Michigan proposes to control the rail

roads within its borders. A report has

been submitted to the Constitutional

Convention providing that the Legisla-

ture shall establish reasonable maximum

rates for transportation of passengers

and freight; shall prohibit contracts be-

tween railway companies in favor of any

railway against any other; and shall

issue except for money, labor or property

actually received.

Curiosity has occasionally been attracted

by the question of what becomes of

the cancelled railway tickets? The

average number issued in Paris is about

30,000 daily, making an annual total of

10,950,000, and which, when the whole

is calculated at 40,000,000.

The weight of each morsel of cardboard

is one gramme, and the sum realized by

the companies selling them wholesale to

the paper makers to be remade is in

16,000 to 18,000 francs.

The state of education in France is dis-

sappointing. There has been no improve-

ment of late years. Over 200,000 chil-

dran, from seven to thirteen years of age,

cent. of the married men are ignorant

of their own marriage act. The most

of the central one, and those adjoining

Spain and the Mediterranean.

cago, who was apparently searching for

his own front door in a cloud of

smoke, told of "one of the most stu-

pendous cloud-fights that mortal eye ever

miles wide, of an indigo color, with a

number of "hummocks" were "capped

Canadian, British and Foreign.

[To the Associated Press.]

New York, Oct. 11.—P. M. Gold 108 1/2; sterling exchange 106 1/2; money 7 per cent.

A fire in Boston this morning burned the stable of Martin Hayes with eighty-six horses, most of them valued at \$300 to \$1,000 each.

Ex-Senator Pomeroy of Kansas, was shot this afternoon in Washington by ex-Representative M. T. Conway of Kansas.

A person claiming to be Arthur Orton has arrived here. Five hundred thousand dollars in specie were shipped from Liverpool for New York to-day.

The Spanish Government squadron has anchored four miles from Cartagena. Consols 92 1/2; U. S. 5-20's 1865, 101 1/2.

NEW YORK, Oct. 11. A special from Memphis says that the situation there could hardly be worse. Business is almost totally suspended.

Thousands have fled, many shutting up their business houses, and abandoning their homes.

The chief ravages of the disease have been confined to the portion of the city inhabited chiefly by poor people.

There are many cases in south Memphis. The disease has entered nearly every door in the infected district.

Whole families have died, and for a square on some streets there is not a house in which some body is not sick or has fallen a victim.

The money generously sent from all quarters is being judiciously used to aid the sick and destitute and bury the dead.

Often it happens that parents abandon their sick children, and children their parents.

THE POLICE INVESTIGATION. A Washington despatch says there is apparently a good deal of ill feeling among members of the Polaris party now here.

They seem to consider the reported poisoning of Capt. Hall as charges specifically made by the Tyson party, and they are much disturbed by the idea Tyson advanced that the separation from the party on the ice was intentional.

It seems, however, that the feeling sprang up since the Buddington people were reconciled and the statement made, and not to have existed before the unfortunate separation from the vessel.

There seems to have been much personal hostility among the more prominent members of the expedition.

The examination of Buddington will probably be concluded Saturday. The testimony of Dr. Beasel will be important, it relating principally to the scientific results of the expedition.

LONDON, Oct. 13.—2.30 p. m. AN IRELAND DEMONSTRATION. There was an immense open air demonstration at Cork, yesterday, in favor of the amnesty, Home Rule and the rights of labor.

Twenty thousand persons took part in it. The proceedings were accompanied by much disorder.

Assault on Shipboard—Hind—Another Assault—Stay of Proceedings—Jack Foeled.

The charge of assault against the captain of the brig Ida was concluded at the Police Court on Saturday.

There were several lively scenes between the counsel during the progress of the trial, in which the captain joined.

The assault was fully proven and the Magistrate fined him \$20. This might have satisfied the captain but it did not, and when the mate went on board of the brig, which lies at the end of North Wharf, he was called into the cabin by him and again thrashed.

The captain made a powerful effort or else the mate a great call, as the latter of the captain's blows. John Kerr, Esq., counsel for the mate, applied to Judge Tapley and had a warrant issued for the captain's arrest, as the assault was supposed to have taken place in Portland.

The warrant was issued, but on Saturday night Supt. Gibson, of the Portland police force, received the following note: Supt. Gibson—

Please do not execute warrant against the Captain of the Ida, as there is a dispute as to locality of assault and on other grounds. I don't want any quibble raised, so that son of a gun Captain can escape.

JOHN KERR. In deference to Mr. Kerr's wishes the warrant was not executed. Between Saturday night and this morning it was found by Mr. Kerr that the end of the Long Wharf was in the City. Of course it cannot be believed, as stated by some that it was measured and ascertained to be so on Sunday.

Mr. Kerr would not, even to secure a case, allow such work to be done on Sunday; his moral feelings would at once banish the thought if it entered his head. This morning he, therefore, had information made before the City Police Magistrate, and the Captain will be arrested.

The Captain got wind of the warrant being issued this morning he and J. G. Forbes, Esq., appeared at the Portland Police Court. Mr. Kerr was sent for, and refused to prosecute in that court and the case was dismissed. The Captain was delighted and so was Mr. Forbes. A Tribune reporter met the latter as he was leaving the court-room. His face was wreathed with smiles, and his eyes sparkled and danced with delight.

"Was your captain arrested?" was asked him. "Yes," said the learned counsel, "and discharged; no one would prosecute." "But he will be brought up in the City Court," "Not much," replied Mr. Forbes; "he can't be fined there for an assault committed in Portland. I guess I have fooled Jack this time."

The warrant is issued for the captain, who will be arrested, and a lively time may be expected when the counsel meet to fight the matter before the Magistrate. The great question is, where is the end of the Long Wharf, in the City or Portland?

It is possible that a special commission of enquiry will be appointed to ascertain.
