PREFACE

This Book of Devotion, which is issued by authority of the General Assembly, is designed to provide devotional aids to worship in the home. The hope is that it will not only supply prayers, simple, heartfelt, and reverent, for family use, but that itwill also awaken a prayerful spirit which will in course of time create its own forms of

expression.

The first place has been given to fourteen prayers, seven for the mornings and seven for the evenings of the week. These form the kernel of the book and are intended to become familiar to the members of the household as showing them the wide range of human needs, and some of the best ways of expressing them. Each of the prayers in this division has been kept within the strictest limit as to length, and the ever-recurring wants of family life in our day have been kept constantly in view.

A selection of short devotional sentences from Scripture is prefixed to each of the prayers. These are brief, and for the most part ejaculatory utterances, intended to kindle a devotional spirit and prepare the

way for the rest of the service.

The prayers in the second division of the book are meant to meet the wants of those who would, on occasion, prefer to vary a little

the daily service. Here will be found, on the one hand, prayers by the great masters of the spiritual life in past generations, and on the other hand, some prayers of our own day. One or two of the latter are more social than personal in their spirit and content. The prayers in this part are also arranged for morning and evening, although

the days of the week are not specified.

The third division is made up of short occasional prayers, connected with or arising from special events and experiences of the family life. It also includes prayers circling round the cardinal events in Gospel history, such as the Birth, Death, Resurrection, and Ascension of our Lord, and the Descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. Here will be found also prayers for the Missionary and Educational work of the Church, for the Nation and Commonweal, together with Children's Prayers, and forms of Grace before meat.

A valuable part of the book is the list of readings from Scripture for every day in the year. In this list the name of the book, the number of the chapter, and the verses in which the lesson for the day is to be found, are set down in detail. An apposite title suggesting the main gist of the selected lesson has been given in every case, and it is important that this should be announced before the passage of Scripture is read. A list of Psalms and Hymns

has been added from the Book of Praise, to aid in choosing the hymn to be used. This completes the devotional aids to Family Worship which have been deemed most helpful and necessary.

In the preparation of the prayers, in the selection of portions of Scripture to be read and hymns to be sung, we have followed carefully thought-out principles, which have been tested in practice and found to work satisfactorily. But in using this book yourself, bear in mind that the circumstances within our homes are very varied, and that it may be necessary to make little changes or adjustments to meet these conditions. example, if you have not found it possible to. have prayers in the morning, before or after breakfast, then try to secure a few minutes after the evening meal, if need be without leaving the table. Be brief—never more than eight, or less than three minutes—and let all take a part in the service as far as possible, in prayer, or hymn, or responsive reading, or by reading in unison. Be sincere, at the same time bright and natural, and keep in mind that you are entering into the Great Father's presence, and in thought and feeling try to bring your children and friends with In using a book such as this, there must of necessity be repetition, but avoid monotony in tone or manner, and let the

fresh feeling of the heart inspire every word. Then you and your household will have some high moments with God and with one another, and the level of life in your home will be lifted nearer heaven.

The manuscript of this volume was prepared some years ago by the General Assembly's Committee on 'Public Worship and Aids to Devotion', of which the Rev. W. Farquharson, D.D., was then Convener; but owing to war conditions publication had to be postponed till the present year. Thanks are due to the Rev. J. M. E. Ross, M.A., London, Eng., for assistance in reading proofs for the press.

We send forth the Book of Family Devotion with the earnest hope and prayer that it may help our people to give God the central place in their home life; for it is in the home where Christ is honored that all the highest interests of the world find their first and best nourishment, and men and women their most enduring lessons of love and patience, self-sacrifice and tender forbearance.






