

## BILL.

An Act to enlarge the Representation of the People of this Province in Parliament.

HEREAS the increasing population of this Province Preamble. and the necessity of providing for its growing wants and for the development of its resources, render 5 it imperative to enlarge the Representation of the People thereof in the Legislative Assembly, and to apportion that Representation more fairly, and with this view to alter the limits of certain Counties and other subdivisions, and to adopt other Legislative provisions in the behalf afore-10 said: Be it therefore, &c.

And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, New divisions That from and after the end of the present Provincial established for Parliament, the Counties, Cities and Towns herein-tailing. after mentioned shall be the subdivisions of this Pro-15 vince upon which the Representation of the People thereof in the Legislative Assembly shall be based and regulated, in the manner hereinafter prescribed, and such subdivisions shall be in the place and stead of those now subsisting, as regards elections of Members of the said Assembly, and all matters thereunto relating, that is to say:

### LOWER CANADA.

1. The County of Gaspé shall be bounded on the south- County of west by a line commencing at Mackarel point, on the Gaspe. 25 north side and near the mouth of the Bay of Chaleurs, thence running north-west forty-seven miles, thence south sixty-nine degrees west, until it strikes a line drawn southeast from Cape Chat on the River St. Lawrence, - on the west by the line last mentioned,—and on the north and 30 east by the River and Gulf of St. Lawrence; including in the said County the Island of Bonaventure, and all the Islands wholly or in part opposite to the said County and nearest thereto, and also the Magdalen Islands in the Gulf of St. Lawrence; the said County so bounded, compris-35 ing the Fiels and Seigniories of Ste. Anne, Mont-Louis, La Magdaleine, Grande Vallée des Monts and Anse de l'Etang, Grand River and Pabos, and the Townships of Cap Chat, Sydenham, Fox, Cap Rosier, Gaspé Bay North, Gaspé Bay South, York, Douglas, Malbaie, Percé 40 and Newport, the Mag lalen Islands, and the said Islands, lying opposite to the said County and nearest to it.

County of Ronaventure. 2. The County of Bonaventure shall be bounded on the east by the County of Gaspé,—on the north partly by the said County of Gaspé, and partly by the County of Rimouski hereinafter described,—on the west by the said County of Rimouski,—and on the South by the Bay of Chaleurs and the southern limits of the Province,—and shall comprise that part of the District of Gaspé lying between the County of Gaspé and the District of Quebec, including all the Islands wholly or partly opposite to the said County of Bonaventure and nearest there-to; the said County so bounded comprising the Seigniory of Shootbred and the Townships of Port Daniel, Hope, Cox, Hamilton, New Richmond, Maria, Carleton, Nouvelle, Mann, Ristigouche and Matapédia.

County of Rimouski: 3. The County of Rimouski shall be bounded on the 15 east by the County of Gaspé,—on the west by the northeastern line of the parish of St. Simon prolonged to the County of Bonaventure,—on the south-east by the County of Bonaventure,—and on the north-west by the River St. Lawrence, including all the Islands in the said River 20 lying nearest to the said County of Rimouski and wholly or partly opposite thereto; the said County so bounded, comprising that part of the Seigniory of Nicolas Rioux, lying within the Parish of St. Fabien, the Seigniories of Bic, Rimouski and St. Barnabé, Lessard, Lepage or Thibierge, Pachot, Mitis, Matane, Lake Matapédia and Lake Metis, and the Townships of MacNider, Matane, St. Denis and the augmentation thereof.

County of Temiscounta.

4. The County of Temiscouata shall be bounded on the north-east by the County of Rimouski as hereinbefore 30 described,—on the south-west by the north-eastern line of the Seigniory of Terrebois or Verbois prolonged to the River St. François, and thence down the said River to the Province line,—on the south and south-east by the Province line,—on the north west by the River St. Law-35 rence, including Green Island and all the Islands in the said River St. Lawrence nearest to the said County of Temiscouata and wholly or partly opposite thereto; the said County so bounded comprising that part of the Seigniory of Nicolas Rioux lying in the parish of St. Simon, 40 the Seigniories of Trois-Pistoles, Isle Vert, Villerai, Le Parc, Rivière du Loup, Madawaska and Lake Temiscouata, and the Townships of Whitworth and Viger.

County of Kamouraska. 5. The County of Kamouraska shall be bounded on the north-east by the County of Temiscouata,—on the 45 south-west by the south-western line of the Seigniory of Ste. Anne, prolonged to the southern limits of the Province,—on the north-west by the River St. Lawrence, including all the Islands in the said River nearest to the County of Kamouraska and wholly or partly opposite 50 thereto,—and on the south-east by the Province line; the

said County so bounded comprising the Seigniories of Terrebois or Verbois, L'Islet du Portage, Granville, Kamouraska, Saint Denis de la Bouteillerie and its augmentation, Rivière Ouelle and its augmentation, St. Anne and 5 the Townships of Bungay, Woodbridge, Parke and Ixworth.

6. The County of L'Islet shall be bounded on the County of north-east by the County of Kamouraska as above described,—on the south-west by the north-eastern line of 01 the Seigniory of Bellechasse, prolonged to the southern corner of the Fief Lépinai thence following the rear line of the said Fief to the north-eastern line of the Township of Armagh; and thence following the line last mentioned prolonged to the limits of the Province,—on the 15 north-west by the River St Lawrence, including Crane Island, Goose Island, and all the Islands in the said River nearest to the County of L'Islet and wholly or partly opposite thereto,—and to the south-east by the southern limits of the Province; the said County so bounded com-20 prising the Fief Saint Denis, the Seigniories of Saint Roch des Aulnets, Réaume, Saint Jean Port Joli, L'Islet, Lessard, Bonsecours, Vincelot and its augmentation, Cap Saint Ignace, Gagnier, Saint Joseph, Saint Claire, Saint Thomas, Rivière du Sud and Lépinai, the Townships of Ashford (and its augmentation,) Lessard and Ashburton.

25 7. The County of Bellechasse shall be bounded on the County of Bellechasse. north-east by the County of L'Islet as above described.on the north-west by the River St. Lawrence, including all the Islands in the said River lying nearest to the said 30 County of Bellechasse and wholly or partly opposite thereto,—on the south-east by the southern limits of the Province,—and on the south-west by the north-eastern. lines of the Seigniories of Lauzon and Jolliet, and of the Township of Frampton as far as the north-western. 35 line of Standon, and thence following the said northwestern line of Standon and its augmentation as far as. the northern corner of the said augmentation, and thence by the north-eastern line of the said augmentation prolonged to the Province line; the said County so bounded comprising the Seigniories of Berthier, Bellechasse, 40 Saint Vallier and its augmentation, Saint Michel and its augmentation, Vincennes, Livaudière, Beaumont and its augmentation, LaMartinière, Montapeine and Saint Ger-

The County of Dorchester shall be bounded on the County of Dorchester. north-east by the County of Bellechasse as above described, as far as the south-eastern corner of the Seigniory: ry of Lauzon, - on the north-west by the River St. Lawrence,-on the south-east by the southern line of the Sei-50 gniory of Lauzon,--again on the north-east by the Seigniories of Saint Etienne and Sainte Marie as far as the?

vais, and the Townships of Buckland and Armagh.

south eastern corner of the Seigniory of St. Giles, and on the south by the southern limits of the said Seigniory of St. Giles,—on the south-west by the south-western line of the said Seigniory of St. Giles,—on the north-west by the north-western limits of the said 5 Seigniory as far as the south-western line of the Seigniory of Lauzon,—and again on the west by the south-western line of the said Seigniory of Lauzon as far as the River St. Lawrence, the said County so bounded comprising the Seigniory of Lauzon and the Seigniory 10 of Saint Giles or Beaurivage.

County of Beauce.

9. The County of Beauce shall be bounded on the north-east by the County of Bellechasse as above described,---on the north-west and partly on the south-west by the County of Dorchester as above described, and 15 again on the south-west by the Townships of Broughton, Tring and part of Shenley, as far as the south-eastern line of the Seigniory of Aubert-Gallion,---thence by the south-eastern line of the said Seigniory as far as the River Chaudière, thence upwards towards the south by 20 the middle of the said River as far as the southern corner of the Township of Gayhurst, and thence by the prolongation of the south-western line of the said Township to the Province line, --- and on the east by the Province line; the said County so bounded comprising the Seigni-25 ories of Jolliet, Saint Etienne, Sainte Marie, Saint Joseph, Vaudreuil, Aubert-Gallion and Aubin-Delisle, and the Townships of Frampton, Cranbourne, Watford, Standon, Ware, Jersey, Marlow, Linière and Risborough.

County of Lothinière. 10. The County of Lotbinière shall be bounded on 30 the north-east by the County of Dorchester as above described,—on the north-west by the River St. Lawrence,—on the south-east partly by the County of Dorchester as above described, and partly by the Townships of Leeds, Nelson, Somerset and the River Bécancour,—and on the 35 south-west by the south-western line of the Seigniory of Saint Jean Deschaillons prolonged to the River Bécancour; the said County so bounded comprising the Seigniories of Tilly, Desplaines, Bonsecours, Gaspé, Maranda, Sainte Croix, Lotbinière and Saint Jean Deschaillons, 40 with their augmentations and the augmentation of the Township of Somerset.

County of Megantic. 11. The County of Megantic shall be bounded on the north-east by the County of Beauce as above describ-45 ed,---on the north-west by the County of Lotbinière and the County of Dorchester, as above describèd,--and on the south-west and south by the Townships of Stanfold, Arthabaska, Chester, Wolfestown, Garthby, Stratford, Winslow and Whitton; the said County so bounded com-50 prising the Townships of Somerset, Nelson, Halifax, Inverness, Leeds, Ireland, Thetford, Broughton, Colraine,

Price, Adstock, Tring, Lambton, Forsyth, Aylmer, Shenley, Dorset, and Gayhurst.

12. The County of Nicolet shall be bounded on the County of Nicolet State and the Nicolet Stat 5 north-east by the County of Lothinière as above described,---on the north-west by the River St. Lawrence,---on the south-west by the south-western line of the Seigniory of Nicolet and its augmentation,---and on the south-east by the Township of Wendover, the augmentation of the Township of Aston, and the Township of Aston as far 10 as the River Bécancour, and thence by the middle of the River Becancour upwards as far as the County of Lotbinière; the said County so bounded, comprising the Seignory of Nicolet and its augmentation, the Parishes of St. Grégoire, Bécancour, Gentilly, Sainte Gertrude, St. Pierre les Becquets, and the continuations of the said 15 Parishes and Seigniories, to the limits aforesaid, and the Townships of Maddington and Blandford.

13. The County of Yamaska shall be bounded on the County of the east by the County of Nicolet, --- on the north by the Yamaska. 20 River St. Lawrence, --- on the west by the north-eastern line of the Seigniory of Bonsecours from la Baie de Lavallières to the River Yamaska, thence by the said River as far as the north-eastern line of the Seigniory of St. Charles, and thence by the said north-eastern line of the 25 said Seigniory,---on the south by the rear lines of the Seigniories of De Guire and Pierreville, the River Yamaska and the rear line of the Seigniory of Courval; the said County so bounded comprising the whole of the Seigniories of la Baie du Febvre, Courval, Lussaudière, Pierreville, Saint François and its augmentation, that part 30 of Lavallières (otherwise called Saint Michel d'Yamaska) which lies south of la Baie de Lavallières, Bourgmarie East and Deguire, the augmentation of Upton and the Gore of Wendover.

14. The County of Drummond shall be bounded on county of the east by the County of Lotbinière and the County of Drummond. Megantic,---on the north by the Counties of Nicolet and Yamaska, --- on the west by the western lines of the Town-40 ship of Upton,---on the south by the southern lines of the Townships of Upton and Acton,---on the south-east by the south-eastern lines of the Townships of Durham, Kingsey, Warwick and Arthabaska; the said County so bounded comprising the Townships of Aston and its 45 augmentation, the Gore of Aston, Bulstrode and its augmentation, Stanford, Arthabaska, Warwick, Horton, Wendover, Simpson, Kingsey, Durham, Wickham, Grantham, Upton and Acton.

15. The County of Sherbrooke shall be bounded on County of the north-east by the County of Megantic and the County of Beauce, as above described,—on the north-west by

the County of Drummond,—on the west by the Township of Ely and the Township of Stukely,—on the south by the northern line of the Township of Hatley,—again on the west by the eastern line of the said Township of Hatley,—again on the south by the northern line of the Township of Barnston and of the Township of Barford,—and again on the west by the eastern line of the said Township of Barford,—and again on the south and south-east by the Province line; the said County so bounded comprising the Townships of Ascot, (except the Town of Sherbrooke according to the boundaries hereinafter established), Eaton, Compton, Orford, Brompton, 10. Stoke, Melbourne, Windsor, Shipton, Tingwick, Chester, Wolfestown, Garthby, Stratford, Ham, Watton, Weedon, Dudswell, Winslow, Lingwick, Whitton, Westbury, Hampden, Marston, Newport, Ditton, Chesham, Clinton, Aukland, Bury, Oulney, Clifton, Hereford, Spalding, Ditchfield, Woburn, Emberton and Drayton, with all the 15 gores and augmentations of the said Townships.

County of Stunsfead.

16. The County of Stanstead shall be bounded on the north by the Township of Stukeley,—then on the north and on the east by the County of Sherbrooke,—on the south 20 by the Province line,—and on the west by the Townships of Sutton and Brome; the said County so bounded comprising the Townships of Hatley, Barnston, Barford, Stanstead, Bolton and Potton, with all the gores and augmentations of the said Townships.

County of Missiskoui. 17. The County of Missiskoui shall be bounded on the north by the Township of Farnham and the Township of Brome,—on the east by the County of Stanstead,—on the south by the Province line,—and on the west by Missiskoui Bay and the Seigniories of Noyan and Sabrevois as far as the south-western line of the augn entation 30 of Monnoir, and by the south-western line and the eastern line of the said augmentation of Monnoir, as far as the Township of Farnham; the said County so bounded comprising the Township of Sutton, the Seigniory of Saint Armand, and the Townships of Dunham and Stan-35 bridge, with all the gores and augmentations of the said Townships.

County of Shefford.

18. The County of Shefford shall be bounded on the north by the County of Drummond,—on the east partly by the County of Sherbrooke and partly by the County 40 of Stanstead,—on the south partly by the County of Stanstead and partly by the County of Missiskou,—on the west by the augmentation of Monnoir,—on the northeast by the Seigniory of St. Hyacinthe,—on the west by the said Seigniory of St. Hyacinthe,—and again on the north-east by the western line of the Seigniory of 45 Ramsay as far as the southern corner thereof, and thence by the eastern line of the said Seigniory as far as the

County of Drummond; the said County so bounded comprising the Townships of Ely, Stukely, Brome, Shefford, Roxton, Milton, Granby and Farnham, with all the gores and augmentations of the said Townships.

5 19. The County of Richelieu shall be bounded on the County of east by the Baie de La Vallières and the County of Richelien. Yamaska,—on the north by the River St. Lawrence,—on the west by the eastern line of the Seigniory of Contrecœur as far as the River Richelieu, thence by the said 10 River upwards as far as the south-western line of the Seigniory of St. Charles upon the said River, thence by the said south-western line as far as the rear line of the said Seigniory, thence by the said rear line as far as the northeastern line of the said Seigniory of St. Charles, thence 15 by the said north-eastern line as far as the rear line of the Seigniory of St. Denis, thence by the said rear line as far as the line between the Seigniories of St. Hyacinthe and St. Ours, thence by the said line as far as the River Yamaska, thence by the middle of the said River 20 downwards as far as the County of Yamaska; the said County so bounded comprising the Seigniories of St. Ours and its augmentation, St. Denis, St. Charles on the River Richelieu, Sorel and its augmentation, and the gore on the north side of the Baie de La Vallières, Bourche-25 min on the west of the River Yamaska, Bourgmarie West and Bonsecours, including the following Islands in the River St. Lawrence, that is to say: Isles Cochon. Madame, Ronde, de Grace, aux Ours, and the Islands commonly called Battures à la Carpe, and les Isles du 30 Sable, de Moine and du Basque, and the Islands in the River Richelieu or Chambly nearest to the County of Richelieu, and wholly or partly opposite thereto.

20. The County of Saint Hyacinthe shall be bounded county of St. 35 on the north-east by the County of Yamaska and the Hyacinthe. County of Drammond,—on the east by the County of Shefford,—on the west partly by the County of Shefford and partly by the augmentation of Monnoir and the northeastern line of the Seigniory of Monnoir,—and on the 40 north-west by the rear line and the north-eastern line of the Seigniory of Rouville, and by the County of Richelieu; the said County so bounded comprising the Seigniories of Ramsay, Bourchemin on the east of the River Yamaska, and St. Hyacinthe.

21. The County of Rouville shall be bounded on the County of north-east by the County of Richelieu,—on the east by Rouville. the County of St. Hyacinthe, the County of Shefford and the County of Missiskoui,—In the south by the Province 50 line,—and on the west by the River Richelieu, including all the Islands in the said River nearest to the County of Rouville; the said County so bounded comprising the Seigniories of Rouville, Chambly East, Monnoir and its augmentation, Bleury, Sabrevois, Noyan and Foucault.

County of Verchères 22. The County of Verchères shall be bounded on the no th-west by the River St. Lawrence,—on the northeast by the County of Richelieu,—on the east by the River Richelieu or Chambly,—and on the south-west by 5 the Seigniories of Boucherville, Montarville and Chambly west; the said County so bounded comprising the Seigniories of Contrecœur, Bellevue, Verchères, Saint Blain, Guillodière, La Trinité or Cap Saint Michel, Varennes, Belœil and its augmentation, Cournoyer, and all the 01 Islands in the River St. Lawrence opposite the County of Verchères, except Isle Bouchard.

County of Chambly.

23. The County of Chambly shall be bounded on the north-west by the River St. Lawrence,—on the south-east by the River Richelieu or Chambly, including all the 15 Islands in the River St. Lawrence and in the River Richelieu or Chambly nearest to the said County and wholly or partly opposite thereto,—on the south-west by the north-eastern line of the Seigniory of Laprairie, the south-eastern line of the said Seigniory and the north-20 eastern line of the Seigniory of De Léry,—and on the north-east by the County of Verchères; the said County so bounded comprising the Seigniories of Boucherville, Montarville, Longueuil, the Fief Tremblay, Chambly west, and the Barony of Longueuil, and all other places 25 included by the boundaries aforesaid.

County of Lapraire.

24. The County of Laprairie shall be bounded on the north-west by the River St. Lawrence, - on the southeast by the south-eastern line of the Seigniory of Chateauguay, the prolongation of the north-eastern line of 30 the said Seigniory as far as the Seigniory of St. George, the north line of the said Seigniory of St. George and of the Township of Sherrington as far as the Seigniory of Laprairie, the south-western line of the Seigniory of Laprairie to the rear line thereof, and the said rear line 35 as far as the County of Chambly and by the said County of Chambly,—on the north-east by the said County of Chambly,—and on the south-west by the Seigniory of Beauharnois, the said County so bounded comprising the Seigniories of Laprairie de la Magdeleine, Sault-Saint- 40 Louis, part of Lasalle and Chateauguay, and the Islands in the River St. Lawrence nearest to the County of Laprairie, and wholly or partly opposite thereto.

County of Acadie.

25. The County of Acadie shall be bounded on the north-west by the County of Laprairie as above 45 described,—on the south by the Province line,—on the east by the River Richelieu or Chambly,—on the north-east by the County of Chambly,—and on the south-west by the north-eastern line of the Township of Hemmingford and of part of the Seigniory of Beauharnois; the 50 said County so bounded comprising the Seigniories of Lacolle and de Léry, part of Lasalle, and the Township

of Sherrington, with the Seigniories and places called St. Gaorge, St. Normand, St. James, Thwaite, and all other places included by the boundaries aforesaid, and all the Islands in the River Richelieu or Chambly nearest to the 5 County of Acadie and wholly or partly opposite thereto.

26: The County of Beauharnois shall be bounded on Boundarnois. the north-east by the County of Laprairie and the County of Acadie as above described,—on the south by the Province line,—on the south-west by the Townships of 10 Hinchinbrooke and Godmanchester,—and on the northwest by the River St. Lawrence, including Grand Isle and all the Islands nearest to the said County and wholly or partly opposite thereto; the said County so bounded comprising the Seigniory of Beauharnois and the Town-15 ship of Hemmingtord.

27. The County of Huntingdon shall be bounded on County of the east by the County of Beauharnois as above described, -on the south by the Province line, -and on the northwest by the River St. Lawrence, including all the Islands 20 nearest to the County of Huntingdon and wholly or partlyopposite thereto; the said County so bounded comprising the Townships of Hinchinbrooke and Godmanchester, with Dundee and the Indian Tract to the west there f, extending to the Indian Village of St. Regis exclusively, <sup>1</sup> 25 along the Province line.

29. The County of Vaudreuil shall be bounded on the County of north and north-east by the River Ottawa,—on the south by the River St. Lawrence,—on the west by the line separating Upper Canada from Lower Canada, and shall 30 include Isle Perrot and all the Islands in the River Ottawa and the River St. Lawrence nearest to the said County and wholly or partly opposite thereto; the said County so bounded comprising the Seigniories of Vaudreuil, Rigaud, Soulanges and Nouvelle Longueuil, Isle Perrot 35 and the Township of Newton and its augmentation.

28. The County of Ottawa shall be bounded on the County of east by the eastern line of the Seigniory of Petite Nation Ottawa. as far as the rear thereof, and by the western line of the Township of Harrington prolonged until it meets the line 40 of the County or Lachenaye hereinafter described, and thence towards the north by the County of Lachenaye to the limits of the Province,—on the west by the northern and western limits of the Province,—and on the south and south-west by the Grand or Ottawa River throughout 45 its whole length as far as Lake Temiscamigue, and from the head of the said Lake by a true north line to the limits of the Hudson's Bay. Territory, including all the Islands in the Grand or Ottawa River and Lake Temiscamingue wholly or partly opposite to the County of 50 Ottawa; the County of Ottawa so bounded comprising

the Seigniory of Petite Nation, the Townships of Lochabar and its augmentation, Buckingham, Templeton, Hall, Eardly, Onslow, Bristol, Clarendon, Litchfield, Mansfield, Grand Calumet and Alumette Island, the Townships Ponsonby, Amherst, Rippon Derry, Portland, Wakefield, 5 Masham, Aldfield, Thorne, Waltham, Chichester, Sheen, Esher, Aberdeen, Hastings, Aberford, Kirkiby, Labouchere, Gladstone, Graham, Low, Denholm, Bowman, Picanoka, Hincks, Bigelow, Aylwin, Wright, Northfield, Blake, Bouchette, Wabassee, Dudley, Notowese, Ken-10 sington, Bouthillier, Kiamica, Egan, Aumond, Merritt, Campbell, Pontefract and Suffolk, and all the Townships included by the boundaries aforesaid, and north of the Grand or Ottawa River.

County of Argenteuil.

30. The County of Argenteuil shall be bounded on 15 the west by the County of Ottawa as above described, on the south by the River Ottawa, - on the north by the County of Lachenaye as hereinafter described, -- on the east by a line drawn from the Baie de Carillon at the south-western corner of the lot of land now or lately 20 occupied by Joseph Richer, and continued along the western line of the said lot of land to the rear of the concessions of the Baie de Carillon, thence following the rear line of the lands in the said Concession, as far as the western line of the Seigniory of the Lake of the 25 Two Mountains, thence along the said line as far as the northern line of the Township of Gore, thence by the said line of the said Township as far as the Township of Wentworth, and thence towards the north by the eastern line of the Townships of Wentworth, Howard and Beres-30 ford, as far as the said County of Lachenaye, including all the Islands nearest to the County of Argenteuil and wholly or partly opposite thereto; the said County so bounded comprising the Townships of Grenville and its augmentation, Chatham, Gore, Wentworth, Harrington, 35 Howard, Arundel, Grandison and Beresford, and the Seigniory of Argenteuil, except that part thereof which is excluded from the said County according to the boundaries aforesaid, and which makes part of the Parish or Mission of St. Placide.

County of Two Mountains. 31. That the County of Two Mountains shall be bounded on the east and north-east by the south-western line of the Seigniory of Blainville and of the augmentation of Mille-Isles and by the rear line of the augmentation of the Seigniory of the Lake of the Two Mountains, 25—on the west by the County of Argenteuil as above described,—and on the south by the Grand or Ottawa River, including Isle Bizard and all the islands in the Grand or Ottawa River nearest to the County of Two Mountains and wholly or partly opposite thereto; the said County so bounded comprising the Seigniories of River du Chêne, the Lake of the Two Mountains and its

augmentations, Isle Bizard and that part of Argenteuil hereinbefore excluded from the County of Argenteuil, and forming part of the Parish or Mission of Saint Placide.

32. The County of Terrebonne shall be bounded on County of the north-east by the south-western line of the Seigniory of Lachenaye as far the rear thereof, thence westward by the rear line of the augmentation of Terrebonne, as 10 far as the north-eastern line of the Township of Abercrombie, thence along the said line to the rear thereof, and thence along the north-eastern line of the Township of Morin, to the boundary of the County of Argenteuil as above described, - on the south-west by the said County of Argenteuil and the County of Two Mountains 15 as above described, - and on the south-east by that branch of the Ottawa River commonly called the River des Prairies, including the Island and Seigniory of Isle Jesus. and all the islands in the said River nearest to the County of Terrebonne and wholly or partly opposite thereto; 20 the said County so bounded comprising the Seigniories of Isle Jesus, Terrebonne, Desplaines, Lacorne, Blainville, the augmentation of Mille Isles, the Township of Abercrombie and the Township of Morin.

33. The County of Lachenaye shall be bounded on County of the south-west by the County of Terrebonne, the County of Argenteuil and the County of Ottawa as above described,—on the south-east by that branch of the Ottawa River commonly called the River des Prairies, and by the River St. Lawrence, including the Islands 30 nearest to the said County, and wholly or partly opposite thereto,-on the north-east by the south-western line of the Seigniory of St. Sulpice, as far as the Township of Rawdon, thence by the rear line of the Seigniory of L'Assomption or Saint Ours as far as the southern corner 35 of the said Township of Rawdon, thence by the southwestern line of the said Township, prolonged to the limits of the Province, and on the north-west by the limits of the Province; the said County so bounded comprising the Seigniory of Lachenaye, the Seigniory of L'Assomption, 40 commonly called Saint Ours, the Seigniory of Repentigny, and the Townships of Kilkenny, Wexford, Carrick and Doncaster.

34. The County of Assumption shall be bounded on County of 45 the south-west by the County of Lachenaye as above Assumption. described,—on the south-east by the River St. Lawrence, including Isle Bouchard and all the Islands nearest to the County of Assumption and wholly or partly opposite thereto,—on the north-west by the limits of the 50 Province,--and on the north-east by the north-eastern. line of the Seigniory of Lavaltrie and its augmentation, the north-eastern line of the Township of Kildare and its

augmentation prolonged as far as the north-western corner of the Seigniory of Daillebout, thence by the rear line of the Seigniory of Daillebout to the north-eastern corner thereof, and hence by a line drawn astronomically north-west to the limits of the Province; the said County so bounded comprising Isle Bouchard, the Seigniories of Lavaltrie (and its augmentation,) and Saint Sulpice, and the Townships of Rawdon, Chertsey, Kildare (and its augmentations,) and Cathcart.

County of Monereal. 35. The County of Montreal shall comprise all the 10 Island of Montreal, except the City of Montreal as now bounded, with all the Islands nearest to the said County and wholly or partly opposite thereto, except Isle Bizard; the said County so bounded comprising the Parish of Montreal, except the City of Montreal, and the Parishes 15 of Sainte Anne, Sainte Geneviève, Pointe Claire, Lachine, Sault au Recollet, Saint Laurent, Rivière des Prairies, Pointe aux Trembles, and Longue Pointe.

County of Bernner. 36. The County of Berthier shall be bounded on the south-west by the County of Assumption as above 20 described,—on the north-west by the limits of the Province,—on the south-east by the River St. Lawrence, including Isle St. Ignace and Isle du Pads, and all other Islands nearest to the County of Berthier and wholly or partly opposite thereto,—and on the north-east by the 25 north-east line of Fief du Sablé or York, prolonged on the one hand towards the south-east as far as the River St. Lawrence, and on the other hand towards the north-west to the limits of the Province; the said County so bounded comprising the Islands Saint Ignace and du 30 Pads, the Seigniories of Lanoraye, Dautié and their augmentations, Daillebout, Ramsay, Berthier and its augmentation, du Sablé or Nouvelle York, Maskinongé West on the River St. Lawrence, the Settlement commonly called St. Gabriel, and the Township of Brandon. 35

County of St. Maurice. 37. The County of Saint Maurice shall be bounded on the north-west by the County of Berthier as above described,—on the north-east by the River St. Maurice until it meets the south-western line of the Seigniory of Cap de la Magdeleine, and thence by the said line pro-40 longed to the limits of the Province,—on the north-west by the limits of the Province,—and on the south-east by the River St. Lawrence, including all the Islands nearest to the County of St. Maurice, and wholly or partly opposite thereto, but excluding the Town and Parish of 45 Three Rivers as ascertained and recognized by this Act; the said County so bounded comprising the north-eastern part of Maskinongé, the Fiefs and Seigniories of Lanaudière, St. Jean, Grandpré, Grosbois, or Yamachiche, Dumontier, Gatineau, and its augmentation, Saint Maurice, 50 St. Etienne, Pointe du Lac, and others, as far as the

Parish of Three-Rivers as herinafter described, the Townships of Hunterstown, Caxton and its augmentation, and Shawenigan, and all the Islands in the River St. Lawrence or in the River St. Maurice nearest to the said 5 County and opposite thereto, but excluding the Town and Parish of Three-Rivers as hereinafter described.

38. The County of Champlain shall be bounded on County of the south-west by the County of St. Maurice as above described, and by the Town and Parish of Three-Rivers, 10 —on the north-east by the north-eastern line of the Seigniory of Ste. Anne, and its augmentation, and by the prolongation thereof to the limits of the Province,—on the north-west by the limits of the Province,—and on the south-east by the River St. Lawrence, including the 15 Islands nearest to the said County and wholly or partly opposite thereto; the said County so bounded comprising the Seigniories of Sainte Anne and its augmentation, Dorvilliers, Sainte Marie, Batsican, Champlain and its augmentations, Cap de Magdeleine, and the Township of 20 Radnor.

39. The County of Portneuf shall be bounded on the County of north-cast by the south-western lines of the Seigniories of Sillery and St. Gabriel and by the prolongation thereof to the limits of the Province,—on the south-west by the 25 County of Champlain as above described, -- on the northwest by the limits of the Province, - and on the south-east by the River St. Lawrence; the said County so bounded comprising the Seigniories of Gaudarville, Fossambault, Demaures or St. Augustin, Guillaume Bonhomme, Neu-30 ville or Pointe aux Trembles, Bourg Louis, Belaire and its augmentation, d'Auteuil, Jacques Cartier, the Barony of Portneuf, Perthuis Deschambault, La Chevrotière, Tesserie, Francheville, les Grondines east and west, and their augmentations, and the Townships of Alton, Montauban and Gosford.

35 40. The County of Quebec shall be bounded on the County of south-west by the County of Portneuf as far as the forty-Quebec. eighth degree of north latitude,—on the north-east by the south-western line of the Seigniory of la Côte de Beau-40 prc, until it meets the south-eastern line of the Township of Tewkesbury, thence towards the north-east by the said south-eastern line as far as the eastern corner of the said Township, thence towards the north by the north-eastern line of the said Township to the rear thereof, and thence 45 by the prolongation of the said line as far as the said forty-eighth degree of north latitude,—on the north-west by the parallel of the said forty-eighth degree of north latitude, -and on the south-east by the River St. Lawrence, excluding the City of Quebec as now bounded; the said 50 County so bounded comprising the Seigniories of Beau-

port and its augmentation, Notre Dame des Anges, Dor-

sainville, Lepinay, Fief Saint Ignace, Fief Hubert, the Seigniories of Sillery and Saint Gabriel, and the Townships of Stoneham and Tewksbury, with those portions of the Parishes of Quebec, Notre Dame des Anges and Saint Roch de Quebec not included in the City of Quebec, and all other tracts of land comprised within the houndaries of the said County as above described, except the City of Quebec.

County of Montmorency.

41. The County of Montmorency shall be bounded on the west by the County of Quebec,—on the north by the 10 parallel of the forty-eighth degree of north latitude,—on the east by a line to be drawn from Cape de l'Abatis on the River St. Lawrence, towards the north west and 15 parallel to the line of Beauport as far as the limits of the said County,-on the south by the River St. Lawrence. including the Island of Orleans and all the Islands nearest to the County of Montmorency and wholly or partly opposite thereto; the said County so bounded comprising 20 the Parishes of St. Pierre, Saint Jean, Sainte Famille, Saint Laurent and Saint François, Isle Madame, and Isle aux Reaux, and the Parishes of Saint Féréol, Saint Joachim, Sainte Anne, Chateau Richer, Laval and Ange 25 Gardien.

Courty of Saguenay.

42. The County of Saguenav shall be bounded on the west by the County of Montmorency,—on the north by the parallel of the forty-eighth degree of north latitude, as far as the prolongation of the eastern line of the Township of St. Jean on the River Saguenay, and by 80 the said prolongation and the said line as far as the River Saguenay, and thence towards the west by a line to be drawn astronomically north to the limits of the Province, -and on the south east, from the County of Montmorency downwards, by the River St. Lawrence, including 35 Isle aux Coudres, Hare Island, and all the Islands nearest to the said County and wholly or partly opposite thereto; the said County so bounded comprising part of the Seigniory of Beaupré, the Seigniories du Gouffre, des Eboulemens, Murray Bay and Mount Murray, Isle aux 40 Coudres, Hare Island, and the Townships of Settrington, Callières, Saguenay, Tadoussac, Bergeronnes, Escoumain, d'Iberville, Laval, De Latour and Betsiamites, and the Seigniory of Mille-Vaches or Portneuf, the Terra Firma of Mingan, the Islets of Mingan, the Island and 45 Seigniory of Anticosti, and all the other tracts of land and Islands comprised within the limits and description aforesaid.

County of Montagnais.

43. The County of Montagnais shall be bounded on the south-west by the County of Portneuf,—on the south 50 by the County of Quebec and the County of Montmorency, as far as the prolongation of the western line of the Township of Simard,—on the east by the said pro-

longation and the said line as far as the north-western corner of the Township of simard to the limits of the Province, and on the north by the limits of the Province; the said County so bounded comprising the Townships of Ouatchouan, Metabetchouan, Caron, De Mesy, Plessis, 5 Kenongami, Labaire, Signai, Delisle, Taché and Bourget.

44 The County of Bagot shall be bounded on the County of south by the County of Montmorency and the County of Saguenay as above described, - on the south-east and on 10 the east by the County of Saguency,—on the west by the County of Montagnais, - and on the north by the limits of the Province; the said County so bounded comprising the Townships of Jonquière, Simard, Tremblay, - Harvey, Chicoutimi, Laterrière, Bagot, Simon, Lartigue 15 and Saint Jean, and all other Townships or Settlements included by the boundaries aforesaid.

- 45. The City of Montreal shall be comprised within City of its present limits.
- 20 46. The City of Quebec shall be comprised withinits City of
- 47. The Town of Three Rivers shall, for the purposes Town of 25 of this Act, comprise the Town of Three Rivers, commonly so called, and the Parish of Three Rivers as it now subsists for ecclesiastical purposes, and including the several concessions upon the River St. Lawrence, and backwards, as far as the tract included for ecclesiastical 30 purposes in the Parish of Pointe du Lac, and up to the Fief St. Etienne.

48. The Town of Sherbrooke shall, for the purpeses Town of - of this Act, be bounded and limited so as to comprise the Sherbrooks. 35 following tract of land, that is to say: all that part of the Township of Ascot which lies in the fifth and sixth ranges of the said Township, from lot number ten to lot number seventeen inclusively, and in the seventh and eighth ranges thereof from lot number fourteen to lot 40 number twenty-two inclusively, and all that part of the Township of Orford which lies in the first and second ranges thereof from lot number seven to lot number sixteen inclusively, the portions and sections aforesaid comprising and including the said Town of Sherbrooke and 45 the adjacent Village of Lennoxville and their vicinage respectively: Provided always, that the qualification of Proviso: voters at elections of Members for the said. Town of Qualification of voters Sherbrooke (as hereinbefore described and bounded) shall be the same as that required for voters in the other Towns

50 of this Province.

The County of Renfrew shall consist of the Town-20 ships of Admaston, Blithfield, Bagot, Bromley, Horton, McNab, Pembroke, Ross, Stafford, Westmeath, and all that tract of land lying between the Western Boundaries of the Townships of Lavant, Blithfield, Admaston, Bromley, Stafford and Pembroke and the Ottawa River, and a 25 line drawn parallel to the general course of the said Boundaries of the said Townships from the western corner of the Township of Clarendon to the Ottawa River.

Lanark.

7. The County of Lanark shall consist of the Town-30 ships of Montague, Elmsley North, Burgess North, Sherbrooke North, Sherbrooke South, Bathurst, Drummond, Beckwith, Dalhousie, Lanark, Ramsay, Lavant, Darling and Packenham.

Dundas.

8. The County of Dundas shall consist of the Town-35 ships of Mountain, Matilda, Winchester and Williamsburgh.

Grenville.

9. The County of Grenville shall consist of the Townships of Edwardsburgh, Wolford, Gower South, Oxford and Augusta, including the Town of Prescott.

Lesis.

10. The County of Leeds shall consist of the Townships of North Crosby, South Crosby, Burgess, Bastard, Elmsley, Kitley, Front of Leeds and Lansdowne, Rear

of Leeds and Lansdowne, Escott, Yonge, and that portion of the Township of Elizabeth Town not included within the limits of the Town of Brockville.

Brant.

26. The County of Brant shall consist of the Town-25 ships of Brantford, (including the Town of that name,) Onondaga, Tuscarora, Oakland, South Dumfries and East Burford, and the village of Paris.

Wellington.

27. The County of Wellington shall consist of the Townships of Erin, Puslinch, Guelph, Nichol, Garafraxa, 30 Peel, Maryborough, Minto, Arthur, Luther, Eramosa, Amaranth and Pilkington.

42. The County of Wentworth shall consist of the 15 Townships of Beverly, Flamborough East, Flamborough West, Ancaster Glanford, Binbrook, Salifleet, and that portion of the Township of Barton not included within the limits of the City of Hamilton and the liberties thereof.

Cities of Toronto; 43. The City of Toronto shall be comprised within its 20 present limits.

Hamilton.

44. The City of Hamilton shall be comprised within its present limits.

Kingston.

45. The City of Kingston shall be comprised within its present limits.

Towns of Bytown.

46. The Town of Bytown shall be comprised within its present limits.

London.

47. The Town of London shall be comprised within its present limits.

Nisgara.

48. The Town of Niagara shall be comprised within 30 its present limits.

Brockville.

49. The Town of Brockville shall be comprised within its present limits.

Cornwall.

49. The town of Cornwall shall be comprised within its present limits.

#### GENERAL PROVISIONS.

II. And be it enacted, That the Counties of Kamouraska, l'Islet, Bellechasse, Dorchester, Beauce, Nicolet, Sherbrooke, Richelieu, Saint Hyacinthe, Rouville, Chambly, Laprairie, Acadie, Beauharnois, Vaudreuil, Ottawa,

Two Mountains, Montreal, Terrebonne, Lachenaye, Assomption, Berthier, St. Maurice, and Portneuf, in Lower Canada, and the Counties of Glengarry, Carlton, Lanark, Grenville, Leeds, Prince Edward, Hastings, Northumber-5 land, Durham, Simcoe, Halton, Wentworth, Waterloo, Elgin, Middlesex, Brant, Wellington, Norfolk, Oxford, Welland, Lincoln, Ontario and Peel in Upper Canada, shall each be respectively represented by two Members in the Legislative Assembly of this Province, and the County of York in Upper Canada by three Members; the Counties of 10 Gaspé, Bonaventure, Rimousky, Temiscouata, Lotbinière, Megantic, I rummond, Yamaska, Stanstead, Shefford, Missiskoui, Verchères, Huntingdon, Argenteuil, Champlain, Quebec, Montmorency, and Saguenay, in Lower anada, and the Counties of Stormont, Prescott, Russell, 15 Renfrew, Dundas, Lennox, Addington, Frontenac, Peterborough, Victoria, Perth, Lambton, Kent, Essex, Haldimand and Grey, in Upper Canada, each, respectively by one Member; the Counties of Bagot and Montagnais, in Lower Canada, which shall be united for the purpo-20 ses of this Act, by one Member for the two; and the Counties of Huron and Bruce in Upper Canada, which shall be united for the purposes of this Act, by one Member for the two; the Cities of Quebec and Montreal, each, respectively, by three Members; the City of 25 Toronto by two Members; and the Town of Three-Rivers, with the Parish as hereinbefore defined, the Town of Sherbrooke, the City of Hamilton, the City of Kingston, the Town of Bytown, the Town of London, the Town of Niagara, the Town of Brockville, and the 30 Town of Cornwall, each, respectively by one Member; Provided always, that the qualifications of persons entitled to vote at Elections of Members in the said Counties, Cities, and Towns, shall respectively remain as they now are, or as fixed by this Act, or as they may be fixed by any other Act passed during the present or any 35 future Session; Provided also, that for all other purposes Proviso: except those of this Act, the several Cities and Towns in this Province, shall be considered as making part of the County in which they are situate, in all cases where it is not otherwise provided by law.

40 III. And be it enacted, That the Divisions of Counties, When this Cities and Towns in this Province, established for the effect purposes of this Act, shall have their full and entire effect for all the purposes thereof so soon as it shall come into force, but shall not in any manner affect the Divisions now 45 existing for the purposes of the Administration of Justice, of the Militia, of the Registration of deeds or other instruments, of Municipal or local affairs, or of any other matter whatsoever, except only for the purposes of this Act, unless and until it shall be otherwise provided by the Degislature; Provided always, that any Act or Acts mak- Proviso.

ing provision for any of the matters aforesaid may be

passed during the present Session of the Provincial Parliament; Provided also, that all Augmentations or Gores of Seigniories, Parishes, Townships or settlements, and all Towns, Villages, or Reserves for the same, not snecially mentioned in this Act, shall be considered as forming 5 part of the County in which the principal portion of such locality or in the immediate vicinity of which such Town. Village or reserve, shall be situate, unless such Augmentation, Gore or Settlement, Town, Village or Reserve, shall, under the provisions of this Act, form part of some 10 other County, either as being included therein by name. or according to the boundaries established for such County.

Inconsistent enactments repealed.

IV. And be it enacted, That all Legislative provisions now in force in this Province, or in Upper Canada or 15. Lower, Canada respectively, concerning the division of the said Province into Counties, Cities, and Towns, and Representation of the said Counties, Cities and Towns in the Legislative Assembly, shall be and they are hereby repealed or amended according to the provisions 20 of this Act, from the time when it shall come into force and effect, but in so far only as such provisions may be contrary to those of this Act.

As to Territorial of this Session.

V. Provided always, and be it enacted, that so much Divisions Act of the Act passed during the present Session, and inti-25 tuled " An Act to make certain alterations in the Territorial Divisions of Upper Canada," as may be inconsistent with this Act, shall be superseded and repealed from the time this Act shall come into force and effect.

Commencement of Act.

VI. And be it enacted, That this Act shall have force 30 and effect from and after the end of the present Provincial Parliament, and not before.
