COUNTY VISITORS

On Thursday last the members of the counties council came by special train to Athens to visit the House of Industry. They were escorted through every department of that institution by Manager Steacy and expressed themselves as delighted with the order and cleanliness everywhere apparent.

On invitation of Co. Councillor M. B. Holmes, reeve of Athens, the party came on to this station, where they were met by Mr. Joseph Thompson, chairman, and Messrs. Beach and Donnelley, trustees of the Model School, and Messrs. W. G. Parish and H. H. Arnold of the High School. They first visited the Model School and assembled in the room devoted to the training of teachers, where they were introduced by Mr. Holmes and warmly welcomed by Principal Burchell. Brief addresses, commending the work of the school, were given by Warden Kidd and Dr. Preston, Chairman of the Educational Committee of the Co. Council, and an able and practical address to the teachers in training was delivered by Mr. Britton. Principal Burchell made fitting acknowledgement of the kind words spoken and, on invitation, Mr. Thompson also spoke briefly.

The party then proceeded to the A.H.S. where they were welcomed by Principal Massey and conducted through the different rooms, finally assembling in the lecture room. Here the students from the other forms were summoned, and it was an inspiring sight to see them fyte in—representatives of the hopes and aspirations of so many homes throughout the country. Warden Kidd, Dr. Preston and Mr. Britton again spoke—the Warden on general lines, Dr. Preston on the need of caring for the health of both teacher and pupils, and Mr. Britton on Education as a source of happiness and remuneration. The addresses were exceedingly practical and were heard with pleasure.

Principal Massey and Mr. Parish replied briefly to the words of praise spoken of the A.H.S., and here, as at the A.M.S., the visit closed with the national anthem, heartily sung by the students. The school "yells" of both the boys and the girls were also given as a demonstration that their vocal organs were being properly trained.

HON. DANIEL DERBYSHIRE

On Saturday last announcement was made that Mr. D. Derbyshire of Brockville had been called to the Senate of Canada—a position for which he is eminently qualified by his business and public career.

He was educated at the Farmer's high school—a school (the Recorder says) that then and has since held a foremost place among the educational institutions of Ontario.
