NATURAL GAS EXPLOSION. Two Persons Fatally Burned and Six Seriously Injured.

BRADDOCK, Pa., Nov. 22.—A two-story brick dwelling was blown to pieces here today by an explosion of natural gas. Two persons were fatally burned and six others seriously injured. The accident was caused by a leak in the main. The leakage was discovered last night and this morning Charles Hoeselinger, an employee of the gas company, was sent to repair the trouble. He descended into the basement and almost immediately there was a terrific explosion. The others in the house were taken to the hospital and the bodies of Peter Kelch, wife and six children, the foundation upheaved and the sides and front of the building entirely collapsed. Mrs. Kelch was sick when she was in the street and fatally injured. Her three-day-old babe was not hurt. Hoeselinger was frightfully burned from his head to his feet and will die. Kelch and five children aged from 8 to 11 were thrown into the street or buried in debris. All were seriously injured but will recover.
