LONDON, Aug. 18. Despatches from Belfast to noon today state that the disturbances there continued through Saturday night and into Sunday and were not yet ended.

The populace are divided into a hostile Catholic and Protestant mob. Whenever they come in contact there is a fight.

The police were using every effort to stop rioting. They have been obliged to fire on the rioters on both sides, and many of the latter were wounded.

The troops with fixed bayonets now occupy the principal streets and keep the mobs apart.

The dragons of the 40th Regt. have arrived at Belfast from Dublin, and the Constabulary were pouring into the city from all parts.

No persons are reported killed, but excitement is so great that it is impossible to get definite particulars.

New York, Aug. 19. An epidemic similar to yellow fever is raging in Cartagena, over 5,000 people being attacked but only 800 deaths.

During June 1,500 deaths occurred in Valparaiso, more than half from small pox, which is raging throughout Chili and Peru.
