An Interesting Paragraph.—The Greeneck (Scotland) Advertiser, has for some time back been publishing every week, extracts from eld copies of the same paper, selected by Mr. Allan Park Paton. In its issue of July the 19th, we find the following paragraph, interesting to Canadians, inserted, copies from the Greenock Advertiser, of December 22nd, 1899:—"Quebeo, Nov 6.—Steamboat.—On Saturday morning, at eight o'clock, arrived from Montreal, being her first trip, the steamboat. "Accommodation," with 10 passengers. This is the first vessel of the kind that ever appeared in our harbor. She is continually enowed by visitants. She left Montreal on Wednesday, at two o'clock, so that her passenge was sixty six hours; thirty of which she was at anchor. She arrived in Three Rivers in twenty-four hour. She has at present borths for twenty passengers; which next year will be considerably augmented. No wind or tide can stop her. She has seventy five feet keel, and eighty five on deck. The price for a passage up is nine dollars; and eight down, the vessel supplying provisions. The great advantage attending a vessel somattructed is, that a passage may be calculated to a degree of certainty, in point of time, which cannot be the case with any vessel propelled by sails only. The steamboat reserves her impulse from an open, double spoked, perpendicular wheel, on each side, without any circular band or rim. If the end of each double spoke is fixed a square board, which enters the water, and by the rotatory motion of the wheel, acts like a paddle. The wheels are put and kept in motion by steam operating within the vessel. A mast is to be fixed in Ler for the purpose of using a sail, when the wind is favorable, which will occasionally accelerate her headway.


