When Creditors Lose Nothing.

A novel plan to get ahead of other creditors and not lose anything by the failure of a customer, has been devised by some Canadian manufacturers.

It has been in use for some time, but is not generally known.

The manufacturers sell goods subject to a discount of 50 to 60 per cent, with an extra 5 for cash. The goods are invoiced, however, at a gross or list price, and a memo attached saying that if the account is paid on July 1 a discount of 50 or 60, as the case may be, and 5 per cent will be allowed. If not paid before August 1 they will not get the extra 5 per cent. If not paid by October 1 no discount whatever will be allowed. If the buyer falls, the creditors at once make a claim for the full amount of the invoice, which is in reality 50 per cent more than the actual market value of the article. That is, an article which usually sells at \$1 and is invoiced by everyone else at that price is invoiced by these particular manufacturers at 50 to 60 per cent. If paid at the usual time for the article, the manufacturer gets the full amount of their actual claim—and sometimes more—while the others get only 50 per cent, or less.

The scheme is a clever one, but recently the inspectors, representing other creditors, when examining the affairs of the estate, have "got onto it," when there has been unusually a "pretty row" after which the clever manufacturers must amend their claims. A number of estates, however, have been worked up without the inspectors discovering the trick.

AFRICAN CANNIBALS.

WIDIOUS SCENES WITNESSED BY FATHER DUBENDORF.

Story of a Raid by Semi-Civilized Natives Upon a Trading Station—Six Prisoners Slain and Divided Among the Tribe.

Father J. Dubendorf, Superior of a Roman Catholic mission at Onitaka, in the Niger, 150 miles above its mouth, tells in a late issue of Le Courrier de Paris an amazing story of mingled civilization and barbarism among the negroes near the mouth of the river. Father Dubendorf journeyed down the river by canoe some months ago along with Nathaniel, a negro boy of Brass, educated and Christianized at the mission.

The father and his companion were entertained at a Zenobian trading post six or eight hours from the mouth of Brass, and there the King of Brass had a pirogue waiting, with the request that the lad be sent to visit his people.

Brass is on one of the mouths of the Niger, not far from the sea. On another of the mouths is the rival city of Akassa, the seat of the Niger-Niger Company, a trading concern, which, according to the Father, has driven out of the region by severe persecutions the other companies.

Early the next morning the Father called on the King, but learned that he was too busy to be seen. Waiting an hour, he was astonished to see the King come forth from a council with the chiefs, naked save for an ornate breech cloth, pale with white rings under his eyes, a musket in his hand, and a knife in his belt.

The first returning canoe reached Brass at six o'clock next morning, and a quantity of booty was carried into the King's house. Then it was that the Father first learned that the attack had been made upon the headquarters of the Royal Niger Company.

Other canoes rapidly arrived, bringing much booty, and many of the warriors were white with blood, in token of enemies slain. By noon nearly all the canoes but the King's had returned. He and some of his warriors had stopped at an island some miles from Brass, and taken ashore six captive Koumen negroes of the slave coast, who had been employed at the company's agency, and had come to hate the people of Brass.

Then began a scene of savage rejoicing and cannibalism. The bodies were cut in pieces, the children being stationed round that they might be injured to the sight, and whole limbs were carried off to be cooked and eaten. One young negro, who the Father declares, had been educated at a Protestant mission, taking in one hand the sabre of Mr. Flint, general agent of the Royal Niger Company, and in the other a limb of one of the victims, danced in savage joy about the company's flag, with a crowd of onlookers applauding.

The division of the plunder followed, accompanied with quarrels and a sort of savage frenzy. The madness of gin and palm brandy was added to that of slaughter, and the scene was so hideous that the Father refused to describe it. He notes that several parts of a human body were brought to him and he was courteously asked to take his choice. His refusal was evidently not understood.

The King was not to be seen, so the priest sent word of his wishes. The King answered that the boy must remain at Brass.

"Then I remain too," was the father's answer, for he knew that the King desired to make a sorcerer of Nathaniel. The latter was eager to be gone, and declared that if the King made him a sorcerer, in return he would, in that character, transform the King into a gorilla.

The father and Nathaniel, neither being guarded, concerted an escape. The village was sound asleep early in the evening, and the two visitors also pretended to go to bed. Between half-past nine and ten they stole to the river, took a light pirogue, already fixed upon in a reconnaissance early in the evening, and made off. They paddled until exhausted, and then the boy fell asleep. At four in the morning they heard a large pirogue pass their hiding place.

All over Japan to-day the men who died in the late war are being solemnly and beautifully remembered. In every home which gave a home to the cause the mother or wife has caused a little altar to be erected. Upon this is placed a portrait of the deceased, a tablet recording the date and manner of death and the sacred name which the Buddhist gives to the departed. Kings on are laid from time to time melons, rice, lotus flowers, etc., and such ornaments as the family can afford to offer.

The most cheerful war in the world lives in Madagascar. The latest story that comes from there tells of a king, the King of the Lotolles, one of the local tribes which is not busy fighting the French.

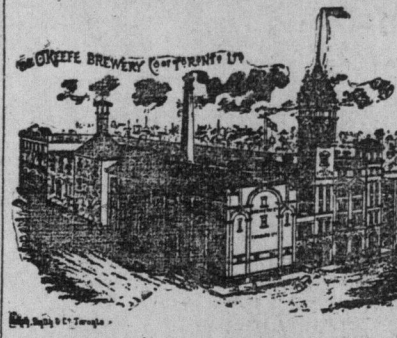

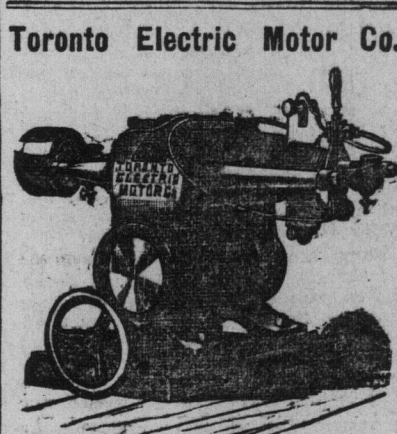
