SALTING HAY.—There can be no greater improvement in the economy of provendity than that of moderately salting succulent or coarse hay, when it is moved or stacked for preservation, in burns, barracks or stacks and ricks. Not less, nor much more than half a peck to a ton, is better than a larger quantity. The use of salt has often proved the soundness of the trite adage—"Too much of a good thing is good for nothing." If too much salt be applied, excess of moisture is the consequence, or heating or mow barming follows; so that all the nutriment of the hay is extracted, and the residum is no better than salted saw dust. To clover hay this often occurs; though if it be stucked with layers of strawthe straw absorbs the superabundant moisture. This mode presents, in a great degree, the tendency of second crop clover to cause slabbars or plyalism in horses; yet to them it is highly improper, when other hay can be given. With herned beasts it agrees well, when thus prepared, the straw, having imbibed the juices of the clover and the brine, is palatable and nutrious to catle and sleep. Onts straw is the best, (though any other, good and sound, will answer,) for stacking with clover. Some farmers have lightly salted buckwheat straw; which has since fed profitably to store cattle and sheep. Those who exceed a peck of salt to a ton of lary, have repented of their overwening desire to do good. That salt is not only a preservative of hay, but a wholesome condiment inviting and the cessary to our domestic animals, is proved by long experience.
