A Priests Golden Jubilec.

(From the Newfoundlander.)

On Saturday last a brave old News foundland missionary had the happiness of celebrating his Golden Jubilee or tift eth anniversary of his ordination to the priesthood. To many persons in St ohn's, Father Berney is comparatively a stranger, and the works of his early missionary days unknown; but along the western seaboard of Newfound and his name is a household word, and old people are never tired of te.ling us of the difficulties and dangers that beset his elapsed since Father Berney was able to take part in active missionary work, yet counsellor to many; in cases of neces to this office. Father Berney was born in Wexford in the year 1808, and having finished his ecclesiastical studses in Ireland in his Twillingate-Mr. W. T. Roberts. his 23rd year, he came out to this country and was ordained priest on the 24th of September 1831, in the old Roman Titon Harbor-Mr. J. Burke, Sr. Catholic chapel by the sainted Dr Flems

His first mission was to assist Father Yore, of Harbor Grace, as curate, his place of residence being mostly Carbonear and Northern Bay, and whilst there his practical zeal for the glory of God's house showed itself conspicuously. He undertook the erection of a beautiful Conception Harbor-Mr. Kennedy pacious church, the same (if I mistake not) that has served as the pari h church of Carbonear to this day. Before the church was completed be was called away by the Bishop to a wider field of labor, and one be set with much dfliculty In the November of 1833 Father Berney eached Burin, and at onceset himse f to work visiting his extensive pastorate and when it is remembered that the Burin mission then covered many hune aired of m less that by reason of the many islands and complete absence of roads all visitation had to be done in boats and at a wild season of the year; it is not difficult to conclude that Father Berney needed the mantle of the Catholic mis-Florary and the traditionary courage of the black robe to face his arduous work. I have many times heard the old priest tell as a good story, the an wer of Dr. Fleming when asked to define the bouns daries of Burin parish "My dear F: Bers ney;" saie the bishop, 'you can go to Placentia Bay, take your departure from Merasheen Head, and go west as far as you like, or as far as you are able. Besides attending Burin he travelled yearly all over Fortune and Herm tage Bays attended the Indian settlements, and built hand ome chapels in St. Lawrence, Lawn, Beautois and Oderin. In his published account of the visitation of his tiocese in 1842, Dr Fleming pays a hand. some compliment to the zeal and energy that characterised the then young priest.
