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## ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

# ST. GEORGE'S SOCIETY,

FOR THE YEAR ENDING JAN. 5TH, 1863.

The Annual Meeting of the St. George's Society was held on Monday, Jan. 5th, 1863, at Dexter's Hotel. There was a full attendance of the members.

The Reports of the President, Treasurer Secretary, and Charitable Committee were read and adopted, and the Officers for 1863 were elected.

After the usual vote of thanks to the retiring officers and specially to the Sub-Committee of charity the meeting adjourned.

# PRESIDENT'S REPORT.

#### GENTLEMEN,

The Twenty-seventh Board of Management of the St. George's Society, about to lay down the offices to which they were elected on the 5th of January, 1862, beg leave to render to the Members in General Meeting assembled, their Report of the proceedings and condition of the Society during the past year.

It affords the Board great pleasure to be enabled to announce the continued success and prosperity of this Institution, so dear in its objects and reminiscences to their fellowcountrymen, both as regards the state of its funds and the general harmony and utility of its operations in the relief of deserving persons of English and Welch origin.

St. George's Day was, as usual, celebrated by the attendance of the Society at Divine Service in the Cathedral. Prayers were read by the Revd. Messrs. Housman and Mountain, and the Rev. Mr. Fothergill preached a most excellent sermon applicable to the occasion.

The Musical portion of the Service was beautifully performed by James Pearce, Esq., Mus. Bac., who was ably assisted by the Volunteer Choir of the Cathedral.

The Collection amounted to the sum of \$66 35.

It is a most pleasing part of the duty of the Board to direct your attention to the assistance which has been rendered to the afflicted and distressed natives of England and Wales during the past year, under the able direction of the Sub-Committee of Charity.

The amount to which relief, proportioned to the wants of the claimants, has been afforded, is \$429 20.

It is particularly gratifying to the Board to state that no death has occurred amongst the members of St. George's Society during the past year.

In conclusion, the Board, in a truly philanthropic spirit, most earnestly appeal to their countrymen resident in Quebec and the vicinity thereof, and call upon them to enroll themselves in the St. George's Society, which has stood the practical test of twenty-seven years.

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# REPORT OF THE CHARITABLE COMMITTEE.

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The Secretary of the Charitable Committee, in presenting his Report, has the satisfaction to state, that its object as a Society to relieve distressed englishmen, has in its fullest meaning, maintained the position it has ever held in the community, and rendered its aid to nearly as many in number, as well as in amount, to preceding years.

The claims on the Society were, if not more numerous, fully equal to the past year, and the cases relieved amount in number to 83, amongst whom the sum of \$429.90 was expended, as follows:—

Temporary aid to.......61 Forwarded to England,....10 Others to their destination...12

The Committee have also the pleasing intelligence to communicate to the Society, that the evils heretofore so fredently complained of our Sister Societies in the Upper Province, of sending their poor here to be relieved and forwarded to England have, by the method adopted, been radically cured; at least such was the conjecture, from the fact, that after a few cases so treated, we saw no more of them.

There are very many of the cases relieved that were of great interest, which may be seen on reference to the Charitable Committee Book. One among whom, though a pauper here, may yet attain a sphere of high respectability in England.

The Committee have every reason to believe that all were relieved who had any just claims upon the Funds of the Society; and in conclusion, would bear testimony to the efficient services rendered by Mr. Rogers in obtaining information relative to the parties applying for relief, and to his most indefatigable attention in seeing that the funds were properly administered.
