# THIRTY-SIXTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

## University Lying-in Hospital,

Submitted to the Meeting of Subscribers, 25th June, 1880.

The COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT of the UNIVERSITY LYING-IN HOSPITAL, in presenting the following Report of the affairs of that Institution for the past year, have much pleasure in stating that the highly important objects for which it was originally established, namely: to afford a comfortable home for poor married and unfortunate women during their confinement; to afford facilities for the practical study of midwifery, and thus to improve the knowledge of that science in the Dominion, have been faithfully and successfully carried out.

The number of patients admitted during the year just closed was 101. Of these, there were:—

The number of students who during the year availed themselves of the advantages presented by the Hospital for the practical study of this important branch of their profession was forty-nine.

Two deaths occurred in the Hospital during the year.

Your Committee regret that they have not been able to take any steps towards the erection of a suitable building for the purposes of this charity. In consequence of the prevailing financial depression they did not feel warranted at this time in making an appeal to the public for the necessary pecuniary aid. Increased accommodation has, however, been provided for private cases.

Provision has been made for the attendance of poor married women in their own homes in accordance with the original By-laws of the Hospital. It is felt that this will prove very beneficial to many of the deserving poor.

To the Reverend Gentlemen of the Seminary, and to the Directors of the City and District Savings Bank, the grateful thanks of the Committee are due for their generous donations.

The government grant, \$480.00, has been received this year.

The names of the following ladies were proposed and added to the committee: Mesdames, Reford, Dawson, Macrae, Carsley, Guy, Brayley and Browne.

The Committee beg to return their grateful thanks to Drs. MacCallum and Browne for their attention during the year.

In recognition of her faithful service during the past year, a gratuity of \$30 was unanimously voted to the matron, Mrs. Smillie.
