On motion, a Committee consisting of R. W., Bro. Adam Murray, W. Bro. J. W. Morrason, W. Bro. Nell McKelvie, W. Bro. R. A. Clark, and R. W. Bro. William T. Hunt, was appointed to report on Appeal and Memorial in the afternoon session.

Grand Lodge was called from labor to meet at three o'clock.

WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON,

17th May.

'Grand Lodge was called to labor at three o'clock; M. W. Grand Master in the East.

W. Bro. R. A. CLARK and Bro. WILLIAM R. ELLIS, were installed as Grand Director and Assistant Grand Director of Ceremonies.

W. Bro. J. W. MORRISON, stated that he declined putting the motion for certain amendment to the constitution, notice of which was given at the Annual Communication.

W. Bro, W. W. McLeod, pursuant to notice given at the Annual-Communication; Moved the following:

In Section 1, of the regulations for the government of Subordinate Lodges, in the Constitution. under the head of "Proposing Members," on page 53, to strike out all after the word "Lodge," on the third line of the said paragraph to, and including the word "ballot," on the eleventh line of the same, and by substituting the following: "Nor until his Grand Lodge Certificate, with the Certificate of his former Lodge be produced, and the decision of the Brethren be ascertained by ballot, as in the case of a Petition for Membership."

Which motion was lost.

W. Bro. J. W. MORRISON, Chairman of the Committee appointed to report on the Appeal and Memorial from members of True Brothers Lodge, moved that the Committee be discharged, and the matter be discussed in Grand Lodge, which was agreed to, and after discussing the matter it was decided to leave the decision to the M. W. Grand Master, who gave his decision on the question raised.

On Motion of W. Bro. J. W. Morrison, seconded by W. Bro. DAVID SMALL, the Rigual Committee was discharged.

W. Bro. SIMON W. CRABBE, submitted the following resolution, which was seconded by the Grand Secretary, and adopted.

Resolved, That the Rivual now used by the M. W. Grand Lodge, of New Brunswick be adopted by this Grand Lodge.

On Motion a vote of thanks was unanimously passed to the Brethren of Mount Lebanon Lodge, for the use of their Hall, for this Communication.

M. W. Grand Master, presented a Commission from the Grand Lodge of New Jersey, appointing him the Representative of that Grand Lodge, near this Grand Lodge, and was duly accredited as such.

No further business appearing, the minutes were read and approved. The Grand Lodge of Prince Edward Island was closed in ample form with prayer.

The Most Worshipful Grand Master delivered the following address:

BRETHREN:

In accordance with the provisions of our constitution we are again assembled at this our Second Annual Communication. I am much pleased to find so many representatives present from the Subordinate Lodges. It is our duty to examine carefully all proceedings in connection with the craft for the past year—to redress greivances if any are known to exist, and to consider earnestly what is required from us, upon this occasion, to advance the interest of our cherished order within this jurisdiction.

Since our last Annual Communication this Grand Lodge has received the recognition and fraternal greeting of the following Grand Lodges:

I have appointed the following representatives of this Grand Lodge to other Grand Lodges:

Bro. Henry P. Buckley, near the Grand Lodge of Louisiana; M. W. Bro. E. George Conklin, near the Grand Lodge of Manichola; Bro. John Kennedy, near the Grand Lodge of Idaho; Bro. Samuel Reed, near the Grand Lodge of New Jersey; Bro. W. H. Clark, near the Grand Lodge of Nebraska; Bro. David A. Manson; near the Grand Lodge of Quebec.

I have recommended R. W. Bro. WILLIAM T. HUNT for appointment as the representative of the Grand Lodge of Louisiana near this Grand Lodge.

I have also recommended R. W. Bro. JOHN A. MATHESON to be the representative near this Grand Lodge of the Grand Lodge of Idaho.

I have also recommended R. W. Bro. John Murhead as the representative of the Grand Lodge of Nebraska near this Grand Lodge.

I submit these recommendations and appointments to which I ask the confirmation of Grand Lodge.

I have granted a Dispensation to form a new Lodge at Crapaud, to be called Westmorland.

I have also issued a Dispensation to Bros. McFarlane, McLean, Carlton, and other Brethren to form a new Lodge at Souris, to be called Orient. This Lodge has been opened under most favorable auspices, and with every prospect of a bright future.

Four Dispensations have been granted to confer degrees at shorter periods than allowed by our constitution.

As provided by our constitution, three Quarterly Communications of Grand Lodge have been held—one in May, at Summerstide; in August, at Port Hill; and at Georgetown, in November. The weather was remarkably fine on each of these occasions, the attendance good, and the members of Grand Lodge were most kindly welcomed and hospitably entertained by the Brethren in their localities. In reference to our Quarterly Communications a notice has been given by a W. Bro. that these be discontinued; this matter will, no doubt, come before Grand Lodge for decision.

No questions of importance have been submitted for my decision. I am happy to report, so far as I am informed, that the kindest feeling of Brotherly love and harmony prevails amongst the Freternity within this jurisdiction.

I have visited several of the Lodges which I have found generally in a very satisfactory condition. I was particularly well pleased with the work in St. John's Lodge, No. 1, which, on the occasion of my visit, could not easily be excelled.

We have every reason to feel thankful to the Great Giver of all good for having favored us with a healthy and bountiful season. We must all have observed with pleasure the great prosperity of Masonry throughout the world during the past year. Within our own little Province, although we cannot report a large increase in numbers still, I think our success has been quite as good as could reasonably be anticipated; our lodges are, financially, in good standing and are all, I think, progressing favorably.

In concluding this short address, allow me to thank you all for the high honor which you have conferred upon me on two successive occasions in electing me to the high position of your Grand Master. It will afford me great satisfaction if, during my term of office, my official acts have met with your approval. I tender my shorere thanks to the officers of the Grand Lodge for the courtesy and kindness they have extended to me on all occasions, and in this respect I flave specially to mention R. W. Bro. B. WILSON HIGGS, our energetic Grand Secretary, to whom I am much indebted for valuable assistance.

GRAND SECRETARY'S REPORT.

To the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of A. F. & A. M. of Prince Edward Island:

I herewith beg to submit my Annual Report of the proceedings of the Grand Secretary's Office for the past year.

As soon as possible after the last Annual Communication I had the proceedings printed, and forwarded copies to each member of Grand Lodge; also three copies each to the Grand Lodges of England, Ireland, and Scotland; also, to all the Grand Lodges in the United States and Dominion of Canada.

I have received one hundred parchment Diplomas from Edinburgh, R. W. Bro. ALEXANDER HAY having kindly superintended the engraving of a Plate for the same, and had the Diplomas struck off and forwarded, and I am sure that the Grand Lodge will be pleased with the manner in which this work is executed. This lot will answer for the present.

I issued, by order of the Most Worshipful Grand Master, a Dispensation to form a new Lodge at Victoria; Lot 29, to be called Westmorland; also a Dispensation to open a new Lodge at Souris, to be called ORIENT.

I have received from the M. W. Grand Lodge of Massachusetts a bound copy of the revised constitution, also the new Trestle Board. I have also received from R. W. Bro. Parvin, Grand Secretary of Iowa, six large bound volumes of their Grand Lodge Proceedings from its formation to 1876. These, with other Grand Lodge Proceedings received, as per list, are very valuable for reference, as they contain decisions on almost every question that will arise.
