The Boston Courier remarks concerning the American General Meade's army of the Potomac:

The whole of his first paragraph is but a repetition of the same old story, and although it is full of facts, it is not only unjust, but it is also untrue.

Your work is not over. The enemy must be pursued as far as possible. It is also untrue that the number of prisoners and cannon captured by the army of Meade is 30,000.
