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ANNUAL REPORT, 1879-80.

To the Members of the Mechanics' Institute of Saint John:

THE PRESIDENT and DIRECTORS, in submitting their Annual Report, have great reason to feel satisfied with the results, which, despite the continued depression in business, to which reference has been made in a previous Report, have attended their efforts

during the past year.

The amount realized from the sale of members' tickets, and the issue of members' certificates, falls only five dollars short of the amount realized from those sources in 1878-79; and the fact that many old members, who had allowed their subscriptions to lapse, have become reinstated to full membership, is particularly gratifying to those intrusted with the management of the Institute.

Since the last annual meeting, death has removed two Ex-Presidents of the Institute. One of these, the late Isaac Woodward, Esquire, had arrived at a ripe old age; George H. Lawrence, Esquire, the second, was a younger man, and, until a comparatively few months before his decease, was an active member of the Board, of which he was also a member when he died. Both gentlemen had done good service for the Institute, and each will be missed by the members.

The vacancy caused by the death of Mr. Lawrence, has been filled by the appointment of George F. Matthew, Esquire, as a member of the Board.

There has been a serious decrease in the rents of the Hall, and, in consequence, some difficulty has occurred in providing for the current expenditure. Had the amount realized from this source of revenue equalled the amount obtained from the same source in the previous year, the current expenses would have been met, the balance due for the alterations of the Hall have

been paid, and a balance would remain to the credit of the Institute.

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Owing to the deficiency in question however, it has been absolutely necessary to obtain a further loan of seven hundred dollars from the Saint John Building Society: but it may be observed that this sum does not involve an increased indebtedness, and really represents the indebtedness carried forward from the previous year on account of the alteration in the Hall.

The manifest defects and requirements of the Hall have specially engaged the attention of the Board, and, as the result of mature deliberation, the Circular appended to this Report was placed in the hands of a number of persons who might feel inclined to enter into a probably profitable venture, and at the same time provide for requirements in this respect. Unfortunately, no definite reply has been received from any one to this Circular, and therefore the scheme suggested apparently falls to the ground, at least for the present, and the incoming Board may perhaps be compelled to adopt some other measures for the accomplishment of the desired objects.

In consequence of the state of the funds, it has been found impossible to make any addition to the Library.

The Reading Room is supplied with the same Periodicals and Newspapers as during the previous year, and is largely patronized by the members.

The Museum also continues to be a source of much attraction, not only to the members but also to the public, to whom it is opened, free of charge, on every Saturday afternoon.

At a recent meeting of the Members, specially called for the purpose, several amendments to the Constitution and Bye Laws were adopted. It will probably be necessary for the new Directors also to revise the regulations, and, on this account, it has been deemed advisable to postpone the printing of the present revision until a future day.

MECHANICS' INSTITUTE OF SAINT JOHN.

In accordance with a resolution recently adopted by the Board of Directors, tenders are invited from persons willing to accept a Lease of the Hall of the Institute.

In issuing this invitation the Board desires it to be understood that it is not determined as yet that the Hall shall be leased, and that the resolution was passed in deference to the opinions of those who believe that the leasing of the same would be advantageous to the Institute. Each person tendering is expected to make provision for improving the present condition of the Hall, with regard to both comfort and appearance, and for altering and improving the present means of entrance and exit. The stage accommodation would also probably have to be improved, and a portion of the space beneath or in rear might be required for this purpose, and could probably be spared by the Institute.

The Mechanics' Institute has now been in existence for more than forty years, and, during that period, has been a chief place of public resort, and its Hall possesses advantages in many respects which place it entirely above competition. There can be no doubt that a judicious expenditure of a comparatively small amount would render it sufficently attractive to preserve and increase the patronage which it has heretofore obtained, and also largely increase the revenue.

No suggestions are made with regard to the best method to be adopted for carrying out the desired changes, as it is considered advisable that each person making a tender should have a full opportunity to present his own views.

The Institute would reserve fifteen nights during each year

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for lectures in connection with the course, and for the annual meeting.

Parties making tenders must provide for heating and lighting, and are required to state what annual rental they would be prepared to pay each year, for a term of ten years, or for other terms in the alternative, and to submit full and detailed plans of proposed alterations.
