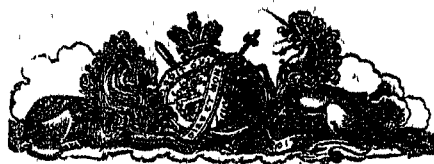

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### PETITIONS.

The number of PETITIONS received during the Session was 1837.

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### SELECT COMMITTEES.

The number of SELECT COMMITTEES appointed was 55, of which the following is a detailed ACCOUNT, shewing the matters referred to the consideration of each Committee, and the day upon which a Report was made therefrom to the House; specifying when such Report was by Bill. Where nothing to the contrary is stated, it is to be understood, that no Report was made.

- I.—To prepare and report the draft of an Address in answer to the *Speech* of His Excellency the Governor General, to both Houses of the Legislature, upon a Resolution adopted by the House (Wednesday, 29th February.) Report, 29th February, 1860.
- II.—To take into consideration the *Annual Report* of the Chief Emigration Agent at Quebec, for the year 1859,—with the *Supplementary Report* of the German Assistant at Quebec, and the general subject of the progressive decrease of late years of the *European Immigration* into this Province. - III.—To assist Mr. Speaker in making proper arrangements for the distribution and disposal of the business before the House. First Report, 9th March, and Second Report, 4th May.

It is the duty of this Committee to take into consideration without a special reference, all Petitions for Private or Local Bills, that may from time to time be received by the House, and to report in each case whether the provisions of the Rules, with regard to the publication of Notices, have been complied with.

The following abstract taken from the Private Bill Register, will convey the judgment of the Committee in reference to the various Petitions taken into their consideration, as far as regards the compliance or non-compliance with the Rules of the House affecting applications for Private Bills. The number prefixed to each entry refers to the application in the Register, on examining which, fuller particulars of the progress of the Committee, in

*DETAILED ACCOUNT of the MONEYS appropriated during the THIRD Session of the SIXTH Provincial Parliament of Canada; specifying whether the appropriation was made by Act of Parliament, or by Warrant upon an Address of the Legislative Assembly.*

*(The Numbers subjoined to the undermentioned Bills, have reference to the preceding Schedule of Bills, by turning to which the Titles of the several Acts will be found at length.)*

**I.—SUBSIDY TO CANADIAN LINE OF STEAMERS, AND FOR THE EXTENSION OF THE LINE OF TELEGRAPH TO BELLE-ISLE. (See Bill No. 39.) (23 Vic., Cap. 5.)**

This Act authorizes the application of a further sum of \$8000 for each voyage, to commence on the 1st of May, 1859, to the 1st of January, 1867, as an aid to the proprietors of the Canadian Line of Steamships, in order to provide additional vessels of greater power and size, to perform more surely the services required of them in the maintenance of a *Weekly Line of Postal* communication between this Province and the United Kingdom.

It further authorizes the payment of \$10,000 for seven years, from the 1st of May, 1859, to the 1st January, 1867, as a Provincial Grant in aid towards the continuation of a Line of Telegraph from Father Point to the Straits of Belle-Isle

**II.—SUPPLY BILL FOR 1860. (See Bill No. 271) (23 Vic., Cap. 15)**

This Act authorizes the payment, out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund, of the sum of \$2,572,202 30 cents, for defraying the expenses of the Civil Government of this Province, and for other purposes, for the year 1860.

It further authorizes the issue of Debentures on the credit of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of this Province, of a sum not exceeding \$1,000,000, for expenses connected with the Public Works.
