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




100 Years

On March 31, 1821, McGill University was given its charter. Its history presents an almost unbroken record of financial embarrassment, but since its foundation it has only made two organized appeals to the citizens.

Development

Nevertheless, its growth during the century is attested by the multiplication of its departments and the increase in the number of its students.

400 in 1881; 2,200 in 1911; 2700 in 1920.

Now it must receive liberal aid or cease to give efficient service and to hold its place among the great universities.

It trains the *Teachers* for the Protestant Schools of our city and province.



### Clergymen

It gives early culture to the men who fill our *Pulpits*.

Students' fees are higher than at any other university in Canada and cannot be further increased.

### \$5,000,000 IS THE MINIMUM
