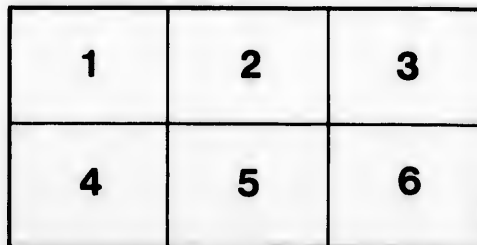
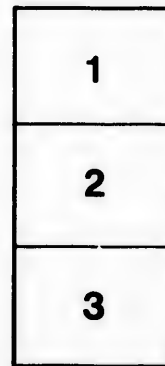

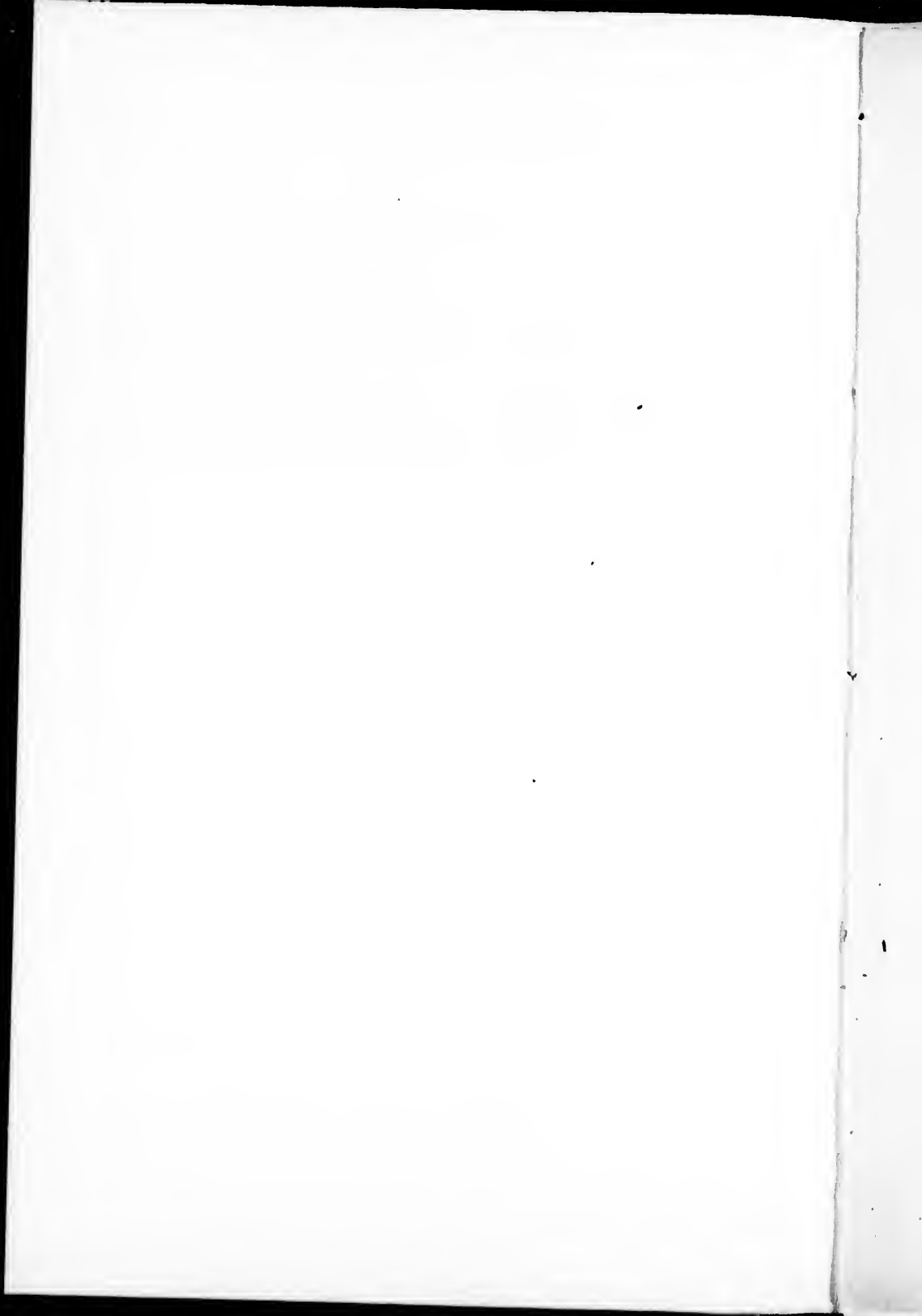

Than Tennyson's they could not well be worse.

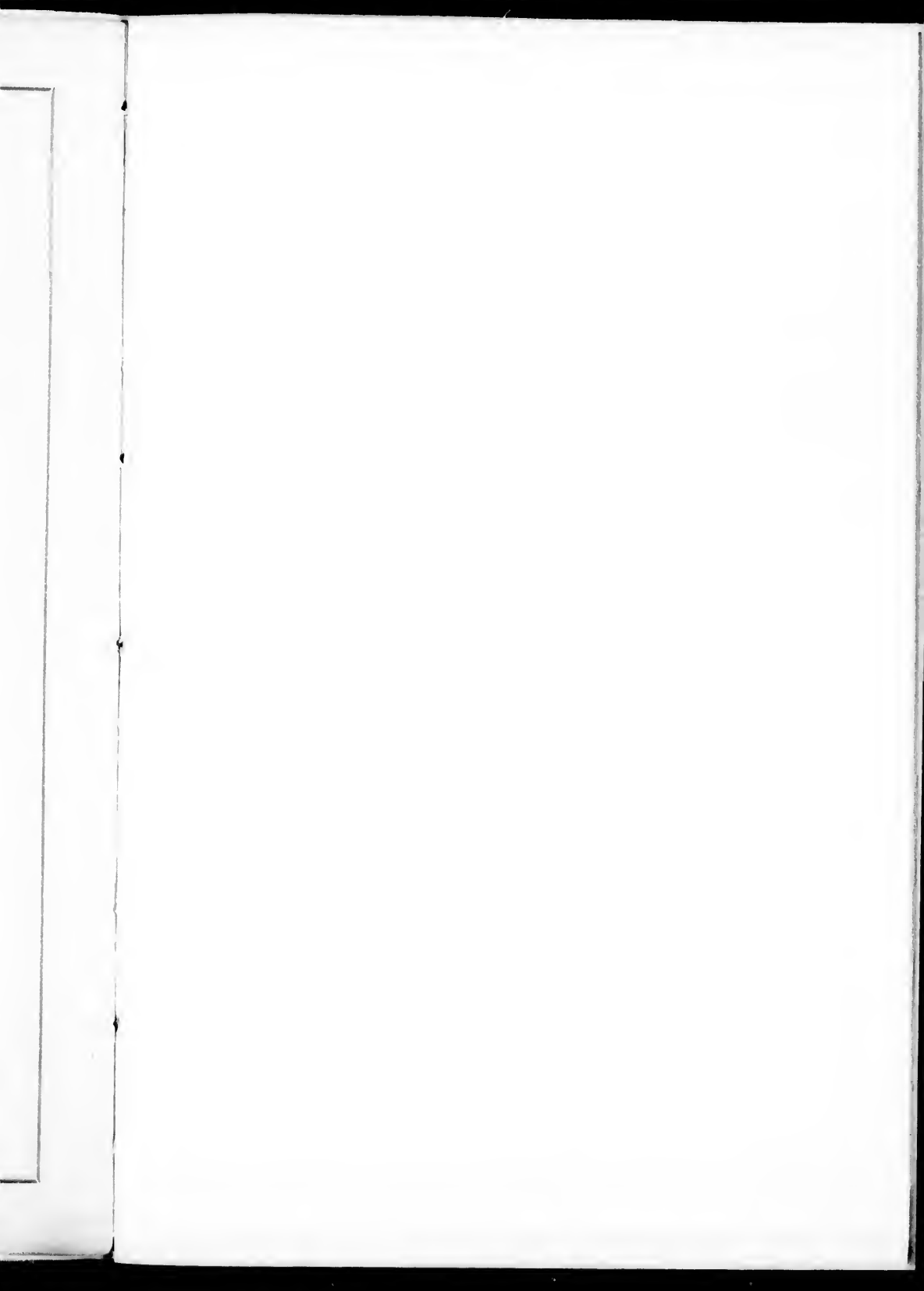
## The British Empire.
