OUR FUTURE BRITAIN'S NOT PERMANENTLY FIXED

Editorial Comments on Speech of Member for South York on Canada's Future Status.

The World repeats herewith editorial comments from The Globe and The London Advertiser on recent utterances of W. F. Maclearen in Parliament on the future of the empire. The Globe said on Tuesday under the heading "Sam's Hegemony":
The Ottawa correspondent of The Boston Transcript makes W. F. Maclearen's recent utterances in Parliament the chief subject of a letter to his paper. Any review of the empire is always desirable in United States newspaper offices, and there can be no doubt that Mr. Maclearen's speech was furnished with so succulent a morsel as Mr. Maclearen's speech in the House of Commons. "For the disappearance of the governor-general, when Canada will be an independent state under the laws of Great Britain." He went on to say that the "trend of public thought in the time will be in the direction of establishing a British empire made up of free and independent states under the crown of England, and working, not through a great imperial system, but through negotiations between the governments of these free states."

Mr. Maclearen's declarations supply a text for the correspondent, and he does not see that the big republic brother should not sit at the world-wide Round Table of the future. He is not to be on a footing of equality with other persons of the same rank. Oh, no! The correspondent translates the fact into charmingly simple language. He says there are three independent Powers? More and more, as the big brother grew mightier and wealthier, the smaller states were being gradually, kindly, happily, the hegemony of the big brother was being established, and get somehow in course of the next generation or two.

That soothing language is soon abandoned, however, when the subject of the speech with the club is revealed to us. "Early in the afternoon of the 2nd inst. the correspondent dropping into a sanitary mood, would seem the best way to accomplish that devotion of precedence without danger that it may arrive thru some channel, and be a calamity to mankind."

It is evident that if we do not gracefully acquiesce in the "hegemony" of the world leader gives notice that he would cut up your throat, but that he is not so bold, rather than submit to being a mere equal of the big brother, who would get something in course of the next generation or two.

Any Canadian has the right to discuss the future of his country. Indeed, the only people who have the privilege are the Maclearen's Conservative colleagues in and out of Parliament. 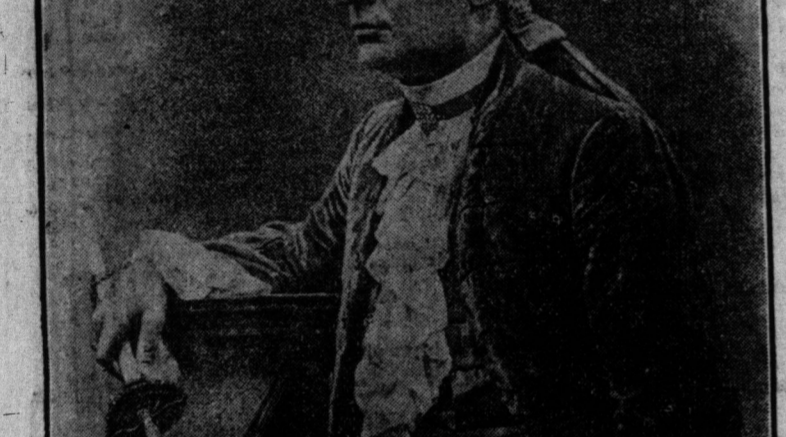

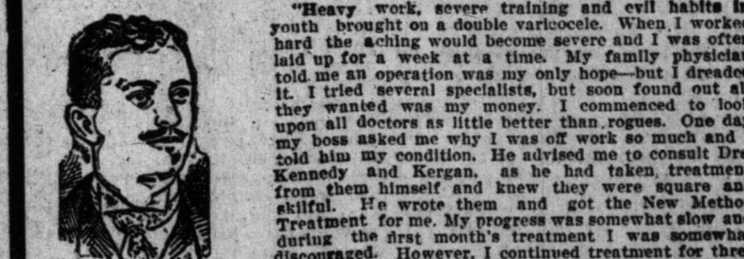

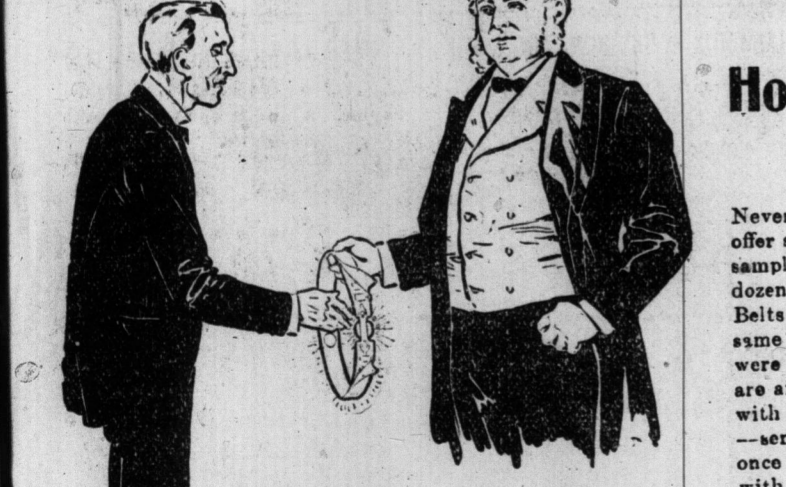

July and some selling of May for Armour dominated the trade in wheat during the possibilities of security during the winter. Modern Miller reports were entirely bullish, and it sustained the position of the Armour house in taking on the later delivery, as it pronounced the winter plant impaired by cold and peculiar weather and much damage done. The zero weather of the last week in January, Minnesota described the cash situation as being the best of the crop.

Market refused to move either way, and the situation is quiet. There was a big crop, but marketings at primary points are light, and the country is inclined to hold. Railroad reports of 3,000,000 bushels exported showed a big spurt in shipments abroad, but total for the crop year is still a million less than for same period last year.

On May oats had a few friends and sold at 90c. Demand for short section was fair. Attempts to depress values radically has evidently failed for the time being.

Provisions—Hog receipts were very light and shipments of lard were heavy, but rest of the list were dull. Consistent when run of hogs will dry up is still unproved, and stock in store here are limited.

The "long room" appointments are expected to be completed in the near future. The floor will be tiled, and marble facings will set off the counters. The addition of the examining warehouse is nearing completion. Mr. McMichael, in speaking of this department, gave a glowing report of no change or removal would be necessary for another five years.
