Curtis Successor To Senator Lodge

Washington, Dec. 1.—Senator Charles Curtis, senior senator from Kansas, was selected yesterday as successor to the late Henry Cabot Lodge of Massachusetts as the Republican leader in the Senate. Senator James E. Watson of Indiana, was elected vice chairman and party "whip," a post which has been held by Senator Curtis since the Republicans gained control of Congress in 1918.

Fined In Ottawa In Lottery Matter

Ottawa, Dec. 1.—Three men were fined \$200 and costs in police court here for selling lottery tickets alleged to have been received from Montreal. The men refused to divulge the source of the tickets. Magistrate Hopewell described the lottery scheme and its results as a "damnable business."

Believed Oldest Priest In World

Belfast, Dec. 1.—The Rev. John J. Roche, believed to be the oldest priest in the world, died last evening at the Franciscan Friary at Westford, aged 100 years. During his 75 years as a cleric he was present at many notable events, including the obsequies for Pope Gregory VI. In 1846 and the funeral of Daniel O'Connell in 1847.

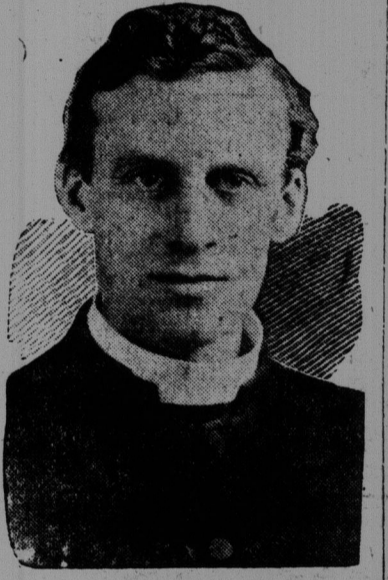

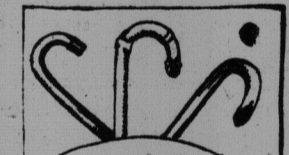

(The Illustrated London News.) With the closing of the British Empire Exhibition at Wembley a large number of cats, hundreds of them, which had taken up their abode in various pavilions, stalls and kiosks, suddenly found that their world was coming to an end, and that they had no abiding city. But they had friends in need who soon came to their assistance. That excellent institution known as "Our Dumb Friends' League" had foreseen the peril that was threatening the feline population of Wembley. The league sent its motor collecting van, which made a tour of the exhibition, and willing helpers took part in rounding up and capturing the disconsolate stragglers, which were wandering bewildered about the grounds as the work of dismantling and packing proceeded. Many of the cats, it is said, preferred to take their future in their own hands, and scurried over the walls in quest of adventure. The animals removed by Our Dumb Friends' League, it should be explained, were not destined for the lethal chamber, but are being cared for until good homes can be found for them. The league has already received numerous requests from the public for a "Wembley cat," an ornament to any patriotic fireside.
