THE MIRAMICHI FIRE.

(From Cooney's History of New Brunswick)

Six Thousand Square Miles of Flame.

Four Thriving Towns and Many Settlements Utterly Destroyed.

Nearly Two Hundred Persons Burned or Drowned.

The summer of 1825 was unusually warm in both hemispheres, particularly in America, where the effects were vastly visible in the prevalence of epidemic diseases.

During July and August, extensive fires raged in different parts of Nova Scotia, especially in the eastern division of the Peninsula, but the country being generally cleared for a considerable distance round the settlements and villages, little injury was sustained.

In Miramichi, and throughout the northern part of New Brunswick, the season had been remarkably dry; scarcely any rain had fallen, and considerable apprehensions were entertained for the crops.

The elements had been unusually dry and unseasonable had prevailed. The protracted drought of the summer acting upon the aridity of the forests, had rendered them more than usually combustible, and the progress of the fires that appeared in the early part of the season, produced the general calamity.

On the 7th the heat increased to such a degree, and became more oppressive, that the people were obliged to seek shelter in many places. About 12 o'clock a pale smoky mist, lightly tinged with purple, emerged from the forest, and settled in the valley.
