Blockaded by Ice.

Halifax Chronicle, April 21.

Halifax Chroniele, April 21.

It is more than forty years (1852) since the port of Halifax has experienced an ice blockade like that which prevails at present. Navigation inward and outward is virtually at a standatill.

From the mouth of the harbor east as far as the eye can see there is nothing but a field of ice, dotted here and there with lumps that have the appearance of small bergs; in fact, some of them are said to be from 10 to 12 feet high.

This unusual state of things is due to the continuous northeast and east winds that have prevailed for the past fortnight and which have brought weat the heavy guif ice that surrounded the coast of Cape Breton the latter part of March and first week of April. It extends west to the vicinity of Lunenburg.

Six ocean steamers are now overdue here and are all without doubt detained outside by the ice. Six steamers and a large fleet of sailing vessels are also detained in port by the ice. The fog which prevailed last night, and which was doubtless caused by the close proximity of the ice, was the thickest ever known here.


