

The foregoing statement shows a continued decrease in the contributions of the congregation for the purposes named during the past year. It is to be hoped that during the present year, improved conditions may lead to larger offerings for these important objects. The Session lately resolved, in view of the state of the funds, not to become responsible for the payment of more than \$300 towards the support of an ordained missionary in British Columbia, believing such a course to be necessary in order to do justly by the other schemes of the church.

The number of deaths reported is much larger than the average of former years, and includes some who had been respected members of

the congregation for a long time and were nearing the eventime of life; and some, around whom were centred high hopes, who stood on the threshold of the real work and responsibilities of life. Our sympathies go out to the families that have lost their loved ones, and we pray that the God of All Grace may give them comfort and consolation.

We have lost heavily in membership by removals, but we are encouraged by the fact that we close the year with a net increase of 22 on

the Communion Roll.

Notwithstanding the financial depression we have reached the period in our history so long looked forward to, when our place of worship should be fully paid for and the Lord's House be free of debt. Peace and harmony prevail, and all the church machinery seems to be working smoothly. MANAGERS' REPORT.

In looking back over the financial affairs of the Congregation for the past year, there is good cause for thankfulness. Although there were times in the last quarter of the year-a time when expenses increasethat the regular contributions scarcely kept abreast of the expenditure, yet when the year closed the small balance of \$14 appeared on the right side, after all current claims had been met. Since then some arrears have come in, making the balance that appears in the subjoined Statement. The special cause for congratulation respecting the finances for the year 1895, is that the last payment on the church debt has been made, and consequently the goal of a church, free from debt, reached. The contributions for Building Fund at the Anniversary of Church Opening, and subsequently, amounted to \$338.50, certainly a very creditable sum, considering the general scarcity of money, and that there were 30 subscribers less than the previous year; still it was short of the annual payment and expenses \$170.75. The amount required to make up this deficiency was borrowed from a junior member of the family, The Young People's League, out of a little fund accrued from past years' savings, and then the last instalment of \$1000 on mortgage was paid, and a release obtained.

The Managers take this opportunity of drawing the attention of the Congregation to the danger of undue relaxation regarding money matters at this time, as the burden of a church debt is being laid down. and giving a word of explanation concerning the revenue system of the Congregation. We think it may be said without insincerity, that the object considered of first importance is an open church where all are equally welcome. In respect to the necessary funds of the Congregation the contributions thereto are voluntary, the only rule recognized as to amount being, "As God has prospered him." The small square envelopes in which the Weekly Offering is made are placed on the table in the vestibule of Church, open to all. Our highest aim in this regard is to have sufficient funds, supplied on Christian principles, to meet, when carefully expended, all contingencies promptly, besides the stipulated outlay, without requiring appeals for money, as heretofore, more than the general intimation of the case, as may from time to time present itself. The Congregation has lost several good friends, we regret to say, during the past year. So far as this loss is reparable we look to the new members and adherents joining the Congregation from time to time, together with the continued liberality of the old, to make it up. Above all we desire God's blessing and approval, and, while being thankful for what He has done for the Congregation in the past, implore that He will bless it still more in the future with such prosperity as will be pleasing to Himself, and give it strongly to desire Spiritual blessing, and a habitual inclination to give to God's name all the honor and glory.

Eleventh Annual Report of the Brampton Auxiliary to the W. F. M. S.

Meetings were held regularly during the year on the First Friday of each month.

We are pleased to report that though our regular membership has not increased, the number of "Scattered Helpers" has grown to twenty-three. Our total membership is seventy-eight. The amount of money contributed during the year, including contribution from the McLaren Mission Band, was \$136.64, an increase of \$21 over last year; and a bale of Clothing valued at \$34.25 was sent to the Northwest Mission Schools.

The Toronto Presbyterial Society held its semi-annual meeting here in October. The attendance and the offering were larger than at any previous meeting Miss Sinclair, returned missionary from Indore, gave an interesting address on her work in India.

In November the Rev. R. P. McKay, gave an address on "Medical Mission Work" at our annual "Thank Offering" meeting.

Our Society has sustained a loss in the removal of Mrs. Gray, who has been our President for the past six years, and who, by her thorough knowledge of the work and her special aptitude for conducting the meetings, had become very necessary to us. The Society, in recognition of Mrs. Gray's services, presented her with a life membership certificate.

May we still press forward with the hope that the coming year may find us more earnest and more faithful in the service of "Him who loved us and gave Himself for us."

Seventh Annual Report of McLaren Mission Band.

During the past year the Band has held seventeen regular meetings. These meetings have been held twice every month, with the exception of the months July and August.

There were thirty-seven names enrolled, and the average attendance was twenty-two.

The total amount of money realized was \$17.62; and a box which was sent to the Northwest was valued at \$10.05.

The contributions to mite-boxes were very small this year, and consequently our Board has not done so well financially as in previous years. But we hope to be more successful in this and other departments of our work, and that during the year apon which we have entered more may be done to help in the establishing of Christ's Kingdom here upon the earth.

SABBATH SCHOOL REPORT FOR 1895.

The Sabbath School has passed through a year that has not been very eventful.

The attendance of scholars and teachers has been up to the average, which is a gratifying sign; and the interest in the school has been fairly well maintained. There has, however, been a very regrettable deficit in the finance of the school. The contributions for Missions have been very good, but the receipts for running expenses have been disappointing. We do not know fully the cause of this shortage, yet we would beg the parents to give the matter their attention. We pray you who send children to the Sabbath School to see that they are supplied with collection each Sabbath. The Sabbath School supplies the children, and, through them, the homes of the congregation with bright, readable magazines; and it is only right that the children should pay for them with the weekly collections. Sometimes we think there is a little carelessness and neglect in this matter of the children's collection, and we urge the parents to give us their help so far as they can.

We may, at this point, remark that the offering of the Congregation for the S. S. Pienic this past year was not as liberal as it should have been. Our pienic is an annual event for the children, and, indeed, for all the congregation. The Sabbath School undertakes to give the great majority of the scholars free railway tickets, with the expectation that the entire congregation, rich and poor, those who have children, and those who have none, will unite in a special offering to defray the outlay incurred. Unfortunately this special offering has come sadly short of the needs of the occasion.

Perhaps the Sabbath School has failed in not presenting itself and its claims on the congregation more forcibly and often. The School cannot thrive without the interested co-operation of the Church; and so it is hoped that this year we may succeed in making our Sabbath School more closely identified with the Congregation's life and work. We should be very much pleased to have more frequent visits from the parents and friends of the scholars, and we promise them a hearty welcome.

We are in need, over and over again, of regular and occasional teachers, and we shall be very grateful if some members—adult members—of the congregation would volunteer their services for such work. We would suggest that many older ones attend the Sabbath School, which is not only for children, but for the child-like, and we all of us should be disciples of the great Teacher—the Christ. We are glad to have secured our Pastor to be the teacher of the Bible Class, and we trust that many will become members of his class and help him and profit greatly.

We regret that our beloved Superintendent, Mr. Robert McClure, has had to leave us for a time. Still we are glad to know he does not forget us, and we pray that his health may be permanently restored, and that early he may return to his accustomed duties and place. We are sorry to lose the efficient service of Mr. F. W. Gillies, who has been, during the past year, his able assistant.
