Shedden.—A most atrocious and heinous murder was committed at the house of Mr. Terence Ferguson on the road to Kingsburg; about seven miles from this city, on Tuesday last. It appears that four men named Leonard, McGeorge, Doyle, and Haley, (some of whom were married and had their wives with them), left town on the morning of that day in waggon for a day's amusement in the country, and having drunk rather freely of poisonous liquors, became abusive and quarrelsome, and insulted several persons on the road; and finally entered Mr. Ferguson's where their behaviour towards him, &c. while musing upon being furnished with liquor, was highly offensive. A man named Bernard Doyle, in the employ of Mr. Ferguson, having interfered, was immediately ordered to death by the ruffians.
