vacation abroad. And pack it in your luggage — it's a handy reference book of travel tips, important phone numbers and addresses of Canadian missions around the world. A companion publication, Crossing the 49th, gives Canadian travellers specific information about travel to the United States. For more information on ordering this free booklet and others, turn to page 31.

PART ONE: BEFORE YOU GO

Preparation is the key to a successful trip. By doing your homework before you leave, you minimize your chances of something going wrong.

Learn About Your Destination

Before you board that airplane or train, take the time to learn about the political, cultural and economic environment of your destination. Learn at least a few key phrases in the country's language. Even a modest command of the local language will go a long way.

When you're travelling, the laws of the country you're visiting apply to you too. **Never** assume that because you're a Canadian citizen you're immune to foreign laws.

Some countries experience ongoing wars, insurgencies or sporadic unrest. Find out if your destination is known to be dangerous. Check with the Department of Foreign Affairs and International Trade before you leave:

- Call the Department's Consular Affairs Bureau in Ottawa at 1-800-267-6788 (in Canada only) or (613) 944-6788 (if you're in Ottawa or abroad) for travel information reports. These reports will give you background information on security and political conditions, health conditions and entry requirements (e.g. if you need a visa) for foreign countries. Information is no further than your fingertips seven days a week, 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. If you would like to receive information by fax, dial 1-800-575-2500 and follow the instructions. In Ottawa, call (613) 944-2500.
- You can also find this information on the Internet. Our World Wide Web address is: http://www.dfait-maeci.gc.ca
- If you're abroad, contact the nearest Canadian mission.
 Addresses and telephone numbers are listed at the end of this booklet.

❖ To reduce your long distance costs when travelling, you may wish to use Canada Direct, an operator-assisted long distance service that allows you to place calls to Canada or to other countries via a bilingual Canadian operator. For a list of all the Canada Direct access numbers, call 1-800-561-8868 (toll-free in Canada). They are also available on page 62 of this booklet.

While you are abroad, tune in to Radio Canada International (RCI) for the latest news. RCI also broadcasts messages from the Canadian government during emergency situations. A schedule of times and frequency of broadcasts to different parts of the world can be obtained by calling the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation at (416) 205-3311 in Toronto. Ask to be connected to RCI. In Montreal, call (514) 597-7555.

Make Sure Your Passport Is in Order

Your passport is the best proof of your Canadian citizenship. You and all family members should have a valid passport if you plan to travel outside Canada. If you have any questions about passports, call 1-800-567-6868. Locally you can call: in Toronto. (416) 973-3251; in Ottawa-Hull, (613) 994-3500; in Vancouver. (604) 775-6250: or in Montreal. (514) 283-2152.

Applications for Canadian passports may be obtained at passport offices. Canadian missions, travel agencies, and at the nearest Northern Store in northern communities. Allow at least three weeks for delivery.

If your passport is due to expire within the next six months. check with your destination's embassy or consulate in Canada for their rules and restrictions regarding passport validity and expiration. Some countries will not let you enter if your passport is within six months of expiring.

Before you leave on your trip, be sure to complete the "In case of accident or death notify" section in your passport. This will help us quickly notify your family or friends if an emergency situation arises.

Make a photocopy of your passport's identification page and keep it separate from the original when you travel. For added security, leave a photocopy with a friend or relative at home. These simple steps may speed the replacement process if you lose your passport.

If your passport is lost or stolen while you are travelling. contact the nearest Canadian mission immediately for a replacement after reporting the loss or theft to the local police. Make sure you get a copy of the police report or the report number. Before a new passport can be issued, you must complete an application form, produce written evidence of your Canadian citizenship (e.g. a birth or citizenship certificate), produce a copy of the police report or report number, present new photographs and pay the required fee.

Do You Need a Visa?

You need a visa to travel to certain countries. Your travel agent or the country's embassy or consulate in Canada can advise you of the requirements. You can also call Foreign Affairs' Emergency Services at 1-800-267-6788 (toll-free in Canada) or (613) 944-6788 for travel information and reports.

Apply for visas well in advance of your trip.

When you arrive at your destination, be prepared to prove that you have enough money to support yourself during your stay.

- Be aware of the rules and restrictions governing visas and your length of stay. This knowledge can save you both time and money.
- Some countries will only allow you to enter if you can prove you will be leaving — be prepared to show your return or onward ticket or any visas that demonstrate you plan to visit another country.

Schengen Convention Countries

Visitors to Belgium, Spain, France, Germany, The Netherlands, Luxembourg and Portugal (Schengen Convention countries)

should obtain an official entry stamp in their passports either when they first arrive or within 72 hours. This entry stamp allows you to stay for longer than three days or visit the other Schengen countries. Failure to register with the proper authorities may result in fines and/or deportation. If you would like further information about the entry requirements for Schengen countries, contact their embassies or consulates in Canada before you depart.

Charter Flights

Before you book a charter flight to your destination, check out both the travel agency's and the charter company's credentials with either the Better Business Bureau or a local consumer advisory organization.

Dual Nationality

To avoid unpleasant surprises, find out whether you, your spouse, or any other family member are citizens of another country. If you are considered a "national," you may be compelled to do military service or pay special taxes. Your child custody arrangements in Canada may not be recognized. In extreme cases, you or your child may not be allowed to leave. Check your status with the country's embassy or consular mission in Canada before you travel. In regard to custody questions, contact Foreign Affairs' Consular Case Management division at 1-800-267-6788 (in Canada) or (613) 944-6788.

If you do run into problems because of your dual nationality, contact the nearest Canadian mission immediately.

People with Special Needs

Many countries do not provide access for people in wheelchairs or make allowances for those with special hearing, sight or other physical requirements. Contact your local access organization or talk to others who have travelled to your destination in the past. There are also several guides BON VOYAGE, BUT...

published about international travel and people with special needs. Check your local library or bookstore.

Medical Advice is Important

Your family physician or a travel medical clinic are good sources of medical advice. If you are being treated for an illness or are taking medication, ask your doctor before you leave if there are any special precautions you should take during your trip.

For a list of travel medical clinics in Canada, call the Canadian Society for International Health at (613) 230-2654.


Health Canada's Laboratory Centre for Disease Control (LCDC) provides travel health information through the Internet (http://www.hwc.ca/hpb/lcdc) and through a fax retrieval system. FAXIink. To access FAXIink, call (613) 941-3900 using the handset of your fax machine and follow the instructions.

Vaccinations

Before travelling to any destination, find out well in advance of your trip if you need any special vaccinations or preventive medications for such illnesses as yellow fever, typhoid. meningitis, Japanese encephalitis, hepatitis or malaria. For instance, a meningococcal vaccination is required for pilgrims travelling to Mecca, Saudi Arabia, for the annual Haji. And an International Certificate of Vaccination for yellow fever may be a legal requirement to enter certain countries. Your doctor, local office of the Canadian Society for International Health, LCDC FAXlink service, (613) 941-3900 or LCDC Web site. http://www.hwc.ca/hpb/icdc can provide you with this information.

Start your vaccination shots at least three months before you leave. In some cases, you may need several inoculations with waiting periods between each injection.

Make sure that your routine immunizations are up to date. If you weren't exposed to certain diseases as a child, or weren't immunized, you could be at an increased risk of acquiring



diseases such as tetanus, diphtheria, polio, measles, mumps or rubella (German measles). All adults should ensure they're protected from tetanus and diphtheria by receiving a booster shot every 10 years.

If you're travelling with infants or small children, you may need to arrange an alternate or accelerated childhood immunization schedule for them. Talk to your pediatrician, family doctor or travel medical clinic.

AIDS

AIDS/HIV is a global disease. Some countries require proof of AIDS testing. Have the test conducted and obtain the results **before** you travel. Call Health Canada at **(613) 957-8739** to find out if the country you plan to visit requires this documentation.

When travelling, take all the same precautions you do at home. Do not assume that condoms will be readily available. Even if they are, they may not meet the safety standards set by the World Health Organization.

Remember: Using intravenous drugs is not only illegal but extremely risky — especially if you share needles.

Medication

If you take medication, be sure to pack an extra supply just in case you're away for longer than expected. Carrying a duplicate of your original prescription is highly recommended — especially when travelling to countries that are particularly sensitive about drugs. Also, carry an extra prescription that lists both the generic and trade names of the drug, just in case your medication is lost or stolen. This is also a good idea if you wear glasses or contact lenses — having the prescription makes it easier to replace them.

Do not try to save luggage space by combining medications into a single container. Keep all medications in the original, labelled container to avoid problems.

Find out whether your medication is sold in the country you are visiting. Also check to see that it is legal. Some over-the-counter medications in Canada are illegal in other countries or

require a prescription. Obtaining a note from your doctor that states the medical reasons for your prescription and recommended dosage as required is also encouraged.

If you need syringes for a medical condition such as diabetes, it is very important that you take along an appropriate supply. As well, you should carry a medical certificate that shows they are for medical use.

If you have a pre-existing medical condition that could present a problem while you're travelling, it's wise to wear a Medic Alert bracelet. Through their Foundation, your vital medical facts become part of a database that can be accessed 24 hours a day from anywhere in the world. Call **1-800-825-3785** for membership information.

Pregnancy

If you are pregnant, talk to your doctor if you plan to travel abroad. Some vaccinations may not be recommended. Also, check your travel and health insurance plans carefully to ensure they cover health complications arising from pregnancy.

Upon Your Return

If you have been ill while abroad or become ill upon return, contact your doctor immediately. Be able to provide your physician with the specifics of any treatment you received while you were away, as well as where you were travelling.

If you have a fever or a flu-like illness upon your return see your physician as soon as possible, especially if you've just returned from an area where malaria is common. You can help your doctor by telling him/her the countries you visited.

Supplemental Health Insurance

Don't rely on your provincial health plan to pick up the tab if you get sick or are injured while you're abroad. At best, your health plan will cover only a portion of the bill. It's your responsibility to obtain and understand the terms of your supplementary insurance policies. Some credit cards offer their holders

health and travel insurance. Don't assume the card alone provides adequate coverage.

Be sure to ask whether or not your policy:

- Has an in-house worldwide emergency hotline you can call if you're in trouble. Check to see if it is open 24 hours a day, seven days a week; whether the operators are multilingual; and if nurses or physicians are on-staff.
- Pays foreign hospital and related medical costs, and if so, whether it pays "up front" or expects you to pay and be reimbursed later.
- Provides for your medical evacuation to Canada.
- Pays for any required medical escort (doctor/nurse) to accompany you back to Canada.
- Excludes pre-existing medical conditions. If such conditions exist, notify your insurance company and get an agreement in writing that you are covered for these conditions. Otherwise, you could find your claim "null and void" under a pre-existing condition clause.
- Covers premature births and related neonatal care.
- Allows for cash advances if a hospital accepts only such payment.
- Pays for the preparation and return to Canada of your remains should you die while travelling.

Carry details of your insurance with you. Also, tell your travel agent, a friend or relative at home and your travelling companion how to contact your insurer.

Get a detailed invoice from the doctor or hospital before you leave the country. There is nothing more frustrating than trying to get the proper paperwork from thousands of kilometres away.

Remember to always **submit original receipts** for any medical services or prescriptions you received while travelling abroad. Most insurance companies will not accept copies or faxes.

Other Insurance

Lost luggage, theft of your purse or wallet, or flight cancellations can happen to you. These annoyances can cause major disruptions when they take place in a foreign country. Think about purchasing a travel insurance package that will compensate you for such inconveniences.

Travelling by Car?

Keep in mind that each country has its own driving regulations. You may be required to obtain an international driver's licence or additional insurance. Be sure to learn the local rules of the road before you get behind the wheel. In some countries, the driver may be detained and questioned by the police even though only material damages (such as a fender-bender) have occurred. Country-specific insurance must be purchased for travel by car to Mexico and Central America. This is usually available at border crossings. For specific information on driving in the United States, consult *Crossing the 49th* (see page 31 for details on ordering this booklet).

Money Matters

Canadian currency and traveller's cheques in Canadian dollars are not always widely accepted. Before you leave Canada, consult a bank or a foreign currency agent to find out the most appropriate currency to carry. Traveller's cheques in the appropriate currency or in U.S. dollars are often the safest and most convenient option. It's a good idea to have a small amount of the local money on hand when you first arrive, unless the importation of local currency is a crime. There may be restrictions on taking money in and out of the country. Check with the foreign embassies or consulates in Canada or with your travel agent about currency regulations in the countries you plan to visit.

Don't rely exclusively on banking machine cards or credit cards. They are not necessarily honoured internationally.

Women Travelling Solo

Unfortunately, a woman travelling alone can face additional problems, including sexual overtures. If you're travelling by yourself, either for business or pleasure, keep in mind the following precautions:

- Because women are often a target for street crime, be extra vigilant when you're out alone. Stay in well-lit, safe areas where there are other people.
- Dress appropriately and don't wear expensive jewellery or flash large sums of money.
- * Make sure your hotel is sensitive to your needs. Ensure that no secondary room key will be given to anyone, even if they say they're travelling with you. If possible, book a room close to the elevator and ask the bellhop to check your room before you enter. Ensure that the locks on your windows and doors are working properly and that the lighting in your room and in the hallway is adequate. More and more hotels are recognizing the importance and clout of women travellers. Try to stay at hotels that are known for looking after your concerns.
- When out and about, be aware of your surroundings and situation at all times.

Her Own Way: Practical Tips & Advice for the Canadian Woman Traveller provides information for women travellers. See page 31 for how to order this booklet. There are also other books that cover the concerns of women travellers and that offer helpful travel tips. Check with your local bookstore or library before you go.

Travelling with Children

If you're travelling to another country with your child and there is a possibility of a custody dispute developing while you're away, you should talk to a lawyer before leaving home. A special publication, *International Child Abductions: A Manual*

for Parents is available from Foreign Affairs. See page 31 for details on how to order this publication.

If a person younger than 18 is travelling alone or with only one parent or another adult, notarized documentation certifying that the trip is permitted by both parents should be carried.

Have a Great Trip, But Before You Go...

- Do your research. Learn about the country you plan to visit. Learn a few phrases in the local language.
- Arrange supplementary health insurance and travel insurance.
- Carry proof of insurance coverage, and give a copy to someone at home.
- Draw up a flexible itinerary and budget. Leave a copy at home.
- Make sure your passport hasn't expired and is valid for six months beyond the time of your trip. Photocopy the identification page and keep it separate from your passport. Leave another copy with somebody at home. Fill out the "In case of accident or death notify" section in your passport.
- Make sure you have any visas you need.
- Find out whether or not you or any members of your family are considered nationals of any of the countries you plan to visit.
- Have any vaccinations required. If you are taking medication with you, make sure you keep it in its original container. Carry a doctor's prescription for any controlled drugs, and if you use syringes, carry a medical certificate. Leave copies at home as well.
- Keep the original receipts for any purchases you make, as well as your hotel bill, rental car agreement and medical service bills.

- If you are female and travelling alone, take extra precautions to ensure your safety.
- Review all child custody arrangements if you're travelling with a child. If your child is travelling alone, have him/her carry documentation stating that the trip is permitted by both parents.
- Ensure that any plant and animal products you plan to bring back are acceptable to Canada. Travelling pets may require shots and special permits (at a fee). See page 26 for more information and check with a local office of the Canadian Food Inspection Agency.
- Don't forget to pack this booklet. It could help you more than you can imagine.

PART TWO: ASSISTANCE IS AVAILABLE

Register at the Canadian Mission

If your stay is longer than three months in one country, it is recommended that you formally register at the nearest Canadian mission. This will help us contact you in case of an emergency or crisis. Registration is voluntary and the information you provide is not shared with any other part of the Canadian government. Registration is not usually available in the countries of Western Europe, Japan, Australia, New Zealand and the United States.

In countries where Canada has no direct representation, there may be arrangements in place for you to register with another country's embassy or consulate. For instance, Canada has a formal reciprocal agreement with Australia.

Consular Assistance

Canada's missions abroad are ready to help you in case of an emergency. In some instances, there may be a fee for services.

What can we do for you?

- We can contact, at your request, your relatives or friends and ask them to send you emergency funds.
- We can help you during emergencies such as natural disasters and civil and military uprisings.
- We can direct you to sources of information about local laws, regulations, cultural customs and how to obtain visas.
- We can assist with medical emergencies.
- If you are arrested, we can try to ensure equitable treatment under local laws. At your request, we can inform relatives and friends about your arrest and try to ensure that legal rights and processes are extended to you consistent with the standards of the host country. However, we cannot set aside local laws if you are charged with an offence, nor intervene in the judicial process of a foreign country. We cannot post bail, pay for a lawyer or pay your fines.
- If you wish, we can notify your next of kin regarding accidents or deaths and let them know whether, and how, they can help.

Check the listings at the end of this booklet for information about the Canadian missions in the countries you plan to visit.

Emergency Consular Services

Canadian missions offer 24-hour assistance. During nonoffice hours, an answering machine will take your message or your call will be directed to a consular officer in Ottawa, depending upon local arrangements. The machines are monitored by a duty officer. It is essential that you leave a clear and detailed message, including a telephone number where you can be reached. Duty officers worldwide as well as consular officers in Ottawa are remarkably successful at providing emergency assistance.

In an emergency, you can also make a collect call to Foreign Affairs in Ottawa at **(613) 996-8885.** Use the *Canada Direct* service if it is available.

In some areas where Canada doesn't have a fully established mission, you may obtain emergency consular assistance from the Australian or British missions. Though not equipped to provide you with the same range of services as fully established Canadian missions, they can assist you in an emergency.

Consular Assistance Around the Globe

A list identifying where you may seek consular assistance abroad is provided at the back of this book.

Please remember that addresses and telephone numbers may change. Should you fail to reach a mission through the number listed in this booklet, call the local operator for the new number.

PART THREE: WHILE TRAVELLING

Foreign Laws and Customs

When you're travelling in a foreign country, familiarize yourself with the way of life there. Respect that country's laws, religions, culture, class structure and economic conditions. Though you may not personally agree with some of their beliefs, remember that you are a visitor.

In many countries, appropriate attire — for both sexes — is very important. In some countries, laws govern what men and women can and cannot wear in public. Penalties for disobeying local laws can be quite severe.

Be especially respectful of temples, mosques, churches, synagogues and other religious sites. Many of these areas are off-limits to foreigners or people who are not members of that faith. Ask permission before taking photographs of religious artifacts or buildings.

Not everybody likes to have his or her picture taken. Local people may resent you for taking their photograph or they may demand money for the picture after it has been taken. Always ask first.

Never take photographs of military facilities, a harbour where naval vessels are docked or industrial installations such as oil refineries. You may lose your film and your camera, and could even come under suspicion of espionage.

Take Precautions

The same rules apply abroad as at home, only more so. Foreigners are usually at greater risk than locals. In many countries foreigners are specifically targeted. Do not wander into unknown areas. Find out how safe they are first. Do not pick up hitchhikers or cross borders with people you have just met. Watch your luggage and make sure it is locked — never take anything, even an envelope, across a border for someone eise.

Do not flash large amounts of money or expensive jewellery in public. Use a money belt or a case with concealed sections for valuables. Dress appropriately.

Leave a copy of your itinerary with someone at home so that they can contact you in case of an emergency. Phone home, particularly if you have promised family members or friends that you would do so. We receive thousands of calls every year from worried family members or friends who have not received a promised call.

Keep a separate record of your traveller's cheques and credit cards. Never carry your passport, travel tickets, identification documents, cash, credit cards and insurance papers together. If you do so, you risk being left with no identification or funds.

Use the safety deposit box at your hotel. Never leave valuables in your room.

Illegal Drugs

Drug use and trafficking are prohibited in all countries, even though drugs are readily available and openly used in some places. Most countries impose heavy fines and long prison sentences for possession and trafficking.



In some countries, possession of even small amounts of drugs carries the death penalty.

Never transport any parcel that isn't yours across a border.

Choose your travelling companions wisely. Never cross a border with a hitchhiker or as a hitchhiker. Though you may not be carrying anything illegal, your companions may be

Sexual Exploitation of Children

The Government of Canada has proposed amendments to the Criminal Code of Canada that would permit the arrest and prosecution of Canadians in Canada for the sexual exploitation of children in other countries. At the time of publication of this booklet, the changes to the Criminal Code were still before Parliament. Most countries are now enacting legislation, or more vigorously enforcing existing laws, concerning the sexual exploitation of children. The penalties are severe.

Crime and Punishment

More than 1,400 Canadians are currently imprisoned abroad for various offences — 60 per cent of those are in the United States.

The laws and customs of countries around the world can be very different from those in Canada. Ignorance of those laws is no defence.

While in a foreign country, you are subject to its laws and regulations. Your Canadian citizenship offers no immunity. Canadian consular staff abroad must also follow the rules of the host country. If you do find yourself in trouble, they can help you find a lawyer, contact your family and friends, and ensure that you receive fair treatment according to the standards of that country. However, they cannot pull any strings to reduce your sentence or fine.

Judicial Process

Never assume that the legal system of the country you're visiting is the same as at home. "Innocent until proven guilty" isn't a universally recognized concept. In some countries, you may not even have the right to legal representation or a trial in your mother tongue.

Some countries don't recognize or respect religious freedom, freedom of association, speech or the press, or equality of the sexes. For instance, guilt by association is presumed in some countries. This means that you may be charged simply for being in the company of a person suspected or found guilty of a crime.

Even if you're an innocent bystander at a demonstration or riot you may be considered a participant and rounded up with those involved. Your Canadian citizenship does not grant you immunity.

If you do find yourself in legal trouble, contact the nearest Canadian mission immediately. If you cannot do so yourself, have someone else do it for you.

Mail

If you are travelling for an extended period of time, you can arrange to have your mail sent to a post office box or, where possible, to the nearest Canadian mission. In the latter case, the mission will hold on to letter-size mail (not parcels) for you to pick up **in person**. This mail cannot be forwarded to another address.

Travel to the United States

Because of our close relationship with our neighbours to the south, we sometimes forget that we're visiting a foreign country. The same preparations should be made for visiting the United States as for travelling to any other country. And it should be remembered that U.S. laws and customs are different from ours at home.

Always carry your Canadian passport, citizenship or birth certificate when you're travelling to the United States. A driver's licence is not valid proof of citizenship.

When travelling to the United States, keep in mind that:

- As soon as you stop at the U.S. border, you are subject to U.S. law. Immigration laws in the United States refuse entry to people with a criminal record, among others.
- What you say in answer to the immigration or customs officer can be used against you if you are considered to be, for any reason, inadmissible.
- When a person is refused entry, the information is entered in a computer; if another entry is attempted, the person may be subject to fines and/or vehicle seizure.

PART FOUR: RETURNING TO CANADA

Departure Tax

Some countries impose a departure tax or service fee at the airport or point of departure. Prior to leaving such a country, make sure you set aside enough money, in local funds, to pay this tax.

Canadian Food Inspection Agency: Be Aware and Declare

A single sausage illegally brought into Canada caused footand-mouth disease, destroying cattle and costing Canadians more than \$1 billion. Every year, thousands of travellers fail to declare things like cheese, meat, animal hides, live birds, plants and fruit. These items may carry pests and diseases, and pose a risk to human health.

Foreign pests and diseases could destroy Canada's crops and forests, and wipe out our livestock, thus threatening our

harm Canada. Travelling pets may require shots and special permits (at a fee).

ability to produce food and a multi-billion dollar export trade critical to Canada's economic well-being.

We need to protect our country. Canadian law says you **must** declare all plant and animal products you bring back. It restricts and prohibits entry of products that could harm Canada's agriculture and forestry or pose a danger to human health and safety. To enforce these laws, we have Canadian inspectors with dogs trained to sniff out plant and animal products.

As of April 1, 1997, all federally mandated food inspection and quarantine services will be consolidated in a single government agency, called the Canadian Food Inspection Agency. Before you leave Canada, call a local office of the Agency for more information.

Canada Customs and Import Controls

You must declare everything acquired abroad, whether purchases for yourself or gifts, as well as goods bought at a Canadian or foreign duty-free store. Keep your original receipts for possible inspection.

If you've been away from Canada for 24 hours, you may claim C\$50 worth of goods, excluding alcohol and tobacco, duty-free. After 48 hours, you may claim C\$200. You can now claim the C\$500 exemption including alcohol and tobacco, any time you have been away from Canada for seven days or longer.

Certain goods are restricted from entering Canada. If you are considering importing meat or dairy products, weapons, plants, vehicles, or exotic animals or products made from their skins or feathers, please contact Canada Customs beforehand for guidance.

Obscene materials, hate propaganda, most weapons including firearms, and goods harmful to the environment are prohibited from entering Canada.

If you have any questions about what you can bring home, call your local Canada Customs office. Someone is available 24 hours a day,

In co-operation with over 130 countries, Canada is committed to protecting some 40,000 plant and animal species. Before bringing any item made from them into Canada (even if you owned it before leaving), know the rules.

You risk losing the item, prosecution and fines up to \$150,000.

Illegal Souvenirs

While travelling outside Canada, you may decide to purchase souvenirs. Unfortunately, many attractive items sold in foreign countries are made from endangered plants or animals.

Crocodile-skin briefcases and wallets, python-skin boots, ivory bracelets and carvings, coral earrings, cactus rainsticks, tortoise shells, orchids and parrots are some of the more common items illegally brought back to Canada. These items are included in the more than 40,000 species of wild animals and plants regulated under the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES). Under Canada's Wild Animal and Plant Protection and Regulation of International and Interprovincial Trade Act (WAPPRIITA), a violation of CITES could lead to seizure of your purchase, as well as stiff penalties of up to \$150,000 and/or prison terms of up to five years.

The same rules apply if you already own an item made from a controlled wild animal or plant and you wish to take it out of Canada. Since other countries also have strict laws, it's safer to leave these items at home.

After Residing Abroad

After a stay abroad of more than a year, there are special import provisions for household items and personal belongings when you move back to Canada. Information is contained in the







HOW TO USE CANADA DIRECT

Calling from a touch-tone phone:

- Refer to the chart for the Canada Direct access number for the country you are in. Call Canada from any country listed. And call country-to-country from any of the shaded countries.
- If you are in a hotel, follow hotel instructions to get an outside line. (Canada) **Direct** is provided to hotels toll-free. Some hotels may apply a surcharge to each call regardless. Check with the hotel administration to determine if surcharges are applied.)
- Dial the Canada Direct access number.
- Follow the voice prompts to select language choice and method of payment. (Never give a credit card number). You may use a Calling Card or Call-Me[™] service. Or, you may select "2" to place a call using a HELLO!™ Phone Pass or "0" to call Canada collect. To speak to a Canada Direct operator, press "0" at any time during the voice prompts.
- If you are using a Calling Card, you may place up to five calls in a row without hanging up - simply press # after each call, then follow the voice prompts.
- For fax calls, pick up the handset and follow steps 2 5. For modem calls, refer to the Canada Direct web site for intructions: www.stentor.ca/canada direct.

Calling from a rotary-dial phone

Follow steps 1 - 3, then wait for the Canada Direct operator to answer your call. You may use a Calling Card or HELLO!™ Phone Pass to place calls anywhere, or you may call collect to Canada.

Calls to Canada are billed at Canadian international rates. Time-of-day discounts apply, based on the time and day in Canada (except for calls from the U.S., which are based on the time of day in the calling location). *TelePlus Overseas*™ Real Plus™ and Advantage™ discounts also apply on Calling Card and Call-Me™ service calls.
