

Permanent Pasture—Practical Points
Collated from Experience.

"All flesh is grass." Grass indirectly feede mankind. It even feeds the soil itself. Anything, therefore, that tends to multiply the blades of grass is the nearest benefit that can be bestowed upon us. A valuable article in the loward Homestead, on pasture lands and grasses, insists strongly on the policy of seeding on the natural surface humus, without ploughing this down. Wherever there is sufficient rainfall to sow on the natural sod with assurance of geranination, it is a tatal mistake to plough. All over the country many of the very best pastures are those that seeded themselves and have been closely grazed; the open commons were free to all. All broken surface, inconvenient for tillage, should be seeded with grasses best suited for the region, including the earlier, later and latest. The native Poa pratensis (Junegrass or Kentucky bluegrass) is both early and late, but fais during the heat of summer. Timothy and the clovers resist the heat best. Orchard grass, which
