An ordination was held in the Cathedral on Sunday 15th March, when the following were ordained : *Deacon*, Lewis Buffon Vaughan ; *Priests*, Revs. Archibald Lisle Reed, B.A. and Robert Walter Wallbridge Allen, M.A.

A meeting was held on Thursday evening 26th March, in connection with the Laymen's Missionary Movement, the Archbishop presiding, Mr. W. D. Gwynne addressed the meeting. An earnest desire to further the cause of Missions was very evident, and will, we feel assured, bring forth good results. There has been some confusion in some peoples' minds between the so called Laymen's Movement and the special gift to be presented at the Conference in London, but it was explained that the former comprehended the latter. For our part we would prefer that the gift at Lambeth should be a special and exceptional matter, and that the "Movement" should aim not at a particularly strenuous effort for once, as it seems to many to be, but much rather an effort to widen and deepen the missionary spirit, which was the original intention of the movement, and thus bring about a more lasting benefit to both cause and the givers.

It is with deep regret that we record the death of one of the Choristers, Joseph Errington Stonge, aged 9 years, son of Mr. Harvey Stonge.

ST. ALBAN'S CATHEDRAL BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

We are thankful to say that in the past year we have taken a tiny step forward but when we look into the records of the branch and see what a great step we might have taken, it is a little depressing. For instance, our membership last year was 62 and we have had 17 new members, so that our membership now should be 79 instead of which it is only 65 ; thirteen members having left during the year and one transferred to another branch. Of the 13 who left, 6 have moved either out of town or out of the district, as also did the one transferred, so that much was unavoidable, but the other 7 were the careless ones who did not pay any fees during the year and consequently have to be counted as having left.

Twenty-nine Meetings were held during the year. The average attendance being only 13.5. Bad weather and so much sickness being the cause of low average. But when we see how much these two causes effect the attendance can we not all make an extra effort not to let every trifling thing prevent us coming to the meetings. Surely we can lay aside one afternoon in the week for Missionary work.

Sixty-five Leaflets are taken by the branch all of which are subscribed for. Thirty Intercession papers are taken with twenty-eight subscribers.

We have Six Life Members.

Our pledges have not been fully met by the 50 cents a year plan. Only two-thirds of our members have paid in their share, the balance has been made up by the generosity of three members who have paid more than their share. May I suggest to the members who do not pay this 50 cents a year, that you look at your pledge card and pick out the pledge you are most interested in and give the 50 cents towards one particular object, with this stipulation that if the Treasurer tells you she has enough to meet that particular pledge you will choose another.

During the year addresses on Missionary subjects have been given by Miss Tilley, Miss Jones, and Mrs. S. G. Wood. Notes of Miss Cartwright's Class on Japan have been given by Mrs. Herring. Many thanks are due all of these ladies, especially Mrs. Herring as she not only had to attend the class but has had to prepare her notes afterwards which takes up a good deal of time.

The Missionary questions given by the Literature Committee have not been taken up very well. So far I have only received 6 answers out of 12; and they must be given in by the end of the week.

Do you attend the Monthly Board Meeting of the Diocese? You have been invited to do so, and I can assure you if you attend one you will not willingly miss one afterwards for you will be so interested. Some say they cannot get away for the whole day, but that is not necessary, the meetings commence at half-past ten but you may go in or out when you please. The morning is probably the most interesting part.

In conclusion I would like to leave a question with you. How often do you pray for your Branch and your Officers?

We have sent off two bales, one on May 28th to Annie Susukwamoos, Emmanuel College, containing a complete outfit of clothing and the other on December 10th, to Louisa Shebahagezis, Shingwauk Home, the latter containing clothing for Louisa and 73 small presents to be distributed among the children of the Home.
