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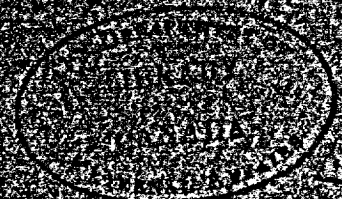

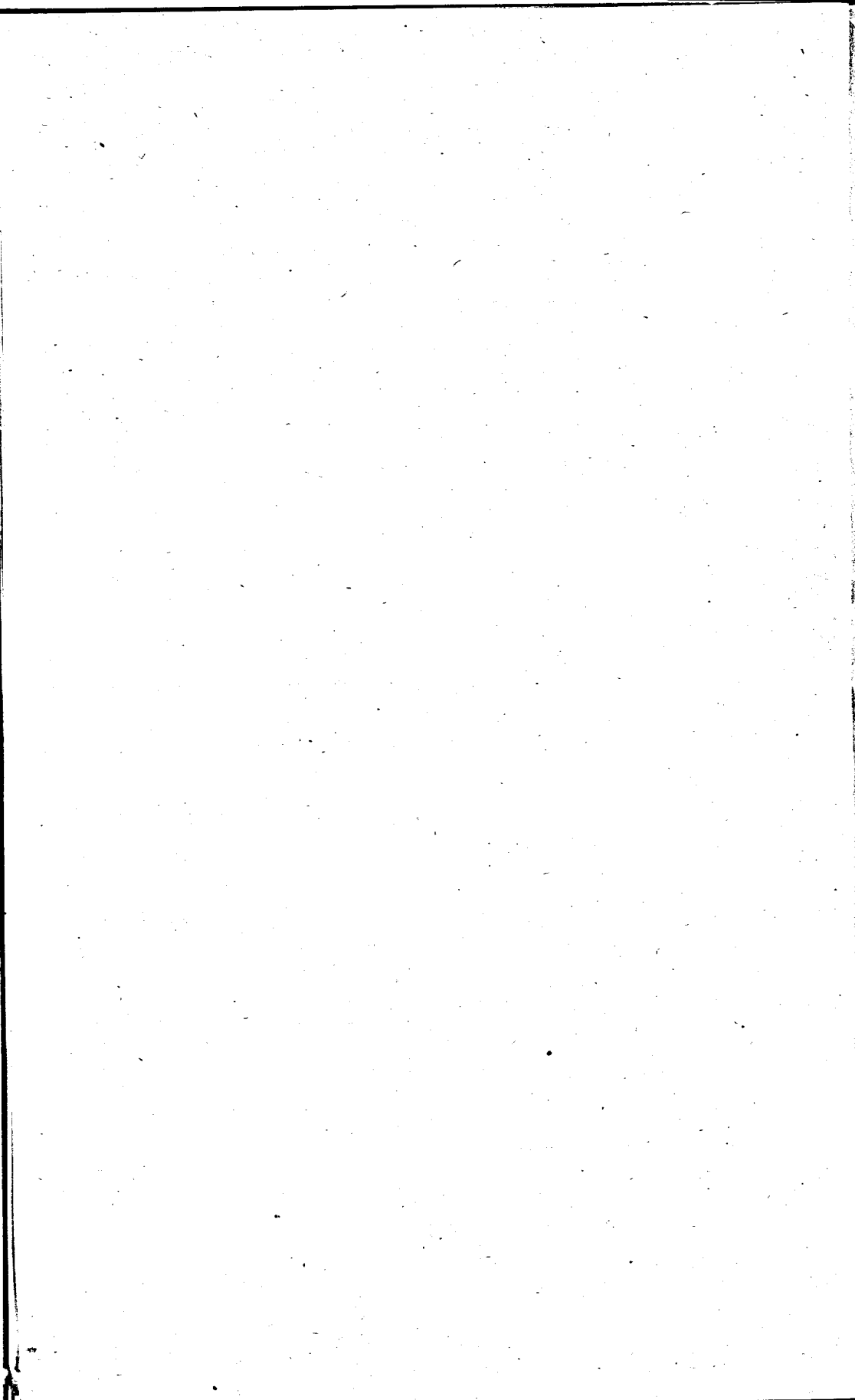

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REPORT

OF THE

UNDER-SECRETARY OF STATE FOR EXTERNAL AFFAIRS.*

To the Honourable CHARLES MURPHY, K. C., M.P.,
Secretary of State for External Affairs.

SIR,—I have the honour to submit herewith a report on the affairs of the Department of External Affairs covering the first year of its existence.

The Act by which the Department was created was brought into operation by proclamation of the Governor General on June 1, 1909, and steps were forthwith taken for its organization and for the inception of its work. Temporary accommodation having been obtained in the House of Commons building, it was possible to begin operations early in July. About the middle of October its location was transferred to quarters in the Trafalgar building, at the corner of Queen and Bank Streets, where it is now established.

In addition to the current business of the Department, a highly important and laborious part of its work is the laying of foundations for its future usefulness by collecting and arranging the papers recording the history of Canada's external relations. Good progress has been made with this work, especially as regards the more recent papers, but much remains to be done.

The current correspondence with which the Department has been called on to deal, has been concerned with subjects of perhaps rather more than usual interest, as will appear from the following brief review.

TRADE RELATIONS.

CONVENTION WITH FRANCE.

The Supplementary Convention signed January 23, 1909, modifying the Convention of September 19, 1907, regulating the commercial relations between Canada and France, was approved by the Canadian Parliament in an Act which took effect on December 3, 1909, and both Conventions were ratified and became operative on February 1, 1910.

The general effect of these two Conventions which are to remain in force, unless previously denounced, for ten years, and thereafter until the expiry of twelve months from the day on which either of the two parties shall have denounced them, is to give to certain Canadian products enumerated in Schedule A of the Convention, the benefits of the French minimum tariff, in return for the concession to the French products specified in Schedule B, of the Canadian Intermediate tariff, and of special tariff rates to other French products named in Schedule C.

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ARRANGEMENT WITH GERMANY.

As a result of informal negotiations between the Minister of Finance and the Imperial German Consul for Canada, the contention of Germany that German products should receive in Canada the same treatment as the products of the United Kingdom was abandoned, and a provisional commercial agreement arranged whereby in return for the admission of a list of specified Canadian products to the benefits of the German Conventional tariff, the application of the surtax of 33½ per cent, imposed on German imports into Canada was suspended.

Effect as from March 1, 1910, was given to this agreement by an Order of the Governor General in Council, dated February 14, 1910, and a Notice of the German Federal Council dated February 24, 1910.

This agreement is a provisional one, made in contemplation of the negotiation of a formal Convention, and if such a Convention is not entered into within a reasonable time, may be terminated on two months' notice.

ARRANGEMENT WITH ITALY.

As in the case of Germany, an informal agreement was entered into between the Minister of Finance and the Royal Consul of Italy whereby specified Canadian products were to be admitted to Italy on payment of the Conventional import duties, in return for the admission into Canada at Intermediate tariff rates of specified products of Italy.

Effect was given to this agreement, in so far as Canada was concerned, by an Order of the Governor General in Council dated June 7, 1910.

Like the arrangement with Germany, this agreement was made in contemplation of a formal Convention, and is liable to be terminated on two months notice if such a Convention is not concluded within a reasonable time.

ARRANGEMENT WITH BELGIUM.

The tariff treatment granted to Canadian products by Belgium having been considered to warrant concessions from Canada, the Canadian Government, by Order in Council of June 7, 1910, extended the benefit of the Intermediate tariff to specified Belgian products.

ARRANGEMENT WITH THE NETHERLANDS.

On the same grounds a similar concession by Order in Council of June 7, 1910, was made to like products of the Netherlands.

UNITED STATES.

The enactment of the United States Tariff Act on August 5, 1909, by which the President of the United States was empowered to grant the benefits of the minimum tariff to the products of such countries as did not unduly discriminate in their tariff treatment against United States products, raised the question whether the Franco-Canadian Treaty, the benefits of which were automatically extended under most favoured nation clauses in certain treaties to various foreign nations, among which the United States was not included, did not effect such a discrimination.

In order to satisfy himself that he would be justified in applying the minimum tariff to Canadian products, the President invited the Minister of Finance to Albany to discuss the subject. As an outcome of this discussion Canada agreed to reduce the general tariff on thirteen named articles, on which, under the Treaty, France had been granted the Intermediate tariff, to the level of the Intermediate tariff. This agreement was carried into effect

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by the passing of an Act by the Canadian Parliament to amend the Customs Tariff, and the President issued a Proclamation admitting Canadian products to the benefits of the minimum tariff.

It has been arranged that the question of the commercial relations between the two countries shall form the subject of further negotiations.

WEST INDIES COMMISSION.

With the object of promoting closer trade relations and developing mutual trading facilities between Canada and the British West India Colonies, a Commission, dated August 9, 1909, was issued by His Majesty's Government appointing the Right Honourable Lord Balfour of Burleigh, K. T., the Honourable W. S. Fielding, the Honourable William Paterson, Sir John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Bart., D. S. O., and Sir Donald Morris, K. C. M. G., to investigate and report upon the measures to be taken for this end.

In furtherance of the objects of the Commission, meetings were held at various points in Canada in the autumn of 1909; and a tour of the principal West India Islands arranged for, commencing towards the end of January. On this tour Mr. Paterson accompanied his fellow commissioners, but owing to pressure of Parliamentary duties Mr. Fielding was unable to join them.

Further meetings were held in London in June, 1910.

OTHER TREATIES.

TREATY WITH UNITED STATES *re* BOUNDARY WATERS.

This Treaty, as approved by the United States Senate in its Resolution of March 3, 1909, which stipulated that the Treaty should not be construed so as to affect or change existing rights at the rapids of Sault Ste. Marie, or to interfere with the drainage of swamp or overflowed lands into streams flowing into boundary waters, was accepted by Canada, and the final ratifications exchanged on May 5, 1910.

Its object is to prevent disputes regarding boundary waters which, broadly speaking, it defines as waters and connecting waterways along which the international boundary between Canada and the United States passes. Navigation of such waters for purposes of commerce is made free to the inhabitants and vessels of both countries equally, and the like freedom is extended to the waters of Lake Michigan and to all canals connecting boundary waters.

Each Government reserves exclusive jurisdiction and control over the use and diversion of all waters on its own side of the boundary line which in their natural channel would flow across the boundary; but it is agreed that any interference with such waters on either side of the line, resulting in injury on the other, shall give rise to the same rights and entitle the injured parties to the same legal remedies as if such injury took place in the country where the interference occurs.

No obstruction or diversion of boundary waters, except by special agreement, is to be made hereafter save by the authorities of the Dominion of Canada or of the United States within their respective jurisdictions, and with the approval of the International Joint Commission established by the Treaty. The approval of that Commission is also made necessary to the construction or maintenance of any remedial or protective works or dams in waters flowing from boundary waters, or in waters at a lower level than the boundary, in rivers flowing across the boundary, the effect of which is to raise the natural level of waters on the other side of the boundary. Provision is also made to prevent the pollution of boundary waters on either side to the injury of health or property on the other.

A limit is placed upon the diversion of water from the Niagara river so that the level of Lake Erie and the flow of the river may not be appreciably affected.

The diversion of water above the falls for power purposes allowed to the United States is not to exceed in the aggregate a daily diversion at the rate of 20,000 cubic feet per second,

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that allowed to Canada is not to exceed in the aggregate a daily diversion at the rate of 36,000 cubic feet per second.

It is agreed that the St. Mary and Milk rivers, and their tributaries (in the State of Montana and the Provinces of Alberta and Saskatchewan) shall be treated as a single stream for purposes of irrigation and power, and their waters shall be equally apportioned between the two countries.

An International Joint Commission is constituted to consist of six Commissioners, three appointed by the United States and three by Canada, which is to have jurisdiction over and to pass upon cases involving the obstruction or diversion of boundary waters.

It is further provided that other questions and matters of difference arising between the two countries involving the rights, obligations or interests of either in relation to the other or to the inhabitants of the other along the common frontier shall be referred to the Commission for examination and report, and that any questions or matters of difference arising, involving the rights, obligations or interests of either country in relation to the other or their respective inhabitants may be referred for decision to the same tribunal.

TREATY FOR PRESERVATION OF FISHERIES IN INTERNATIONAL BOUNDARY WATERS OF
APRIL 11, 1908.

Under the authority conferred by this Treaty, Joint Regulations were drawn up by Professor E. E. Prince and Professor D. S. Jordan, the International Fisheries Commissioners, and were simultaneously laid before the Canadian Parliament and the United States Congress on February 4, 1910.

NORTH ATLANTIC COAST FISHERIES ARBITRATION.

Under the General Convention of Arbitration between Great Britain and the United States of April 4th, 1908, a Special Agreement was signed on January 27, 1909, arranging for the reference to arbitration of the long-standing questions of difference in regard to the interpretation of the provisions of the Convention of 1818 relative to the North Atlantic Coast Fisheries.

The Arbitration Tribunal chosen by mutual agreement from among the members of the Permanent Court at the Hague consists of Dr. Heinrich Lammasch, President, His Excellency Luis M. Drago, Jonkheer A. F. de Savornin Lohman, the Honourable George Gray and the Right Honourable Sir Charles Fitzpatrick. The Honourable A. B. Aylesworth was appointed British Agent, and Mr. Chandler Anderson, Agent of the United States.

The pleadings were duly exchanged between the two parties as provided by the agreement and the oral argument began at the Hague on June 1.

DELIMITATION OF BOUNDARY IN PASSAMAQUODDY BAY.

The provision made in the Demarcation of Boundaries Treaty with the United States, of 1908, for the delimitation of two portions of the International Boundary in Passamaquoddy Bay by mutual agreement having expired before such agreement was reached, it became necessary, in order to give effect to a compromise arranged between the two Governments by which Pope's Folly Island was relinquished to the United States and Canada retained the Upper Middle Grounds, to conclude a new treaty. Such a treaty fixing the boundary in accordance with a description settled by the British and United States Boundary Commissioners so as to carry out the compromise was signed on May 21, 1910.

DEMARCATON OF BOUNDARIES.

Further progress was made during the season of 1909 under the Alaska Boundary Convention of 1906, in the survey and demarcation of the 141st meridian of west longitude

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where it forms the international boundary, so as to complete that work between a point near the Natazhat Ridge and the Yukon River, a distance of 215 miles, with the exception of the vista cutting for a distance of 57 miles and the placing of the final monuments for about 101 miles.

Correspondence has taken place with the United States Government in regard to the condition of the sealing industry and the question of the necessity of further measures for the protection of the fur-seal species; and the conclusion of an agreement for settling the various outstanding pecuniary claims of subjects of His Majesty against the United States Government and of citizens of the United States against His Majesty's Government has also been the subject of negotiations.

I have much pleasure in expressing my satisfaction with the manner in which the members of the staff have discharged their duties during the past year.

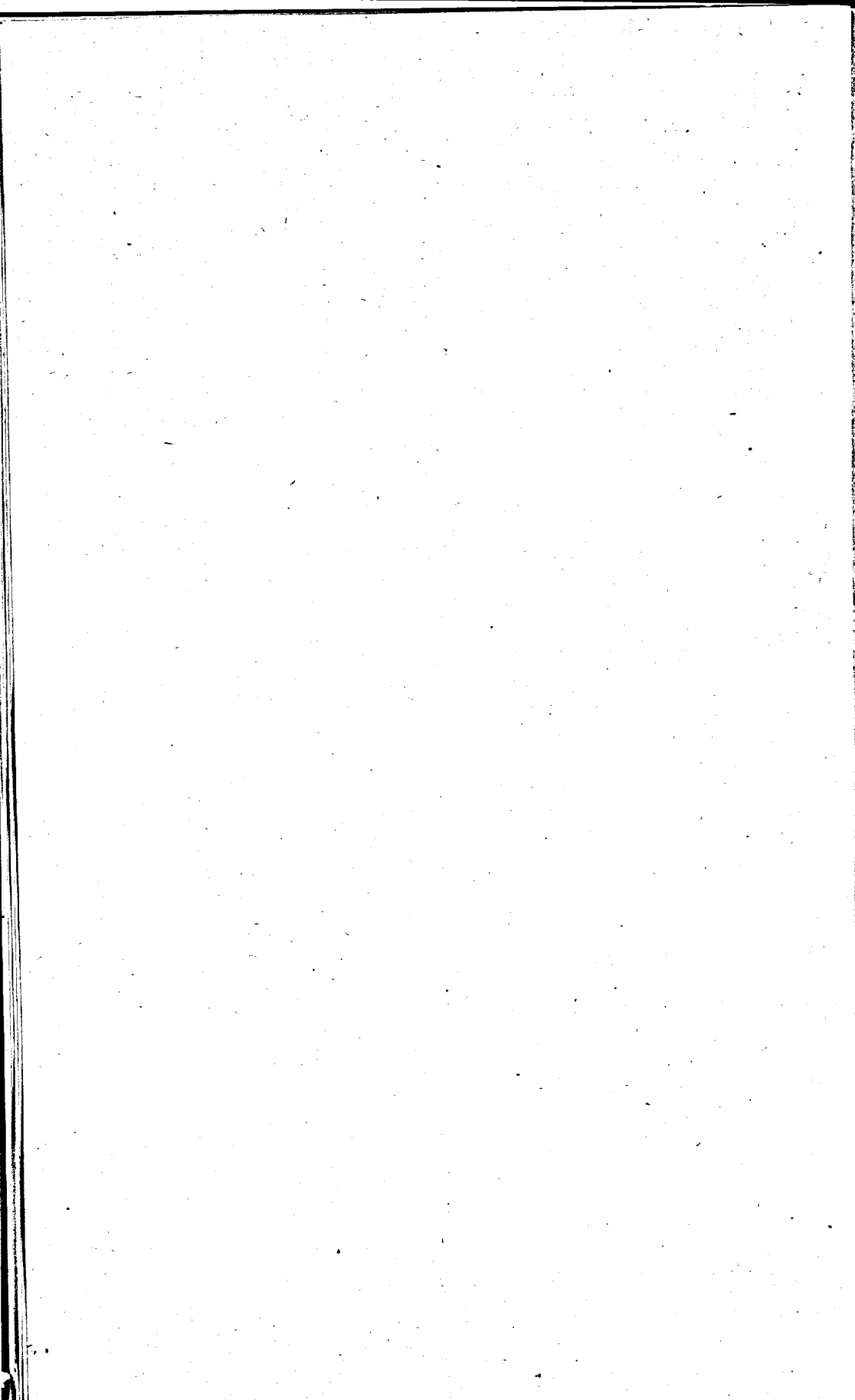

PASSPORTS REQUIREMENTS OF FOREIGN COUNTRIES:

NOTE.—British subjects travelling abroad are recommended to furnish themselves with passports, for even in those countries where they are no longer obligatory they are found to be useful as affording a ready means of identification in case of need.

ARGENTINE REPUBLIC.—Passengers for the Argentine Republic should carry Passports, and are advised to also carry certificates of birth. Persons born in His Majesty's dominions should, if they intend to become resident, even for a short time, obtain from a British Consulate in the Republic a Certificate of Nationality for purposes of identification, and to secure exemption from military service.

AUSTRIA—HUNGARY.—Persons entering Hungary from Servia or Roumania must be provided with passports. Although, in other cases, passports are not legally necessary, travellers are advised to carry them. For purposes of residence a passport or other document to prove identity is necessary.

BELGIUM.—It is desirable for travellers to possess passports. For purposes of residence, registration at the Police Office of the district is required, and a passport is accepted as evidence of identity.

BOLIVIA.—See *Peru*.

BRAZIL.—Passports not actually required, but travellers are advised to carry them for purposes of identification. If intending to become resident they should register their names and addresses at the nearest British Consulate.

BULGARIA.—Travellers should carry passports of recent date. Bulgarian *visa* not required. Residents should provide themselves annually with certificates of registration under the Ottoman Order in Council.

CENTRAL AMERICA.—Possession of passports desirable both for personal security and purposes of identification.

Costa Rica.—No regulations in force.

Guatemala.—Alien residents are required to present at the Guatemalan Foreign Office passports *visés* by the Diplomatic or Consular officer in Guatemala of their native country.

Honduras.—No regulations except in times of disturbance.

Nicaragua.—No regulations in time of peace. To leave the country a local passport has, however, to be obtained from the Ministry of War.

Salvador.—Travellers should carry passports, and should, in addition, obtain passports from the Government of Salvador. (Charge for latter, 25 cents.)

CHILE.—No regulations in force.

CHINA.—Passports are not required at open ports. For travelling into the interior a special passport must be obtained from a British Consul, which is valid for one year. (Cost, 3 dol. 50c. *Mexican*.)

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COLOMBIA.—British subjects proceeding to the Republic of Colombia must provide themselves with passports, *visés* by the Colombian Minister or by a Consul of the Republic in Canada. For travelling in the interior it is advisable to obtain a special passport from a British Consul (charge, sixty cents.) Immigrants without resources must be provided with a passport issued *gratis* by the Colombian Consul at port of departure.

COREA.—Passports are not required within a radius of 100 li (33 miles) from the open ports. Persons travelling in the interior must obtain a passport through the British Consul. (Fee 3.50 yen, about \$1.75.)

CUBA.—Although passports are not legally necessary, travellers are advised to carry them. Persons intending to reside in Cuba for any length of time should have their names registered at the British Consulate-General.

DENMARK.—No regulations in force. But passports or similar documents may be required by the Police from persons accepting employment in Denmark before furnishing them with an "opholdsbog" (situation book), and also from music hall artistes.

Iceland.—No regulations in force.

St. Thomas.—No regulations in force. A local government passport must, however, be procured when leaving the island, the cost of which varies according to destination.

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC.—Passport necessary. In order to leave the country a Dominican passport must, in addition, be obtained, for which a fee of about \$5 is charged.

ECUADOR.—See *Peru*.

EGYPT.—Passports are not required by law, but travellers are advised to carry them. For travelling in other parts of the Ottoman dominions, see *Turkey*.

Sudan.—Persons desiring to enter the Sudan, travelling third-class, *unless* they are officials of the government, or are travelling on government warrants, or are *bona fide* natives of the Sudan, must apply for permits to the Sudan Agent, Cairo, the Sudan Government Railway's Agent at Alexandria, the Sudan Government Agent at Suez, the Governor of Halfa, the Governor of the Red Sea Province, or the Inspector at Port Sudan.

Persons proceeding south or west of El Obeid or Bara must obtain a permit from the Governor of Kordofan or his representative at El Obeid or Bara.

All Europeans are recommended to report their arrival, personally or in writing, at any place where an official holding the post of Sub-Mamur, or any superior post, is stationed.

FRANCE.—The possession of a passport may save inconvenience, since evidence of identity may at any time be required.

If produced as evidence of identity at a Post Office the passport may require to be countersigned by the British Consul for the district.

For permanent residence, or in order to exercise profession or trade, a declaration furnishing particulars with respect to the family, nationality, profession, &c., of the person making the declaration, is required to be made at the Mairie of the Commune within a few days of arrival.

Algeria.—Regulations similar to France, both as regards passports and residence, &c.

French Guiana.—Regulations similar to France, both as regards passports and residence, &c.

Madagascar.—Travellers are advised to carry passports.

Martinique.—
Réunion.—
Saigon.— } Regulations similar to France, both as regards passports and residence, &c.

New Caledonia.—Possession of passport desirable in view of existence of penal establishment.

Tahiti.—No regulations affecting Europeans in force.

Tunis.—Regulations similar to France, both as regards passports and residence, &c.

GERMAN EMPIRE.—Military officers travelling to Germany should be provided with passports; and although in other cases the possession of a passport is not obligatory yet as evidence of identity may at any time be required, travellers are advised to carry them. For residence of more than three weeks a passport is absolutely necessary. Children sent to schools in Germany should carry passports.

GREECE.—No regulations in force, except as regards persons entering the country by the land frontier, who are sometimes required to be in possession of passports.

HAYTI.—A passport (*visé* by a Haytian Consul) must, on arrival, be shown at the Port Office. It should also be produced and registered at the nearest British Consulate. On leaving the country a Haytian permit has to be obtained, as to which the British Consul should be consulted.

ITALY.—The possession of a passport is not obligatory, but travellers may at any time be required to give a satisfactory account of themselves, and to establish their identity.

British subjects producing passports at Italian post offices for purposes of personal identification may be required to obtain certified translations of the same from the British Consul.

Eritrea.—Travellers proceeding to Italian Colonies should, unless they carry special letters of recommendation to the authorities, provide themselves with passports, and obtain a *visa* from an Italian Consulate.

JAPAN.—Travellers are advised to carry passports.

LIBERIA.—No regulations in force, but a passport issued by the Liberian Secretary of State is required from residents leaving the country. For this 50 cents is charged.

MEXICO.—No regulations in force.

MONTENEGRO.—No special regulations exist, but a passport properly *visé* is required for travelling through the surrounding Turkish and Austrian territories.

MOROCCO.—It is advisable for travellers to be provided with passports, which are sometimes necessary, *e.g.*, for travelling inland, or for embarking on board the French

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steamers for Oran. Any one wishing to travel into the interior should consult His Majesty's Minister at Tangier or the British Consul for the district through which his route lies.

British subjects residing for more than one month in Morocco are required, under the Morocco Order in Council, 1889, to register themselves at the British Consulate.

MUSCAT.—No regulations exist. Travelling in the interior is unsafe without an armed escort.

NETHERLANDS.—The possession of a passport is not strictly necessary, but is recommended for purposes of identification.

Dutch Guiana: Curaçoa and Dependencies.—No regulations in force. Travellers are advised to provide themselves with passports as evidence of nationality.

Netherland East Indies.—Travellers, on arrival, must register themselves at the Office of the chief Local authority. For travelling inland in the islands, or for residence, a passport must also be obtained from the Local authorities, respecting which the British Consul should be consulted.

NORWAY.—No regulations in force.

PARAGUAY.—No regulations in force. Neither passports nor certificates of nationality are required from foreigners by the local authorities. It is as well, however, for persons travelling in the interior of the country to be provided with passports.

PERSIA.—A passport bearing the *visa* of a Persian Consular officer must be produced on entering Persia and the passport should be countersigned by the Persian passport officer before leaving the country.

PERU, ECUADOR AND BOLIVIA.—A passport is not actually necessary, but it is desirable to possess one in order to be able to obtain from a British Diplomatic or Consular officer the certificate of nationality required in the event of civil disturbances.

PORTUGAL.—Travellers are advised to provide themselves with passports. For residence in Portugal or Portuguese Colonies, a passport or other proof of nationality is required in order to obtain the necessary permission.

Azores.—The possession of a passport is advisable.

Cape Verde Islands.—Passports are not actually required, except in times of public danger, but they are useful in view of the fact that all foreigners have to personally register themselves at the Mayor's Office as soon as possible after arrival.

Loanda.—Passport necessary.

Madeira.—No regulations in force.

Mozambique.—Travellers should be provided with passports.

ROUMANIA.—Persons travelling to Roumania must be provided with passports bearing the *visa* of a Roumanian Consul in the United Kingdom. A fresh *visa* must be obtained for each journey. On arrival they should at once obtain the *visa* of the British Legation or of a British Consulate, and then, within twenty-four hours of arrival, apply to the Roumanian authorities for a permit to reside in the country. For a stay of less than eight

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days this formality may be dispensed with, and the permit will be stated upon the passport by the police officials at the frontier.

RUSSIA.—Visitors to Russia must be provided with passports bearing the *visa* of a Russian Diplomatic or Consular officer. Without such *visa* they will not be allowed to enter the country. To persons of the Jewish faith the *visa* is only granted in special circumstances, as to which the Russian Consular Officer should be consulted, and in any case such persons are subject to special regulations in Russia.

The passport will enable the holder to reside in Russia for six months, when it must be exchanged at the prefecture of St. Petersburg, or at the Chancery of a Provincial Governor, for a Russian "Billet de Séjour," to be renewed annually.

The cost of such a "Billet de Séjour" varies from 7 r. 15 c. to 1 r. 29 c. Each "Billet de Séjour," on first issue or renewal, must be delivered to the local police officer for inscription or *visa*. For non-renewal of a "Billet de Séjour" at the time of its expiration a fine is exacted.

On leaving Russia a police certificate must be obtained, which is granted on the first visit of the traveller to Russia at a cost of 75c. On subsequent visits 6 r. 50 c. is charged. If a "Billet de Séjour" has been obtained it must be returned, when the passport will be handed back to the owner with the necessary authorization to leave.

In the case of persons travelling through Russia, without stopping at any point within the Empire, the *visa* of a Russian Consular officer "to travel through Russia" will be accepted as sufficient, both for the purpose of entering and leaving the country, without obligation to obtain the police authorization to leave necessary in case of a stay in Russia.

Travellers to Russia should on each journey obtain a new passport to avoid the necessity of obtaining a "Billet de Séjour" on arrival, which they will be required to do when a passport is used six months after the date of the Russian *visa* attached to it.

SERVIA.—Travellers must be provided with passports.

SIAM.—No special regulations in force, but British subjects are required to register themselves at the British Consulate-General within one month of arrival. For travelling in the interior a passport must be obtained from the Siamese Government. Fee for registration, sixty cents, and for passport fifty cents.

SPAIN.—It is most advisable for travellers to be provided with passports. The *visa* of a Spanish Consul is not necessary, but it will be found useful in travelling in provincial towns and country districts.

In the Province of Barcelona, British subjects should, upon arrival, personally show their passports to His Majesty's Consul, who will thereupon furnish them with a certificate, which they are required to present, within twenty-four hours after their arrival in Barcelona, at the Office of the Civil Governor (in country towns and villages at the Office of the Mayor) in order that their names, descriptions, &c., may be registered. A fine, and possibly expulsion, may result from non-compliance with this regulation.

Canary Islands.—No regulations in force.

Ceuta.—British subjects desiring to visit Ceuta should apply through the British Vice-Consul at Algeciras for an order from the Commandante-General.

SWEDEN.—No regulations in force.

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SWITZERLAND.—A passport is necessary in order to obtain a "Permis de Séjour," which must be taken out, after their arrival, by persons intending to reside in Switzerland. Children sent to school in Switzerland should carry passports.

TURKISH EMPIRE.—Persons travelling to Turkey must be provided with a passport bearing the *visa* of a Turkish Consular officer. Without such passport they will be refused admission to the country. A fresh *visa* must be obtained for each journey. British subjects desiring afterwards to travel within Turkey must obtain a permit through a British Consul. On leaving Turkey the *visa* of a British Consul should be obtained.

Tripoli.—Regulations similar to Turkey.

UNITED STATES.—No regulations in force.

Hawaiian Islands.—No regulations in force.

Philippine Islands.—Passports not required.

Porto Rico.—Travellers are advised to carry passports.

URUGUAY.—No regulations affecting Europeans in force. Travellers are, however, advised to have passports as evidence of nationality, in case of need.

VENEZUELA.—Travellers should be provided with passports bearing the *visa* of a Venezuelan Consular officer.

ZANZIBAR.—No regulations in force.

DEPARTMENT OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS, JANUARY, 1910.

DEPARTMENT OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING PASSPORTS.

NOTE.—Naturalized British subjects should bear in mind that their naturalization has no effect within the limits of the Foreign State to which they originally belonged, unless they have ceased to be subjects of that state, in the manner prescribed by the laws thereof, or in pursuance of a treaty or convention to that effect.

1. Applications for passports should be made in writing and enclosed in a cover addressed to "THE HONOURABLE THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR EXTERNAL AFFAIRS, OTTAWA."

2. The charge for a passport, whatever number of persons may be named in it, is two dollars. The fee payable must accompany the application. Postage stamps will not be received as payment.

3. Passports are granted only to British-born subjects or to persons naturalized in the Dominion of Canada. A married woman is deemed to be a subject of the state of which her husband is for the time being a subject.

4. Passports are not valid after five years from the date of issue. Fresh passports must then be obtained. When the party is a naturalized British subject he will be so designated in his passport.

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5. Passports are granted to all persons either known to the Secretary of State or recommended to him by some person who is known to him; or upon the production of a declaration by the applicant, a blank form of which may be obtained at this Department, verified by a declaration made by any banking firm or by any mayor, magistrate, justice of the peace, minister of religion, physician, surgeon, solicitor, or notary resident in the Dominion of Canada. In certain cases, the applicant's certificate of birth must be produced in addition to the declaration.

6. If the applicant for a passport be a naturalized British subject, his certificate of naturalization must be forwarded to the Department of External Affairs with the declaration; and his certificate of naturalization will be returned with the passport to the person who has communicated with this Department in the applicant's behalf for delivery to the latter.

7. A passport cannot be issued by the Department of External Affairs on behalf of a person already abroad; such person should apply for one to the nearest British Mission or Consulate.

8. Travellers who may have any intention of visiting the Russian Empire, the Turkish Dominions, the Kingdom of Roumania, Persia, Colombia, Venezuela, Hayti, or Eritrea, at any time in the course of their travels, must first have their passports *visés* at the nearest Russian, Turkish, Roumanian, Persian, Colombian, Venezuelan, Haytian, or Italian Consulate as the case may be. For the information of travellers proceeding to any of these countries *via* Great Britain, it may be stated that the addresses in London of these consulates are respectively as follows:—The Russian Consulate-General, Windsor Chambers, 20, Great St. Helen's, E.C.; the Consulate-General of the Sublime Porte, 140 Leadenhall Street, E.C.; the Roumanian Consulate-General, 49 Parliament Street, S.W.; the Persian Consulate-General, 82 Victoria Street, S.W.; the Colombian Consulate-General, Friars House, New Broad Street, E.C.; the Venezuelan Consulate, Finsbury Pavement House, Finsbury Pavement, E.C.; the Haytian Consulate, 32 Fenchurch Street, E.C.; the Italian Consulate-General (for Eritrea), 44 Finsbury Square, E.C. Passports may also be *visés* at any of the other Consulates of Russia, Turkey, Roumania, Persia, Colombia, Venezuela, Hayti, or Italy in the United Kingdom. Travellers about to proceed to any other country need not obtain the *visa* of the Diplomatic or Consular Agents of such country.

N.B.—Although travellers are now free to enter most foreign countries without passports, colonial British subjects travelling abroad are recommended not to omit to provide themselves with passports, for even in those countries where they are no longer obligatory, they are found to be useful as affording a ready means of identification in case of need. British subjects intending to *reside* in Germany or in Switzerland should provide themselves with passports.

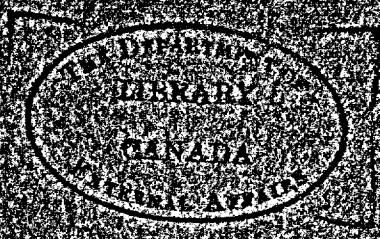

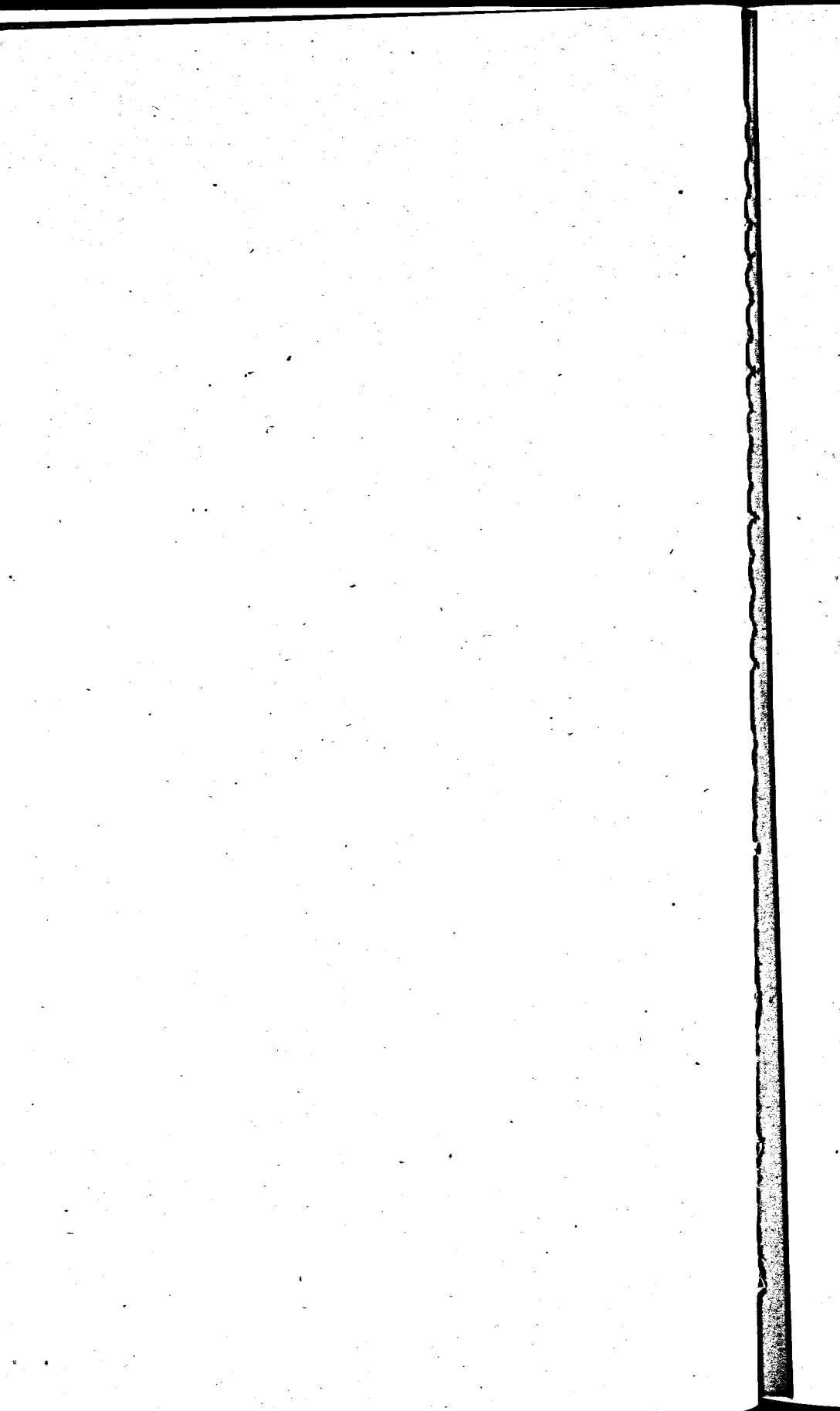

REPORT

OF THE

UNDER-SECRETARY OF STATE FOR EXTERNAL AFFAIRS.

To the Honourable W. J. ROCHE, M. D., M. P.,
Secretary of State for External Affairs.

SIR,—I have the honour to submit my annual report upon the affairs of this Department for the year just ended* in the form of a brief review of the more important matters which have formed the subjects of the correspondence dealt with by the Department.

It will be convenient perhaps, to classify these matters under the headings of (1) Relations with Foreign Powers (2) Relations with other portions of the Empire.

(1) RELATIONS WITH FOREIGN POWERS.

NORTH ATLANTIC COAST FISHERIES ARBITRATION.

The decision of the Arbitration Tribunal upon the questions submitted to it with regard to the interpretation of the Treaty of 1818 conferring certain liberties on United States fishermen was pronounced at the Hague on the 7th September, 1910. The effect of the decision may be stated as follows:—

(1) The British contention that the liberty to take fish in territorial waters granted to United States fishermen by the Treaty of 1818 was subject to reasonable regulation by Great Britain without the consent of the United States, was sustained.

Provision was made by the convoking of the Commission of Experts for deciding the question raised by the United States as to the reasonableness of certain specified British regulations; but this matter was found to be susceptible of diplomatic settlement, and as a result of conferences between British and United States representatives held at Washington in January, 1911, the differences between the parties were adjusted.

(2) The right of inhabitants of the United States, while exercising their treaty liberties to employ as members of their fishing crews persons not inhabitants of the United States was established; but it was at the same time decided that such persons so employed derived no benefit or immunity from the treaty. Hence it would seem that such persons would be personally amenable to municipal laws restricting or prohibiting the exercise of fishing rights by them.

(3) It was held that the requirement that the United States fishing vessels should report was reasonable if reasonably convenient opportunity for such a report was afforded, but that they should not be subjected to the purely com-

mercial formalities of report, entry and clearance at a custom house, nor to the payment of light, harbour or other duties not imposed on Newfoundland fishermen.

(4) It was held that United States fishermen exercising their limited treaty right to enter bays and harbours for shelter, repairs, wood, or water could not be required to pay light, harbour or other dues or to enter or report at custom houses, though any fishermen so entering and remaining more than forty-eight hours might be required to report where reasonably convenient opportunity so to do was afforded.

(5) It was decided that in measuring the "three marine miles of any of the coasts, bays, creeks or harbours" within which the United States had renounced the right to take, dry or cure fish the term 'bays' must be interpreted as applying to every bay on the coasts in question which might be reasonably supposed to have been considered as a bay by the negotiators of the Treaty, and that the three marine miles are to be measured from a straight line drawn across the body of water where it ceases to have the configuration and character of a bay. At other places the three marine miles are to be measured following the sinuosities of the coast.

(6) The liberty of the inhabitants of the United States under the Treaty to take fish in the bays, harbours and creeks on the so-called treaty coasts which was denied by Great Britain was established by the Tribunal.

(7) The right of United States fishing vessels resorting to the treaty coasts for the purpose of exercising their treaty liberties to have, when duly authorized, the commercial privileges accorded to United States trading vessels generally, was affirmed in so far as the Treaty of 1818 was concerned, but with the proviso that the treaty liberty of fishing and the commercial privileges should not be exercised concurrently.

Apart from their decision on the questions submitted, though in discharge of a duty imposed by the Special Agreement for the Arbitration, the Tribunal recommended for the adoption of the two Powers, rules and a method of procedure for the determination of all questions which might arise hereafter regarding the exercise of the Treaty liberties; they further recommended rules and a method for determining the limits of the bays along the treaty coasts from which the three marine miles were to be measured.

These recommendations are still under consideration.

PELAGIC SEALING. (BEHRING SEA).

In the course of the correspondence referred to in my last report the United States had pressed a suggestion, put forward some years ago, for an International Conference of Powers interested in the preservation of the fur-seal species, with the object of concerting the necessary measures to that end, and Canada had expressed willingness to take part in such a Conference; but intimated that she would not consent to any proposal for suspension of Pelagic Sealing unless satisfactory arrangements were made to compensate her for the abandonment of her right. This claim to compensation was admitted by the United States and as a preliminary to the proposed Conference a Treaty was concluded between Great Britain and the United States on the 7th February, 1911, whereby in consideration of the relinquishment by the former for a period of 15 years of her right of Pelagic Sealing in that part of the North Pacific and Behring Sea north of the 35° north latitude and east of the 180th meridian, she obtained a share of the land-take from the United States herd on the Pribilof Islands amounting to one-fifth of the gross take.

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The coming into effect of this Treaty was conditional on the conclusion of an International agreement between Great Britain, the United States, Japan and Russia to prohibit to their respective subjects and citizens Pelagic Sealing in the area referred to.

The proposed International Conference including representatives of the Powers named was duly assembled at Washington in May last, the duty of representing Canada's interests at the Conference being entrusted to me. His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, Mr. Bryce, and myself were the British representatives; Mr. Nagel, Secretary of Commerce and Labour, and Mr. Chandler P. Anderson represented the United States; Baron Uchida, the Japanese Ambassador at Washington, and Mr. H. Dauke, Japan; and Mr. P. Botkine, Russian Minister to Morocco, Mr. Brajnikoff, and Baron Nolde, Russia.

The meetings of the Conference continued through May and June until the 7th of July when a Treaty was finally concluded and signed by which it was agreed that Pelagic Sealing in the waters of the North Pacific Ocean north of the 30th parallel of north latitude and including the seas of Behring, Kamchatka, Okhotsk and Japan should be forbidden to the subjects and citizens of the four Powers during the life of the Treaty, which it is provided shall go into effect on the 15th December, 1911, and continue in force for a period of 15 years and thereafter until duly terminated by a year's written notice from any one or more Powers to all the others.

As compensation to Canada and to Japan for giving up a valuable right, the United States agrees to give to each an annual share amounting to 15% of the gross land take upon the United States rookeries and to make to each an advance payment as soon as the Treaty goes into effect of \$200,000. Russia as a rookery owning power further agrees to deliver to Canada and to Japan annually 15% each of the gross yearly take on the Russian rookeries. Japan, the owner also of a rookery at Robben Island, agrees to deliver to Canada, to the United States and to Russia annually 10% each of the gross yearly take on the Japanese rookeries.

Great Britain also undertakes, in case any seal herd resorts to any islands or shores of the prohibited waters under her jurisdiction, to deliver annually during the term of the treaty to the United States, to Russia, and to Japan 10% each of the gross yearly take upon such islands or shores.

The provisions of the Treaty concluded between Great Britain and the United States of the 7th February, 1911, in so far as they are inconsistent with the later Treaty are superseded. The most important effect of this provision is to reduce the share of the United States land take to be paid to Canada from 20% to 15%.

PECUNIARY CLAIMS CONVENTION.

The agreement for the submission to arbitration of Pecuniary Claims outstanding between Great Britain and the United States referred to in my last report was signed on the 18th August, 1910. It provided for the constitution of an Arbitral Tribunal to which Pecuniary Claims agreed upon by the two Governments and arranged in schedules which have been approved by the United States Senate, shall be referred for decision. The time within which claims may be presented for settlement is limited to four months after the formal confirmation of the agreement which is to be made by an exchange of notes between the two Governments. The Agreement with a first schedule of claims thereunder and the Terms of Submission have been approved by the United States Senate.

TRADE RELATIONS WITH THE UNITED STATES.

Further negotiations in regard to this matter were initiated by the visit to Ottawa in November, 1910, of Mr. Henry M. Hoyt, Counsellor, and Mr. Charles M. Pepper, Commercial Adviser of the United States State Department, who accompanied by Mr. J. G. Foster, the United States Consul General at Ottawa, held conferences with the Minister of Finance and the Minister of Customs. These conferences were resumed at Washington in January, 1911, and as a result it was agreed that certain specified products should be reciprocally admitted into either country from the other free of duty, that other specified products should be reciprocally admitted at identical rates of duty, while further specified Canadian products were to be admitted into the United States at special rates of duty and specified United States products admitted into Canada at special rates of duty. The agreement was to be carried out by concurrent legislation. Such legislation has been duly enacted by the United States.

TRADE RELATIONS WITH JAPAN.

In January, 1911, Japan gave notice of her intention to terminate as from the 17th July, 1911, the Convention of the 31st January, 1906, regarding commercial relations between Canada and Japan. Her main Commercial Treaty with Great Britain, that of 1894, with the supplementary conventions of 1895 and 1900 had also been denounced so as to expire on the same date; and a new treaty with the Mother Country was in course of negotiation. Opportunity was afforded to Canada to adhere to such new treaty but it was not thought advisable to take advantage of this opportunity.

A temporary arrangement on behalf of Canada was concluded and recorded in notes exchanged between the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs and the Japanese Ambassador on the 7th July, 1911, agreeing that the products of either country imported into the other should enjoy most-favoured-nation treatment for a period of two years from the 17th July, 1911. An Act of the Canadian Parliament to give effect to this agreement was passed on the 19th May and brought into operation by Order in Council of the 13th July, 1911.

ALASKA BOUNDARY DEMARCATION.

Further progress was made in the demarcation under the provisions of the Treaty of 1906 of the portion of the boundary between Canada and the United States constituted by the 141st meridian. The demarcation between Natazhat Ridge and the Yukon River was completed by 57 miles of vista cutting and 101 miles of monumenting. The line was further traced from the point about 40 miles north of the Yukon where operations ceased last year to a point 10 miles north of the crossing on the Porcupine River, the customary belt of triangulation being laid down, line cutting being carried out from the starting point for a distance northward of about 63 miles and monumenting for a distance of 45 miles to latitude 85° 55' North.

(2) RELATIONS WITH OTHER PORTIONS OF THE EMPIRE.

CANADA — WEST INDIES TRADE COMMISSION.

The Report of the Royal Commission appointed in 1909 to inquire into the question of trade relations between Canada and the West Indian Colonies was duly presented and published in August, 1910.

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The Commission acknowledging the benefits which had accrued to the West Indian sugar industry from the preferential treatment accorded by the Canadian tariff considered that concessions should be made by the West Indian Colonies with a view to ensuring the continuance of such treatment. They expressed the opinion that the grant of a reciprocal preference was the only policy likely to be approved by the West Indian Colonies or by Canada; and submitted with their report a draft form of agreement to be entered into between Canada and the several West Indian Colonies with the object of giving effect to such a policy.

They further emphasized the importance of maintaining the steamship service between Canada and the West Indies and submitted recommendations for its improvement.

The recommendations of the Commissioners in regard to reciprocal preference have been accepted in principle by some nine of the West Indian Colonies; and the question of giving effect to them is now under consideration.

IMPERIAL CONFERENCE.

In pursuance of the policy approved at the Imperial Conference of 1907 of holding such conferences every four years an Imperial Conference was convened and met at London in May, 1911. Representatives of the Imperial Government and of the Governments of Canada, of Australia, of New Zealand, of South Africa and of Newfoundland attended the Conference.

The principal subjects discussed were:—

- (a) Declaration of London.
- (b) Navigation Laws.
- (c) International Exhibitions.
- (d) Uniformity of laws as to copyright, trade marks, patents and exclusion of aliens, &c.
- (e) Naturalization.
- (f) Naval and Military Defence.
- (g) Improvement of telegraphic communications within the Empire.
- (h) All-red Mail route.
- (i) Treaties.
- (j) Imperial Court of Appeal.

Resolutions were adopted approving the ratification of the declaration of London, recommending a scheme of Imperial Naturalization and expressing the desirability of greater uniformity throughout the Empire in the laws regarding Copyright, Trade Marks, Patents, Exclusion of Aliens, &c. It was recommended that proposals laid before the Conference by His Majesty's Government for an Imperial Court of Appeal should be circulated to the several Dominions; and that a Royal Commission should be appointed to investigate and report upon the natural resources of the Empire and the means for the improvement of its trade.

It only remains for me to add that the staff of the department have continued to perform their duties to my satisfaction.

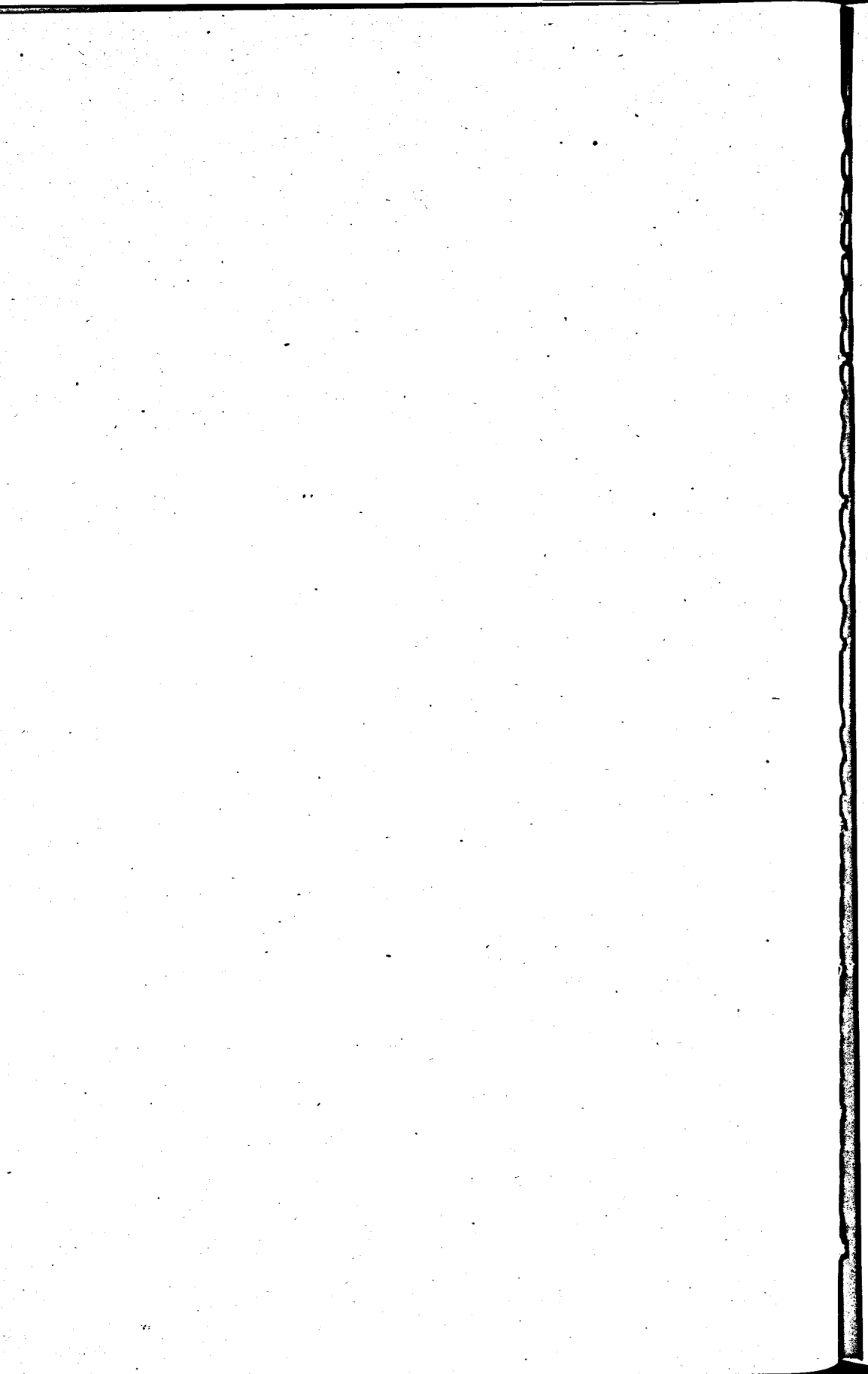

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PASSPORT REQUIREMENTS OF FOREIGN COUNTRIES.

NOTE.—British subjects travelling abroad are recommended to furnish themselves with passports, for even in those countries where they are no longer obligatory they are found to be useful as affording a ready means of identification in case of need.

ARGENTINE REPUBLIC.—Passengers for the Argentine Republic should carry Passports, and are advised to also carry certificates of birth. Persons born in His Majesty's dominions should, if they intend to become resident, even for a short time, obtain from a British Consulate in the Republic a Certificate of Nationality for purposes of identification, and to secure exemption from military service.

AUSTRIA-HUNGARY.—Persons entering Hungary from Servia or Roumania must be provided with passports. Although, in other cases, passports are not legally necessary, travellers are advised to carry them. For purposes of residence a passport or other document to prove identity is necessary.

BELGIUM.—It is desirable for travellers to possess passports. For purposes of residence, registration at the Police Office of the district is required, and a passport is accepted as evidence of identity.

BOLIVIA.—See PERU.

BRAZIL.—Passports not actually required, but travellers are advised to carry them for purposes of identification. If intending to become resident they should register their names and addresses at the nearest British Consulate.

BULGARIA.—Travellers should carry passports of recent date. Bulgarian *visa* not required. Residents should provide themselves annually with certificates of registration under the Ottoman Order in Council.

CENTRAL AMERICA.—Possession of passports desirable both for personal security and purposes of identification.

COSTA RICA.—No regulations in force.

GUATEMALA.—Alien residents are required to present at the Guatemala Foreign Office passports *visés* by the Diplomatic or Consular officer in Guatemala of their native country.

HONDURAS.—No regulations except in time of disturbance.

NICARAGUA.—No regulations in time of peace. To leave the country a local passport has, however, to be obtained from the Minister of War.

SALVADOR.—Travellers should carry passports, and should, in addition, obtain passports from the Government of Salvador. (Charge for latter, 25 cents.)

CHILE.—No regulations in force.

CHINA.—Passports are not required at open ports. For travelling into the interior a special passport must be obtained from a British Consul, which is valid for one year. (Cost, 3 dol. 50c. *Mexican*.)

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COLOMBIA.—British subjects proceeding to the Republic of Colombia must provide themselves with passports, *visés* by the Colombian Minister or by a Consul of the Republic in Canada. For travelling in the interior it is advisable to obtain special passport from a British Consul (charge, sixty cents). Immigrants without resources must be provided with a passport issued *gratis* by the Colombian Consul at port of departure.

COREA.—Passports are not required within a radius of 100 li (33 miles) from the open ports. Persons travelling in the interior must obtain a passport through the British Consul. (Fee 3.50 yen, about \$1.75.)

CUBA.—Although passports are not legally necessary, travellers are advised to carry them. Persons intending to reside in Cuba for any length of time should have their names registered at the British Consulate-General.

DENMARK.—No regulations in force. But passports or similar documents may be required by the Police from persons accepting employment in Denmark before furnishing them with an "opholdsbog" (situation book), and also from music hall artistes.

ICELAND.—No regulations in force.

ST. THOMAS.—No regulations in force. A local government passport must, however, be procured when leaving the island, the cost of which varies according to destination.

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC.—Passport necessary. In order to leave the country a Dominican passport must, in addition, be obtained, for which a fee of about \$5 is charged.

ECUADOR.—See *Peru*.

EGYPT.—Passports not required by law, but travellers are advised to carry them. For travelling in other parts of the Ottoman dominions, see *Turkey*.

Sudan.—Persons desiring to enter the Sudan, travelling third-class, unless they are officials of the government, or are travelling on government warrants, or are *bona fide* natives of the Sudan, must apply for permits to the Sudan Agent, Cairo, the Sudan Government Railway's Agent at Alexandria, the Sudan Government Agent at Suez, the Governor of Halfa, the Governor of the Red Sea Province, or the Inspector at Port Sudan.

Persons proceeding south or west of El Obeid or Bara must obtain a permit from the Governor of Kordofan or his representative at El Obeid or Bara.

All Europeans are recommended to report their arrival, personally or in writing, at any place where an official holding the post of Sub-Mamur, or any superior post, is stationed.

FRANCE.—The possession of a passport may save inconvenience, since evidence of identity may at any time be required.

If produced as evidence of identity at a Post Office, the passport may require to be countersigned by the British Consul for the district.

For permanent residence, or in order to exercise profession or trade, a declaration furnishing particulars with respect to the family, nationality, profession, &c., of the person making the declaration, is required to be made at the Mairie of the Commune within a few days of arrival.

Algeria.—Regulations similar to France, both as regards passports and residence, &c.

French Guiana.—Regulations similar to France, both as regards passports and residence, &c.

Madagascar.—Travellers are advised to carry passports.

Martinique.—
Reunion.—
Saigon.— } Regulations similar to France, both as regards passports and residence, &c.

New Caledonia.—Possession of passport desirable in view of existence of penal establishment.

Tahiti.—No regulations affecting Europeans in force.

Tunis.—Regulations similar to France, both as regards passports and residence, &c.

GERMAN EMPIRE.—Military officers travelling to Germany should be provided with passports; and although in other cases the possession of a passport is not obligatory yet as evidence of identity may at any time be required, travellers are advised to carry them. For residence of more than three weeks a passport is absolutely necessary. Children sent to schools in Germany should carry passports.

GREECE.—No regulations in force, except as regards persons entering the country by the land frontier, who are sometimes required to be in possession of passports.

HAYTI.—A passport (*visé* by a Haytian Consul) must, on arrival, be shown at the Port Office. It should also be produced and registered at the nearest British Consulate. On leaving the country a Haytian permit has to be obtained, as to which the British Consul should be consulted.

ITALY.—The possession of a passport is not obligatory, but travellers may at any time be required to give a satisfactory account of themselves, and to establish their identity.

British subjects producing passports at Italian post offices for purposes of personal identification may be required to obtain certified translations of the same from the British Consul.

Eritrea.—Travellers proceeding to Italian Colonies should, unless they carry special letters of recommendation to the authorities, provide themselves with passports, and obtain a *visé* from an Italian Consulate.

JAPAN.—Travellers are advised to carry passports.

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LIBERIA.—No regulations in force, but a passport issued by the Liberian Secretary of State is required from residents leaving the country. For this 50 cents is charged.

MEXICO.—No regulations in force.

MONTENEGRO.—No special regulations exist, but a passport properly *visé* is required for travelling through the surrounding Turkish and Austrian territories.

MOROCCO.—It is advisable for travellers to be provided with passports, which are sometimes necessary, *e.g.*, for travelling inland, or for embarking on board the French steamers for Oran. Anyone wishing to travel into the interior should consult His Majesty's Minister at Tangier or the British Consul for the district through which his route lies.

British subjects residing for more than one month in Morocco are required under the Morocco Order in Council, 1889, to register themselves at the British Consulate.

MUSCAT.—No regulations exist. Travelling in the interior is unsafe without an armed escort.

NETHERLANDS.—The possession of a passport is not strictly necessary, but is recommended for purposes of identification.

Dutch Guiana: Curaçao and Dependencies.—No regulations in force. Travellers are advised to provide themselves with passports as evidence of nationality.

Netherlands East Indies.—Travellers, on arrival, must register themselves at the Office of the chief Local authority. For travelling inland in the islands, or for residence, a passport must also be obtained from the Local authorities, respecting which the British Consul should be consulted.

NORWAY.—No regulations in force.

PARAGUAY.—No regulations in force. Neither passports nor certificates of nationality are required from foreigners by the local authorities. It is as well, however, for persons travelling in the interior of the country to be provided with passports.

PERSIA.—A passport bearing the *visa* of a Persian Consular officer must be produced on entering Persia and the passport should be countersigned by the Persian passport officer before leaving the country.

PERU, ECUADOR AND BOLIVIA.—A passport is not actually necessary, but it is desirable to possess one in order to be able to obtain from a British Diplomatic or Consular officer the certificate of nationality required in the event of civil disturbances.

PORTUGAL.—Travellers are advised to provide themselves with passports. For residence in Portugal or Portuguese Colonies, a passport or other proof of nationality is required in order to obtain the necessary permission.

Azores.—The possession of a passport is advisable.

Cape Verde Islands.—Passports are not actually required, except in times of public danger, but they are useful in view of the fact that all foreigners have to personally register themselves at the Mayor's Office as soon as possible after arrival.

Loanda.—Passport necessary.

Madeira.—No regulations in force.

Mozambique.—Travellers should be provided with passports.

ROUMANIA.—Persons travelling in Roumania must be provided with passports bearing the *visa* of a Roumanian Consul in the United Kingdom. A fresh *visa* must be obtained for each journey. On arrival they should at once obtain the *visa* of the British Legation or of a British Consulate, and then, within twenty-four hours of arrival, apply to the Roumanian authorities for a permit to reside in the country. For a stay of less than eight days this formality may be dispensed with, and the permit will be stated upon the passport by the police officials at the frontier.

RUSSIA.—Visitors to Russia must be provided with passports bearing the *visa* of a Russian Diplomatic or Consular officer. This *visa* must be within six months of the date of entering Russia. Without such *visa* they will not be allowed to enter the country. To persons of the Jewish faith the *visa* is only granted in special circumstances, as to which the Russian Consular officer should be consulted, and in any case such persons are subject to special regulations in Russia.

The passport will enable the holder to reside in Russia for six months, when it must be exchanged at the prefecture of St. Petersburg, or at the Chancery of a Provincial Governor, for a Russian "Billet de Sejour," to be renewed annually.

The cost of such a "Billet de Sejour" varies from 7 r. 15 c. to 1 r. 29 c. Each "Billet de Sejour," on first issue or renewal, must be delivered to the local police officer for inscription or *visa*. For non-renewal of a "Billet de Sejour" at the time of its expiration a fine is exacted.

On leaving Russia a police certificate must be obtained, which is granted on the first visit of the traveller to Russia at a cost of 75c. On subsequent visits 6 r. 50 c. is charged. If a "Billet de Sejour" has been obtained it must be returned, when the passport will be handed back to the owner with the necessary authorization to leave.

In the case of persons travelling through Russia, without stopping at any point within the Empire, the *visa* of a Russian Consular officer "to travel through Russia" will be accepted as sufficient, both for the purpose of entering and leaving the country, without obligation to obtain the police authorization to leave necessary in case of a stay in Russia.

Travellers passing through Tashkand or Askabad should place themselves in communication with the Russian officials at these towns.

SERVIA.—Travellers should be provided with passports, which are required by the Hungarian frontier officials.

SIAM.—No special regulations in force, but British subjects are required to register themselves at the British Consulate-General within one month of arrival. For travelling in the interior a passport must be obtained from the Siamese Government. Fee for registration, sixty cents, and for passport fifty cents.

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SPAIN.—It is most advisable for travellers to be provided with passports. The *visa* of a Spanish Consul is not necessary, but will be found useful in travelling in provincial towns and country districts.

In the Province of Barcelona, British subjects should, upon arrival, personally show their passports to His Majesty's Consul, who will thereupon furnish them with a certificate, which they are required to present, within twenty-four hours after their arrival in Barcelona, at the Office of the Civil Governor (in country towns and villages at the Office of the Mayor) in order that their names, description, &c., may be registered. A fine, and possibly expulsion, may result from non-compliance with this regulation.

Canary Islands.—No regulations in force.

Ceuta.—British subjects desiring to visit Ceuta should apply through the British Vice-Consul at Algenciras for an order from the Commandante-General.

SWEDEN.—No regulations in force.

SWITZERLAND.—A passport is necessary in order to obtain a "Permis de Sejour," which must be taken out, after their arrival, by persons intending to reside in Switzerland. Children sent to school in Switzerland should carry passports.

TURKISH EMPIRE.—Persons travelling to Turkey must be provided with a passport bearing the *visa* of a Turkish Consular officer. Without such passport they will be refused admission to the country. A fresh *visa* must be obtained for each journey. On leaving Turkey the *visa* of a British Consul should be obtained.

Tripoli.—Regulations similar to Turkey.

UNITED STATES.—No regulations in force.

Hawaiian Islands.—No regulations in force.

Philippine Islands.—Passports not required.

Porto Rico.—Travellers are advised to carry passports.

URUGUAY.—No regulations affecting Europeans in force. Travellers, are, however, advised to have passports as evidence of nationality, in case of need.

VENEZUELA.—Travellers should be provided with passports bearing the *visa* of a Venezuelan Consular officer.

ZANZIBAR.—No regulations in force.

DEPARTMENT OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING PASSPORTS.

NOTE.—Naturalized British subjects should bear in mind that their naturalization has no effect within the limits of the Foreign State to which they originally belonged, unless they have ceased to be subjects of that state, in the manner prescribed by the laws thereof, or in pursuance of a treaty or convention to that effect.

1. Applications for passports should be made in writing and enclosed in a cover addressed to "THE HONORABLE THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR EXTERNAL AFFAIRS, OTTAWA."

2. The charge for a passport, whatever number of persons may be named in it, is two dollars. The fee payable must accompany the application. Postage stamps will not be received as payment.

3. Passports are granted only to British born subjects or to persons naturalized in the Dominion of Canada. A married woman is deemed to be a subject of the state of which her husband is for the time being a subject.

4. Passports are not valid after five years from the date of issue. Fresh passports must then be obtained. When the party is a naturalized British subject he will be so designated in his passport.

5. Passports are granted to all persons either known to the Secretary of State or recommended to him by some person who is known to him; or upon the production of a declaration by the applicant, a blank form of which may be obtained at this Department, verified by a declaration made by any banking firm or by any mayor, magistrate, justice of the peace, minister of religion, physician, surgeon, solicitor, or notary resident in the Dominion of Canada. In certain cases, the applicant's certificate of birth must be produced in addition to the declaration.

6. If the applicant for a passport be a naturalized British subject, his certificate of naturalization must be forwarded to the Department of External Affairs with the declaration; and his certificate of naturalization will be returned with the passport to the person who has communicated with this Department in the applicant's behalf for delivery to the latter. A statutory declaration to the effect that the proposed visit abroad is of a temporary character—giving the probable duration of same—and that the applicant intends to return to Canada and reside here permanently, must accompany the application for a passport.

7. A passport cannot be issued by the Department of External Affairs on behalf of a person already abroad; such person should apply for one to the nearest British Mission or Consulate.

8. Travellers who may have any intention of visiting the Russian Empire, the Turkish Dominions, the Kingdom of Roumania, Persia, Colombia, Venezuela, Hayti, or Eritrea, at any time in the course of their travels, must first have their passports *visés* at the nearest Russian, Turkish, Roumanian, Persian,

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Colombian, Venezuelan, Haytian, or Italian Consulate as the case may be. For the information of travellers proceeding to any of these countries *via* Great Britain, it may be stated that the addresses in London of these consulates are respectively as follows:—The Russian Consulate-General, Windsor Chambers, 20 Great St. Helen's, E. C.; the Consulate-General of the Sublime Porte, 7 Union Court, Old Broad Street, E. C.; the Roumanian Consulate-General, 49 Parliament Street, S. W.; the Persian Consulate-General, 82 Victoria Street, S. W.; the Colombian Consulate-General, Friars House, New Broad Street, E. C.; the Venezuelan Consulate, Finsbury Pavement House, Finsbury Pavement, E. C.; the Haytian Consulate, 32 Fenchurch Street, E. C.; the Italian Consulate-General, (for Eritrea) 44 Finsbury Square, E. C. Passports may also be *visés* at any of the other Consulates of Russia, Turkey, Roumania, Persia, Colombia Venezuela, Hayti, or Italy in the United Kingdom. Travellers about to proceed to any other country need not obtain the *visa* of the Diplomatic or Consular Agents of such country.

N. B.—Although travellers are now free to enter most foreign countries without passports, colonial British subjects travelling abroad are recommended not to omit to provide themselves with passports, for even in those countries where they are no longer obligatory, they are found to be useful as affording a ready means of identification in case of need. British subjects intending to *reside* in Germany or Switzerland should provide themselves with passports.

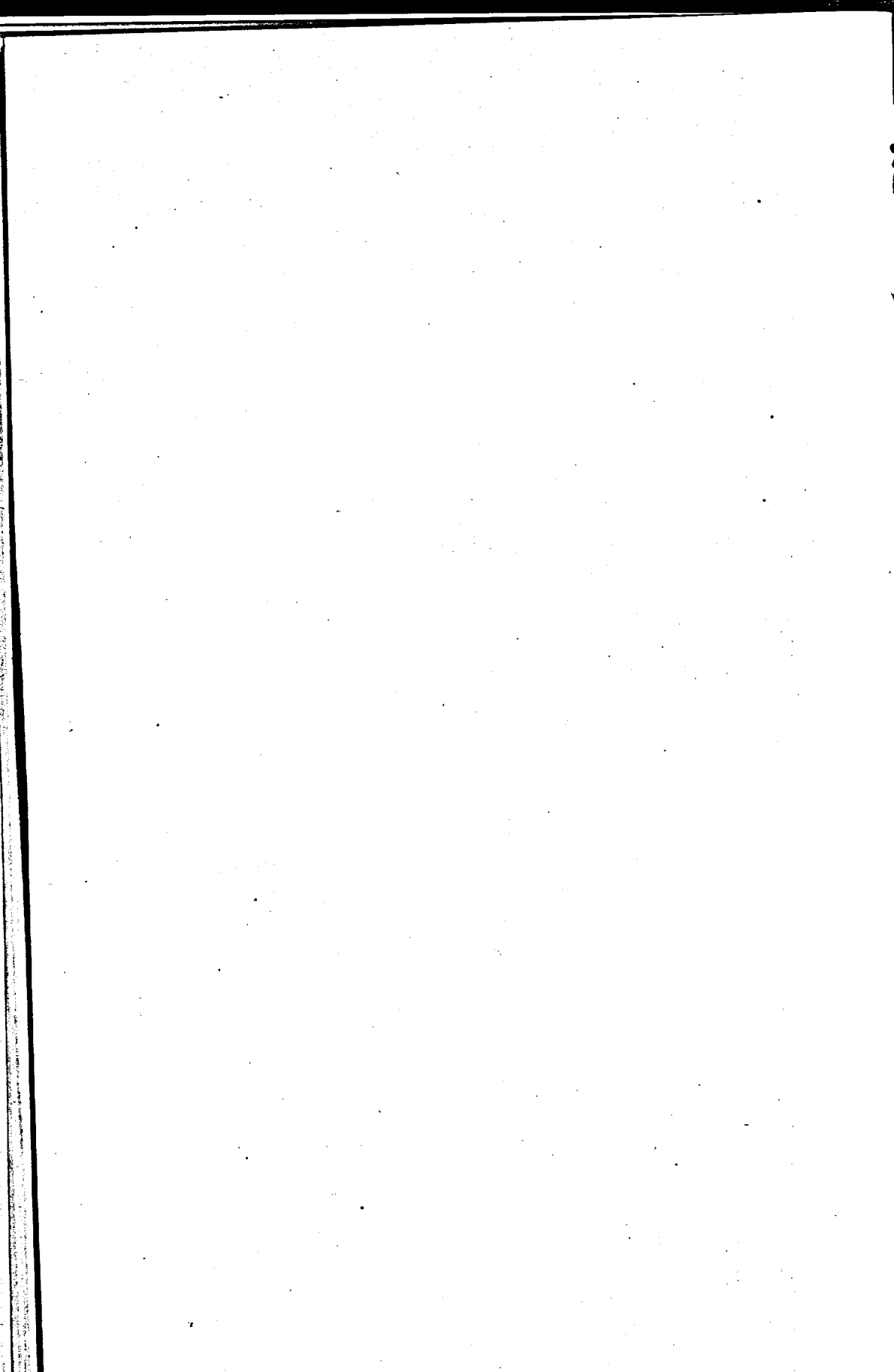


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REPORT OF THE UNDER-SECRETARY OF STATE FOR EXTERNAL AFFAIRS.

To the Right Honourable R. L. BORDEN, K.C., M. P.,
Secretary of State for External Affairs.

SIR,—I have the honour to submit my annual report upon the work of the Department of External Affairs containing a brief account of the more important matters dealt with in the correspondence with outside Governments, arranged as they concern Canada's relations with Foreign Powers or with other portions of the Empire:—

RELATIONS WITH FOREIGN POWERS.

NORTH ATLANTIC COAST FISHERIES ARBITRATION.

The award of the arbitrators left undecided the question of the reasonableness of objections raised before the Tribunal by the United States to certain Canadian and Newfoundland regulations which it was contended contravened the provisions of the Treaty of 1818. The Tribunal desired to have this question first considered by the Commission of Experts provided for by Art. III of the Arbitration Agreement, and steps were taken to assemble that Commission; but as a result of diplomatic discussion it has been found possible amicably to adjust the differences regarding existing regulations in so far as Canada is concerned.

The Arbitrators had further recommended a method of procedure to provide for the settlement of differences regarding future regulations; but as the suggested procedure was not altogether acceptable, a formal agreement has been negotiated between the two Governments whereby the recommendations have been adopted in a modified form. This agreement also includes the acceptance by both parties of the recommendations of the Tribunal with regard to the limits of the bays contiguous to the territory of the Dominion.

PECUNIARY CLAIMS AGREEMENT WITH THE UNITED STATES.

This Agreement with the terms of submission and the First Schedule of claims to be submitted, was finally confirmed by an exchange of notes between the two Governments on the 26th April, 1912. Negotiations are in progress for the settlement of a second schedule to include further claims on both sides. The questions of the personnel of the tribunal to try the claims and of the date when it shall be convened are now under consideration.

ALASKA BOUNDARY DEMARCATION.

This work continues to advance; the line tracing has been carried during the past season to latitude $69^{\circ} 20'$ within a few miles of the Arctic Ocean, the triangulation to latitude $68^{\circ} 54'$ and the topography to $69^{\circ} 04'$.

TREATY WITH UNITED STATES FOR REGULATION OF FISHERIES IN WATERS CONTIGUOUS TO THE BOUNDARY.

The regulations drawn up by the Commissioners under this Treaty have not so far been approved by the United States Commissioners. Dr. Jordan the United States Commissioner having resigned, his place has been filled by the appointment of Mr. Job. E. Hedges.

TREATY WITH UNITED STATES RELATING TO BOUNDARY WATERS.

The International Joint Commission provided for by this Treaty has now been fully constituted, Messrs. T. Chase Casgrain, K.C., H. A. Powell, K.C., and C. A. Magrath having been appointed as the Canadian members. The United States members as originally appointed were the Honourable T. H. Carter, the Honourable James Tawney and the Honourable Frank Sherwin Streeter, but the death of Mr. Carter making a new appointment necessary the Honourable George Turner was appointed to fill the vacancy.

The Commissioners met at Washington early in the year for purposes of organization and Rules of Procedure to be followed in cases before the Commission were adopted.

Applications have been received by the Commission through the United States Government from the Watrous Boom Company for the approval of the erection of booms in the Rainy River, and from the Rainy River Improvement Company for the approval of the erection of a dam at Kettle Falls; and a joint reference has been made by the two Governments of questions relating to the use of the waters of the Lake of the Woods.

RELATIONS WITH OTHER PORTIONS OF THE EMPIRE.

TRADE AGREEMENT BETWEEN CANADA AND WEST INDIAN COLONIES.

The consideration of the measures to be taken to give effect to the suggestions of the Royal Commission on Trade Relations between Canada and the West Indies, gave occasion for the convening of a conference of representatives of the Dominion and the Colonies concerned. The conference opened at Ottawa on the 29th March, Canada being represented by the Honourable G. E. Foster, Minister of Trade and Commerce, the Honourable W. T. White, Minister of Finance, and the Honourable J. D. Reid, Minister of Customs. The West Indian Colonies represented were Trinidad, British Guiana, Barbados, St. Lucia, St. Vincent, Antigua, St. Kitts, Dominica and Montserrat. On the 9th April an agreement was concluded, subject to the approval of the Parliament of Canada, of the legislatures of the West Indian Colonies concerned, and of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, by which preferential tariff treatment in the West Indian Colonies is accorded to a scheduled list of Canadian products in return for similar preferential treatment of enumerated West Indian

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products and the free entry of others when imported into Canada. The tariff concessions granted by Canada are to be extended for three years to the colonies of the Bahamas, Bermuda, British Honduras, Grenada, Jamaica and Newfoundland, but may then be withdrawn from any of those colonies which have failed to grant the preferential tariff treatment provided by the Agreement to the scheduled Canadian products. The Agreement is to remain in force for ten years.

ROYAL COMMISSION ON TRADE AND RESOURCES OF THE EMPIRE.

In accordance with a Resolution adopted at the Imperial Conference of 1911, a Commission was issued by the King on the 15th April, 1912, appointing representatives of the United Kingdom, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, South Africa and Newfoundland to enquire into the natural resources, trade and legislation of certain portions of His Majesty's dominions. The Honourable G. E. Foster, Minister of Trade and Commerce was appointed as the representative of Canada and Mr. W. A. Robinson was made Secretary to the Commission.

Meetings of the Commission were held in London in June for the purpose of making arrangements to enable it to perform its duties effectively and the general lines of the procedure to be followed were settled.

PASSPORT REQUIREMENTS OF FOREIGN COUNTRIES.

NOTE.—British subjects travelling abroad are recommended to furnish themselves with passports, for even in those countries where they are no longer obligatory they are found to be useful as affording a ready means of identification in case of need.

ARGENTINE REPUBLIC.—Passengers for the Argentine Republic should carry passports, and are advised to also carry certificates of birth. Persons born in His Majesty's dominions should, if they intend to become resident, even for a short time, obtain from a British Consulate in the Republic a Certificate of Nationality for purposes of identification, and to secure exemption from military service.

AUSTRIA-HUNGARY.—Persons entering Hungary from Servia or Roumania must be provided with passports. Although, in other cases, passports are not legally necessary, travellers are advised to carry them. For purposes of residence a passport or other document to prove identity is necessary.

BELGIUM.—It is desirable for travellers to possess passports. For purposes of residence, registration at the Police Office of the district is required, and a passport is accepted as evidence of identity.

BOLIVIA.—See PERU.

BRAZIL.—Passports not actually required, but travellers are advised to carry them for purposes of identification. If intending to become resident they should register their names and addresses at the nearest British Consulate.

BULGARIA.—Travellers should carry passports of recent date. Bulgarian *visa* not required. Residents should provide themselves annually with certificates of registration under the Ottoman Order in Council.

CENTRAL AMERICA.—Possession of passports desirable both for personal security and purposes of identification.

COSTA RICA.—No regulations in force.

GUATEMALA.—Alien residents are required to present at the Guatemala Foreign Office passports *visés* by the Diplomatic or Consular officer in Guatemala of their native country.

HONDURAS.—No regulations except in times of disturbance.

NICARAGUA.—No regulations in time of peace. To leave the country a local passport has, however, to be obtained from the Ministry of War.

SALVADOR.—Travellers should carry passports, and should, in addition, obtain passports from the Government of Salvador. (Charge for latter, 25 cents.)

CHILE.—No regulations in force.

CHINA.—Passports are not required at open ports. For travelling into the interior a special passport must be obtained from a British Consul, which is valid for one year. (Cost, 3 dol. 50c. *Mexican*.)

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COLOMBIA.—British subjects proceeding to the Republic of Colombia must provide themselves with passports, *visés* by the Colombian Minister or by a Consul of the Republic in Canada. For travelling in the interior it is advisable to obtain special passport from a British Consul (charge, sixty cents). Immigrants without resources must be provided with a passport issued *gratis* by the Colombian Consul at port of departure.

COREA.—Passports are not required within a radius of 100 li (33 miles) from the open ports. Persons travelling in the interior must obtain a passport through the British Consul. (Fee 3·50 yen, about \$1.75.)

CUBA.—Although passports are not legally necessary, travellers are advised to carry them. Persons intending to reside in Cuba for any length of time should have their names registered at the British Consulate-General.

DENMARK.—No regulations in force. But passports or similar documents may be required by the Police from persons accepting employment in Denmark before furnishing them with an "opholdsbog" (situation book), and also from music hall artistes.

ICELAND.—No regulations in force.

ST. THOMAS.—No regulations in force. A local government passport must, however, be procured when leaving the island, the cost of which varies according to destination.

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC.—Passport necessary.

ECUADOR.—See *Peru*.

EGYPT.—Passports not required by law, but travellers are advised to carry them. For travelling in other parts of the Ottoman dominions, see *Turkish Empire*.

Sudan.—Persons desiring to enter the Sudan, travelling third-class, *unless* they are officials of the government, or are travelling on government warrants, or are *bona fide* natives of the Sudan, must apply for permits to the Sudan Agent, Cairo, the Sudan Government Railway's Agent at Alexandria, the Sudan Government Agent at Suez, the Governor of Halfa, the Governor of the Red Sea Province, or the Inspector at Port Sudan.

Persons proceeding south or west of El Obeid or Bara must obtain a permit from the Governor of Kordofan or his representative at El Obeid or Bara.

All Europeans are recommended to report their arrival, personally or in writing, at any place where an official holding the post of Sub-Mamur, or any superior post, is stationed.

FRANCE.—The possession of a passport may save inconvenience, since evidence of identity may at any time be required.

If produced as evidence of identity at a Post Office, the passport may require to be countersigned by the British Consul for the district.

For permanent residence, or in order to exercise profession or trade, a declaration furnishing particulars with respect to the family, nationality, profession, &c., of the person making the declaration, is required to be made at the Mairie of the Commune within a few days of arrival.

Algeria.—Regulations similar to France, both as regards passports and residence, &c.

French Guiana.—Regulations similar to France, both as regards passports and residence, &c.

Madagascar.—Travellers are advised to carry passports.

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New Caledonia.—Possession of passport desirable in view of existence of penal establishment.

Tahiti.—No regulations affecting Europeans in force.

Tunis.—Regulations similar to France, both as regards passports and residence, &c.

GERMAN EMPIRE.—Military officers travelling to Germany should be provided with passports; and although in other cases the possession of a passport is not obligatory yet as evidence of identity may at any time be required, travellers are advised to carry them. For residence of more than three weeks a passport is absolutely necessary. Children sent to schools in Germany should carry passports.

GREECE.—No regulations in force, except as regards persons entering the country by the land frontier, who are sometimes required to be in possession of passports.

HAYTI.—A passport (*visé* by a Haytian Consul) must, on arrival, be shown at the Port Office. It should also be produced and registered at the nearest British Consulate. On leaving the country a Haytian permit has to be obtained, as to which the British Consul should be consulted.

ITALY.—The possession of a passport is not obligatory, but travellers may at any time be required to give a satisfactory account of themselves, and to establish their identity.

British subjects producing passports at Italian post offices for purposes of personal identification may be required to obtain certified translations of the same from the British Consul.

Eritrea.—Travellers proceeding to Italian Colonies should, unless they carry special letters of recommendation to the authorities, provide themselves with passports, and obtain a *visé* from an Italian Consulate.

JAPAN.—Travellers are advised to carry passports.

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LIBERIA.—No regulations in force, but a passport issued by the Liberian Secretary of State is required from residents leaving the country. For this 50 cents is charged.

MEXICO.—No regulations in force.

MONTENEGRO.—No special regulations exist, but a passport properly *visé* is required for travelling through the surrounding Turkish and Austrian territories. Persons travelling in Montenegro otherwise than by the main roads ("routes nationales"), or for purposes of science or exploration, must obtain permission from the Ministry of the Interior through their own Legation or Consulate.

MOROCCO.—It is advisable for travellers to be provided with passports, which are sometimes necessary, *e.g.*, for travelling inland, or for embarking on board the French steamers for Oran. Any one wishing to travel into the interior should consult His Majesty's Minister at Tangier or the British Consul for the district through which his route lies.

British subjects residing for more than one month in Morocco are required under the Morocco Order in Council, 1889, to register themselves at the British Consulate.

MUSCAT.—No regulations exist. Travelling in the interior is unsafe without an armed escort.

NETHERLANDS.—The possession of a passport is not strictly necessary, but is recommended for purposes of identification.

Dutch Guiana: Curaçao and Dependencies.—No regulations in force. Travellers are advised to provide themselves with passports as evidence of nationality.

Netherland East Indies.—Travellers, on arrival, must register themselves at the Office of the chief Local authority. For travelling inland in the islands, or for residence, a passport must also be obtained from the Local authorities, respecting which the British Consul should be consulted.

NORWAY.—No regulations in force.

PARAGUAY.—No regulations in force. Neither passports nor certificates of nationality are required from foreigners by the local authorities. It is as well, however, for persons travelling in the interior of the country to be provided with passports.

PERSIA.—A passport bearing the *visa* of a Persian Consular officer must be produced on entering Persia and the passport should be countersigned by the Persian passport officer before leaving the country.

PERU, ECUADOR AND BOLIVIA.—A passport is not actually necessary, but it is desirable to possess one in order to be able to obtain from a British Diplomatic or Consular officer the certificate of nationality required in the event of civil disturbances.

PORTUGAL.—Travellers are advised to provide themselves with passports. For residence in Portugal or Portuguese Colonies, a passport or other proof of nationality is required in order to obtain the necessary permission.

Azores.—The possession of a passport is advisable.

Cape Verde Islands.—Passports are not actually required, except in times of public danger, but they are useful in view of the fact that all foreigners have to personally register themselves at the Mayor's Office as soon as possible after arrival.

Loanda.—Passport necessary.

Madeira.—No regulations in force.

Mozambique.—Travellers should be provided with passports.

ROUMANIA.—Persons travelling in Roumania must be provided with passports bearing the *visa* of a Roumanian Consul in the United Kingdom. A fresh *visa* must be obtained for each journey. On arrival they should at once obtain the *visa* of the British Legation or of a British Consulate, and then, within twenty-four hours of arrival, apply to the Roumanian authorities for a permit to reside in the country. For a stay of less than eight days this formality may be dispensed with, and the permit will be stated upon the passport by the police officials at the frontier.

RUSSIA.—Visitors to Russia must be provided with passports bearing the *visa* of a Russian Diplomatic or Consular officer. This *visa* must be within six months of the date of entering Russia. Without such *visa* they will not be allowed to enter the country. To persons of the Jewish faith the *visa* is only granted in special circumstances, as to which the Russian Consular officer should be consulted, and in any case such persons are subject to special regulations in Russia.

The passport will enable the holder to reside in Russia for six months, when it must be exchanged at the prefecture of St. Petersburg, or at the Chancery of a Provincial Governor, for a Russian "Billet de Sejour," to be renewed annually.

The cost of such a "Billet de Sejour" varies from 7 r. 15 c. to 1 r. 29 c. Each "Billet de Sejour," on first issue or renewal, must be delivered to the local police officer for inscription or *visa*. For non-renewal of a "Billet de Sejour" at the time of its expiration a fine is exacted.

On leaving Russia a police certificate must be obtained, which is granted on the first visit of the traveller to Russia at a cost of 75c. On subsequent visits 6 r. 50 c. is charged. If a "Billet de Sejour" has been obtained it must be returned, when the passport will be handed back to the owner with the necessary authorization to leave.

In the case of persons travelling through Russia, without stopping at any point within the Empire, the *visa* of a Russian Consular officer "to travel through Russia" will be accepted as sufficient, both for the purpose of entering and leaving the country, without obligation to obtain the police authorization to leave necessary in case of a stay in Russia.

Travellers passing through Tashkand or Askabad should place themselves in communication with the Russian officials at those towns.

SERVIA.—Travellers should be provided with passports, which are required by the Hungarian frontier officials.

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SIAM.—No special regulations in force, but British subjects are required to register themselves at the British Consulate-General within one month of arrival. For travelling in the interior a passport must be obtained from the Siamese Government. Fee for registration, sixty cents, and for passport fifty cents.

SPAIN.—It is most advisable for travellers to be provided with passports. The *visa* of a Spanish Consul is not necessary, but will be found useful in travelling in provincial towns and country districts.

In the Province of Barcelona, British subjects should, upon arrival, personally show their passports to His Majesty's Consul-General, who will thereupon furnish them with a certificate, which they are required to present, within twenty-four hours after their arrival in Barcelona, at the Office of the Civil Governor (in country towns and villages at the Office of the Mayor) in order that their names, description, &c., may be registered. A fine, and possibly expulsion, may result from non-compliance with this regulation.

Canary Islands.—No regulations in force.

Ceuta.—British subjects desiring to visit Ceuta should apply through the British Vice-Consul at Algeciras for an order from the Commandante-General.

SWEDEN.—No regulations in force.

SWITZERLAND.—A passport is necessary in order to obtain a "Permis de Sejour," which must be taken out, after their arrival, by persons intending to reside in Switzerland. Children sent to schools in Switzerland should carry passports.

TURKISH EMPIRE.—Persons travelling to Turkey must be provided with a passport bearing the *visa* of a Turkish Consular officer. Without such passport they will be refused admission to the country. A fresh *visa* must be obtained for each journey. On leaving Turkey the *visa* of a British Consul should be obtained.

UNITED STATES.—No regulations in force.

Hawaiian Islands.—No regulations in force.

Philippine Islands.—Passports not required.

Porto Rico.—Travellers are advised to carry passports.

URUGUAY.—No regulations affecting Europeans in force. Travellers, are, however, advised to have passports as evidence of nationality, in case of need.

VENEZUELA.—Travellers should be provided with passports bearing the *visa* of a Venezuelan Consular officer.

DEPARTMENT OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING PASSPORTS.

NOTE.—Naturalized British subjects should bear in mind that their naturalization has no effect within the limits of the Foreign State to which they originally belonged, unless they have ceased to be subjects of that state, in the manner prescribed by the laws thereof, or in pursuance of a treaty or convention to that effect.

1. Applications for passports should be made in writing and enclosed in a cover addressed to "THE HONORABLE THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR EXTERNAL AFFAIRS, OTTAWA."

2. The charge for a passport, whatever number of persons may be named in it, is two dollars. The fee payable must accompany the application. Postage stamps will not be received as payment.

3. Passports are granted only to British born subjects or to persons naturalized in the Dominion of Canada. A married woman is deemed to be a subject of the state of which her husband is for the time being a subject.

4. Passports are not valid after five years from the date of issue. Fresh passports must then be obtained. When the party is a naturalized British subject he will be so designated in his passport.

5. Passports are granted to all persons either known to the Secretary of State or recommended to him by some person who is known to him; or upon the production of a declaration by the applicant, a blank form of which may be obtained at this Department, verified by a declaration made by any banking firm or by any mayor, magistrate, justice of the peace, minister of religion, physician, surgeon, solicitor, or notary resident in the Dominion of Canada. In certain cases, the applicant's certificate of birth must be produced in addition to the declaration.

6. If the applicant for a passport be a naturalized British subject, his certificate of naturalization must be forwarded to the Department of External Affairs with the declaration; and his certificate of naturalization will be returned with the passport to the person who has communicated with this Department in the applicant's behalf for delivery to the latter. A statutory declaration to the effect that the proposed visit abroad is of a temporary character—giving the probable duration of same—and that the applicant intends to return to Canada and reside here permanently, must accompany the application for a passport.

7. A passport cannot be issued by the Department of External Affairs on behalf of a person already abroad; such person should apply for one to the nearest British Mission or Consulate.

8. Travellers who may have any intention of visiting the Russian Empire, the Turkish Dominions, the Kingdom of Roumania, Persia, Colombia, Venezuela, Hayti, or Eritrea, at any time in the course of their travels, must first have their passports *visés* at the nearest Russian, Turkish, Roumanian, Persian,

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Colombian, Venezuelan, Haytian, or Italian Consulate as the case may be. For the information of travellers proceeding to any of these countries *via* Great Britain, it may be stated that the addresses in London of these consulates are respectively as follows:—The Russian Consulate-General, Windsor Chambers, 20 Great St. Helen's, E.C.; the Consulate-General of the Sublime Porte, 7 Union Court, Old Broad Street, E. C.; the Roumanian Consulate-General, 49 Parliament Street, S. W.; the Persian Consulate-General, 82 Victoria Street, S. W.; the Colombian Consulate-General, Sicilian House, Sicilian Avenue, Southampton Row, W.C.; the Venezuelan Consulate, Finsbury Pavement House, Finsbury Pavement, E. C.; the Haytian Consulate, 32 Fenchurch Street, E. C.; the Italian Consulate-General (for Eritrea) 44 Finsbury Square, E. C. Passports may also be *visés* at any of the other Consulates of Russia, Turkey, Roumania, Persia, Colombia, Venezuela, Hayti, or Italy in the United Kingdom. Travellers about to proceed to any other country need not obtain the *visa* of the Diplomatic or Consular Agents of such country.

N. B.—Although travellers are now free to enter most foreign countries without passports, colonial British subjects travelling abroad are recommended not to omit to provide themselves with passports, for even in those countries where they are no longer obligatory, they are found to be useful as affording a ready means of identification in case of need. British subjects intending to *reside* in Germany or Switzerland should provide themselves with passports.

CHAP. 22.

An Act respecting the Department of External Affairs.

[Assented to 1st April, 1912.]

HIS Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as *The Department of External Affairs Act*. Short title.
2. There shall be a Department of the Government of Canada to be called the Department of External Affairs, over which the Secretary of State for External Affairs shall preside. Department constituted.
3. The Member of the King's Privy Council for Canada holding the recognized position of First Minister shall be the Secretary of State for External Affairs, and in this Act he is hereafter referred to as "the Minister." Department to be under First Minister.
4. The Governor in Council may appoint an officer who shall be called the Under Secretary of State for External Affairs, and who shall be the deputy head of the department, and may also appoint such other officers and clerks as are requisite for the due administration of the business of the department, all of whom shall hold office during pleasure. Deputy head. Officers.
5. The Minister, as head of the department, shall have the conduct of all official communications between the Government of Canada and the Government of any other country in connection with the external affairs of Canada, Powers and duties of department.

and shall be charged with such other duties as may be assigned to the department by order of the Governor in Council in relation to such external affairs, or to the conduct and management of international or intercolonial negotiations so far as they may appertain to the Government of Canada.

6. The administration of all matters relating to the foreign consular service in Canada shall be transferred to the Department of External Affairs.

7. The Minister shall annually lay before Parliament, within ten days after the meeting thereof, a report of the proceedings, transactions and affairs of the department during the year then next preceding.

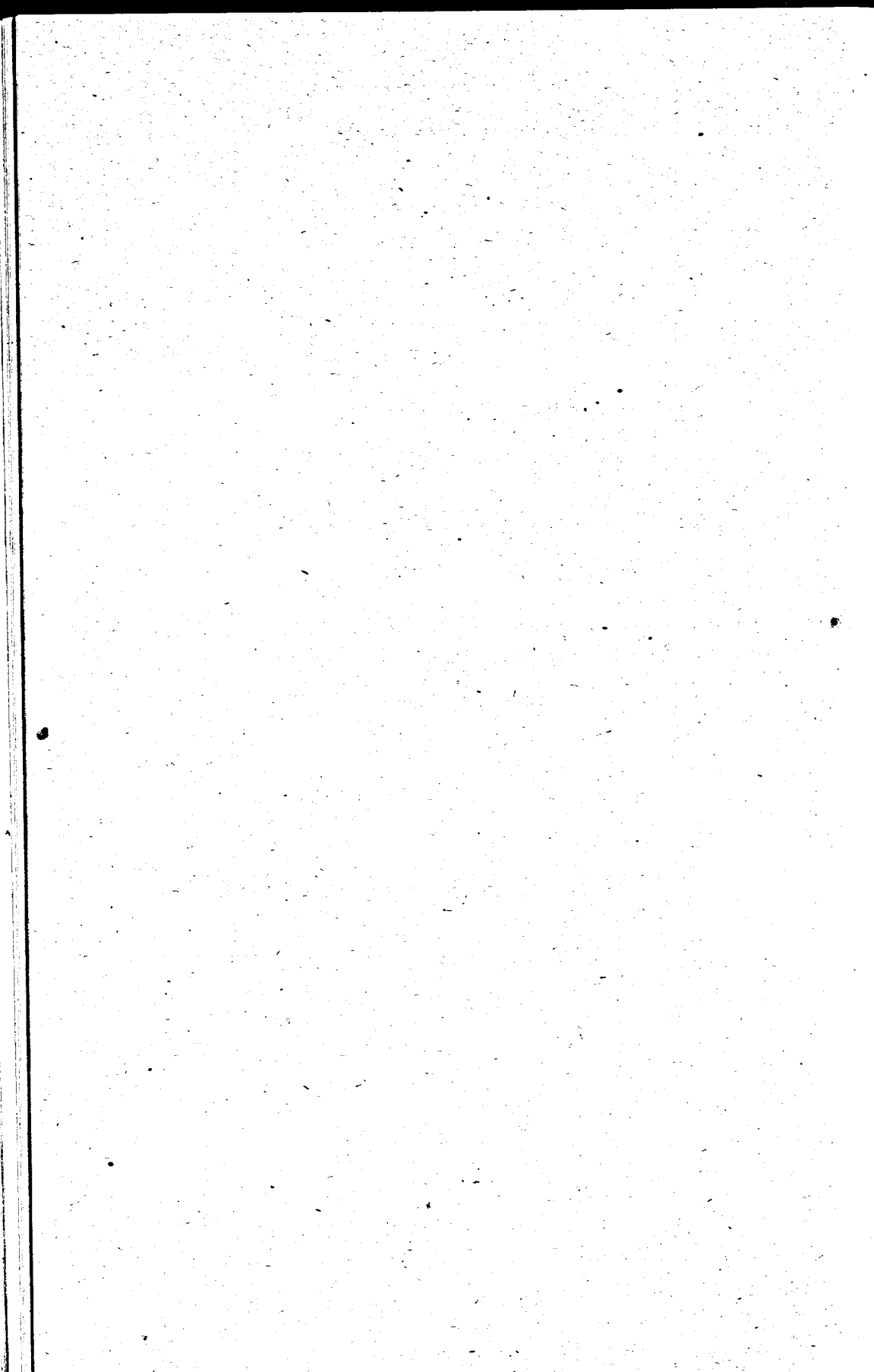
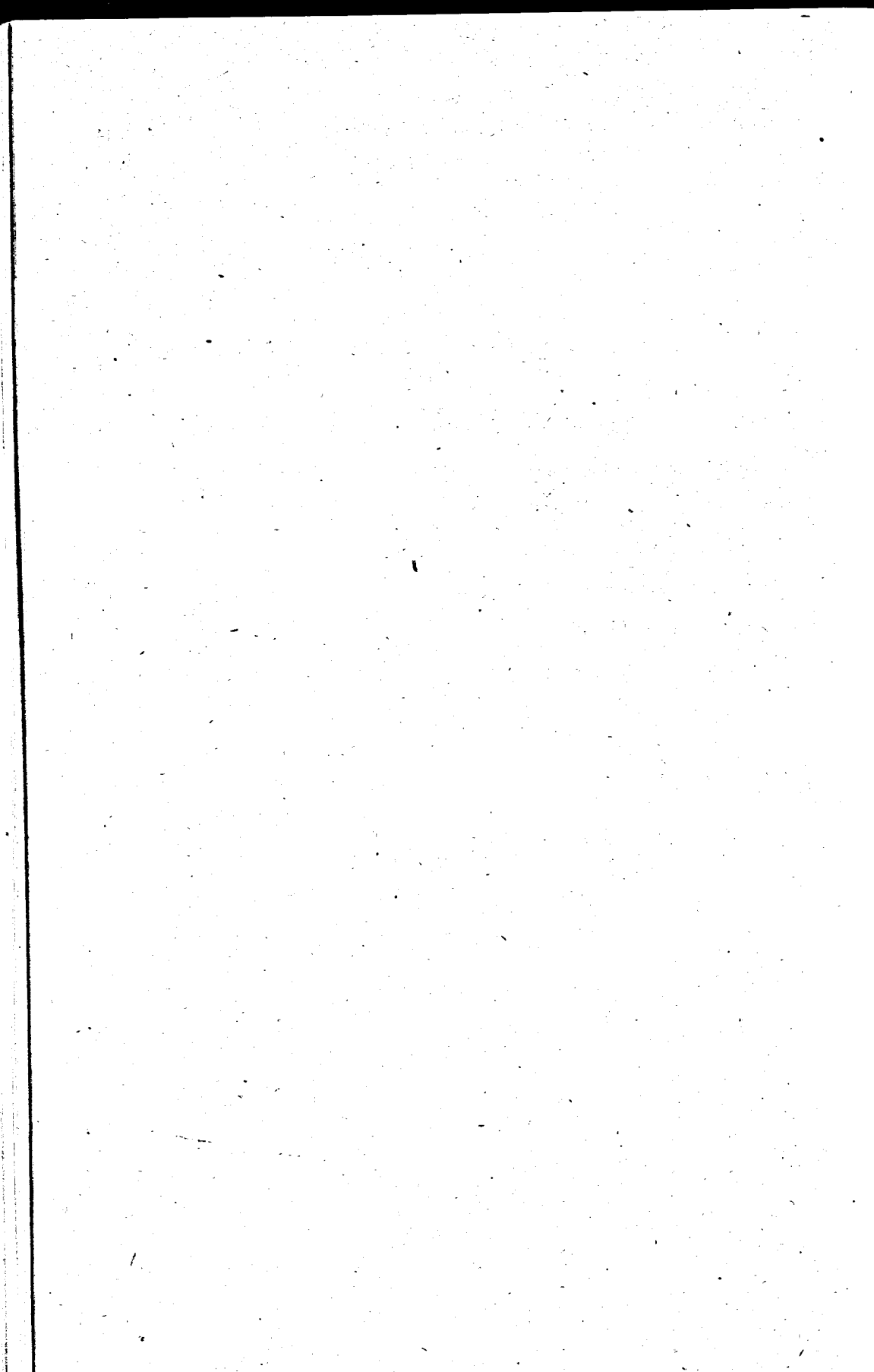


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REPORT OF THE UNDER-SECRETARY OF STATE FOR EXTERNAL AFFAIRS.

The Right Honourable R. L. BORDEN, P.C.,
Secretary of State for External Affairs,
Ottawa.

SIR,—I have the honour to submit my annual report on the proceedings, transactions and affairs of the Department of External Affairs for the year 1912-13.

The more important subjects of correspondence with which the Department has been concerned, grouped as they regard Canada's relations with Foreign Powers and with other portions of the Empire, are briefly reviewed below:—

RELATIONS WITH FOREIGN POWERS.

NORTH ATLANTIC COAST FISHERIES.

The question of the constitution of the Mixed Fishery Commission, provided for by the agreement with the United States of the 20th July, 1912, to determine the reasonableness of future regulations affecting the North Atlantic Coast Fisheries, has been under the consideration of the two Governments and there is every prospect of a satisfactory personnel being soon decided upon.

PECUNIARY CLAIMS AGREEMENT WITH THE UNITED STATES.

The Tribunal for the arbitration of claims under this agreement has now been formed. Sir Charles Fitzpatrick, Chief Justice of Canada, has been selected as the British Arbitrator, Mr. Chandler Anderson as the Arbitrator of the United States; and these two members have concurred in the appointment of Mr. Henri Fromageot, an eminent French advocate, as third member or umpire.

The British Agent before the Tribunal is Mr. C. J. B. Hurst, C.B., of the Foreign Office; Mr. E. L. Newcombe, C.M.G., Deputy Minister of Justice, having been appointed as Associate British Agent. The United States Agent first appointed was Mr. S. Mallett Prevost, who has since been succeeded by Mr. Robert Lansing.

The Tribunal held its first Meetings at Washington on May 13th, the sessions continuing until the 17th of that month. Adjournment was then taken to the 9th of June when it re-assembled at Ottawa and remained in session there until the 18th June. The next meeting is to be held at Washington on the 9th March, 1914.

INTERNATIONAL BOUNDARY WATERS.

The following questions arising under the Boundary Waters Treaty of 1909 with the United States have been referred to the International Joint Commission:

Pollution of Boundary Waters.—At the request of the two Governments, the Commission has been asked to examine and report as to the causes by which boundary waters have been injuriously polluted, and as to the means to be taken to remedy or prevent such pollution, and this question is now receiving consideration.

Livingstone Channel Question.—Reference was similarly made of the question of the necessity for the erection of a dyke, or other compensatory work, in connection with the dredging by the United States of the Livingstone Channel in the Detroit River, and the adequacy of certain works proposed by the United States to meet such necessity if it were found to exist.

The Commission decided that the erection of a dyke was desirable, indicated its proper location and recommended other necessary measures.

Lake of the Woods.—The Commission was also asked to report whether it is practicable and desirable to maintain the waters of this lake at a stated level and, if so, at what level, and further to determine the extent and value of lands likely to be submerged, and to recommend the means for regulating the volume, use and out-flow of the waters so as to maintain the desired level with the least possible damage to public and private interests. No report in this matter has yet been made.

Dam at Kettle Falls.—Application was made to the Commission by the Rainy River Improvement Company for the approval of plans for a dam at Kettle Falls, but on the ground that the Tribunal had no jurisdiction to entertain the application it was dismissed.

Boom in Rainy River.—A further application by the Watrous Island Boom Company for the approval of a boom in the Rainy River has also been considered, but no decision has yet been announced.

TREATY WITH THE UNITED STATES FOR THE REGULATION OF FISHERIES IN WATERS
CONTIGUOUS TO THE INTERNATIONAL
BOUNDARY.

The United States Congress has not yet taken steps to provide for the enforcement in the United States of the regulations prepared by the Commissioners under this Treaty.

PELAGIC SEALING.

Difficulty having been found in extending to Canada by Order of the King in Council the operation of the Act of the Imperial Parliament passed to provide for the enforcement of the provisions of the quadri-partite treaty of 1911, an Act to authorize their enforcement, so far as Canada was concerned, was passed by the Canadian Parliament on the 6th June, 1913.

By Act of Congress passed the 24th August, 1912, the United States, under a power reserved by the Treaty, suspended for a period of five years from that date the killing of seals on the Pribylof Islands. Similar action in respect of the rookeries on the Commander Islands was taken by Russia, land killing being prohibited for the period covering the years 1912 to 1916 inclusive. Canada is thus deprived for five years of the percentage of skins to which she is entitled under the Treaty when land killing takes place.

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ALASKA BOUNDARY DEMARCATION.

Good progress has been made in this work, the demarcation being now completed from the Yukon River to the Arctic Ocean; south from that river to Mount Natazhat very little remains to be done; and operations have been begun on the portion in the difficult mountainous region lying between the latter mountain and Mount St. Elias.

TREATY OF COMMERCE AND NAVIGATION WITH JAPAN OF THE 3RD. APRIL, 1911.

Parliament having sanctioned the application to Canada of this Treaty, with the exception of Article VIII. providing for special tariff treatment, on the understanding that it should not affect the provisions of the Canada Immigration Act, Canada's adherence to the Treaty was duly notified on the 1st May, 1913.

RELATIONS WITH OTHER PORTIONS
OF THE EMPIRE.

TRADE AGREEMENT BETWEEN CANADA AND THE WEST INDIES.

The Agreement of the 9th April, 1912, with certain of the West Indian Colonies was approved by the legislatures of these Colonies, by the Canadian Parliament and by His Majesty's Government, and was duly brought into operation on the 2nd June, 1913.

ROYAL COMMISSION ON TRADE AND RESOURCES OF THE EMPIRE.

Sittings of the Commission were held in London in October and November, 1912; and on the 28th December, 1912, an interim report was submitted with Minutes of the evidence taken at these sittings.

In February, 1913, in pursuit of its investigations, the Commission visited Australia and New Zealand, but no report of the proceedings in these Dominions has yet been made.

It is of interest to mention that the office of the Commissioner General in Paris has been transferred to the control of the Secretary of State for External Affairs.

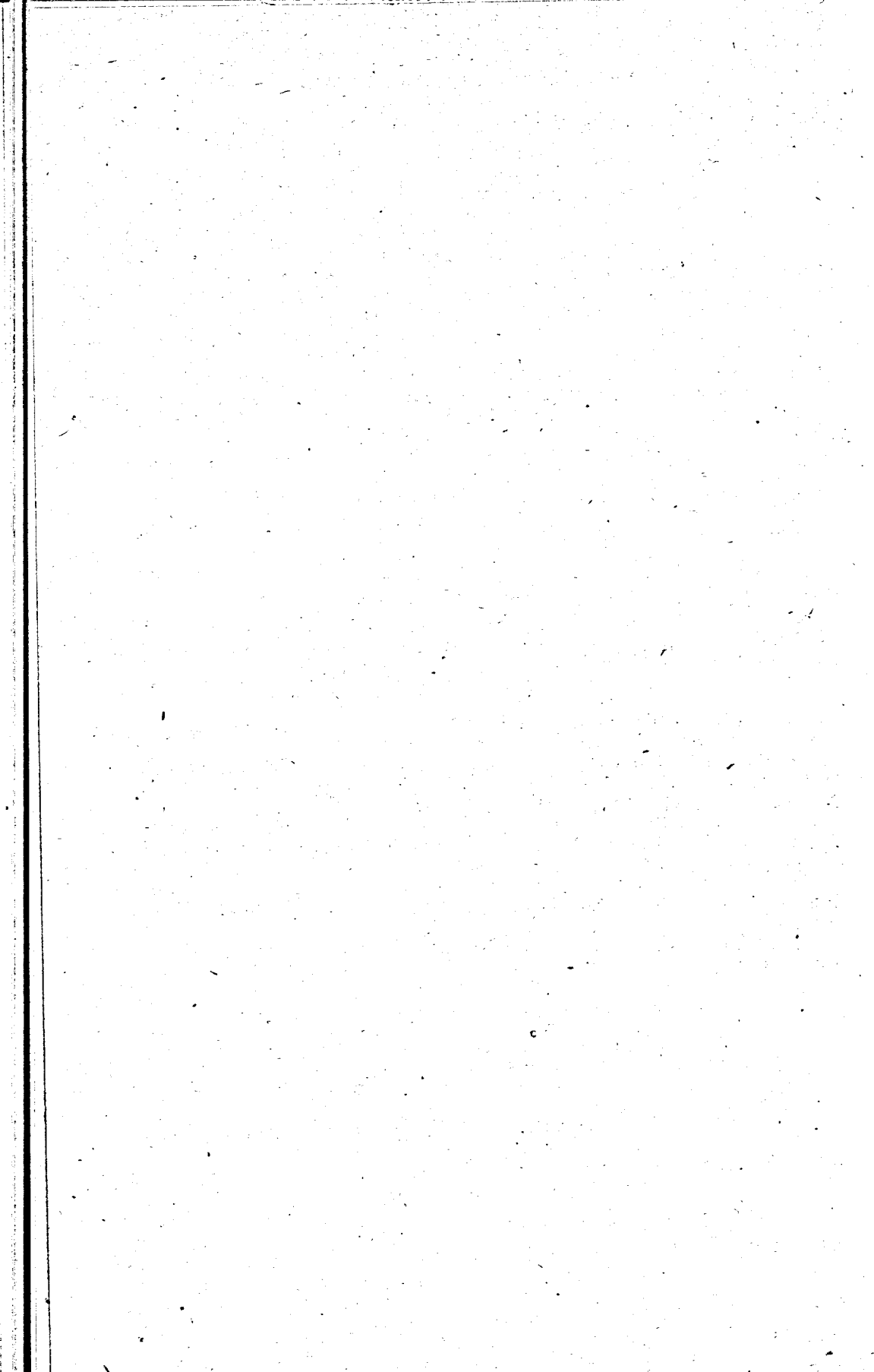

SESSIONAL PAPER No. 29a

PASSPORT REQUIREMENTS OF FOREIGN COUNTRIES.

NOTE.—British subjects travelling abroad are recommended to furnish themselves with Passports, for even in those countries where they are no longer obligatory they are found to be useful as affording a ready means of identification in case of need.

ARGENTINE REPUBLIC.—Passengers for the Argentine Republic should carry passports, and are advised to also carry certificates of birth. Persons born in His Majesty's dominions should, if they intend to become resident, even for a short time, obtain from a British Consulate in the Republic a Certificate of Nationality for purposes of identification, and to secure exemption from military service.

AUSTRIA-HUNGARY.—Persons entering Hungary from Servia or Roumania must be provided with passports. Although, in other cases, passports are not legally necessary, travellers are advised to carry them. For purposes of residence a passport or other document to prove identity is necessary.

BELGIUM.—It is desirable for travellers to possess passports. For purposes of residence, registration at the Police Office of the district is required, and a passport is accepted as evidence of identity.

BOLIVIA.—See Peru.

BRAZIL.—Passports not actually required, but travellers are advised to carry them for purposes of identification. If intending to become resident they should register their names and addresses at the nearest British Consulate.

BULGARIA.—Travellers should carry passports of recent date. Bulgarian *visa* not required. Residents should provide themselves annually with certificates of registration under the Ottoman Order in Council.

CENTRAL AMERICA.—Possession of passports desirable both for personal security and purposes of identification.

Costa Rica.—No regulations in force.

Guatemala.—Alien residents are required to present at the Guatemalan Foreign Office passports *visés* by the Diplomatic or Consular Officer in Guatemala of their native country.

Honduras.—No regulations except in times of disturbance.

Nicaragua.—No regulations in times of peace. To leave the country a local passport has, however, to be obtained from the Ministry of War.

SALVADOR.—Travellers should carry passports, and should, in addition, obtain passports from the Government of Salvador. (Charge for latter, 25 cents.)

CHILE.—No regulations in force.

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CHINA.—Passports are not required at open ports. For travelling into the interior a special passport must be obtained from a British Consul, which is valid for one year. (Cost, 3 dol. 50c. *Mexican.*)

COLOMBIA.—British subjects proceeding to the Republic of Colombia must provide themselves with passports, *visés* by the Colombian Minister or by a Consul of the Republic in Canada. For travelling in the interior it is advisable to obtain special passport from a British Consul (charge, sixty cents). Immigrants without resources must be provided with a passport issued *gratis* by the Colombian Consul at port of departure.

COREA.—Passports are not required within a radius of 100 li (33 miles) from the open ports. Persons travelling in the interior must obtain a passport through the British Consul. (Fee, 3.50 yen, about \$1.75.)

CUBA.—Although passports are not legally necessary, travellers are advised to carry them. Persons intending to reside in Cuba for any length of time should have their names registered at the British Consulate-General.

DENMARK.—No regulations in force. But passports or similar documents may be required by the Police from persons accepting employment in Denmark before furnishing them with an "opholdsbog" (situation book), and also from music hall artistes.

Iceland.—No regulations in force.

St. Thomas.—No regulations in force. A local government passport must, however, be procured when leaving the island, the cost of which varies according to destination.

DOMINION REPUBLIC.—Passport necessary.

ECUADOR.—See Peru.

EGYPT.—Passports not required by law, but travellers are advised to carry them. For travelling in other parts of the Ottoman Dominions, see **TURKISH EMPIRE.**

Sudan.—Persons desiring to enter the Sudan, travelling third-class, *unless* they are officials of the government, or are travelling on government warrants, or are *bonâ fide* natives of the Sudan, must apply for permits to the Sudan Agent, Cairo; the Sudan Government Railway Agent at Alexandria, the Sudan Government Agent at Suez, the Governor of Halfa, the Governor of the Red Sea Province, or the Inspector at Port Sudan.

Persons proceeding south or west of El Obeid or Bara must obtain a permit from the Governor of Kordofan or his representative at El Obeid or Bara.

All Europeans are recommended to report their arrival, personally or in writing, at any place where an official holding the post of Sub-Mamur, or any superior post, is stationed.

FRANCE.—The possession of a passport may save inconvenience, since evidence of identity may at any time be required.

If produced as evidence of identity at a Post Office, the passport may require to be countersigned by the British Consul for the district.

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For permanent residence, or in order to exercise profession or trade, a declaration furnishing particulars with respect to the family, nationality, profession, &c., of the person making the declaration, is required to be made at the Mairie of the Commune within a few days of arrival.

Algeria.—Regulations similar to France, both as regards passports and residence, &c.

French Guiana.—Regulations similar to France, both as regards passports and residence, &c., &c.

Madagascar.—Travellers are advised to carry passports.

Martinique.—
Reunion.—
Saigon.— } Regulations similar to France, both as regards passports and residence, &c.; &c.

New Caledonia.—Possession of passport desirable in view of existence of penal establishment.

Tahiti.—No regulations affecting Europeans in force.

Tunis.—Regulations similar to France, both as regards passports, and residence, &c., &c.

GERMAN EMPIRE.—Military officers travelling to Germany should be provided with passports; and although in other cases the possession of a passport is not obligatory, yet as evidence of identity may at any time be required, travellers are advised to carry them. For residence of more than three weeks a passport is absolutely necessary. Children sent to schools in Germany should carry passports.

GREECE.—No regulations in force, except as regards persons entering the country by the land frontier, who are sometimes required to be in possession of passports.

Hayti.—A passport (*visé* by a Haytian Consul) must, on arrival, be shown at the Port Office. It should also be produced and registered at the nearest British Consulate. On leaving the country a Haytian permit has to be obtained, as to which the British Consul should be consulted.

Italy.—The possession of a passport is not obligatory, but travellers may at any time be required to give a satisfactory account of themselves, and to establish their identity.

British subjects producing passports at Italian post offices for purposes of personal identification may be required to obtain certified translations of the same from the British Consul.

Eritrea.—Travellers proceeding to Italian Colonies should, unless they carry special letters of recommendation to the authorities, provide themselves with passports, and obtain a *visé* from an Italian Consulate.

Tripoli.—Foreigners to be allowed to land must show a passport issued within recent date for Tripolitania by the proper authority and *visaed* by the Italian authority at the port of embarkation, and must, within two days of their arrival, present themselves at the Police Office for the registration of their passports, which will be countersigned by their respective Consuls there resident.

ITALY—continued.

Italians or foreigners who arrive without having complied with the foregoing dispositions will be at once refused admission.

No person, whether Italian, native or foreigner, will be allowed to embark at other ports in Tripolitania or Cyrenaica without a special authorization on his passport.

Non-Italian wishings to leave must show a similar visé of recent date on their passports granted by their respective Consuls.

JAPAN.—Travellers are advised to carry passports.

LIBERIA.—No regulations in force, but a passport issued by the Liberian Secretary of State is required from residents leaving the country. For this 50 cents is charged.

MEXICO.—No regulations in force.

MONTENEGRO.—No special regulations exist, but a passport properly visé is required for travelling through the surrounding Turkish and Austrian territories. Persons travelling in Montenegro otherwise than by the main roads ("routes nationales"), or for purposes of science or exploration, must obtain permission from the Ministry of the Interior through their own Legation or Consulate.

MOROCCO.—It is advisable for travellers to be provided with passports, which are sometimes necessary, *e. g.*, for travelling inland, or for embarking on board the French steamers for Oran. Any one wishing to travel into the interior should consult His Majesty's Minister at Tangier or the British Consul for the district through which this route lies.

British subjects residing for more than one month in Morocco are required, under the Morocco Order in Council, 1889, to register themselves at the British Consulate.

MUSCAT.—No regulations exist. Travelling in the interior is unsafe without an armed escort.

NETHERLANDS.—The possession of a passport is not strictly necessary, but is recommended for purposes of identification.

Dutch Guiana, Curaco and Dependencies.—No regulations in force. Travellers are advised to provide themselves with passports as evidence of nationality.

Netherlands and East Indies.—Travellers on arrival, must register themselves at the Office of the chief Local authority. For travelling inland in the islands, or for residence, a passport must also be obtained from the Local authorities, respecting which the British Consul should be considered.

NORWAY.—No regulations in force.

PARAGUAY.—No regulations in force. Neither passports nor certificates of nationality are required from foreigners by the local authorities. It is as well, however, for persons travelling in the interior of the country to be provided with passports.

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PERSIA.—A passport bearing the *visé* of a Persian Consular officer must be produced on entering Persia and the passport should be countersigned by the Persian passport officer before leaving the country.

PERU, ECUADOR AND BOLIVIA.—A passport is not actually necessary, but it is desirable to possess one in order to be able to obtain from a British Diplomatic or Consular officer the certificate of nationality required in the event of civil disturbances.

PORTUGAL.—Travellers are advised to provide themselves with passports. For residence in Portugal or Portugese Colonies, a passport or other proof of nationality is required in order to obtain the necessary permission.

Azores.—The possession of a passport is advisable.

Cape Verde Islands.—Passports are not actually required, except in times of public danger, but they are useful in view of the fact that all foreigners have to personally register themselves at the Mayor's Office as soon as possible after arrival.

Loanda.—Passports necessary.

Madeira.—No regulations in force.

Mozambique.—Travellers should be provided with passports.

ROUMANIA.—Persons travelling to Roumania must be provided with passports bearing the *visé* of a Roumanian Consul. A fresh *visé* must be obtained for each journey. On arrival they should at once obtain the *visé* of the British Legation or of a British Consulate and then within twenty-four hours of arrival, apply to the Roumanian authorities for a permit to reside in the country. For a stay of less than eight days this formality may be dispensed with, and the permit will be stated upon the passport by the police officials at the frontier.

RUSSIA.—Visitors to Russia must be provided with passports bearing the *visé* of a Russian Diplomatic or Consular officer. This *visé* must be within six months of the date of entering Russia. Without such *visé* they will not be allowed to enter the country. To persons of the Jewish faith the *visé* is only granted in special circumstances, as to which the Russian Consular officer should be consulted, and in any case such persons are subject to special regulations in Russia.

The passport will enable the holder to reside in Russia for six months, when it must be exchanged at the prefecture of St. Petersburg, or at the Chancery of a Provincial Governor, for a Russian "Billet de Séjour," to be renewed annually.

The cost of such a "Billet de Séjour" varies from 7 r. 15c to 1 r. 29c. Each "Billet de Séjour," on first issue or renewal, must be delivered to the local police officer for inscription or *visé*. For non-renewal of a "Billet de Séjour" at the time of its expiration a fine is exacted.

On leaving Russia a police certificate must be obtained which is granted on the first visit of the traveller to Russia at a cost of 75 copecks. On subsequent visits 6r. 50c is charged. If a "Billet de Séjour" has been obtained it must be returned, when the passport will be handed back to the owner with the necessary authorization to leave.

In the case of persons travelling through Russia, without stopping at any point within the Empire, the *visé* of a Russian Consular officer "to travel through Russia" will be accepted as sufficient both for the purpose of entering and leaving the country, without obligation to obtain the police authorization to leave necessary in case of a stay in Russia.

Travellers passing through Tashkend or Askabad should place themselves in communication with the Russian officials at those towns.

SERVIA.—Travellers should be provided with passports, which are required by the Hungarian frontier officials.

SIAM.—No special regulations in force, but British subjects are required to register themselves at the British Consulate-General within one month of arrival. For travelling in the interior a passport must be obtained from the Siamese Government. Fee for registration, sixty cents, and for passport fifty cents.

SPAIN.—It is most advisable for travellers to be provided with passports. The *visé* of a Spanish Consul is not necessary, but will be found useful in travelling in provincial towns and country districts.

In the province of Barcelona, British subjects should, upon arrival, personally show their passports to His Majesty's Consul-General, who will thereupon furnish them with a certificate, which they are required to present, within twenty-four hours after their arrival in Barcelona, at the Office of the Civil Governor (in country towns and villages at the Office of the Mayor), in order that their names, descriptions, &c., may be registered. A fine, and possibly expulsion, may result from non-compliance with this regulation.

Canary Islands.—No regulations in force.

Ceuta.—British subjects desiring to visit Ceuta should apply through the British Vice-Consul at Algeciras for an order from the Commandante-General.

SWEDEN.—No regulations in force.

SWITZERLAND.—A passport is necessary in order to obtain a "Permis de Séjour," which must be taken out, after their arrival, by persons intending to reside in Switzerland. Children sent to schools in Switzerland should carry passports.

TURKISH EMPIRE.—Persons travelling to Turkey must be provided with a passport bearing the *visé* of a Turkish Consular officer. Without such passport they will be refused admission to the country. A fresh *visé* must be obtained for each journey. On leaving Turkey the *visé* of a British Consul should be obtained.

UNITED STATES.—No regulations in force.

Hawaiian Islands.—No regulations in force.

Philippine Islands.—Passports not required.

PORTO RICO.—Travellers are advised to carry passports.

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URUGUAY.—No regulations affecting Europeans in force. Travellers are, however, advised to have passports as evidence of nationality, in case of need.

VENEZUELA.—Travellers should be provided with passports bearing the *visé* of a Venezuelan Consular officer.

DEPARTMENT OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS, APRIL, 1913.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING PASSPORTS.

1. Applications for passports should be made in writing and enclosed in a cover addressed to "*The Honourable the Secretary of State for External Affairs, Ottawa*".

2. The charge for a passport, whatever number of persons may be named in it, is two dollars. The fee payable must accompany the application. Postage stamps will not be received as payment.

3. Passports are granted only to British born subjects or to persons naturalized in the Dominion of Canada. A married woman is deemed to be a subject of the state of which her husband is for the time being a subject.

4. Passports are not valid after five years from the date of issue. Fresh passports must then be obtained. When the party is a naturalized British subject he will be so designated in his passport.

5. Passports are granted to all persons either known to the Secretary of State or recommended to him by some person who is known to him; or upon the production of a declaration by the applicant, a blank form of which may be obtained at this department, verified by a declaration made by any banking firm or by any mayor, magistrate, justice of the peace, minister of religion, surgeon, solicitor, or notary resident in the Dominion of Canada. In certain cases, the applicant's certificate of birth must be produced in addition to the declaration.

6. If the applicant for a passport be a NATURALIZED BRITISH SUBJECT, his certificate of naturalization must be forwarded to the Department of External Affairs with the declaration; and his certificate of naturalization will be returned with the passport to the person who has communicated with this Department in the applicant's behalf for delivery to the latter. A statutory declaration to the effect that the proposed visit abroad is of a temporary character—giving the probable duration of same—and that the applicant intends to return to Canada and reside here permanently, must accompany the application for a passport.

7. A passport cannot be issued by the Department of External Affairs on behalf of a person already abroad; such person should apply for one to the nearest British Mission or Consulate.

N. B.—Although travellers are now free to enter most foreign countries without passports, colonial British subjects travelling abroad are recommended not to omit to provide themselves with passports, for even in those countries where they are no longer obligatory, they are found to be useful as affording a ready means of identification in case of need. British subjects intending to reside in Germany or Switzerland should provide themselves with passports.

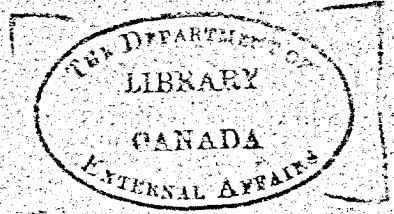

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REPORT OF THE UNDER-SECRETARY OF STATE FOR EXTERNAL AFFAIRS

The Right Honourable
Sir ROBERT BORDEN, G.C.M.G.,
Secretary of State for External Affairs,
Ottawa.

SIR,—I have the honour to submit my customary annual report on the more important matters which have been the subject of correspondence during the year 1913-14.

RELATIONS WITH FOREIGN POWERS.

NORTH ATLANTIC COAST FISHERIES.

Progress has been made in the constitution of the Permanent Mixed Fishery Commission for Canada as provided by the Agreement with the United States of the 20th July, 1912, Dr. William Wakeham having been appointed as the British Commissioner. The two Governments had further agreed to request the appointment of Dr. P. P. C. Hoek, by the Queen of the Netherlands, as the neutral Commissioner, but the regrettable death of that gentleman prevented the fulfilment of their intention. The neutral and the United States Commissioners are, therefore, still to be appointed.

PECUNIARY CLAIMS AGREEMENT.

Further sittings of the Arbitration Tribunal were held in Washington in March and April, 1914, to hear claims included in the first schedule to the Agreement.

Negotiations for the arrangement of a second schedule of claims are still in progress.

INTERNATIONAL BOUNDARY WATERS.

(1) *Pollution of Boundary Waters.*

A progress report on this question was presented by the International Joint Commission in January, 1914, in which detailed information was submitted regarding the localities where the pollution had occurred, as well as the causes and extent of such pollution. The branch of the inquiry concerning the means of remedying or preventing the pollution is still being pursued.

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(2) *St. Mary's River—Applications of Michigan Northern Power Company and Algoma Steel Corporation, Limited.*

The commission's approval was sought by the Michigan Northern Power Company for a plan for the diversion of water from the St. Mary's river to its power canal, and for the construction of compensating works in that river on the United States' side of the international boundary at Sault Ste. Marie, and also by the Algoma Steel Corporation, Limited, for a similar diversion and construction on the Canadian side of the boundary in the same vicinity.

The approval was given in both cases on conditions as to construction laid down by the commission, and further conditions as to the control and operation of the compensating works and power canals, which were to be under the supervision of a joint board of control consisting of two members appointed one by either Government.

(3) *Diversion of Waters of Shoal Lake.*

Application was also made by the Greater Winnipeg Water District for the Joint Commission's approval of the diversion for domestic and sanitary purposes of water from Shoal lake. In view of the possible effect on the level of the lake of the Woods, to which Shoal lake is tributary, the Canadian Government sanctioned the matter being considered by the commission, and, the United States Government making no objection to the proposed diversion, approval was given to the project, with the provision that such approval should not prevail against any recommendations or report to be made on the lake of the Woods reference still under consideration.

(4) *Lake of the Woods Reference.*

A progress report was presented by the commission on the 16th January' 1914, describing the steps taken in the investigation of the problems to be considered, and in accumulating and arranging the data and information upon which their final conclusions must be based.

TREATY WITH THE UNITED STATES FOR THE REGULATION OF FISHERIES IN WATERS CONTIGUOUS TO THE INTERNATIONAL BOUNDARY.

In the continued absence of indications of a disposition on the part of the United States Congress to pass the legislation necessary to give effect to the regulations prepared under the treaty, it is probable that Canada will be compelled to resume her liberty of action in this matter.

PELAGIC SEALING (TREATY OF 1911).

Early in 1914 the United States Government paid over the sum of \$10,000 to Canada, the first of the annual payments due under the treaty during the period for which land killing of seals is suspended on the Pribyloff islands.

It was considered desirable by Canada and Japan that a commission of experts, representing those Governments and that of the United States, should go to the Pribyloff islands for the purpose of investigating the conditions of the seal herd and making a joint report thereon; but on such a proposal being made it was not found possible by the United States to agree to it. As, however, they were sending experts on their own account for the purpose referred to, they readily consented to allow Canadian and Japanese experts to accompany them. Messrs. J. M. Macoun, of the Department of Mines, and B. F. Harmon, of the Department of Marine and Fisheries, were accordingly despatched on this mission as the Canadian experts.

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ALASKA BOUNDARY DEMARCATION.

From the Yukon south to mount Natazhat, the work of demarcation has been completed by the inspection of the line, placing of certain new monuments, and numbering the monuments. Further progress has been made in the portion of the work between mount Natazhat and mount St. Elias.

TREATY RATIFICATIONS.

On the 2nd June, 1913, ratification was made by Great Britain of the International Radiotelegraphic Convention concluded at London, 5th July, 1912, Canada being included in such ratification.

On the 25th August, 1913, notice was given of Canada's accession to the International Convention for the Suppression of the White Slave Traffic, signed at Paris 4th May, 1910.

RELATIONS WITH OTHER PORTIONS OF THE EMPIRE.

ROYAL COMMISSION ON TRADE AND RESOURCES OF THE EMPIRE.

A vacancy on the commission caused by the death of the South African representative, Sir Richard Solomon, was filled by the appointment on the 12th February, 1914, of Sir Jan W. S. Langerman, member of the House of Assembly of the South African Union.

A second interim report covering the activities of the commission in Australia and New Zealand was issued in January, 1914; and the visit of the commissioners to South Africa in the months of February, March, and April furnished material for a third interim report, published on the 26th June, 1914.

It only remains for me to express my satisfaction with the manner in which the various members of the staff have discharged their duties.

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PASSPORT REQUIREMENTS OF FOREIGN COUNTRIES.

NOTE.—British subjects travelling abroad are recommended to furnish themselves with passports, for even in those countries where they are no longer obligatory they are found to be useful as affording a ready means of identification in case of need.

ARGENTINE REPUBLIC.—Passengers for the Argentine Republic should carry passports, and are advised to also carry certificates of birth. Persons born in His Majesty's dominions should, if they intend to become resident, even for a short time, obtain from a British Consulate in the Republic a Certificate of Nationality for purposes of identification, and to secure exemption from military service.

AUSTRIA-HUNGARY.—Persons entering Hungary from Servia or Roumania must be provided with passports. Although, in other cases, passports are not legally necessary, travellers are advised to carry them. For purposes of residence a passport or other document to prove identity is necessary.

BELGIUM.—It is desirable for travellers to possess passports. For purposes of residence, registration at the Police Office of the district is required, and a passport is accepted as evidence of identity.

BOLIVIA.—See Peru.

BRAZIL.—Passports not actually required, but travellers are advised to carry them for purposes of identification. If intending to become resident they should register their names and addresses at the nearest British Consulate.

BULGARIA.—Travellers should carry passports of recent date. Bulgarian *visa* not required. Residents should provide themselves annually with certificates of registration under the Ottoman Order in Council.

CENTRAL AMERICA.—Possession of passports desirable both for personal security and purposes of identification.

Costa Rica.—No regulations in force.

Guatemala.—Alien residents are required to present at the Guatemalan Foreign Office passports *vises* by the Diplomatic or Consular Officer in Guatemala of their native country.

Honduras.—No regulations except in times of disturbance.

Nicaragua.—No regulations in time of peace. To leave the country a local passport has, however, to be obtained from the Ministry of War.

Salvador.—Travellers should carry passports, and should, in addition, obtain passports from the Government of Salvador. (Charge for latter, 25 cents.)

CHILE.—No regulations in force.

CHINA.—Passports are not required at open ports. For travelling into the interior a special passport must be obtained from a British Consul, which is valid for one year. (Cost, 3 dol. 50c. *Mexican*.)

COLOMBIA.—British subjects proceeding to the Republic of Colombia must provide themselves with passports, *vises* by the Colombian Minister or by a Consul of the Republic in Canada. For travelling in the interior it is advisable to obtain special passport from a British Consul (charge, sixty cents). Immigrants without resources must be provided with a passport issued *gratis* by the Colombian Consul at port of departure.

COREA.—Passports are not required within a radius of 100 li (33 miles) from the open ports. Persons travelling in the interior must obtain a passport through the British Consul. (Fee, 3.50 yen, about \$1.75.)

CUBA.—Although passports are not legally necessary, travellers are advised to carry them. Persons intending to reside in Cuba for any length of time should have their names registered at the British Consulate-General.

DENMARK.—No regulations in force. But passports or similar documents may be required by the police from persons accepting employment in Denmark before furnishing them with an "opholdsbog" (situation book), and also from music hall artistes.

Iceland.—No regulations in force.

St. Thomas.—No regulations in force. A local government passport must, however, be produced when leaving the island, the cost of which varies according to destination.

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC.—Passport necessary.

ECUADOR.—See Peru.

EGYPT.—Passports not required by law, but travellers are advised to carry them. For travelling in other parts of the Ottoman Dominions, see **TURKISH EMPIRE.**

Sudan.—Persons desiring to enter the Sudan, travelling third-class, *unless* they are officials of the government, or are travelling on Government warrants, or are *bona fide* natives of the Sudan, must apply for permits to the Sudan Agent, Cairo, the Sudan Government Railways Agent at Alexandria, the Sudan Government Agent at Suez, the Governor of Halfa, the Governor of the Red Sea Province, or the Inspector at Port Sudan.

Persons proceeding south or west of El Obeid or Bara must obtain a permit from the Governor of Kordofan or his representative at El Obeid or Bara.

All Europeans are recommended to report their arrival, personally or in writing, at any place where an official holding the post of Sub-Mamur, or any superior post, is stationed.

FRANCE.—The possession of a passport is advisable, since evidence of identity may at any time be required for permanent residence, or in order to exercise profession or trade. A declaration, furnishing particulars with respect

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to the family, nationality, profession, etc., of the person making the declaration, is required in all parts of France, within a few days of arrival. In Paris, it should be made at the "Préfecture de Police" and, in the provinces, at the "Mairie" of the Commune. In default of a passport or a British Birth Certificate (bearing a 1d. stamp) for this purpose, the person should make, before the nearest British Consular Officer, a declaration of British nationality to be taken to the police authorities. For this purpose satisfactory evidence has to be produced. Proof of identity is always required in France at the post office for withdrawing registered letters or even at the "Post Restante." Either a passport, *visé* at a British Consulate, or a certificate of British nationality from the nearest Consular Officer is usually required for this purpose.

Algeria.—Regulations similar to France, both as regards passports and residence, etc.

French Guiana.—Regulations similar to France, both as regards passports and residence, etc.

Madagascar.—Travellers are advised to carry passports.

} Regulations similar to France, both as regards passports and residence, etc.

New Caledonia.—Possession of passport desirable in view of existence of penal establishment.

Tahiti.—No regulations affecting Europeans in force.

Tunis.—Regulations similar to France, both as regards passports and residence, etc.

GERMAN EMPIRE.—Military officers travelling to Germany should be provided with passports; and although in other cases the possession of a passport is not obligatory yet as evidence of identity may at any time be required, travellers are advised to carry them. For residence of more than three weeks a passport is absolutely necessary. Children sent to schools in Germany should carry passports.

GREECE.—No regulations in force, except as regards persons entering the country by the land frontier, who are sometimes required to be in possession of passports.

HAYTI.—A passport (*visé* by a Haytian Consul) must, on arrival, be shown at the Port Office. It should also be produced and registered at the nearest British Consulate. Persons travelling to Hayti are required to make a declaration before the Communal Police or, at Port-au-Prince, the Minister of the Interior, within three days of their arrival, in order to obtain the required certificate (costing \$2.) This certificate must be *visé* on moving from one commune to another. On leaving the country a Haytian permit has to be obtained, as to which the British Consul should be consulted.

ITALY.—The possession of a passport is not obligatory, but travellers may, at any time be required to give a satisfactory account of themselves, and to establish their identity.

British subjects producing passports at Italian post offices for purposes of personal identification may be required to obtain certified translations of the same from the British Consul.

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Eritrea.—Travellers proceeding to Italian Colonies should, unless they carry special letters of recommendation to the authorities, provide themselves with passports, and obtain a *visé* from an Italian Consulate.

Tripoli.—Travellers should be provided with passports bearing the *visa* of an Italian Consular Officer.

JAPAN.—Travellers are advised to carry passports.

LIBERIA.—No regulations in force, but a passport issued by the Liberian Secretary of State is required from residents leaving the country. For this 50 cents is charged.

MEXICO.—No regulations in force.

MONTENEGRO.—No special regulations exist, but a passport properly *visé* is required for travelling through the surrounding Turkish and Austrian territories. Persons travelling in Montenegro otherwise than by the main roads ("routes nationales"), or for purposes of science or exploration, must obtain permission from the Ministry of the Interior through their own Legation or Consulate.

MOROCCO.—It is advisable for travellers to be provided with passports, which are sometimes necessary, *e. g.*, for travelling inland, or for embarking on board the French steamers for Oran. Anyone wishing to travel into the interior should consult His Majesty's Minister at Tangier or the British Consulate for the district through which his route lies.

British subjects residing for more than one month in Morocco are required, under the Morocco Order in Council, 1889, to register themselves at the British Consulate.

MUSCAT.—No regulations exist. Travelling in the interior is unsafe without an armed escort.

NETHERLANDS.—The possession of a passport is not strictly necessary, but is recommended for purposes of identification.

Dutch Guiana.—Curaçao and Dependencies.—No regulations in force. Travellers are advised to provide themselves with passports as evidence of nationality.

Netherland East Indies.—Travellers on arrival, must register themselves at the office of the chief local authority. For travelling inland in the islands, or for residence, a passport must also be obtained from the local authorities, respecting which the British Consul should be considered.

NORWAY.—No regulations in force.

PARAGUAY.—No regulations in force. Neither passports nor certificates of nationality are required from foreigners by the local authorities. It is as well, however, for persons travelling in the interior of the country to be provided with passports.

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PERSIA.—A passport bearing the *visa* of a Persian Consular officer must be produced on entering Persia and the passport should be countersigned by the Persian passport officer before leaving the country.

PERU, ECUADOR AND BOLIVIA.—A passport is not actually necessary, but it is desirable to possess one in order to be able to obtain from a British Diplomatic or Consular officer the certificate of nationality required in the event of civil disturbances.

PORTUGAL.—Travellers are advised to provide themselves with passports. For residence in Portugal or Portuguese Colonies, a passport or other proof of nationality is required in order to obtain the necessary permission.

Azores.—The possession of a passport is advisable.

Cape Verde Islands.—Passports are not actually required, except in times of public danger, but they are useful in view of the fact that all foreigners have to personally register themselves at the Mayor's Office as soon as possible after arrival.

Loanda.—Passport necessary.

Madeira.—No regulations in force.

Mozambique.—Travellers should be provided with passports.

ROUMANIA.—Persons travelling to Roumania must be provided with passports bearing the *visa* of a Roumanian Consul. A fresh *visa* must be obtained for each journey. On arrival they should at once obtain the *visa* of the British Legation or of a British Consulate and then within twenty-four hours of arrival, apply to the Roumanian authorities for a permit to reside in the country. For a stay of less than eight days this formality may be dispensed with, and the permit will be stated upon the passport by the police officials at the frontier.

RUSSIA.—Visitors to Russia must be provided with passports bearing the *visa* of a Russian Diplomatic or Consular officer. This *visa* must be within six months of the date of entering Russia. Without such *visa* they will not be allowed to enter the country. To persons of the Jewish faith the *visa* is only granted in special circumstances, as to which the Russian Consular officer should be consulted, and in any case such persons are subject to special regulations in Russia.

The passport will enable the holder to reside in Russia for six months, when it must be exchanged at the prefecture of St. Petersburg, or at the Chancery of a provincial Governor, for a Russian "Billet de Séjour," to be renewed annually.

The cost of such "Billet de Séjour" varies from 7r. 15c. to 1r. 29c. Each "Billet de Séjour", on first issue or renewal, must be delivered to the local police officer for inscription or *visa*. For non-renewal of a "Billet de Séjour" at the time of its expiration a fine is exacted.

On leaving Russia a police certificate must be obtained, which is granted on the first visit of the traveller to Russia at a cost of 75 copecks. On subsequent visits 6r. 50c. is charged. If a "Billet de Séjour" has been obtained it must be returned, when the passport will be handed back to the owner with the necessary authorization to leave.

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In the case of persons travelling through Russia, without stopping at any point within the Empire, the *visa* of a German Consular officer "to travel through Russia" will be accepted as sufficient both for the purpose of entering and leaving the country, without obligation to obtain the police authorization to leave, necessary in case of a stay in Russia.

Travellers passing through Tashkend or Askabad should place themselves in communication with the Russian officials at those towns.

SERVIA.—Travellers should be provided with passports, which are required by the Hungarian frontier officials.

SIAM.—No special regulations in force, but British subjects are required to register themselves at the British Consulate-General within one month of arrival. For travelling in the interior a passport must be obtained from the Siamese Government. Fee for registration, sixty cents; and for passport, fifty cents.

SPAIN.—It is most advisable for travellers to be provided with passports. The *visa* of a Spanish Consul is not necessary, but will be found useful in travelling in provincial towns and country districts.

In the province of Barcelona, British subjects should, upon arrival, personally show their passports to His Majesty's Consul-General, who will thereupon furnish them with a certificate, which they are required to present, within twenty-four hours after their arrival in Barcelona, at the Office of the Civil Governor (in country towns and villages at the Office of the Mayor), in order that their names, descriptions, etc., may be registered. A fine, and possibly expulsion, may result from non-compliance with this regulation.

Canary Islands.—No regulations in force.

Ceuta.—British subjects desiring to visit Ceuta should apply through the British Vice-Consul at Algeciras for an order from the Commandante-General.

SWEDEN.—No regulations in force.

SWITZERLAND.—A passport is necessary in order to obtain a "Permis de Séjour", which must be taken out, after their arrival, by persons intending to reside in Switzerland. Children sent to schools in Switzerland should carry passports.

TURKISH EMPIRE.—Persons travelling to Turkey must be provided with a passport bearing the *visa* of a Turkish Consular officer. Without such passport they will be refused admission to the country. A fresh *visa* must be obtained for each journey. On leaving Turkey the *visa* of a British Consul should be obtained.

UNITED STATES.—No regulations in force.

Hawaiian Islands.—No regulations in force.

Philippine Islands.—Passports not required.

Porto Rico.—Travellers are advised to carry passports.

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URUGUAY.—No regulations affecting Europeans in force. Travellers are, however, advised to have passports as evidence of nationality, in case of need.

VENEZUELA.—Travellers are advised to carry passports.

DEPARTMENT OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS,

REGULATIONS RESPECTING PASSPORTS.

1. Applications for passports should be made in writing and enclosed in a cover addressed to "*The Honourable the Secretary of State for External Affairs, Ottawa.*"

2. The charge for a passport, whatever number of persons may be named in it, is two dollars. The fee payable must accompany the application. Postage stamps will not be received as payment.

3. Passports are granted only to British-born subjects or to persons naturalized in the Dominion of Canada. A married woman is deemed to be a subject of the state of which her husband is for the time being a subject.

4. Passports are not valid after five years from the date of issue. Fresh passports must then be obtained. When the party is a naturalized British subject he will be so designated in his passport.

5. Passports are granted to all persons either known to the Secretary of State for External Affairs or recommended to him by some person who is known to him; or upon the production of a declaration by the applicant, a blank form of which may be obtained at this department, verified by a declaration made by any banking firm, or by any mayor, magistrate, justice of the peace, minister of religion, surgeon, solicitor, or notary resident in the Dominion of Canada. In certain cases, the applicant's certificate of birth must be produced in addition to the declaration.

6. If the applicant for a passport be a NATURALIZED BRITISH SUBJECT, his certificate of naturalization must be forwarded to the Department of External Affairs with the declaration; and his certificate of naturalization will be returned with the passport to the person who has communicated with this department in the applicant's behalf for delivery to the latter. A statutory declaration to the effect that the proposed visit abroad is of a temporary character—giving the probable duration of the same—and that the applicant intends to return to Canada and reside here permanently, must accompany the application for a passport.

7. A passport cannot be issued by the Department of External Affairs on behalf of a person already abroad; such person should apply for one to the nearest British Mission or Consulate.

8. Travellers who may have any intention of visiting the Russian Empire, the Turkish Dominions, the Kingdom of Roumania, Persia, Colombia, Hayti, or Eritrea, at any time in the course of their travels, must first have their passports *visés* at the nearest Russian, Turkish, Roumanian, Persian, Colombian, Haytian, or Italian Consulate as the case may be. For the information of travellers proceeding to any of these countries *via* Great Britain, it may be stated that the addresses in London of these consulates are respectively as follows: The Russian Consulate-General, Windsor Chambers, 20 Great St. Helen's, E.C.; the Consulate-General of the Sublime Porte, 7 Union Court, Old Broad street, E.C.; the Roumanian Consulate-General, 3 Mincing Lane, E.C.; the Persian Con-

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sulate-General, 82 Victoria street, S.W.; the Colombian Consulate-General, Friars House, New Broad street, E.C.; the Haytian Consulate, 32 Fenchurch street, E. C.; the Italian Consulate-General (for Eritrea) 44 Finsbury Square, E.C. Passports may also be *visés* at any of the other Consulates of Russia, Turkey, Roumania, Persia, Colombia, Hayti or Italy in the United Kingdom. Travellers about to proceed to any other country need not obtain the *visa* of the Diplomatic or Consular Agents of such country.

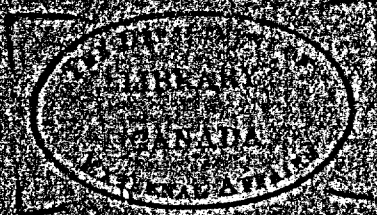
N.B.—Although travellers are now free to enter most foreign countries without passports, British subjects travelling abroad are recommended not to omit to provide themselves with passports, for even in those countries where they are no longer obligatory, they are found to be useful as affording a ready means of identification in case of need. British subjects intending to *reside* in Germany or Switzerland should provide themselves with passports.

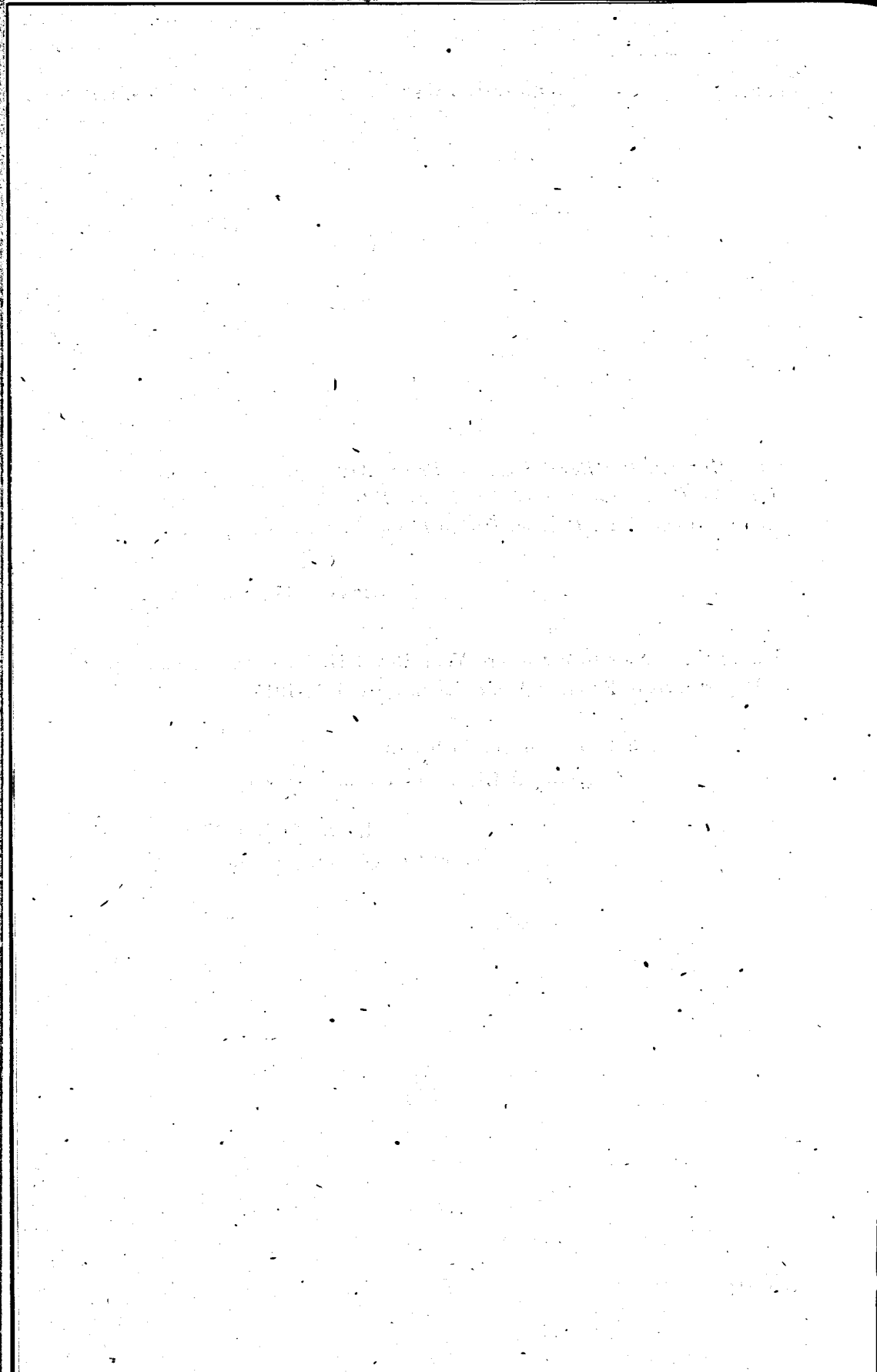

REPORT OF THE UNDER-SECRETARY OF STATE FOR EXTERNAL AFFAIRS.

The Right Honourable

SIR,—I have the honour to submit a brief review of the more important matters which have engaged the attention of the department during the year 1914-15.

EUROPEAN WAR.

That which has overshadowed all others is the European War. Notification of the existence of a state of war between Great Britain and Germany was made on the 4th August, 1914, a similar notification in respect of Austria-Hungary being made on the 12th of the same month, and in respect of Turkey on the 5th of November. Canadian co-operation in the necessary military measures and the number of new questions of administration naturally arising from a state of war, involved a very great increase in the correspondence passing through the hands of the department, though the consideration of other matters of external concern necessarily fell to some extent into abeyance.

NORTH ATLANTIC COAST FISHERIES.

Arrangements had been perfected in concert with the United States Government for inviting the Queen of the Netherlands to name the neutral member of the Permanent Mixed Fishery Commissions for Canada and for Newfoundland, but the outbreak of the war interfered with these arrangements and the completion of the commissions is still to be effected.

INTERNATIONAL BOUNDARY WATERS.

A change in the constitution of the Canadian section of the International Joint Commission under the Boundary Waters Treaty with the United States was caused by the resignation of the chairman, Mr. T. Chase Casgrain, in December, 1914. The vacancy thus arising was filled by the appointment on the 11th December, 1914, of Mr. P. B. Mignault.

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ST. CROIX RIVER—APPLICATION OF SPRAGUE'S FALLS MANUFACTURING COMPANY.

Sanction was given for the reference to the International Joint Commission of an application from the Sprague's Falls Manufacturing Company, a Canadian corporation, for the approval of works in connection with a diversion of the waters of the St. Croix river near Grand Falls.

TREATY WITH THE UNITED STATES FOR THE REGULATION OF FISHERIES IN WATERS CONTIGUOUS TO THE INTERNATIONAL BOUNDARY.

As foreshadowed in last year's report, Canada found it advisable to resume her liberty of action in connection with this matter, and formal notification to that effect was given to the United States Government by His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington on the 19th October, 1914.

PELAGIC SEALING (*Treaty of 1911*).

The investigation into the condition of the seal herd on the Pribyloff islands was duly carried out in the period from June to September, 1914, by the Canadian delegates, Mr. J. M. Macoun, C.M.G., and Mr. B. W. Harmon, working in harmony with United States and Japanese representatives. The opinion of the Canadian delegates, which was shared by the United States and Japanese delegates, was that the interests of the fur seal herd and of the sealing industry made it desirable that regulated land-killing of seals should be resumed on the islands in the season of 1915.

The second annual instalment of \$10,000 payable by the United States during the suspension of land killing was duly paid over to Canada.

ALASKA BOUNDARY DEMARCATION.

The operations of the commissioners engaged in the demarcation of the 141st Meridian approach completion, the field work of the whole survey and the demarcation having been finished. A general report of the whole operations of the survey is in course of preparation.

TREATY RATIFICATIONS.

Treaty between the United Kingdom and the United States for the establishment of a peace commission.—The aim of this treaty, which was signed at Washington on the 15th September, 1914, and ratified on the 10th November, is to ensure the avoidance of war by providing that all disputes which cannot be settled by diplomatic means shall be referred to a commission appointed as provided in the treaty for investigation and report, and that pending such report hostilities shall not be begun nor war declared.

Anglo-Swiss treaty.—By a treaty signed at London the 30th March, 1914, and ratified at the same place 12th July, 1915, power was taken by His Majesty's Government to terminate at any time Articles IX and X of the treaty with Switzerland of the 6th September, 1855, in so far as they apply to the Dominion of Canada, Commonwealth of Australia, Dominion of New Zealand, Union of South Africa, and Newfoundland, or to any of them. The articles referred to guaranteed to each of the two powers in the territories of the other most-favoured-nation-treatment in regard to customs and other duties and to matters of commerce generally.

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Arbitration treaty with the Netherlands.—A treaty with the Netherlands renewing for a further period of five years the arbitration convention concluded between the two countries at London, 15th February, 1905, was signed at London, 25th March, 1915, and ratified 12th July, 1915.

Berne International Convention 1906, for the prohibition of the use of white phosphorus in the manufacture of matches.—Notification of Canada's adhesion to the above-named convention was made to the Swiss Government on the 20th September, 1914.

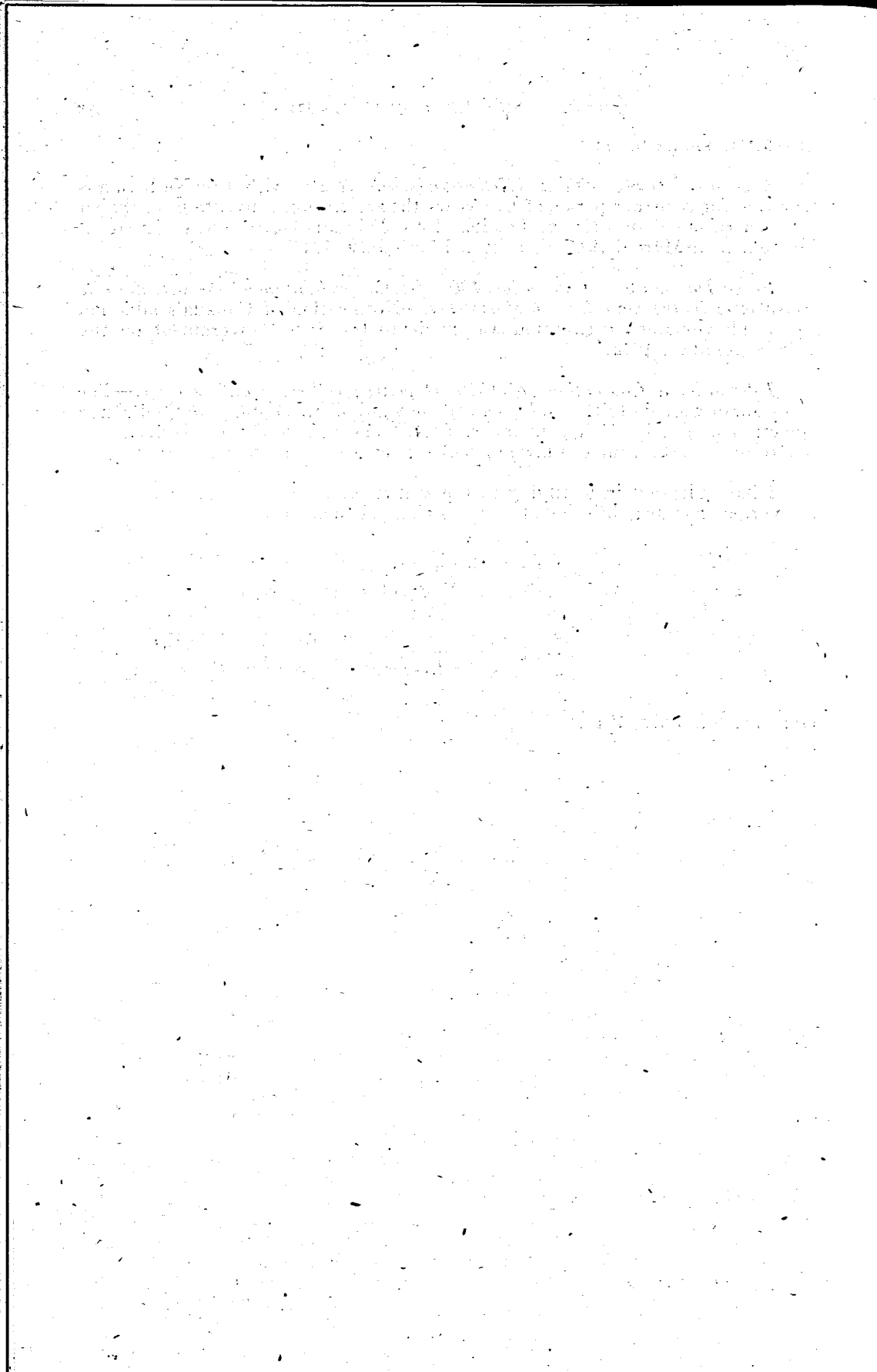
International Conventions of 1910, respecting collisions and salvage.—The accession of Canada to the above-named conventions was notified to the Belgian Government on the 25th September, 1914. The object of these conventions was to unify certain rules of law applicable to collisions and to salvage.

PASSPORT REQUIREMENTS OF FOREIGN COUNTRIES.

NOTE.—British subjects travelling abroad are recommended to furnish themselves with passports, for even in those countries where they are no longer obligatory they are found to be useful as affording a ready means of identification in case of need.

ARGENTINE REPUBLIC.—Passengers for the Argentine Republic should carry passports, and are advised to also carry certificates of birth. Persons born in His Majesty's dominions should, if they intend to become resident, even for a short time, obtain from a British Consulate in the Republic a Certificate of Nationality for purposes of identification, and to secure exemption from military service.

AUSTRIA-HUNGARY.—Persons entering Hungary from Servia or Roumania must be provided with passports. Although, in other cases, passports are not legally necessary, travellers are advised to carry them. For purposes of residence a passport or other document to prove identity is necessary.

BELGIUM.—It is desirable for travellers to possess passports. For purposes of residence, registration at the Police Office of the district is required, and a passport is accepted as evidence of identity.

BOLIVIA.—See Peru.

BRAZIL.—Passports not actually required, but travellers are advised to carry them for purposes of identification. If intending to become resident they should register their names and addresses at the nearest British Consulate.

BULGARIA.—Travellers should carry passports of recent date. Bulgarian *visa* not required. Residents should provide themselves annually with certificates of registration under the Ottoman Order in Council.

CENTRAL AMERICA.—Possession of passports desirable both for personal security and purposes of identification.

Costa Rica.—No regulations in force.

Guatemala.—Alien residents are required to present at the Guatemalan Foreign Office passports *visés* by the Diplomatic or Consular Officer in Guatemala of their native country.

Honduras.—No regulations except in times of disturbance.

Nicaragua.—No regulations in time of peace. To leave the country a local passport has, however, to be obtained from the Ministry of War.

Salvador.—Travellers should carry passports, and should, in addition, obtain passports from the Government of Salvador. (Charge for latter, 25 cents.)

CHILE.—No regulations in force.

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CHINA.—Passports are not required at open ports. For travelling into the interior a special passport must be obtained from a British Consul, which is valid for one year. (Cost, 3 dol. 50c. *Mexican*.)

COLOMBIA.—British subjects proceeding to the Republic of Colombia must provide themselves with passports, *visés* by the Colombian Minister or by a Consul of the Republic in Canada. For travelling in the interior it is advisable to obtain special passport from a British Consul (charge, sixty cents). Immigrants without resources must be provided with a passport issued *gratis* by the Colombian Consul at port of departure.

COREA.—Passports are not required within a radius of 100 li (33 miles) from the open ports. Persons travelling in the interior must obtain a passport through the British Consul. (Fee, 3.50 yen, about \$1.75.)

CUBA.—Although passports are not legally necessary, travellers are advised to carry them. Persons intending to reside in Cuba for any length of time should have their names registered at the British Consulate-General.

DENMARK.—No regulations in force. But passports or similar documents may be required by the police from persons accepting employment in Denmark before furnishing them with an "opholdsbog" (situation book), and also from music hall artistes.

Iceland.—No regulations in force.

St. Thomas.—No regulations in force. A local government passport must, however, be procured when leaving the island, the cost of which varies according to destination.

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC.—Passport necessary.

ECUADOR.—See Peru.

EGYPT.—Passports not required by law, but travellers are advised to carry them. For travelling in other parts of the Ottoman Dominions, see **TURKISH EMPIRE.**

Sudan.—Persons desiring to enter the Sudan, travelling third-class, unless they are officials of the government, or are travelling on Government warrants, or are *bona fide* natives of the Sudan, must apply for permits to the Sudan Agent, Cairo, the Sudan Government Railways Agent at Alexandria, the Sudan Government Agent at Suez, the Governor of Halfa, the Governor of the Red Sea Province, or the Inspector at Port Sudan.

Persons proceeding south or west of El Obeid or Bara must obtain a permit from the Governor of Kordofan or his representative at El Obeid or Bara.

All Europeans are recommended to report their arrival, personally or in writing, at any place where an official holding the post of Sub-Mamur, or any superior post, is stationed.

FRANCE.—The possession of a passport is advisable, since evidence of identity may at any time be required for permanent residence, or in order to

exercise profession or trade. A declaration, furnishing particulars with respect to the family, nationality, profession, etc., of the person making the declaration, is required in all parts of France, within a few days of arrival. In Paris, it should be made at the "Préfecture de Police" and, in the provinces, at the "Mairie" of the Commune. In default of a passport or a British Birth Certificate (bearing a 1d. stamp) for this purpose, the person should make, before the nearest British Consular Officer, a declaration of British nationality to be taken to the police authorities. For this purpose satisfactory evidence has to be produced. Proof of identity is always required in France at the post office for withdrawing registered letters or even at the "Post Restante." Either a passport, *viséd* at a British Consulate, or a certificate of British nationality from the nearest Consular Officer is usually required for this purpose.

Algeria.—Regulations similar to France, both as regards passports and residence, etc.

French Guiana.—Regulations similar to France, both as regards passports and residence, etc.

Madagascar.—Travellers are advised to carry passports.

Martinique.—
Réunion.—
Saigon.— } Regulations similar to France, both as regards passports
and residence, etc.

New Caledonia.—Possession of passport desirable in view of existence of penal establishment.

Tahiti.—No regulations affecting Europeans in force.

Tunis.—Regulations similar to France, both as regards passports and residence, etc.

GERMAN EMPIRE.—Military Officers travelling to Germany should be provided with passports; and although in other cases the possession of a passport is not obligatory yet as evidence of identity may at any time be required, travellers are advised to carry them. For residence of more than three weeks a passport is absolutely necessary. Children sent to schools in Germany should carry passports.

GREECE.—No regulations in force, except as regards persons entering the country by the land frontier, who are sometimes required to be in possession of passports.

HAYTI.—A passport (*visé* by a Haytian Consul) must, on arrival, be shown at the Port Office. It should also be produced and registered at the nearest British Consulate. Persons travelling to Hayti are required to make a declaration before the Communal Police or, at Port-au-Prince, the Minister of the Interior, within three days of their arrival, in order to obtain the required certificate (costing \$2). This certificate must be *viséd* on moving from one commune to another. On leaving the country a Haytian permit has to be obtained, as to which the British Consul should be consulted.

ITALY.—The possession of a passport is not obligatory, but travellers may, at any time be required to give a satisfactory account of themselves, and to establish their identity.

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British subjects producing passports at Italian post offices for purposes of personal identification may be required to obtain certified translations of the same from the British Consul.

Eritrea.—Travellers proceeding to Italian Colonies should, unless they carry special letters of recommendation to the authorities, provide themselves with passports, and obtain a *visa* from an Italian Consulate.

Tripoli.—Travellers should be provided with passports bearing the *visa* of an Italian Consular Officer.

JAPAN.—Travellers are advised to carry passports.

LIBERIA.—No regulation in force, but a passport issued by the Liberian Secretary of State is required from residents leaving the country. For this 50 cents is charged.

MEXICO.—No regulations in force.

MONTENEGRO.—No special regulations exist, but a passport properly *visé* is required for travelling through the surrounding Turkish and Austrian territories. Persons travelling in Montenegro otherwise than by the main roads ("routes nationales"), or for purposes of science or exploration, must obtain permission from the Ministry of the Interior through their own Legation or Consulate.

MOROCCO.—It is advisable for travellers to be provided with passports, which are sometimes necessary, *e. g.*, for travelling inland, or for embarking on board the French steamers for Oran. Anyone wishing to travel into the interior should consult His Majesty's Minister at Tangier or the British Consul for the district through which his route lies.

British subjects residing for more than one month in Morocco are required, under the Morocco Order in Council, 1889, to register themselves at the British Consulate.

MUSCAT.—No regulations exist. Travelling in the interior is unsafe without an armed escort.

NETHERLANDS.—The possession of a passport is not strictly necessary, but is recommended for purposes of identification.

Dutch Guiana.—*Curaçao and Dependencies*.—No regulations in force. Travellers are advised to provide themselves with passports as evidence of nationality.

Netherland East Indies.—Travellers on arrival, must register themselves at the office of the chief local authority. For travelling inland in the islands, or for residence, a passport must also be obtained from the local authorities, respecting which the British Consul should be consulted.

NORWAY.—No regulations in force.

PARAGUAY.—No regulations in force. Neither passports nor certificates of nationality are required from foreigners by the local authorities, It is as well, however, for persons travelling in the interior of the country to be provided with passports.

PERSIA.—A passport bearing the *visa* of a Persian Consular officer must be produced on entering Persia and the passport should be countersigned by the Persian passport officer before leaving the country.

PERU, ECUADOR AND BOLIVIA.—A passport is not actually necessary, but it is desirable to possess one in order to be able to obtain from a British Diplomatic or Consular officer the certificate of nationality required in the event of civil disturbances.

PORTUGAL.—Travellers are advised to provide themselves with passports. For residence in Portugal or Portuguese Colonies, a passport or other proof of nationality is required in order to obtain the necessary permission.

Azores.—The possession of a passport is advisable.

Cape Verde Islands.—Passports are not actually required, except in times of public danger, but they are useful in view of the fact that all foreigners have to personally register themselves at the Mayor's Office as soon as possible after arrival.

Loanda.—Passport necessary.

Madeira.—No regulations in force.

Mozambique.—Travellers should be provided with passports.

ROUMANIA.—Persons travelling to Roumania must be provided with passports bearing the *visa* of a Roumanian Consul. A fresh *visa* must be obtained for each journey. On arrival they should at once obtain the *visa* of the British Legation or of a British Consulate and then within twenty-four hours of arrival, apply to the Roumanian authorities for a permit to reside in the country. For a stay of less than eight days this formality may be dispensed with, and the permit will be stated upon the passport by the police officials at the frontier.

RUSSIA.—Visitors to Russia must be provided with passports bearing the *visa* of a Russian Diplomatic or Consular officer. This *visa* must be within six months of the date of entering Russia. Without such *visa* they will not be allowed to enter the country. To persons of the Jewish faith the *visa* is only granted in special circumstances, as to which the Russian Consular officer should be consulted, and in any case such persons are subject to special regulations in Russia.

The passport will enable the holder to reside in Russia for six months, when it must be exchanged at the Prefecture of Petrograd, or at the Chancery of a provincial Governor, for a Russian "Billet de Séjour," to be renewed annually.

The cost of such a "Billet de Séjour" varies from 7r. 15c. to 1r. 29c. Each "Billet de Séjour", on first issue or renewal, must be delivered to the local police officer for inscription or *visa*. For non-renewal of a "Billet de Séjour" at the time of its expiration a fine is exacted.

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On leaving Russia a police certificate must be obtained, which is granted on the first visit of the traveller to Russia at a cost of 75 copecks. On subsequent visits 6r. 50c. is charged. If a "Billet de Séjour" has been obtained it must be returned, when the passport will be handed back to the owner with the necessary authorization to leave.

In the case of persons travelling through Russia, without stopping at any point within the Empire, the *visa* of a Russian Consular officer "to travel through Russia" will be accepted as sufficient both for the purpose of entering and leaving the country, without obligation to obtain the police authorization to leave, necessary in case of a stay in Russia.

Travellers passing through Tashkend or Askabad should place themselves in communication with the Russian officials at those towns.

SERVIA.—Travellers should be provided with passports, which are required by the Hungarian frontier officials.

SIAM.—No special regulations in force, but British subjects are required to register themselves at the British Consulate-General within one month of arrival. For travelling in the interior a passport must be obtained from the Siamese Government. Fee for registration, sixty cents; and for passport, fifty cents.

SPAIN.—It is most advisable for travellers to be provided with passports. The *visa* of a Spanish Consul is not necessary, but will be found useful in travelling in provincial towns and country districts.

In the province of Barcelona, British subjects should, upon arrival, personally show their passports to His Majesty's Consul-General, who will thereupon furnish them with a certificate, which they are required to present, within twenty-four hours after their arrival in Barcelona, at the Office of the Civil Governor (in country towns and villages at the Office of the Mayor), in order that their names, description, etc., may be registered. A fine, and possibly expulsion, may result from non-compliance with this regulation.

Canary Islands.—No regulations in force.

Ceuta.—British subjects desiring to visit Ceuta should apply through the British Vice-Consul at Algeciras for an order from the Commandante-General.

SWEDEN.—No regulations in force.

SWITZERLAND.—A passport is necessary in order to obtain a "Permis de Séjour", which must be taken out, after their arrival, by persons intending to reside in Switzerland. Children sent to schools in Switzerland should carry passports.

TURKISH EMPIRE.—Persons travelling to Turkey must be provided with a passport bearing the *visa* of a Turkish Consular officer. Without such passport they will be refused admission to the country. A fresh *visa* must be obtained for each journey. On leaving Turkey the *visa* of a British Consul should be obtained.

UNITED STATES.—No regulations in force.

Hawaiian Islands.—No regulations in force.

Philippine Islands.—Passports not required.

Porto Rico.—Travellers are advised to carry passports.

URUGUAY.—No regulations affecting Europeans in force. Travellers are, however, advised to have passports as evidence of nationality, in case of need.

VENEZUELA.—Travellers are advised to carry passports.

SESSIONAL PAPER No. 33

REGULATIONS RESPECTING PASSPORTS.

1. Applications for passports should be made on the approved form, which can be obtained from the Department of External Affairs.

In the case of children under the age of 16 years requiring a separate passport, a special form to be filled in by the child's parent or guardian will be supplied.

The completed form should be enclosed in a cover addressed to "*The Assistant Under Secretary of State for External Affairs, Ottawa*", accompanied by duplicate unmounted photographs, of convenient size (carte de visite), one of which will be attached to the passport and the other retained in the Department. One of these photographs must be certified on the back by the recommender as being a genuine photograph of the applicant.

The wife and children under 16 years of age of an applicant may be included in his passport; photographs of the wife must be supplied when she is to be so included.

2. The charge for a passport is two dollars. The fee payable must accompany the application. Postage stamps will not be received as payment.

3. Passports are granted:—

- (1.) To natural-born British subjects;
- (2.) To the wives and widows of such persons; and
- (3.) To persons naturalized in the Dominion of Canada, in the United Kingdom, in other British Colonies, or in India.

A married woman is deemed to be a subject of the State of which her husband is for the time being a subject.

4. Passports are granted:—

- (1.) In the case of natural-born British subjects, upon the production of a Declaration by the applicant in the authorized form, verified by a Declaration made by the Manager of any Bank (or Branch thereof) established in the Dominion of Canada, or by any *Mayor, Police Magistrate, Minister of Religion, Barrister-at-Law, Physician, Surgeon, Solicitor, or Notary Public*, resident in Canada. The applicant's Certificate of Birth and other evidence may also be required.
- (2.) In the case of children under the age of 16 years requiring a separate passport, upon production of a Declaration made by the child's parent or guardian, in a Form (B), to be obtained upon application to the Department of External Affairs.
- (3.) In the case of naturalized British subjects, upon production of the usual Declaration together with the Certificate of Naturalization of the applicant. The certificate of Naturalization will be returned with the passport to the person who has communicated with the Department in the applicant's behalf for delivery to the latter. The application for the passport must be accompanied by a statutory declaration stating that the proposed visit abroad is of a temporary character, giving its probable duration, and indicating the applicant's intention to return to reside permanently in Canada. Naturalized British subjects will be described as such in their passports, which will be issued subject to the necessary qualifications.

5. Passports are not available beyond two years from the date of issue. They may be renewed for four further periods of two years each, after which fresh passports must be obtained. The fee for each renewal is one dollar.

6. A passport cannot be issued by the Department of External Affairs on behalf of a person already abroad; such person should apply for one to the nearest British Mission or Consulate. Passports must not be sent out of the Dominion of Canada by post.

NOTE.—Naturalized British subjects should bear in mind that their naturalization has no effect within the limits of the Foreign State to which they originally belonged, unless they have ceased to be subjects of that state, in the manner prescribed by the laws thereof, or in pursuance of a treaty or convention to that effect.

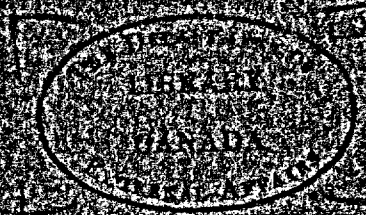

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REPORT OF THE UNDER-SECRETARY OF STATE FOR EXTERNAL AFFAIRS.

To the Right Honourable,
SIR ROBERT BORDEN, G.C.M.G.,
Secretary of State for External Affairs,
Ottawa.

SIR,—I have the honour to submit the customary brief annual review of the more important matters dealt with in the department's correspondence since the issue of the last report:

EUROPEAN WAR.

The most engrossing of these have naturally been the numerous important questions arising from the European war into which new belligerents have entered on both sides: on the 15th October, 1915, Bulgaria declared war on Servia; war was declared on Portugal by Germany on the 9th March, 1916; and Rumania declared war on Austria-Hungary on the 27th August, 1916.

On the 30th November, 1915, the British, French, Italian, Japanese and Russian Governments signed a mutual agreement not to conclude peace separately during the war; Italy thus associating herself in the policy previously agreed on by the other powers.

ARBITRATION CONVENTION WITH DENMARK.

A convention, to renew for a period of five years from the 4th May, 1916, the convention of the 25th October, 1905, providing for the settlement by arbitration of differences of a legal nature or relating to the interpretation of treaties, was concluded by His Majesty and the King of Denmark on the 3rd May, 1916, and ratified on the 31st July, 1916.

RELATIONS WITH THE UNITED STATES.

MIGRATORY BIRDS CONVENTION.

A convention now only awaiting His Majesty's ratification was concluded with the United States on the 16th August, 1916, for the protection of migratory birds in Canada and the United States by the establishment of close seasons in the two countries. This convention is to remain in force for a period of fifteen years and, if a year's previous notice to terminate has not then been given by either of the parties, to continue in force until terminated at the end of any subsequent year by a year's previous notice.

INTERNATIONAL BOUNDARY WATERS.

(1) St. Croix River—Application of Sprague's Falls Manufacturing Company.

The application of the Sprague's Falls Manufacturing Company, incorporated under Dominion legislation, and of the kindred United States corporation, the St. Croix Water Power Company, for the approval of a dam constructed by the two companies across the St. Croix river at Grand Falls, as well as of a connected power canal, was favourably entertained by the International Joint Commission which imposed the condition that the operation of the necessary works for maintaining a suitable level should be regulated by a Board of Control to be appointed by the two Governments.

(2) St. Mary and Milk Rivers Question.

In connection with the measurement and apportionment of the waters of these rivers as provided for in article 6 of the Boundary Waters Treaty of 1909, Mr. Edward Fisher Drake was designated to undertake the necessary duties on behalf of the Government of Canada, and Mr. John F. Whistler on behalf of the United States.

PEACE COMMISSION TREATY, 1914.

As it was not found feasible to complete the international commission provided for in the above-named treaty within the time specified, it was arranged by an exchange of notes to extend the time fixed by the treaty for this purpose to the 1st January, 1916.

DOMINIONS ROYAL COMMISSION, 1912.

Though in submitting its Fourth Interim Report at the close of 1914 the commission had announced an intention of suspending its sessions until the end of the war, it was in the course of the current year decided to resume the inquiries in Canada which had been interrupted by the outbreak of the war, so that the final report of the commission might be prepared. Arrangements have accordingly been made for the holding of its meetings at various Canadian centres in the autumn.

I might remark that the requirements imposed on the travelling public by the war have very largely increased the department's business in regard to the issue of passports. The increase up to the end of the fiscal year as compared with the previous year was almost sevenfold, and this rate is still further increasing.

I am pleased to put on record my appreciation of the zealous and capable manner in which the various members of the staff have discharged their duty.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING PASSPORTS.

1. Applications for passports should be made on the approved form, which can be obtained from the Department of External Affairs.

In the case of children under the age of 16 years requiring a separate passport a special form to be filled in by the child's parent or guardian will be supplied.

The completed form should be enclosed in a cover addressed to "*The Assistant Under Secretary of State for External Affairs, Ottawa,*" accompanied by duplicate unmounted photographs, of convenient size (*carte de visite*), one of which will be attached to the passport and the other retained in the Department. One of these photographs must be certified on the back by the recommender as being a genuine photograph of the applicant.

The wife and children under 16 years of age of an applicant may be included in his passport; photographs of the wife must be supplied when she is to be so included.

2. The charge for a passport is two dollars. The fee payable must accompany the application. Postage stamps will not be received as payment.

3. Passports are granted:—

- (1) To natural-born British subjects;
- (2) To the wives and widows of such persons; and
- (3) To persons naturalized in the Dominion of Canada, in the United Kingdom, in other British Colonies, or in India.

A married woman is deemed to be a subject of the State of which her husband is for the time being a subject.

4. Passports are granted:—

- (1) In the case of natural-born British subjects, upon the production of a Declaration by the applicant in the authorized form, verified by a Declaration made by the Manager of any Bank (or Branch thereof) established in the Dominion of Canada, or by any *Mayor, Police Magistrate, Minister of Religion, Barrister-at-Law, Physician, Surgeon, Solicitor, or Notary Public*, resident in Canada. The applicant's Certificate of Birth and other evidence may also be required.
- (2) In the case of children under the age of 16 years requiring a separate passport, upon production of a Declaration made by the child's parent or guardian, in a Form (B), to be obtained upon application to the Department of External Affairs.
- (3) In the case of naturalized British subjects, upon production of the usual Declaration together with the Certificate of Naturalization of the applicant. The certificate of Naturalization will be returned with the passport to the person who has communicated with the Department in the applicant's behalf for delivery to the latter. The application for the passport must be accompanied by a statutory declaration stating that the proposed visit abroad is of a temporary character, giving its probable duration, and indicating the applicant's intention to return to reside permanently in Canada. Naturalized British subjects will be described as such in their passports, which will be issued subject to the necessary qualifications.

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5. Passports are not available beyond two years from the date of issue. They may be renewed for four further periods of two years each, after which fresh passports must be obtained. The fee for each renewal is one dollar.

6. A passport cannot be issued by the Department of External Affairs on behalf of a person already abroad; such person should apply for one to the nearest British Mission or Consulate. Passports must not be sent out of the Dominion of Canada by post.

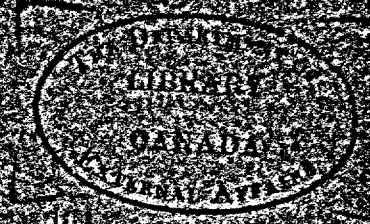
NOTE.—Naturalized British subjects should bear in mind that their naturalization has no effect within the limits of the Foreign State to which they originally belonged, unless they have ceased to be subjects of that state, in the manner prescribed by the laws thereof, or in pursuance of a treaty or convention to that effect.

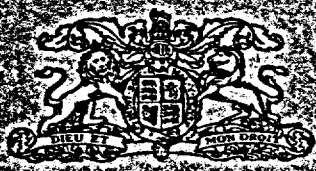

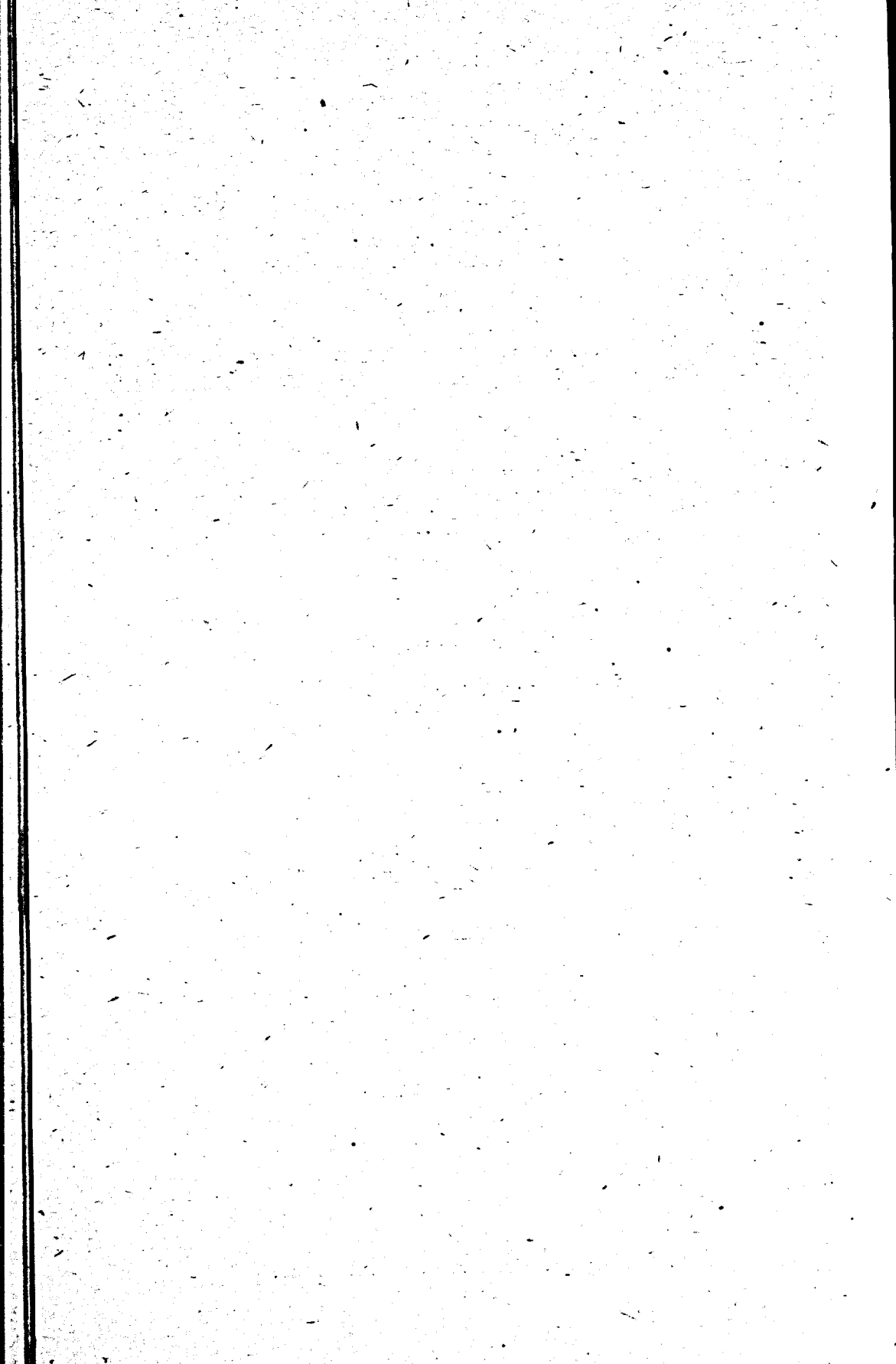

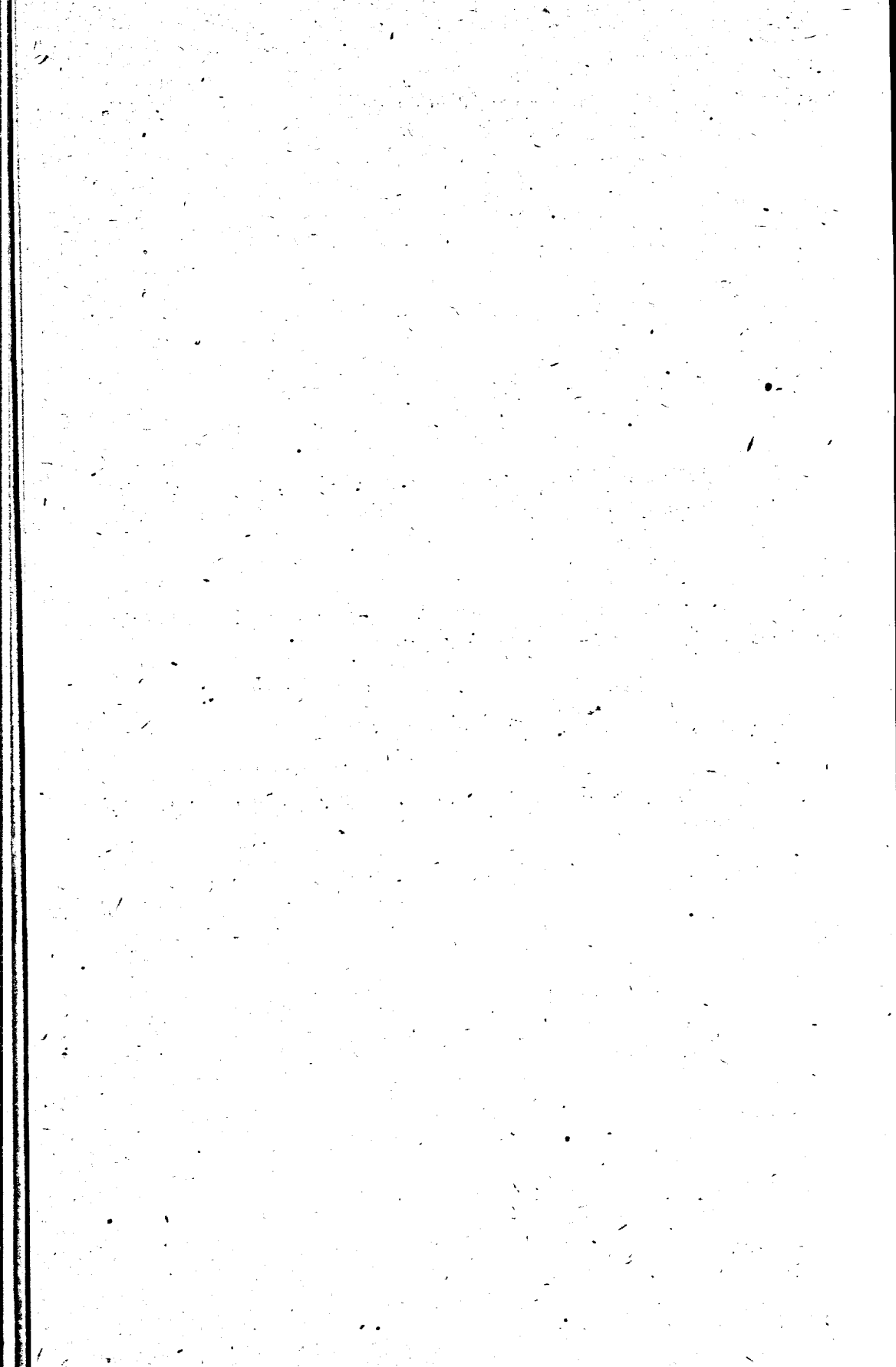

REPORT OF THE UNDER-SECRETARY OF STATE FOR EXTERNAL AFFAIRS.

To The Right Honourable
Sir ROBERT BORDEN, G.C.M.G.,
Secretary of State for External Affairs,
Ottawa.

SIR,—I have the honour to submit my customary report in regard to the business of this department for the annual period 1916–17.

The numerous and complex questions arising from the Great European War continue to provide the subject-matter of the bulk of the correspondence of the year.

Germany's adoption of the policy of unrestricted destruction of merchant vessels, within zones defined by her, brought about a severance of diplomatic relations on the part of the United States, and a state of war was formally proclaimed by the President on the 6th April, 1917. This action of the United States was promptly followed by a severance of relations with Germany by Cuba, Brazil, and Bolivia.

The Dominions Royal Commission resumed its sittings in Canada in August, 1916, starting at Montreal, proceeding westward to Prince Rupert, and returning via Victoria and Vancouver eastward across the continent to Quebec. Sessions were held at all important centres. A fifth interim report, summarizing the information obtained on this tour, was published in February, 1917. The full and final report covering all the commission's operations was issued in March, 1917.

From March to May, 1917, marking a fresh development in the constitutional history of the British Empire, there sat at 10 Downing street, London, for the first time, the Imperial War Cabinet. This new body, over which the Prime Minister of the United Kingdom presided, consisted of the members of the War Cabinet of the United Kingdom, the Prime Minister of each Dominion or in his place a Minister deputed for the purpose, the Secretary of State for India, representing India, and other members of the Government of the United Kingdom specially concerned with Imperial affairs. The Imperial War Cabinet dealt with problems concerned with the effective prosecution of the war, and the terms on which peace might be made. In the end it was decided and announced that an Imperial Cabinet should be held annually to discuss foreign affairs and other aspects of Imperial policy (see Debates, House of Commons, Canada, Session 1917, vol. ii, pp. 1525–40; vol. iii, pp. 2354–5). At the same time, though sitting on alternate days, the Imperial War Conference, which is to be regarded as a special war meeting of the Imperial Conference of previous years enlarged by the inclusion in its membership, for the first time, of representatives from India, met at the Colonial Office under the chairmanship of the Secretary of State for the Colonies. The Imperial War Conference dealt with questions of common concern relating more especially to post-war conditions of an economic and constitutional nature. Canada's representatives at the Imperial War Conference were Sir Robert Borden, Sir George Perley, Mr. Rogers, and Mr. Hazen. Unfortunately, owing to unavoidable causes, Australia was unable to send representatives to the Imperial War Cabinet and Imperial War Conference of 1917.

Turning to matters concerning relations with the United States, it might be mentioned that the ratifications of the Migratory Birds Convention, con-

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cluded on the 16th August, 1916, were duly exchanged at Washington on the 7th December, 1916, and an Act confirming it was passed by the Canadian Parliament in August, 1917.

Reference may further be made to questions arising with the United States Government under the Boundary Waters Treaty, which have been adjusted by the International Joint Commission: (a) Application was made to the commission by the United States Government for the approval of certain improvements in the St. Clair river at Port Huron, involving a deepening of the channel and the construction of a submerged weir. Canada being ready to agree to the proposed improvements conditionally upon the taking of adequate measures to protect Canadian interests, the approval of the commission was given on the 18th May, 1917, subject to Canada's conditions being met. (b) The final report of the commission on the Lake of the Woods reference was made on the 18th May, 1917. A level for the waters of the lake was recommended, which it was considered would be of the widest advantage to the various interests concerned, and compensation for damages to lands overflowed by the raising of the water suggested. A scheme was further outlined for controlling and regulating the flow of the waters, so that the desired level might be maintained. (c) The International Lumber Company, an American Corporation, applied for the approval of certain booms in the Rainy river at International Falls, and on the 3rd October, 1917, such approval was granted; it being laid down that the booms should follow lines indicated by the United States Secretary of War, and steps being taken to safeguard rights on the Canadian side of the boundary line.

TREATY OF COMMERCE AND NAVIGATION WITH PORTUGAL,
12TH AUGUST, 1914.

At the request of the Canadian Government, notice of Canada's adhesion to the above treaty was given on the 16th May, 1917, His Majesty's Government in a communication to the Portuguese Government having previously recorded their view that article 6 of the treaty, relating to the importation into the United Kingdom and the sale therein of port and madeira wines, referred only to the United Kingdom, and that the application of the treaty to any of His Majesty's dominions did not involve the application of the article referred to.

PELAGIC SEALING.

Notification was received from the Russian Government that the killing of seals on the Commander islands, which had been prohibited in 1912, would be resumed in 1917, this involving the revival of Canada's right to share of the take.

The danger attending travel across the submarine zones has made it necessary for the Canadian Government severely to restrict such travel in the case of women and children. It has been arranged to allow it only in special circumstances, approved by a Sub-Committee of the Privy Council, as justifying exceptional treatment. The measures connected with the carrying out of this procedure have added very considerably to the work of the passport office.

I gladly take the opportunity of expressing my satisfaction with the zealous and efficient manner in which the members of the staff have discharged their several duties.

REPORT OF THE UNDER SECRETARY OF STATE FOR EXTERNAL AFFAIRS.

To the Right Honourable

Sir ROBERT BORDEN, G.C.M.G.,

Secretary of State for External Affairs,
Ottawa.

SIR,—I have the honour to submit the usual report on the more important matters which have come before the department during the annual period beginning with April, 1917.

EUROPEAN WAR.

As for the past four years, the European war is still the most fruitful source of questions entailing correspondence with outside authorities, though a number of these have not reached a stage where extended reference is practicable or useful. New combatants continue to be drawn within its widening circle; in July, Siam, and in August, China declared war with Germany and Austria-Hungary, Greece in the latter month making a similar declaration against these powers, and also against Bulgaria and Turkey, while on the 7th December, the President of the United States approved a joint resolution of Congress declaring the existence of a state of war between that country and Austria-Hungary.

CANADIAN WAR MISSION.

To provide for the necessity of frequent and prompt communication and negotiation between the Canadian and United States Governments in the numerous and important matters affecting Canada's participation in the war, it was found necessary in the early part of February, 1918, to establish a Canadian War Mission at Washington, the Chairman of which was empowered to represent the Cabinet and the heads of the various Departments in respect of negotiations relating to purely Canadian affairs with the heads of the Departments of the United States Government and other United States officials, and with the other British or Allied Missions operating in the United States in connection with the war. Of this Mission, Mr. Lloyd Harris was appointed Chairman.

MILITARY SERVICE CONVENTION WITH THE UNITED STATES.

With the object of ensuring that Canadian-British subjects in the United States and United States citizens in Canada of military age should be obliged to return to their respective countries or otherwise become subject to the laws relating to military service in force in the country where they remained, a Military Service Convention was negotiated with the United States and duly signed at Washington on the 3rd June, 1918.

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IMPERIAL WAR CONFERENCE.

Further meetings of the Imperial War Conference, including representatives of His Majesty's Government, of the self-governing Dominions and India, took place in London in the months of March and April, 1918, important matters of a confidential nature being discussed. Canada was represented at this conference by the Prime Minister, Sir Robert Borden, Sir George Perley, the Hon. Robert Rogers, and the Hon. J. D. Hazen.

QUESTIONS WITH THE UNITED STATES.

(1) *St. Mary and Milk Rivers.*—The question of the apportionment of the waters of the St. Mary and Milk rivers between the two countries as provided for in article 6 of the Boundary Waters Treaty of 1909 had been considered by the International Joint Commission on several occasions, and in consequence of an announcement by the Acting Chairman of the United States section at the St. Paul session that the hearing would have to proceed upon the initiative of the Commission itself without stated issues, the United States Government on the 7th November, 1917, addressed a communication to the commission setting forth the view that that tribunal was not competent to pass upon the interpretation of article 6 of the treaty unless some matter of difference as to its meaning had arisen and been referred to the commission; and stating that for this reason no conclusion reached by the tribunal in this matter would be considered binding by the United States Government.

In April, 1918, Mr. A. P. Davis, Director of the United States Reclamation Service, was appointed as the United States Officer to undertake the measurement and apportionment of the waters of the two rivers, and on the 24th May, 1918, an order was issued by the commission instructing the duly appointed officers of the two countries as to the steps for carrying out such apportionment.

(2) *Fisheries Commission.*—In December, 1917, Chief Justice the Hon. J. D. Hazen, Mr. G. J. Desbarats, C.M.G., Deputy Minister of the Naval Service, and Mr. W. A. Found, Superintendent of Fisheries, were appointed commissioners to consider, together with United States Commissioners, the Hon. W. C. Redfield, Secretary of Commerce, Mr. E. F. Sweet, Assistant Secretary of Commerce, and Dr. Hugh M. Smith, Commissioner of Fisheries, outstanding fisheries questions. Meetings were held at Washington and Boston in January, 1918, and later at points on the Pacific coast, as a result of which there is every reason to expect a satisfactory arrangement in regard to these questions.

(3) *Renewal of Arbitration Convention of 1908.*—On the 3rd June, 1918, an agreement was concluded by His Majesty's Government with the United States extending, for a further period of five years, the Arbitration Convention originally entered into in 1908, by which provision is made for reference to the Hague Tribunal of questions of difference between the two countries. The first renewal was made in May, 1913.

(4) *Fur-seals question.*—The stipulated annual payment of ten thousand dollars due to Canada while the killing of seals is suspended on the United States sealing rookeries, was made for the period ending the 24th August, 1917. A report on the condition of the herd, made 21st November, 1917, showed it to consist of four hundred and sixty-eight thousand seals; killing was resumed by the United States in the season of 1917, but Canada did not become entitled to the delivery of any share of United States skins owing to the treaty provisions arranging for the reimbursement of the United States Government for the advance payment of two hundred thousand dollars made on the conclusion of the treaty, and for the annual payments of ten thousand dollars made during the suspension of killing.

It may be added here that a payment of \$2,620.36 was received from Japan in August, 1917, being the amount realized on the sale of Canada's share under the Treaty of 1911 of the seal skins taken on the Japanese Islands during the years 1912, 1913, and 1914. In view, however, of the small number to which the herd has been reduced, Japan has decided to cease killing on her island for the present. Canada's share of Russia's take on her rookeries for the season of 1917, amounting to one hundred and twenty-one skins, was duly forwarded to the Chief Inspector of Fisheries at New Westminster.

TREATY OF COMMERCE AND NAVIGATION WITH PORTUGAL, 1914.

The Portuguese Government having declined to accept the view in which Canada's adhesion was given to this Treaty, namely, that article 6 was applicable only to the United Kingdom and not to His Majesty's dominions generally, Canada's adhesion to the Treaty was withdrawn.

ANGLO-RUSSIAN TREATY, 1859.

By a note dated the 24th October, 1917, the Russian Government gave notice denouncing the Treaty of Commerce and Navigation between Great Britain and Russia of January, 1859, which accordingly will terminate on the 24th October, 1918.

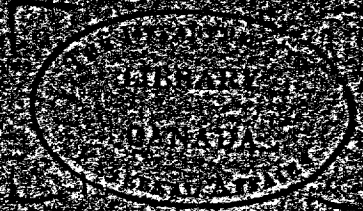

REPORT OF THE UNDER SECRETARY OF STATE FOR EXTERNAL AFFAIRS.

To the Right Honourable

Sir ROBERT BORDEN, G.C.M.G.,
Secretary of State for External Affairs,
Ottawa.

SIR,—I submit herewith the usual review of the more important questions which have engaged the attention of the department during the annual period 1918-19.

EUROPEAN WAR.

This will cover the last phase of the tremendous struggle which has taxed the energy and resources of the whole world, and its termination in the complete defeat of the Central Powers. The enemy's supreme effort to break through to the Channel Ports and to strike at Paris, which was initiated in March and culminated in July, was in that month effectively checked, and the Allies counter-offensive begun and continuously and successfully maintained until, thoroughly broken and defeated, the German army sought terms for an armistice. This was concluded on the 11th November, 1918. Austria-Hungary had previously laid down her arms under an armistice of the 3rd November, Bulgaria having surrendered on the 30th September and Turkey on the 31st October.

Roumania having reached the end of her resources, had unfortunately been compelled to abandon the Allied cause and come to terms with the Central Powers as she did by the Treaty of Bucharest, concluded on the 5th March and ratified the 7th May.

Shortly before the conclusion of the Armistice, the Canadian ministers were invited to London to consult as to the matters to be dealt with at the Conference to settle the terms of peace. Accordingly, the Prime Minister, accompanied by the Right Honourable Sir George Foster and the Honourable A. L. Sifton, set out on this mission in November, 1918, being followed later by the Honourable C. J. Doherty. The Conference, consisting of delegates of the Allied and Associated Powers, assembled at Paris, where its first meeting was held on the 18th January, 1919, its deliberations being still continued at the present time. The most important of its earlier operations has been the formulation of the Covenent constituting the League of Nations, which it is intended to embody in the treaties settling the terms of peace with the various enemy powers, so that assurance of the continuance of peaceful and beneficial conditions for the future may be provided.

THE IMPERIAL WAR CONFERENCE.

The Imperial War Conference, including representatives of the Imperial Government, the Governments of Canada, of New Zealand, of South Africa, of Newfoundland and of India, assembled at London on the 12th June, 1918, for the consideration of the problems of reconstruction which would arise after the coming of peace, its discussions continuing until the 26th July. Sir Robert Borden, Mr. Meighen and Mr. Rowell attended as Canadian representatives.

Among the more important matters discussed was the Empire's future economic policy regarding the supply of non-ferrous metals and all essential raw materials which,

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it was agreed, should be directed towards insuring independence of German sources and the retention of the control of such materials within the Empire.

The encouragement of efforts for the development of the dye industry was also approved, and the consideration of the question of shipping with the object of developing and improving sea communication between the various parts of the Empire was recommended.

A resolution was also adopted respecting reciprocity of treatment between India and other parts of the Empire in relation to immigration.

Other matters dealt with were the establishing of an Imperial mineral resources bureau, petroleum, state-owned Atlantic cable, demobilization and improved channels of communication between the Governments of the United Kingdom and of the Dominions.

TREATIES.

1. *General Arbitration Treaties.*—During the year 1918, a treaty between His Majesty and Uruguay was negotiated, providing that all disputes between the two countries which it was found impossible to settle by diplomatic means should be referred to arbitration. Canada's concurrence in the conclusion of the treaty was invited and given and the treaty duly ratified on the 11th February, 1919.

Similar general arbitration treaties with France, with Italy, with Spain, and with the United States concluded, respectively, on the 14th October, 1903; 1st February, 1904; 27th February, 1904; 4th April, 1908, which were about to expire, were renewed and extended for further periods of five years in each case, such renewals dating from 14th October, 1918; 1st February, 1919; 26th February, 1919, and 4th June, 1918.

2. *Commercial Treaties with Greece.*—In view of the changed conditions brought about by the abrogation of commercial treaties consequent on the war, and with the object of gaining freedom to regulate her foreign relations in conformity with the new situation, Greece, on the 3rd March, 1919, gave notice denouncing her commercial treaties with Great Britain. To give full opportunity for considering the forming of new arrangements, it was agreed that the treaties should be prolonged after the date which the denunciation fixed for their termination, subject to definite termination on three months' notice.

3. *Commercial Treaty with France.*—Notice was given by France on the 10th September, 1918, denouncing the convention respecting commercial relations between France and Canada of the 19th September, 1907, and the Supplementary Convention of the 23rd January, 1909, so that they should terminate on the 10th September, 1919, but, in accordance with the suggestion of the French Government, it has been agreed that they shall continue to operate subject to three months' notice of final termination.

BOUNDARY WATERS QUESTION WITH THE UNITED STATES.

St. Lawrence River Power Company's Application.—This company, an American corporation and a subsidiary of the Aluminium Company of America, asked for approval of the construction of a submerged weir on the south side of the St. Lawrence river at Massena, New York, with the object of improving the operation of its electrical power plant where aluminium was smelted. The application was supported by the United States Government and was heard at Montreal on the 29th and 30th August. It was opposed by the Canadian Government on the ground that as the proposed weir would close to navigation the south channel of the St. Lawrence at the Long Sault, the provision of the Ashburton Treaty of 1842; "that the channels of the St. Lawrence on both sides of Long Sault Islands . . . shall be equally free and open to the ships, vessels and boats of both countries," prevented the Commission granting approval of the plan proposed. The Dominion Marine Association and the Harbour Commission of Montreal also opposed the application.

By an Order dated the 14th September, 1918, on the consideration of the urgency as a war measure of facilitating the production of aluminium, the Commission approved

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the proposed construction of the submerged weir as a temporary expedient, it being provided that the weir should be removed on the termination of the war, or at the end of five years, which ever should last occur. The Commission declined to make a pronouncement regarding the right of the company to divert water from the river.

Pollution of Boundary Waters.—The final report of the Joint Commission upon the reference for examination of the question of the pollution of boundary waters and the means to be taken to remedy or prevent it was completed on the 12th August, 1918, and presented to the two governments. It was found that a serious condition of pollution existed which appeared susceptible of remedy, and it was recommended that jurisdiction and authority should be conferred on the Commission to enforce measures for remedying such pollution. The two governments, accepting this recommendation, have addressed similar requests to the Commission to prepare and submit copies of such a convention or such legislation as was considered necessary to confer upon it or other Government agencies authority to remedy the existing conditions of pollution.

Resignation of Mr. Mignault.—On the 21st October, 1918, Mr. P. B. Mignault, immediately prior to his appointment to the Supreme Court, tendered his resignation from the Joint Commission to His Majesty, who was pleased to accept it as from that date.

PASSPORTS.

The heavily increased volume of business in the Passport Office continues to be maintained, and, considering the indications of a very general intention on the part of European Governments to exercise control over immigration, which will be most readily facilitated by the passport system, there does not seem to be any reasonable prospect of an early slackening of this business.

I desire to add an expression of my appreciation of the efficient and zealous manner in which the various members of the staff have discharged their duties.
