## BRITISH STEAMER BURNED.

Six Unfortunates Lost Their Lives b Drowning and Fire, and Several

Others Were Injured.

Boston, Feb. 27.—The British steamer Legislator, Captain Tennant, bound from Liverpool for Colon, was burned at sea on Feb. 16 in lat. 31.28 north and long. 44.10 west. The fire broke out so suddenly that 11 men forwards were cut off from the rest of the ship, and in saving them a boat was capsized and five men, including the second and third officers, the steward and the cook, were drowned. A fireman received such severe burns that he died in a few minutes. The balance of the crew, 28 in all, with two passengers, Dr. W. Mortimer and wife, of London, were rescued within four hours after the fire broke out, by the fruit steamer Flowergate, and brought to this port. The steamer burned to the water's edge.

The names of the dead are: Drowned—Chief Steward John Gaffney, Second Officer James Bateman, Third Officer William Martin, Cook Alexander Jenkins, Seaman William Angill.

Burned to death—Fireman Thomas Roberts.

During the fire the following were severely burned, and upon arrival in this city were taken to the Marine Hospital: Chief Engineer John Traughear, Second Engineer John Holden, Fourth Engineer Robert Miln, Seaman Charles Ibbston.

He had deep religious convictions at heart and his faith was deeply rooted, and some of Hawthorne's moralizing is magnificent. 



Athens, Feb. 26.-An unsuccessful attempt was made to-day to assassinate King George of Greece.

The King was returning from Phalerun at 5 o'clock in the evening in a landau, ac companied by the Princess Maria, when two men who were hidden in a ditch alongsid the road opened fire with guns upon the occupants of the carriage. The first shot missed, but the second wounded a footman in the arm. The coachman whipped up his horses and the royal party dashed away at a gallop. The miscreants fired seven mor shots after them, none of which took effect and the King and Princess returned to the

He continued to fire after the carriage until it was out of range. His companion, who was more cowardly, did not leave the ditch. As soon as the news became known, all the leading politicians hastened to the Palace to express their congratulations over the escape of King George and the Princess. The action of His Majesty in shielding the Princess at the risk of his own life has aroused great enthusiasm.
