The annual championship games of the Amateur Athletic Association of Canada were held Saturday at Rosedale before about 3000 spectators. The Government House party occupied their seats in the grand stand centre, and all the invited guests were present.

The games may be pronounced a success, although many of the spectators were disappointed by the non-appearance of Connel and the other crickers from across the line.

No Canadian records were lowered, although in the 400 yards run A. W. Gifford of Montreal got down to 51.35 seconds, being only 1.25 seconds away from the 100 yards hurdle Fred Puffer of New Jersey went in 16 seconds, only 1.5 of second away. Also in the running broad jump the same athlete covered 21 ft. 7.3-in.

The bicycle races brought by far the most enthusiasm, and Fred Young's victory over Champion Hyslop in the half mile race fairly made the grand stand roar and showed the little wanderer to be a general favorite. The mile event kept the assembly to the last, but this time Hyslop upheld the Toronto's honors and withstood Young's final spurt.

The three-mile walk was the amusing feature of the day and brought out three starters. Dinsen of Toronto, with a peculiar stride, immediately took the lead. He had not gone many laps before Campbell of the West End Y.M.C.A. overtook him and held him for a while, but eventually a policeman forced him to discontinue.

The races were half an hour late in starting, but all the officials manage the games that a quarter hour was gained during the afternoon and the last race was over at 4.45.

The Short Distance Races. The 100 yards race was run in haste. Stage captured the first three yards from Sterling, who was only a foot in front of Morrow. In the second heat Carr and Wood finished easily first and second. Carr and Wood were put back a yard in the final for getting over the mark, but they easily gave the three feet to Sterling, who finished last. Stage won handsily by a yard with Carr a foot in front of Wood. Stage is a pretty and easy sprinter and apparently can get faster than his opponent. He also had an easy thing in the 200 yards race, beating Carr by two yards, who was over a yard behind Wood of Winnipeg. Instead, a local sprinter, did not finish.

The half mile run was a clash for Gifford. Campbell of the West End Y.M.C.A. stayed with him until coming to the tape on the stretch. Then the Montrealer sprang in, which the other starter couldn't do.

The 440 yards furnished a good race, which Gifford won by a gain of Winnipeg second, and Campbell of the West End Y.M.C.A. third.

Overcoming Easy Victories. Sam Ewing, with the three V's on his breast, came out to make a race in the mile event. He finished in slow time, but George Orton had gone the distance in 4:30 and half a lap ahead of his only opponent. Orton went alone in the two mile race, but failed to touch the Canadian record.

W. H. Hazlett of Toronto Junction won the three mile walk by a half lap from R. Maddock of Toronto. Dinsen could have easily finished in front of the policeman had he permitted him to continue on his way. Puffer won the hurdle in the good time of 1:10 sec. He went over neatly without getting too high or losing his stride. Moffatt was closely pressed for second place by W. Young, but the explosive champion unfortunately failed to clear the second last hurdle and came to grass.

The New Jersey lad also won the broad jump by two feet, and a half. Richardson jumped 19 ft. 11.2-in., and Courtneymache 18 ft. 11.2-in.

Throwing Weights and Javelin. Joseph Gray, the light brother of Chamption George, won the 16 pound shot put from our own Childs by less than three inches. Thompson, the bulky Cleveland, only made 38 feet.

The pole vaulting appeared to interest the crowd. Cobbold stopped at 8 feet 4 1/2 inches and Richardson was cheered for clearing 23 inches higher on an exhibition jump after many unsuccessful attempts.

The high jump only went up to 4 ft. 10.3.8-in., at which height McArthur and Walker failed, but the latter cleared a subsequent trial and took the second medal. Allison, the police champion, went over at the first trial.

P. C. Nicol won the hammer and weight events in a walk. He threw the hammer 120 ft. 8-in., being an inch less than 10 feet farther than Davis of Brooklyn. He also easily captured the 56 lb. weight event.

The Bicycle Races. There were three starters in each bicycle race. In the half Young trailed Hyslop until they reached the training bars when the wanderer went out and took a lead that the Toronto man tried in vain to pull down.

Decks set the pace for the mile, with Hyslop second. The order was unchanged until the club house was reached on the last round. Hyslop and Young went out and passed Decks. Young tried to go around Hyslop, but the Toronto man would not have it and won by two yards.
