FORTY-FOURTH ANNUAL REPORT  
OF THE  
INDUSTRIAL REFUGE,

CORNER McMURRICH AND BELMONT STREETS.

Once more Time, in its flight, brings before us the duty of presenting to our friends and the public, our regular Annual Report. This institution, as you are all doubtless aware, has for its aim the raising of the fallen and up holding of those who, by our efforts in the past, have been led to see the error of their ways, and in whom has been implanted the desire to lead a better life.

There are, of course, many discouragements to be met with in this work, owing to the restlessness and waywardness of some who come under our care, yet we have reason this year, judging by the number who have voluntarily returned to the Home which had given them shelter, to feel that our labors have not been in vain. Then, too, the fact that \$1307.28 has been earned by the inmates during the year by laundry and other work, is an evidence that they are not kept in idleness and encouraged in pauperism, but that they take an active interest in the Home and its workings. There were 29 in the Refuge at the beginning of the year and 18 have been admitted since, making a total of 47. Of these 7 went to service, 2 to the General Hospital, 1 to the Asylum, 1 to the Mercer Reformatory, 1 was dismissed and 7 left of their own accord, leaving 28 in the Refuge on September 30th, 1897.

We have much cause for thankfulness in that this year the angel of death has not entered the Home, and with few exceptions the inmates have enjoyed good health.

It is, however, with the deepest sorrow, that we touch upon the heavy loss we have sustained by the removal of



our much beloved Honorary President, Mrs. Ewart. This was most fitly expressed in the following resolution passed by the Board at their meeting on the seventh of July last :

"We would desire most feelingly to record our deep sense of the loss we have sustained in the death of our loved Honorary President, Mrs. Ewart. Closely connected with the work of the Industrial Refuge as Secretary, from its earliest years, Mrs. Ewart gave to the Home and its work all the loving sympathy, wise counsel and untiring effort which it demanded of her, recording faithfully every incident calculated to help and encourage those with whom she labored. The extension of the Industrial character of the work of the Refuge, was largely due to the faithfulness with which she discharged every duty, and the executive ability with which she was so pre-eminently endowed. The highest appreciation of this part of her life work was shown by the fact that, when she proposed undertaking the establishing of a Home for respectable aged women, there was not one dissentient voice.

"We cannot too strongly express our high appreciation of what these Homes owe to the executive ability and good judgment, carried out in a spirit of love, by her who has been called so sweetly and gently to cease from her labors, and to enter into the joy of her Lord, whose spirit she so faithfully imbibed.

"We owe to her very largely the delightful fact that we have now a handsome, comfortable home for aged women, free from debt. She has gone from us, but has left her life as a testimony to what our Saviour can do for His people through the teaching of His Holy Spirit."

The services of the Matron, Mrs. Cameron, are much appreciated by the Management, and she is ably assisted by Miss Calder, who has been appointed since the issuance of the last report.

It is with much regret that we are obliged to omit this year from our list of Honorary Members, the name of Mrs. Alcorn, who, for over forty years, evidenced a deep interest in the welfare of the Home, but has now passed away from this earthly scene.

Mrs. Grant, who has so efficiently and faithfully filled the position of Treasurer, during the past year, has found it necessary to resign.

Service has been held as heretofore every Sabbath morning, conducted by the Rev. Mr. Dowler and Rev. Mr. Young; Mr. Robert Hall, the City Missionary, Mr. Anderson, and Mr. Chapman have kindly taken charge of the evening services. Mrs. Carman still superintends the Sabbath School work, and is aided by Miss Durand and Miss McBride. The inmates, as usual, thoroughly appreciated the tea and concert which was so generously provided by the teachers.

Mrs. Renaud continues her welcome visits to the Home, as also the Hospital Workers of Walmer Road Baptist Church. To Dr. Starr and Dr. Moore our thanks are justly due for their kind attention to the needs of the inmates; and we also desire to thank those who by entertainments or otherwise, have helped to render their lives less monotonous. Messrs. Dudley & Burns have earned our thanks by repeating their annual kindness in the matter of printing.

### THE FOURTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE AGED WOMAN'S HOME, BELMONT ST.

---

We cannot but feel, when presenting this, the Fourteenth Annual Report of the Aged Woman's Home, that we have special cause for thankfulness to the Great Giver of all good, who has put it into the hearts of His people to give so generously to this most deserving cause, that we are able now to announce it practically free from debt.

This is a work which certainly appeals to our best instincts, inasmuch as it provides a home for aged mothers whose children have passed away, or are for some reason unable to attend to their comfort; and for single women who are no longer able to care for themselves. Last year



we were enabled to do something towards making comfortable and happy 51 such aged women, 38 of whom were inmates at the beginning of the year, and 13 were afterwards admitted.

There have been only five deaths—a very small proportion when the advanced age of most of the inmates is considered—17 being over eighty years of age, and the majority of the rest having passed the “three score years and ten.”

The Management are much indebted to the Matron, Mrs. Peacock, for the indefatigable energy displayed by her in the superintendence of the Home, and also to Miss Robertson, to whom is entrusted the care of the sick.

¶ We would again very sincerely thank the kind friends who have conducted the religious services—Rev. Mr. Coulthard, who takes the Sabbath morning service, Rev. Septimus Jones, who dispenses the Communion; Mr. Bryce, and the students from Knox and Wycliffe Colleges. Mrs. Ball, Mrs. Saunders, and the Misses Wilkes have been very faithful in their visitations; and the annual treat provided by Mrs. Wilkes was much enjoyed by the inmates. Drs. Boulton and James Caven found it necessary to resign from the medical staff, but the duties have been most efficiently performed by Drs. William Caven and Scadding, assisted by Drs. G. Boyd, Stenhouse and McIlwraith, whose attentive services, given gratuitously, are most highly appreciated.

The Home formerly used for aged women being now unoccupied, the Managers contemplate utilizing it as a Home for aged men, and thus a long felt want will be supplied. We have no doubt but that this will gratify the many subscribers and friends who have called our attention to the need there is for such a Home, and have wished that we could see our way clear to extend the work in this direction.

## ANNUAL MEDICAL REPORT OF INDUSTRIAL REFUGE.

It gives me great pleasure to be able to report that no deaths have occurred in the Institution during the year just past.

The ailments that I have been called upon to attend have been, in the majority of instances, of a trivial nature, and no serious consequences have followed in any case.

One case of a more serious nature presented, and that, requiring surgical interference, was recommended to go to the General Hospital. I am pleased to be able to report that she was operated upon successfully, and has since returned to the Institution apparently in good health.

One or two cases have come under my notice where the patient was suffering from a general breakdown, due apparently to old age, and, of course nothing can be done to re-establish the old-time vigor. If it is within the province of the medical officer to make a recommendation, I would suggest that an effort be made to get the very old people into more suitable institutions, as they are totally unable to do anything of an industrial nature.

We have been unfortunate enough to have two cases of mental derangement, and it was deemed advisable to have them removed, and they were subsequently placed in the jail awaiting an order for entrance to the asylum.

On the whole, the health of the inmates of the institution has been very good, and I would like to take the opportunity of stating that, in my opinion, this is due very largely to the careful manner in which the Matron and her assistants have looked after the cleanliness and general sanitary condition of the institution, which, on my frequent visits, I have noticed have been almost perfect.

MEDICAL REPORT OF AGED WOMAN'S HOME,  
1896-'97.

The number of women who have been in the Institution during the past year is 51. Of this number 5 have died and 4 been discharged, leaving a total of 42 in the Home at the present time.

Of those who died during the year, one was over 90 and the others over 70 years of age, save one who was sent out for a hernia operation and subsequently died in the Home.

The staff commends the placing of gates at the heads of the stairways, as a measure that was necessary for the safety of the aged and feeble inmates.

The sanitary condition of the institution has been excellent, as is testified by the general good health of the women.

The staff suggests the advisability of having a mortuary in connection with the institution.
