Sunday, October 1st.

Met at 11 o'clock. The Rev. George R. Neale preach the Introductory Sermon from Isaiah lix. 19 verse, followed by C. Roan and Rev. H. Frances and more of the brethren. Met at 7 o'clock, P. M. Preaching by Rev. H. Frances, from Jonah iii, 2, followed by C. Roan, E. Dixon, Rev. G. R. Neale, Rev. B. Smithers, and more of the brethren. A Singing kept on until 12 o'clock. Truly it was a good time.

Tuesday, October 3rd.

Met at 9 o'clock, A. M. Rev. G. R. Neale read Isaiah

Met at 7 o'clock. Preaching by Rev. G. R. Neale, from Acts xx. 32, followed by C. Roan, E Dixon, Rev Benson Smithers. Then Ministers, Deacons and Delegates formed in a ring, hand in hand. The Doxology was sung. Prayer by the Rev. H. Frances. The benediction pronounced by the Rev. Benson Smithers. Then speaking and singing was kept up until 12 o'clock. Then the brethren separated to meet with the South Preston Church, on the last Saturday in September, 1872.

Wednesday, Oct. 4th.—We came on to Digby Joggins. Many of the of the brothers and sisters came with us. At 7 o'clock, P. M., Rev. B. Smithers preached from Isaiah lxiii. 1, followed by E. Dixon, C. Roan, Rev. H. Frances, Rev. G. R. Neale, and a great many more of the brethren.

THE CILCULAR LETTER OF THE AFRICAN BAPTIST AS-SOCIATION, CONVENED AT WEYMOUTH, SEPTEMBER OF 30TH, 1871.

We feel thankful to Almighty God for his goodness and mercy. He has spared our lives through another year. Glory be to his Name. Since we last met many have been taken away by death; but we are still spared to hail you again upon the shores of time.

I asked you last year to pray to the Lord that he might make peace among the nations of the earth. That prayer has been answered, war and bloodshed have ceased; thanks be to the Lord. We feel glad he has also made peace in the hearts of a great many of his people.

And now my brethren I recommend you to have a little more faith in Jesus Christ—not wavering nor shaky faith but strong standing faith. Our blessed Lord Jesus Christ recommended growing faith like a grain of mustard seed. The Apostle Paul said "Faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen." Jude recommends us to earnestly contend for the faith which was once delivered unto the Saints, but shakey moving faith will not do at all. My brethren the Israelites had faith when they started out of Egypt, but their faith failed at the Red Sea. After they got over, and seeing their enemies drowned and gone, they got faith to sing and to say: Who is like our God? but afterwards they murmurred and their faith failed. When Moses was up in the mount forty days they said to Aaron, Make us Gods. For which cause the Lord was wroth

against them. My brethren I recommend to you faith like the faith of Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego. Their faith was so strong that God delivered them out of the burning fiery furnace, and he will deliver us, for we were made to rejoice that faith went with us to our Association, and we were glad to see our Bishop Smithers walled in by his brethren; and to see the Lion turned into a lamb. We hope he will have a little more faith in Jesus, I shall say
